Hi, gang! Since I am a new member of the NRC I think some of you will want to know about me. I have been DXing since 1948 and have logged 1,180 stations with 430 verified. I first began verifying stations last year and am busy catching up on stations I have heard previously. I am 16 years old and am a licensed ham (W9NXL). I also belong to the NNRC but I joined the NRC to become more informed per week. Latest veries in are CKWI WPCF WBBL WBAP WKLJ WTAQ KWRE KWGB WRJN KJSK KMAJ WANE KXLY CKOY WCIL KMOX KOSE KGGF. Those out are WDUN KFAM KRMO WMDN WPNX WTCO KRMO KIMO WSOY WREC & KVOD. I see that the CPC has arranged 7 stations that I must add to my log. I would like to know more about the DX contests. KGGF's OE tells me that the station can't be heard 3 miles north of Coffeyville after they switch power and directions. WIMS & WTVB are both on at night now. WIMS beamed away from me and WTVB beams toward Winnetka. Noticed that Bill Prater has Tennessee verified 100%. For Tennessee has the poorest percentage of answers, with at least 10 overdue stations, about 9 more than any other state. Most of my veries come from the south. I have heard stations in every state except Vermont and Hawaii too. It is almost impossible to hear the east except in the early morning, around 4 a.m. At present I am verifying the big and the local stations. Have plenty of schedules and verie signers which are enclosed. Verie signers needed are WCDT WGNS WIRO KIWT WAGC WCBS WBML WATO WOPI KBOK KSWO KABR WNGO & WBSR. First of all my new catches have been YNVP-1000, Rabat II 1043, Lisbon I-719, WKVM-810, "Radio Noumea"-1500. Some "marine banders" of note are TIX-1690, YSX-1630 (these are beacons), KOB-38-1650, Sheridan Wyoming Police Dept., London, England Marine Radio-2340, Honolulu Airport-2860 (my farthest marine band catch). In response to the board release I sent Hal Williams a letter with a few ideas. One I would like to tell you about. I proposed that the second sentence of Article I read thus: "The purpose of this organization shall be the promotion of the hobby of DXing on all frequency bands except the short wave band (3,000-30,000 kc/s.) However the primary interest of the NRC shall be the Broadcast Band. Of course the present by-laws could be interpreted this way as I told Harold, not necessarily. With the above change the NRC would be assured of being able to keep up with any change or new development in radio and yet the Broadcast Band clause would give stability to the organization and assure that it will not rush headlong into something new. Further this clause will assure the NRC of remaining one of the top broadcast band organizations in the world. I don't know if I have run over the 30 line limit or not but I thought the matter was important and worth a little extra space if necessary. The DX season may have returned but so far I have not received a single verification this season. 73s.

Two new veries slithered in this past week for me - letter from WRSW (1480) Warsaw, Indiana, very plain, and a nice card from WSEB. Reception finally returned to good again on Tuesday morning, and prior to this, it was quite poor here. Monday mornings, which here-to-fore had been "harvest" mornings for me at the dials, are now a real trial, for images caused by that 4-alarm fire siren on WCBS together with the 50 kilowatt signals of WNEW, WJZ and WOR appear all over the dial. Frequencies blocked by them, besides their own channels, were 590 - 690 - 740 - 800 - 850 - 930 1150 - 1220 - 1240 - 1320 - 1370 - 1410 - 1430 - 1490 - 1540 & 1590 kc/s. Heard here early Monday morning on split channels were stations on 795 and 1358 which gave evidence of being Europeans. 795 faded down too low by around 12:35 a.m., as did 1358, which I believe could be Radio Tirana, Albania, now 50,000 watts, I understand. That would be a new country for me. CMBZ "Radio Salas" is drifting again, and now is almost on top of WHAS, seeming to be on 838 kc/s. Insights of the MembersDon Kaskey - 908 South 25 Street - Omaha, Nebraska

