FOREIGN DX DIGEST

NORTH AMERICA

VIRGIN ISLANDS--Our good friend Steve Mann is now wandering in the West Indies gathering information and arranging programs. You will find more information on his CPC work later in the DIGEST. Our first word from him is that WIVI is due on the air in about two weeks to give the Virgin Islands their second station. WSTA in Charlotte Amalie on 1340 Kcs. continues to be heard with a report this month from PJ heard on 4/7. RA reports a WSTA verie card to help him along in the contest.

MEXICO--As usual so much from Mexico that I almost hate to tackle it, but here goes. First, RJ accuses your editor of not answering his reply card re the address of XEYC. If it wasn't answered, then I did not receive it, as everything received here has been cleared. XERB (1090) Rosarita Beach, B. Cfa., is now on until 0300 with typical mail order stuff and music. Address is P. O. Box 1190, San Diego, Cal. Heard with WPAL silent. (HSW) XEDM (1580) Hermosillo, Sonora, continues the same sort of programing giving a mail address as Nogales, Arizona. (HSW) RE reports a verie from XEDM. And now back to our old friend on 1290 Kcs. BS says he has heard him mention Ciudad Obregon many times. For this reason he thinks it is XEAP in that city. His latest log was 4/12 at 0630. Your editor thinks that both XEAP and XEDA have been heard at different times and in different sections of the country. This report was probably XEAP. Certainly worth a report, Bob. BS reports that he has identified his mystery on 1460 Kcs. It was XES, Tampico, Tams., heard on 4/1 at 0715. Sign-on is apparently 0700. XEBZ continues to reach the Pacific Coast on 660 Kcs. from Mexico City. Heard on 4/1 at 0205. (BS) XEQR (1030) Mexico City, heard nightly, rounds out BS's list of Mexicans this time. CMS reports that XEMC is apparently drifting badly. Has heard him all the way over in the police band. CMS also reports a new verie in from XEW. HH has added to his collection of Mexican veries with XEXX (1420). RJ reports that XEDF (790) didn't come on with his F/C the morning of 4/15. HS reports a verie from him giving the signer as Felipe Maldonado P., address as Box 99 Nuevo Laredo, Tams., or Box 87, Laredo, Texas. And that about does it for information about our southern neighbor this time.

BAHAMAS--Little to report from this one-station country except that many more of us are receiving our veries from ZNS (1540) Nassau. HH, RE, and PR added their veries this time. PJ also reports that he heard the recent special quite well, but that he already had ZNS's verie in his collection. Most of us have now heard and verified this country, I think.

GUANTANAMO BAY--More and more of you are making your editor feel sick about WGEY. Everyone but ye ed seems to have logged him. The veries are now coming in with RE, RA, and RJ all reporting them. RJ adds that the address was a little different than the one which had appeared in DX NEWS. It is Gilbert Esquerdo, JO2; AFRS-Station WGEY; Navy #115, Box 19; C/o FPO, New York, New York.

ALASKA--Let's turn our attention away from the tropics to the colder northland. BS has been having quite a time logging stations from Alaska. He reports WVCQ (1400) AFRS, Kodiak, logged from 0456-0502 on 3/30 through terrific QRM. Also heard them signing off on 4/13 at 0700. In addition he has logged AFRS-Adak (900) on 4/16 and 3/30. On 3/30 he was logged 0509-0547 through 4YC, while on 4/16 he topped 4YC. On 3/28 NM also logged Adak, and was quite surprised to hear them as far south. He logged him from 0400-0530 with a very good report. Alaskans are rare, even in the Western part of the US. Hope those of you out there will still have a chance to get Adak and WVCQ if they are still coming through. Go to it.

PUERTO RICO--Recent veries from this country are WXRJ reported by RA and WKJB reported by PR. CMS reports that the ACE special came in weakly but absolutely free from QRM. PJ reports that Puerto Rico is one of the foreign countries he will report to. Has a verie from WKJB, and has heard WKVM on 1070 Kcs., as well as WORA (1150), WCMN (1280), and WENA (1560), which he considers his best.

USS COURIER--Hardly a separate country, the Courier is now at anchor near Balboa, Canal Zone, and is operating KU2XAJ on 1510 Kcs. with a power of 50 Kw. Spanish is used exclusively and reports go to Box 2016, Balboa, Canal Zone. Program is mostly relays of the Voice of America, with some classical music on records, Spanish announcements. Heard by SM on 4/10 QSA-3 through WLAC/WMEX. Heard by RA on 3/19. Not heard here, although I have tried three evenings. (FV)

CUBA--Most Cuban information has apparently become old stuff to our foreign tuners. Only items reported this time are CMW (550) Havana, logged on 3/31 at 2006 by CMS. And a verie from CMQ reported by HS.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC--CMS has received a new official list from the Dominican government. Here are the corrections to the Mann log: HI8B has moved from 610 Kcs. to 1360 Kcs. HI3J has moved from 1330 Kc. to 1380 Kcs. HI5S has changed its call to HI6T and has changed freq. from 1360 to 610 Kcs. HI4B has changed from 1380 to 1330 Kcs., and they have changed location from La Romana to Santiago. HI3V has moved from La Vega to Bani. HI4C has moved from La Romana to San Francisco de Macores.

PANAMA--CMS also has a new Panama list with some corrections as follows: Call letters of the station on 660 Kcs. are now HOH36. The station formerly operating in David on 1455 Kcs. (H00C) is now deleted. New stations are as follows: HOU (1025) David; HOE91 (1210) Panama City H00C (1370) David; HPU28 (1540) Panama City; HOE35 (1570) Colon, and one on 1520 in Panama City which has not yet had call letters assigned. On 3/23 CMS logged HOLY (670) Panama City, at 2158. While he was listening, English was spoken, so the identification was positive.

