



KNOG - Nogales, Arizona. We are sorry not to have had notification of this program in time for last week's DX News, but we just didn't. Hal Beh Greenhaw, C. E. sent cards around, we believe, on this one, however, so we hope you all heard KNOG well. We wish to thank Mr. Ben Greenhaw, Chief Engineer of KNOG, for his courtesy towards us DXers, and it is our understanding that his station has a very attractive verification card to send out to all who were successful in logging the station. The frequency should have been clear at least some of the way. Arranged by Howard Kemp - his first!

KIWW - San Antonio, Texas. Here is a station which is almost certain to have a large audience of DXers, since it is missing from most of our logs. This channel is almost always wide open at this hour, and we confidently feel that KIWW will be heard well and at great distance. Announcements will be bi-lingual, Spanish as well as English, plus some tone modulation, and music. KIWW broadcasts mostly in Spanish on regular schedule. Mr. L. E. Richards has promised verifications to all correct reporters. KIWW is just over one year old. This was arranged by Corporal Jack D. Rhea of the Air Force.

WBNL - Boonville, Indiana "We'll be right there from three till three-thirty (CST) Sunday morning, Nov. 25 from 4:00-4:30 E.S.T. We'll be looking for many reports from all over and will verify all reports received," writes Mr. Sanders, in part. They will follow KIWW on the same channel, which again should be clear of all others. This station is also just a bit over one year old, and this special test should find a good many eager dialists waiting for them to sign on. By way of introduction, might say that I have been an ardent DX fan since March of 1926, with an old 3-tube super squeezer job. For DX work I use a 1932 Atwater Kent and a whip aerial with no ground. Still a pretty good old set although it does need a good thorough going over. Went into shortwave about 18 months ago with a Halli-crafters 1950 S-40-A. However, the broadcast band still claims most of my DX time. At the moment my log stands at 1424 stations, so far as I know, all in active operation, for when I know of a station's having left the air I take it from my log. I haven't gone too deeply into verifications, as I began a new verification file when I returned from "the big ordeal" late in '45. Incidentally, when I returned I sent a letter of subscription to Radex, which I had previously taken for 6 or 7 years. The letter was returned "unknown." Did Radex fade from the scene? Haven't been able to find a good station list the past year on the news stands. If you know of a good listing of U.S., Mexican, Canadian and Cuban stations, would like the publisher's address. I received a note from Len Kruse of Dubuque, only about 35 miles from here - who sent my name to the NRC. Will try to have some "dope" to send along in a few weeks, although between motors, TVs and what have you, the past 15 months have been strictly discouraging for DXing. Best regards. (Welcome to the NRC, Duane, and we hope to hear from you often. A swell log is soon to be released by Carroll Weyrich, 2800 Alden Road, Parkville 14, Maryland. It will list all Western Hemisphere stations by frequency and is \$1.00 and a masterpiece! -Ed.)

No additions to my log the past week. Was unable to hear KGDE's new rig's f/c second Thursday at 1:35. I'm wondering if anyone else did. CKLD's promised DX of 11/10 failed to show too. WTTS, 1370, daily till 2:00. KLIC and KOLS are my only new veries. I greatly appreciate Len Kruse's telling me my 1580 tester was WRLY and not WIRY, Columbus, Ohio.

I have lined up a special from KNOG, Nogales, Ariz., 1340 kc/s., for Mon. Nov. 19, from 3:00-4:00 AM EST. DX not up to snuff here and replies even worse. Good listening. (We believe cards were sent out on this one, only we had it 3-5. -Ed.)