Logged only 3 this week, all on Sunday, Oct. 12. First was WTVH-1590 in Peoria signing off at 1:06 following news, then WOMI-1490 in Owensboro, Ky. sign off at 1:35. Last was WBIS-1440 Bristol, Conn. on DX. Program heard in entirety but loud buzz almost ruined it here. Veries over the same period came from WFEA-1370, WLOW-1400, WHOT-1490 and KOMW-680. Hope these come through all right, and we'll stick to these. News on the new International Log we are working on is that the Masters are all made on the South Pacific section. Looks as if it is still too early for much foreign DXing, for we haven't had too many reports. Please keep your reports grouped as to country, and use one side of the page only. Now for the DX news.

NORTH AMERICA

MEXICO--DD has noted XEN on 695 regularly with S-8 signals. Heard well around 2130, using tones for interval signal between announcements and station breaks. Power 5 Kw. Address is XEN, Brazil #25, Mexico City, D. F. DD also had XEX (730) Mexico City, with a dramatic program around 2145. XEB (1220) strong at 2230 with musical program. (DD)

COSTA RICA--DD is going to wonder why I put this item here. He has been hearing a station on 880 Kcs. with strong signal on 10/11. Logged 2145-2215 with good signal. He heard call as "Radio Munra" en Guatemala. Dave, this is TILS, San Jose, Costa Rica, announcing as "Radio El Mundo". They have a Guatemalan program in the evening which was reported in DX NEWS June 14 bulletin. Signs off at 2400 with a rooster crowing. (FV)

CUBA--DD logged CMBL (860) under heavy QRM at 2140.

EUROPE

GREENLAND--DD reports information from a short wave outlet here gives a BCB frequency of 633 Kcs. in Godthaab, announcing as "Goodthaab Radio" with 1 Kw. SW is 5964 Kcs.

AFRICA

UGANDA--Also from DD relaying from Art Cushen is the information that both broadcast and short wave services will be set up here in the near future. Will be constructed by BEC technicians. No call letters or frequency available yet.

ASIA

KOREA--From DD again we have the report that Pyongyang, North Korea announces use of 970 Kcs., as well as 1800 and 4400. Short wave outlets are heard around 0200-0800. Possibly 970 uses same schedule. NZ Times advises that Radio Homesteader changed from 1240 to 1230 Kcs. in June. Also that Far East Network stations in Korea are now on 24 hours a day. Complete list appeared in the August 16 DX NEWS.

OCEANIA

AUSTRALIA--Following are changes in Australia via the NZ Times. 2KM now 980 Kcs. 3TR (1240) now 2 Kw. 2LT (1370) now 500 w. 3CV (1470) now 1 Kw. 4MK (1380) now 2 Kw. 3CS (1130) soon to 2 Kw Day 1 Kw Nite. SM advises that he was able to take a log and report 2WL (1430) in Wollongong, still the best Aussie here in the east. Has 2 KW from latest list. RG asks about a Down-Under station heard on 790 Kcs. Bob, this is 4QG, Brisbane, Qsld. Has 10 Kw., and has been reported here in the east too.

NEW ZEALAND--RG also asks about a station heard on 800 Kcs. and announcing as 1--. Has a good log from 0430-0500, and was 100% readable for 20 minutes during that time. Faded out at 0500 announcement. Bob, this one is IYZ, Rotorua, New Zealand. Has 10 Kw, and address is Box 298. Latest VS is K. C. Collins, Stn. Mgr. IRC not necessary to get your verio. (This info from Jack Fox) This information will be in the new log when it comes out, but Jack advises that NZ government stations do not require IRC's to answer. They will verify all correct reports.

I still want your verio lists for the DX supremacy ratings by the second issue of November. I have just one so far. Refer to the NEWS of October 4th for complete information. And now from your editor to all of you, Let's have more reports.

