# \_regarding\_the\_nrc\_dx\_contest.\_

The District of Columbia, Northwest Territories and Yukon Territory are all eligible as areas in the contest.

A Special NRC DX counts for five (5) bomus points. If it is the first station you verify in its particular area, it counts one (1) point for being the first in the area, plus five (5) because it was an NRC special. If it is the second station you verify in the area, it counts three (3) points for being that, and five (5) more because it is an NRC DX. If it is neither first nor second station in an area, then it counts a straight five (5) points.

We will publish the prize list as soon as it is received, also a rule change as soon as the official results of the Board of Directors' action is published.

We wonder if any of you would remember the New York Radio scene in 1922, when there were these stations in New York: WOR, WWZ, the Wanamaker's Dep't Store outlet: WBAY (later WEAF and now WNBC) operated by A.T.& T., WJZ, owned by Westhinghouse, WBS, New ark, operated by D.W.Nay & Co. who manufactured batteries; WHN (now WMCM) Ridgewood, N.J., WHW, Tarrytown, N.Y. an experimental outfit: WBAW owned by the Wireless Telephone Corp., Paterson, W.J., WAAT Jarsey City and WAAM Newark, operated by I. R. Neilson, Newark, manufacturers of generators and motors. All operated on 360 meters and at the same time! With the prevalent static too, this was quite a cacophony! At that time Bloyd's of Lendon issued "static insurance" to American radio stations!

My antenna here at home is only a 20 ft. V from the back corners of the house to the fence. It is my best town logging. I wish I could do all my DX this way without having to travel to my location, about a 35 mile trip just to DX. Have also reported Guam (660) signing off at 0219 (1400 GMT). Veries have been very good, 3 of my best all on the one QSL card and a new country at that. Yes, South Africa with Johnnesburg 1034, Capt Town 656, and Durban (566) Kes. Others DZRB, DZRI, Cairova (1457), Timissora (755) last two in Romania; VOA-Okinawa, 1180 and AFRS Okinawa 810 (Another country). WTAL, KTNH, KGAL, KPOL, WPKY, WXRF for #10 in P. R., Manteh 800, SWM, ZBW, CMKB, 6KY, CX6, TIDER, JOLK, 4AN, KXRO, DZAQ, 4XB36, Victnam 1360 Kes, I Kw. (Sounds like Ken is doing cuite well. What a varied list of DX stations.)

John, I send return postage with all of my overses reports, even the ones which seem quite obviously not to regulre it. I usually send an IRC with my original report. However, when I send a follow-up I generally send my own reply card with the correct postage stamp or stamps already on. I get them from a local stamp dealer. They rarely cost more than an IRC and have usually brought results. They would probably work better in the first place, but I hate to bother the dealer with my requests which are quite definitely not in the stamp collecting line. This might be a hint to some of you who are having some trouble getting the veries back.
