Boy, is it hot out this way! Oh well - it is only a lull before the storm. Kate is on her way. (The name of the typhoon that should hit us before the morning.) Oh well, will joys never cease! Yep, I am winding up my DX again, moving back to Korea. Only this time it's not to fight, but to R-O-T-A-T-E back to the good old USA. Gosh I've been out of circulation so long I wonder what it will be like to walk into any bar one chooses and get a cold brew. (It's wonderful, Andy, hi -Ed.) Hey Len, take notice, as Dubuque is a 3-day stop for me. Expect to be back in Frisco within the next month, and after a 30-day furlough and a tour of the US, I expect to be assigned to A.F.R.S., Los Angeles. If I can get it-if not, well, any place will do, as long as it ain't in Texas. DX here in Sendai is fair. I have an antenna pointing N-S. It gives better reception for the down-under stations, of which I am very much after. Only chance I guess I'll ever have to get them is now. 16 letters out now to Australia, New Zealand, and Indonesia. 3 out to the Philippines, and if they come in will make a total of 12 veries from the Islands. Also, will somebody give me some info? There is a station in Manila which has really got this guy confused. I would swear it was an Aussie. It operates on 650 kc/s. But as they announce Manila all the time, I don't know. Have the British got a station there - I didn't even know they had any occupational forces there. Recent veries from the Philippines are: DZST - 860 - Magial, same station as DZAB, also verified. WVTM, 1300, A.F.R.S., Clark Field, Luzon; DZBU, 1250, Cebu City. Recent veries in from Australia and New Zealand are: 2YC, 660, Wellington, N.Z. I guess that is the only one I got in since my last to you. Now for the record, AFRS, Sendai, is now on 1430 kc/s. Moved here from 1370 on July 1 and still using 10,000 watts. Recent letters out to the following U.S. stations: WKBB 1490; WDBC 680; WOKZ 1570; WENR 890; KHON 1380; KTOH 1490; KFRB 1290; KBYR 1240; & KTOP 1490. It is surprising that the 1230, 1240, 1340 and 1490 channels are the best DX frequencies over here. Say by the way - the convention if I remember rightly, will be around the 1st of September. Well friends, as I'll be on leave you know I may make this year - probably the only chance I'll get. So to get a letter off to HLKA I'd better close now, and by the way, the log now stands at 1013 verified. All BCB, natch. No TV here to watch, which is a God-send. Nothing but little Chinese yakity yaking all over the dial. Oooh, I could shoot or strangle some of them. At this time I want to thank you, the members of the National Radio Club for the many kind words and prayers for my safety and safe return. I know they have helped me and I have spent many a happy hour reading of your DXings. My thanks especially to Len Kruse, Hal Stein, Peggy Callahan, for their nice letters that I got at mail call in Korea. Believe me friends, I'll never forget. They sure helped me to carry on. And as long as I'm still in this world, I believe I'll always be a member of the N.R.C. It is one great team!