This is the second edition of the TV DXer and despite the fact that the season for TV reception is waning the response to this new addition to DX News was very gratifying. Since NRCers will accept or reject this venture it will probably be interesting to note at this time a few of the comments that have come in. Pete Taylor writes from Duke University, Durham, N. C., "I was fairly gratified to see that TV DX is now part of the NRC. ."; Ens. Bob Duggan, Jr., USS Rowe DD564, FPO, N.Y. wrote, "Interested in the TV DX Column of NRC."; while Sid Rosenbaum wrote from Wheeling, W. Va., "Glad to see the NRC is catching the TV hobby in its infancy." My thanks to all of you who also sent along a "Good luck" nod of approval. A note of controversy crept into a couple of letters received here and concerned TV-DX vs FM-DX. The issue is not for me to decide fellas, and can only suggest the FMers take the matter up in a resolution to the Board of Directors for a FM section patterned after this column. But in accordance with the action of the Board in regards to this column, FM-DX will not be reported herein, only TV-DX items will be usable. Reviewing briefly the first edition of this column the log of Television Stations was courtesy E. Barry Foote and several of you fellows have promptly identified the Montreal outlet on Channel 2 as CBFT and Pete, the mystery of the Mexican listings on Channel 2 puzzled me also, but maybe Barry will drop me a line of explanation and we can clear up his listing next month. I have logged XEW-Television on Channel 4 several times and have seen their identification picture and they stated location as Mexico City, so XHTV Channel 4 is ? in my mind. Len Kruse send along some interesting facts he noted in Broadcasting Magazine for September 22nd issue to wit: Total TV stations on the air--110, 819 requests for CPs for TV received by the FCC, 60 TV CPs granted by the FCC since the freeze including 51 commercial and 9 educational stations, and estimated sets in use, 18,539,991. Len also reports the first commercial UHF TV station went on the air 9/20 and was KPTV, Portland, Oregon operating on Channel 27, so that gives you West Coast boys something to shoot for. Pete Taylor sent along a very comprehensive report of the TV situation in Europe but as the Haskett Brothers pointed out in their letter the system in use there is incompatible with the system in use here so will shelve that info for now with your permission. Now to some of your swell reports:

Bob Duggan: Additions to your list: Channel 8-WLTV Atlanta, Ga. A; WSAZ-TV Huntington, W. Va. Possibly you left out part of Channel 8. (Could be Bob, Hi. Ed) Out in the Atlantic we sometimes pick up Channel 13 on our air search radar (213 Mc.). We have picked up WATV and WAAM several times. (Hope to hear more from you Bob.)

Hal Wagner, RD #1, North Girard, Penna.: CBL-T seen and heard with test pattern on Channel 9 at 2 pm 9/9, Television service of the CBC in Toronto. (Thanks Hal, and yes, let's have that resume of your TV DX activity. Ed)

Pete Taylor: Looking over your list in the Sept. 12 issue, I find that the Montreal TV station on channel 2 is CBFT, modeled after CBLT in Toronto. CBFT has been operating regularly since 9/6; CBLT since 9/8. I saw the (some of it anyway) 2½ week testing of CBLT from my Grandfather's place in Oshawa, 30 miles East of Toronto. The station now uses 4 kw video & 2 kw audio. When their new 400-foot tower (in the middle of downtown Toronto) is completed, they will have 26½ kw video & 13½ kw audio. KECA-TV on channel 7 is ABC-TV, natch. If possible, you should * the ones with coaxial cable service (or the ones without) which would in many cases help, as to network shows. I visited the Canadian National Exhibition; CBLT was televising daily from there. From Oshawa, I believe Toronto & Cleveland are both in a straight line. WKEL could usually be seen interfering with CBLT. WTVJ-#4 is now hooked up to the cable, and live shows started going there July 1. Is KOTV-#6 Tulsa any relation to WVOO? I have read that KVOD-TV Denver is due to go on the air on 9/29 this year, and that KDEN, Channel 26 will be on by Thanksgiving. What channel is KVOD-TV?

