Guess the "off-season" laziness has caught up with me, as I've done very little listening since my last report. In fact I've only logged two new ones - WJSW, Altoona, Pa., on 1290 with regular program the afternoon of the 28th when I happened to get home early, and WPRC, Lincoln, Illinois on 1370 with a test program the morning of the 29th. However, I was fortunate enough to receive six veries the past week. On the 26th I received one from WEOL for my report of 2/21 on 930 kc/s. which said in part, "It is a very fine report and complete. I was very much disappointed by the response as there were very few answers. We use a directional system day and night, using the night pattern for the test." v/s G.R. McCasland, CE. The same date I received one from CKON for a poor report as they were hard to copy through heavy QRM. They said "Thank you very much for a good report. Yours is one of the best we have as yet received. Even with the interference from the Ball-nighters" you got most of our show. Everything you reported was correct, so I hope this will verify your report." v/s Ted Little, CE. The 27th brought a three line, typed but unsigned verie from Theodore Kalin, CE of WEIM on their DX of the 19th. Then, on the 28th I received a nice verie from WHCO in reply to two reports on f/cs - 2/5 and 3/5 (I'd sent 'em a follow-up in March with my 2nd report). "We certainly appreciate receiving your nice complete reports and you must have a good listening post to hear us so well." Then an apology for not answering my February report. v/s F C Wilbur, CE. 29th brought one from WJIV on their 3/33 special, saying I gave an accurate description of the program and that they plan to make frequency checks on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. (No time given - 900 kc/s), v/s Robert Rivers, CE. Friday showed up with a form letter with date filled in on the WILM special of 3/18 on 1450 kc/s. H. Edwin Kennedy, CE, v/s, and Saturday brought me a two-line verie, "Your reception report of Feb. 9th is correct and we want to thank you very much." Roland C. Cooper, GM, WHOW, on a one-identification report. So there you are! Hope to work up the ambition to begin sending out follow-ups soon. "Signal strength seemed to be very good South to Mexico, fair East to Chicago, and rather weak beyond to the East coast.

KBRS (1340) Springdale, Ark. under heavy QRM. Was that WKID on 1580 at 2:57? WAVU was finally heard at 6:03 AM with a fair signal. 3/26 - KGDM (1140) Stockton, Calif. in the cleat at 3 AM. PRB-9 (1000) Sao Paulo, Brazil very strong at 4:10 a.m. I finally heard CKFH (1400) Toronto, Ont. 4:25 actually over-riding WJLB. I've been hearing a Spanish-speaker on 1600 for the last few evenings with a remarkable signal, actually topping WFRC at 6:30. 3 unknown 'K' stations on 3/26 - On 1250 at 3:32 and 2 on 1340 - one of them on s/off at 4:45 and the other at 4:58. I received 7 verifications on 3/26 to tie with record. I received a very short verie from WINS for report of 1/15. Here it is, "Report of reception correct as stated." A very interesting letter from WTUX, signed by Wayne C. Newhaus, C.E. He gave a list of the Delaware stations (5) and gave their frequency and power. I've heard 3.
