

THE TV DXER Edited by Hank Ward, 404 North 14th, Fonca City, Oklahoma

Last month's TV DXer had nearly a hundred CP Grants from the FCC. Just what does a city contemplating Television expect of its new station, a city that is that is not what is considered an entertainment center? The answer to that can be noted from one such station. WTAR-TV in Norfolk, Virginia. A look at their statistics should be of interest to everyone of us and to get this month's edition of this column underway I thought it would be fitting to quote their information bulletin.

GENERAL STATION INFORMATION

WTAR-TV is licensed to operate on Channel 4, frequency 66-72 megacycles, with effective radiated power of 24,248 watts video and 12,124 watts audio. Studios, transmitter and offices are located at 720-724 Boush Street, Norfolk, in a new radio-television center building. The antenna tower is directly behind the building, rising to a height of 367 feet above average terrain, with an overall height above ground of 400 feet. The new building, containing 432,000 cubic feet of operation space, has a main television studio 35 by 50 feet; with a 25-foot coiling, an adjoining auditorium studio of similar size complete with stage, dressing rooms and clients! viewing Iounge on a rezganine, and seating for 100 persons. In addition, there are a film projection room, 'eveloping laboratory, library, and all other necessary facilities for producing live hows. The main television studio is so arranged that automobiles can be driven diectly from the street into the studio for televising. There also is a large open air television studio on a commodious deck which will be used for outdoor and garden sets. Good signal strength is reported up to and beyond an area within a radius of approximately 50 miles of Norfolk. It is estimated that 778,700 persons-192,000 familieslive in the area served by WTAR-TV.

TECHNICAL EQUIPMENT

FOR REMOTE TELECASTS—WTAR-TV has an RCA Mobile Unit equipped with two Image Orthicon cameras, micro-wave transmitter and receiver and associated sound facilities so that events in the Norfolk area may be picked up and televised.

POR STUDIO PROGRAMS—The station has two RCA Image Orthicon cameras mounted on dollies, complete Television Associates controllable lighting system, become microphone equipment, etc. There is a workshop for construction of sets and props and ample storage space.

FOR FILM AND SLIEE PROJECTION—Equipment includes two 16mm RCA-TP 16C projectors, an Eastman 35mm slide projector, an Iconoscope camera chain and one spare Iconoscope camera. A Bell and Howell 16mm camera, complete with lens equipment is used for silent movie production. Slides, cards and posters will be produced for clients on a cost basis.

FOR TRANSCRIPTIONS—HTAR-TV has RCA equipment to handle vertical and lateral 33 1/3 and 78 RPM transcriptions.

PROGRAMMING

An interconnected station, as an affiliate of NBC, CBS and ABC, WTAR-TV carries a heavy schedule of those networks.

A number of local studio programs are in production, including a ventriloquist, disc jockey who illustrates songs, vestern music, a fashkurreview and a sports show. All of these are available on a participation basis and additional information will be furnished when requested.

WTAR-TV has full leased wire service of the Associated Press, the INS Telenews Service, its own news staff for local coverage, and access to news and pictures from its affiliate, Norfolk Newspapers, Inc., publishers of the Norfolk Ledger-Dispatch, evening, and the Virginian-Pilot, mornings and Sundays.