Here is a log of stations (TV) I have logged from one of our 3 places! From Miami: WTVJ-4, CMQ-TV-6. That's all! From our farm, 45 miles west of Washington, in the Plains, Va. 2-WCBS, WVAR, KPRC-TV; 3-WPTZ, WTMJ; 4-WNBW WGAL-TV WMBT WVAR-TV; 5-WTTG WABD WSAZ-TV Huntington, W. Va., left out, now 85 kw, world's strongest; 6-WTVR WFL-TV; 7-WMAL-TV WDEL-TV; 8-No; 9-WTOP-TV WOR-TV; 10-WCAU-TV; 11-WBAL-TV; 12-No; 13-WAAM WJAC-TV. From Oshawa, Ont., Canada-2-WJBK-TV; 3-WDTV WKZO-TV; 4-WBEN-TV WJW-TV WNBK-TV; 5-WSYR-TV WNEWS; 6-WHAM-TV WJIM-TV; 7-WXYZ-TV; 8-WHEN; 9-CBLT WKEL; 10 and 11-No; 12-WICU WBBF-TV; 13-WKTV WJAC-TV. I have also seen from either NY, Durham, or stops in cities, these; (also Chattanooga): 2-WSE-TV WEMY-TV; 3-WBTW; 4-WBRC-TV WMBR-TV WMCT

(Thanks Pete and let me keep hearing from you. Re KVOO-TV Len Kruse's card had this item from Broadcasting: "KBTV (TV) Denver, Col. (Colorado Television Corp. /KVOO/, vhf Ch. 9)" under their column of Call Assignments. And as far as I know KOTV and KVOO have no known connection with each other. Touraide Headquarters where I work was originally located in Denver and several of the ex-Denverites were back there in recent months and only report seeing KFEL-TV on the air and on Ch. 4. Their transmitter is atop Lookout Mt., the site of Buffalo Bill's grave, about 10 miles west of Denver proper. Ed)

Bill Moser, Uniontown, Penna.: WJAC-TV Johnstown, Pa. is now operating on Channel 6 with 70 kw. Only 1 day of testing preceded the switch which took place 10/4. On 9/9 WJBF-TV was seen from 0953 to 1023 EDT on ch. 12. 9/10 a station on ch. 13 (not WJAC-TV who s/on at 0900) was carrying "Today" at 0610. Think it was WKTV but had to leave for school before 10. 9/13 all Cleveland, Columbus, and Detroit stations SEEN. WXEL reported and has not verified. My receiver is a Magnovox MV72, 17 inch picture tube, 24 tubes. Antennas are all channel double stacked Yagis, antenna cut for Ch. 3 directed NNW. Double stacked 7-13 Yagi directed NE. (Okay Bill. Be looking for more reports from you. Sorry about the FM material not being used, explanation reverse side. Did not use the v/signer list due to limited space. Ed)

Pat Reilley, 11 Irvine Place, Jamestown, N.Y.: The wife wants me to thank you for the list of TV stations in Sept. 12th DX News. Here is a funny one. . . A few weeks ago, I had a new Super 10 Yagi put up on the house and a new Admiral TV set brought in to try out. I've had an old 10" Capehart set for a number of years, so I took the old set into the barn, drove a pipe into ground, took an old bench the old lady (this for you single bucks is standard term employed by ALL married males in referring to their spouses, continue Pat. .Ed). . . took an old bench the old lady used for her tubs in cellar, drilled a hold through the bench and put it over or down over the pipe, put the old antenna over the pipe, hooked up the lead-in and put it into barn to set, then turned the set on and went out and turned the antenna by hand in different directions. Both are beamed towards the two local transx. That about wraps up the TV-DXer for October but before we close out this month's stencils I'd like to compliment the Haskett Brothers for the splendid log they enclosed.