Missings of the MembersDon Kaskey - 908 South 25 Street - Omaha, Nebraska

The big news here is no KPST on Nov. 5. Either my setup is totally no good or they weren't on at the designated time. To make things worse I drew a total blank for the Monday AM DX. Only 5 stations heard since last report. KWOE-1320, Clinton, Okla. on twilight reception from 6:45-7:01 PM s/off. Then on Nov. 1, logged the other 4. WANT-990, on DX from Richmond, was fair here from 4:30-5:00. Was blocked first 30 minutes by home-made static in the neighborhood. Then WACL-570, Waycross, Ga. from 5:00-6:00 a.m. on regular and WKIN, 1320, Kingsport, Tenn. 5:00-5:30 on regular. Also WKAY-1490, Glasgow, Ky. on f/c-TT and M/c from 5:00-5:15. I heard both WANT & KOLS DXes and reception wasn't half bad for a change. Veries in from KXXX-790, WDXE 1370; WBBQ-1340, WBRW-1340, WQBC-1420, WFUL-1270, KLWT-1230, KCUL-1540, WILM-1450, WJJM-1490, WOKE-1430, KWOE-1320, and KWCB-1300. I received 2 two page letters from WJJM the same day and they are among the best I've ever received. This raises my total to 1507 heard, 1077 veries. I guess I'll have to rig up an antenna or else log 8 or 9 a month, at this rate. My reception pattern isn't bad with stations at a distance with 1,000 watts or over but the 250 watters just are nil from both coasts. That's it, fellows. 73s.

CJNP, North Battleford, Sask., 1460, signing off just after 2:00 over KENO. WBSM signing off 11:30 PM. WNAB under VMAS and others but identifiable. 11/2 - KOTA, 1380, Rapid City, on regular sked at 1:45 AM. 11/3 - CHML testing auxiliary transmitter, much weaker than main transmitter, at 2:32. CKCL, Truro, N.S., strong on test over WJLB. WFUR, Grand Rapids, Mich, 1570, testing and taking out XERF (it should happen more.) 11/4 - WWIN all-nighter more or less in clear. WKMH dominating 1310. CKFH overhauling WWIN. 11/5 - WHSC, Hartsville, S.C. testing at 2:15 on 1450 with announced s/on time of 6:55. KGO strong on 810, WSRS loud as anybody on the dial. WVEB in Miami caught in clear at 3:15. By the way, KENO s/off on Monday, 11/5 at 3:07, not 4:30 as indicated in NRC "DX News" 10/27. WKNE, Keene, N. Edited by Fred VanVoorhees, Box 132, Lemoyne, Penna., Deadline Wed AM. Reports next week by Tues. PM to Hotel Allen, Honesdale, Pennsylvania.

Since we are making our progress in the islands, let's turn right away to the storm Barry Foote turned up by reporting 4VK. SM says that it can't be, as 4VK is not even started. He says 4VW (1315) and 4VGM (1430) are only Haitian's on. 4VYM (1200) due in January. HH further checked 1130 and reports CMHM, Cadena Oriental in Santa Clara coming in so this is probably Barry's station. Also from HH regarding Barry's list of unknowns: 1190 CMK Havana; 760 CMJY Cadena Oriental in Ciego de Avila; 1000 CMJG Cadena Oriental in Camaguey; 920 CMJL Circuito CMQ in Camaguey; 1290 CMCW Radio Lavin in Havana evenings plus a Mexican in the early morning. HH says 1090 if mystery to him. (I think we have him tabbed as CMBS now).

ES has two mystery stations, one on 880 in Spanish hrd 10-10:15 PM very hard to copy. (Ye Ed suggests TILS, "Radio Para Ti" in San Jose with 5 KW, QRA Aptdo 3) BS also asks about one hrd 11/3 at 6 AM in Spanish. Wonders if XEDF. (Possibly, but better bet is CMCH 10 KW in Havana, as Cubans often come on that early) SM has a mystery Latin on 787 Kcs. FV has them on 823 and 695. One on 695 with classical organ music, may be XEN, but doubt it.

The Europeans are back with us again with a bang. HH & SM report Ottringham BBC (1295); Marseille (1376); French (1403); Germans (1586); HH reports French on 1493.