EL SALVADOR--CMS logged YSU (1050) in San Salvador at 1945 with fair signals on 3/24. HH advises that he is still hearing YSEB (1075) in San Salvador, but he contends that there must be some delay in the mail service between here and there. It seems that he doesn't have his verie as yet. In view of the experience of the rest of us, he feels he is being slighted.

COSTA RICA--BS advises that he has heard TILS (880) San Jose, "Radio Para Ti" several times recently, and that they have a program directed to Guatemala, as he has heard Guatemala mentioned many times. He feels that this is the station both he and CMS have reported. TILS goes off at 2400 and has a rooster crowing before sign-off time. HH has reported TIDCR (625) San Jose, and he got them on 3/31 from 2236 to 2310 just in time for the contest. Difficult through WMAL, local on 630 Kcs., but enough for a fair report. On same date TIW (765), TIGPH (605) and TIHB (685) were all coming in well.

CURACAO--RM has interesting news for us this time concerning the station reported on 722 Kcs. He thinks that it is PJC2, "Julana Zonder" in Curacao. The latest WRH bulletin reports that they have shifted one of the SW transmitters to 722 Kcs. RM logged the station on 3/26 from 1928-2130 sign-off, but due to fading and terrific QRM wasn't able to get a single announcement. It was not, he is sure, a Spanish speaking station. Keep watching for this one. It will mean a new country on ECB if it really is PJC2.

Notes: This time it took two full pages to cover North America. Of course, this issue includes all information which has come in here since the 6th of April. As you can well see, there has been plenty. I am very glad to see that so many of you have continued DXing on into April. Somehow I just can't seem to keep the fires burning much after the end of March. Well, on to other continents.

SOUTH AMERICA

TRINIDAD--SM advises via postcard from Port-of-Spain, that "Radio Trinidad" is now testing a new 5 KW transmitter on 790 Kcs. It will soon replace their 2 KW job on 1295 Kcs. HH advises that he has now received his verie card from VP4RD.

BRAZIL--CMS took a last parting shot at the Brazilians before 3/31 when they left us again until next fall. on 3/24 he logged PRA6 (890) Sao Paulo at 0315. Then on 3/25 he logged PRA2 (800) Rio de Janeiro at 0315. On 3/25 PRH9 (840) Sao Paulo, was added at 0315. And to top it off he reports a verie from PRE-9.

CHILE--CMS is really going to town on foreign DX with this issue. He copied CBL14 (1140) Santiago at 2200 on 3/30.

ARGENTINA--CMS reports that he logged a station which he believes was LR3 (950) Buenos Aires. This was on 3/31.

PERU--On 4/3 CMS logged OAX4X (785) Lima at 2100. RA and HH also have Peruvian news. Both have received verie cards from OAX4A. HH also has his verie from OAX4X, which returned his reply card. The signer was Jose E. Cavero A. The QRA is "Radio Victoria", Paseo la Republica, Lima, Peru.

VENEZUELA--CMS reports a verie card from "Radio Caracas" YVKS on 750 Kcs. HH reports that a follow-up brought back a reply-card from YVKQ (1160). Verie signer was Felipe Garcia G.

EUROPE

FRANCE--Yep, Europeans still coming through in the East. Not France though, as our news is from HH who reports that Nice I has answered his follow-up. He sent follow-ups to Nice and to the Paris office. Both replied, so plenty of veries. This is for the 1554 Kc. transmitter. Hank says that Nice sent a friendlier letter while Paris used better paper.

PORTUGAL--On March 29th, reception of CSB-2 (1034) Parede, almost gave HH the shock of his life, but they were there all right. Heard 1847-1905 sign-off through WBZ trouble. Some American popular music with announcements in Portuguese. At 1900 a clock tolled off the hour of Midnight. Last five minutes was news. RM also heard Lisbon I on 719 Kcs. on 3/24 with popular music from 1835 to 1900, good signals.

GERMANY--HH reports that NWDR (1586) and SWF (1538) were both coming through near Midnight on 3/31. Actual program hard to follow due to QRM, but carrier was plenty good.

SPAIN--Madrid Arganda (737) was logged with news at 1645-1702 sign-off. Announced as "Radio Nacional de Espana" and at signoff man shouts "Viva Franco, Arriva Espana". This from RM.

ASIA

JAPAN--BS, our Japanese authority, has further reception to report from across the Pacific. New ones were JOQB (1030) Niigata weak on 3/29 at 0830; and AFRS-Osaka (1390) S-4-6 at 0755 on 4/16, but taken out by a US station coming on at 0800. Older ones still heard were JOBK (670) Osaka; JOBK (890) Sendai; JOBB (830) Tokyo; JOKR (1130) Tokyo; and JOOC (880) Obihiro. These were on 3/29, and are not coming through so well now. JOBK and JOBK were good until 0915. Then on 4/16 the following were heard; JOKR (1130) Tokyo good at 0600; JOAK (590) poor at 0600; JOAB (950) Tokyo, with good signal at 0630. AFRS Tokyo, good most of morning. AFRS-Sendai (1430) heard at 0645 under another station. And that about covers Japan for this month.

TAIWAN--On 3/29 a station in Chinese or Japanese was heard on 670 under JOBK from 0840-0900. Just before 0600 a tone preceded by 3 or 4 beeps was heard. Call was missed, but news started at that time. This was reported by BE who thinks that it must have been BED-2. Can anyone help him on this one at all?

KOREA--Art Cushen of the NZRDXL has a verie from "Radio Troubadour" operating one mile south of Inje in Korea. It is a part of the AFRS net used to broadcast to the United Nations troops in Korea. He heard i
