WATZ has several affiliated stations - WTCM WATT WMBN, stations of the Paul Bunyan Network. WPTR, Albany, NY, 1540-50000, No net, on air 24 hours a day. They said, "We operate 24 hours a day, 6 AM Monday through Sunday midnight, as an independent station." I have heard WPTR when they were only 10000 w. but have not had it verified. Letter for 3/25/51. WCUE, Akron, O., 1150 kc/s., 1000 w. no net., letter for 3/21/51. KWBG, Boone, Iowa, 1590-1000 D, 500 N. Network I believe LBS, letter for 4/5/51 at 7:15 PM. KWBG stands for "Keep Watching Boone Grow." WCBM, Baltimore, Md., 680. Received it when it operated with 5000 w., now changed to 10000. MBS. In the official log it does not show it. Letter for 9/19/50. I did not get it verified until 4/6/51, that is date CE wrote it. WVOM Brookline 46, Mass., 1600-5000, no net. Letter for 3/22/51. Also sent very nice verie card. WVOM "The Voice of Mass." New England's only 24-hour station. KTXC, Big Spring, Tex., 1400-100, LBS. A late letter, but worth waiting for as it was one of the most complete I have ever received from a small station, This for 3/10/51. Equipment is an old but reliable Gates 250-watt transmitter, operated on 100 w. The limited and freq. control units are original equipment with the type 2504 Gates transmitter that we have, the frequency and modulation monitors are Gates & are or were new at the time of installation, which was a year ago last Aug. The console is a Gates Studioetta. S/gn 7:30 AM, off 11:30 PM EST. To the entire staff of KTXC I wish to say many thanks & all is forgiven as we all make mistakes. CFAC Calgary, Alta, 960-5000, carries some CBC programs, but is privately owned. Sent a fine letter & very nice QSL card. I asked them for a special DX show but they said "The NRC contacts us every year & we supply them with a DX program. The last one was in Dec., '50." Being a new member I did not know this fact. The letter for 4/18/51. WMT, Cedar Rapids, Iowa 1600-5000 CBC, letter for 4/14/51. WMT is Iowa's first frequency. At night they operate directional of Memphis. WBBM Chicago, 780-50000-CBS, letter for 5/13/51. KCOG Centerville, Iowa, 1400-250, no net. Letter for 3/29/51 at 2:12 AM. KCOG is full time but only uses 16½ hours a day, 7AM-11:30PM. KSWI, Council Bluffs, Iowa, 1560-500-D, letter for 4/14/51. I asked if they would like a special DX show & this was my answer, "Because our staff is at a minimum at this particular time we must decline your request for a special DX program. Also being a daytime only station we would be forced to receive special permission from the FCC to broadcast a regular program even in the test hours from midnight to 4 AM." "As for specific details, we use a DA for night pattern & non-D. Daytime. We have 2 towers 265' high." One of the most complete I have ever received. WEIM Fitchburg, Mass. 1280-1000-MBS, letter for DX 3/19/51. WHOP, Hopkinsville, Ky. 1230-250-CBS. Several years ago recd a rpt from NZ. The letter for verie, 3/23/51., f/c-TT 4th Fri. 3:30-4. non-DA WHAV, Haverhill, Mass. 1490-250-no net, letter 3/19/51. 3:35 AM. CE said, "I was especially pleased to receive your letter, since yours is the only report we have ever received from Minn." Ketchikan, Sitka, & Juneau are E.S.T. minus 3 hours, so sign-off times shown for KTKN KINY & KIFW should read 0300 EST. Adak and Kodiak are EST minus 6 hours, but sign-off times of 0430 EST for these AFRS stations are correct. Also, KFQD now has a CP for 600 kc/s., no power change.

CHILE (Page 8) Add: 820 kc/s., CA82, 1000 watts, "Radio del Salitre, in Iquique.

COSTA RICA (Page 13) Mailing address of TICS, 855 kc/s., is Apartado 727.

GUADELOUPE (Page 18) "Radio Guadeloupe" is now actually operating on assigned frequency of 650 kilocycles.

HONDURAS (Page 20) HRPl, 1400 kc/s., is now on the air.

MEXICO (Page 21) Once again, conflicting information was received as to local time in use. It now appears that some parts of western Mexico are E.S.T. minus 2 hours. Also note that ALL border stations use the clock time in use in their sister cities on the U.S. side. Accurate information on Mexican stations was found to be more difficult to obtain than on any other country. We are hopeful that the listings are at least 90% accurate!
