NORTH AMERICA

GUANTANAMO BAY--*--Can't stir up much here except that EC has now received his verie from WGBY. That should about cover them for this season.

MEXICO--*--EC reports veries from XEPH and XELG to help him round out his foreign contest effort. He also adds that he has reported to XEXO (1550) who is on until 0205 in the clear daily. CMS reports a verie from XEXO, so he verifies. FV reports a verie from XEHL (1010) in Guadalajara, Jalisco. VS is not plain, but looks like J. Muroint. Address is S. H. Calle 10, Num. 183, Aptdo 604. Slogan is Radio-difusoras de Occidente.

PUERTO RICO--*--EC adds to his verie total with a verie from ACE, one of the better ones your editor missed this season.

CUBA--*--CMS reports a verie from CMBZ and EC reports from CMHQ. CMS forwards a Cuban list issued in December, 1951, which we have not yet had time to carefully check. He says that the only change he has noted is that all Union Radio stations are now using the Havana address. This is Prado 152, 7° y 8° piso, Habana. We will check the list for further changes in time for the next bulletin.

COSTA RICA--*--RA reports that TIFC (995) was coming in on 7/1 and 7/2, comments on how well spilt signals were coming through on those two evenings.

GENERAL

Now that the first year of this column is almost up, your editor has a request or two to make, in order to prepare for the bang-up foreign season just ahead of us. First of all, please send your reports to me set-up as nearly like the column is set up as possible. Group all reports by country and continent. Use one side of the page only. I intend to cut your reports up so that countries can be grouped more easily, so please leave me enough space to work with. Will you please when reporting about a station give call letters, frequency, and location of the station, as many of these pages are written in hotel rooms where I do not have access to my complete file of lists. If you will all adhere to these instructions, it will make it a lot easier here to give you a really good Foreign column during the season to come.

We are going to plan to have a weekend contest sometime in December during which stations heard will count. Veries will not be necessary. We will all listen from Friday night to Sunday night and see how many foreigners we can hear. More about that later. It will be in addition to the regular contest and will not interfere in any way with it.

Now getting over to the poor percentage of return which many of you have experienced this past season from foreign reception. Many stations are not predictable. They verify for some and not others.

July 12, 1952

My own list of non-verifiers includes the following: CMCA-YSEB-CMBC-HJ CZ-XEQ-PRE7-PRG3-TIPG-ZBM. Not too bad a total, and some of these have verified for others. HH lists his non-verifiers as XEX-YVML-CMHW-YSABC-Guadeloupe-PRE7-PRA8-TGUX-HI3A-WRIO-YVMF-HJCI-HJAT-HJAQ-HJAC-HJKM-HJCN-PRA2-YSC-PRH2-CMGW. Any help on recent signers will be appreciated by Hank. RA lists his as follows: 2YA-2WL-4QS-PRA2-PRA8-PRA6-PRA9-PRB7-PRH7-PRG3-PRE8-PRE3-PRA9-HI3A-TIW-YVML-YVKC-HJAQ-HJ CZ-HJCN-HJCI-XEN-CMBD-CMCD-CMCX. He too would like any help from others that might be forthcoming. RA had a return of only 54% from foreign reports by definite check. His best was OAX4Y for the season. He is aiming to increase his total of 30 countries to 40 next season with principal targets in Europe and KFAR. He reports that HH is selling his NC-183 and is now using a ZENITH Trans-Ocean portable for DXing.

The New Zealand DX Times reports that the USA is planning other sister ships to go along with the USS COURIER. They note that four other ships will follow the COURIER. One sometimes has to go a long way from home to learn things about one's own country.

CMS sent in some notes concerning reception of stations in what he calls the medium wave band up around 2780 Kcs. He has also been hearing a continuous tone on 1580 Kcs. going out around 2300. He has thought it might be coming from Europe. Calls mentioned on 2780 Kcs. were DMV, DAT, and CNEL. He further comments that there are seven Dominican stations under construction on this band. Stan, you didn't say what type of service they will be used in. I think likely that we had best stick to the BCB (540-1600 Kcs.) in the future. I too have enjoyed a lot of DXing in the medium wave band, but I don't think it belongs in this column, so in the future, we will confine our doings to the BCB.

CMS reports two CW stations heard on June 5th between 1120 and 1130 Kcs. He didn't identify them, but is quite sure that they are not images or harmonics. Any information would be appreciated. I used to hear CW on my radio when I lived 2 miles from Rocky Point, N. Y. I finally identified it as a Rocky Point station whose transmitter was on a frequency almost the same as my IF frequency. This often happens, so if you get CW QRM check this as a possible source.

A late note from SM. Radio Trinidad is now operating on 670 Kcs. having moved from 1295 Kcs.

I believe that this brings up just about up to date on DX doings in the foreign section for now. We'll be back in August, and please send your reports in the future the way I outlined earlier in the column. Until August, then. 73

Release #2 Submitted by member E. Barry Foote.

"During the six months of April, May, June July, August and September, the so-called off season for Broadcast Band DX, DX doings and the exchanging of information of NRC members DXing on the Frequency Modulation (FM) Band, (88-108 megacycles) and the Television (TV) Band (Channels 2-13* shall be accepted and published in the Club's Publication 'DX NEWS' and will appear in 'Musings of the members' only. The members shall be permitted to use NRC stationery and report forms and mention that he is an NRC member at any time of the year when corresponding with an FM or TV station (Article 16). Mention of FM and TV Dxing shall be permitted during the other months (September to April) but only on a limited basis. At such time Broadcast Band DX information shall have priority and the Editor shall have sole right to exclude any FM or TV information in favor of the Broadcast Band. This item shall be valid for one year from time of acceptance. At the end of one year this item shall be accepted or rejected by vote of the Board".

Voting Yes R. Cooper, Wagner-- No, Johanns, Williams, Reilley, Stein, Brauner, E. Cooper. Kruse did not vote, VanVoorhees received too late. The motion did not pass.

Release #3 Submitted by Board member Johanns.

An addition to Article 8 a rule that had been inadvertently omitted in the last printing of the By-laws.

"No NRC member who holds an official position shall hold any type of official position in any other radio club during his NRC term of office. If such NRC officer is duly elected by another radio club and such member does not refuse such elected office, his term of office in the NRC will be considered automatically terminated. Such person should so advise the NRC Board Chairman of such action so that the vacancy so caused can be filled by the Board Chairman in appointing the next highest point member eligible to fill the unexpired term."

Voting Yes, Johanns, VanVoorhees, Reilley, Wagner, Brauner, E.Cooper--
Voting No, R. Cooper, Stein, Kruse, Not voting, Williams. Motion did not receive 2/3rds majority and did not pass.
