However, the supreme efforts of the CPC has drawn out a few comments as well as sincere appreciation for their efforts, as well as yours, Fred's, Pop's and the many others who all have put so much time and patience into this top-flight DX vehicle. Please accept my hundle and sinceres admiration and thanks. Was surprised to note Conley's thunderstorm on the WCTA DX. Shucks - I thought it was right over this neck of the woods. WGTA surely signed off suddenly at 2:20 exactly as Moser commented. They had a strong signal but the barrage of static was terrific. YSDF DX was rather tough through CACB. WLFH not needed here but tuned in and it was odd the way WNOR gave way to WITH, then WISP before WIFH struggled to the surface at 2:55 with that youthful voice giving out with the news. His account of the barn that was burning in Peru, N. Y. was good copy. Couldn't hear much after that. 4VIM also tough; local QRN worst in a year or so. WEFP surprised me with his sock. The competition was not lessened any in 1950 when KOOL owner Gene Autry, old-time CBS star, took the lucrative Columbia affiliation away from KOY. Whon, a year later, both stations applied for the same television channel, it looked as though they would bettle it out through longthy and costly hearings before the Federal Commissions Commission. And they were in a hurry to get on the air; one outlet was already operating, and two more were applied for. Barly this year the two rivals got together in a series of meetings, the KOOL and 10Y executives seeing autry in Hollywood or estching him between planes in Thoenix. The outcome: they decided to join forces and ask the commission if they could share Channel 10. The FCC approved the marriage in day; and last month KOY-KOOI-TV went on the air, the first shared-time orderation in television where the participants also sharo the some studies. *** One week KOY opens the telecasting day at 4 rene. runs to 8 o'clock, and then turns the operation over to 2001, which continues until midnight. The next week the process is reversed. This schedule quickly led the citizens to refer to both stations as being "now and then on Channel 10." It also led the announcers, who work for both stations, to worry about saying the wrong call (KOY and KOCL contd.) letters during the wrong hours. So far, it hasn't happened.
"If we're in doubt," one said, "we simply start with 'KO' and take a quick look at the slide that's on the air."

THE FOLLOWING MAY BE OF HELP TO YOU WRC'ERS WHO ARE HAVING TV INTERFERENCE TROUBLES: Mike Farguson, University of Mouston, Mouston 4, Texas: I noticed your remark about TV interference and thought I might be able to help. I had the same trouble until I shielded my lead-in. But since I did that, I have had much better luck while the TV set is on. I simply got about 40 feet of shielded wire and ran it up as high as it would go on my lead-in. Then I grounded the lead-in shield and, of course, grounded the set. I have no more than I inch of the aerial wire unshielded inside the house. And the TV trouble has been cut way down. Of course, there is a little noise left, expecially feed back thru the line, but most of the TV interference here was of the radiated variety, and this surely did help. (Thanks for the info, Mike. Unfortuately here I have interference from the meighbors sets too, and I in afraid it would be rather a project to work over the 8 or 10 odd antenna systems on neighboring omes, but perhaps some of the fellows who are having trouble within their own homes can make good use of your findings. Hank)

OTE: During a newscast December 6th, it was announced that 75% of the people of the United States have television available to them through the facilities of 319 television stations!

THE KEYT STORY: Television as it rapidly matures has presented problems that have at times defied solving by similar previous examples. You've seen others in the W Dier. This month we'll let you in on the KEYF story in case you haven't heard it before, and our thanks again too, to Bernie Duffy who forrets out the unusual for mis column. It all started back in August. Scens that because of cortain geograhical populiarities. South Barbara residents have always been able to receive with durity telegasts from Los Angeles, despite it being 100 miles away. Than the FCC ssigned a channel to Santa Larbara and a syndicate headed by actor Ronald Colman milt a \$500,000 station. The city's 2,000 set-owners screemed that their one and only local station seriously interfered with the recordion of the seven Los Angeles potions. Owners of MAYT pointed to their investment of \$500,000. The 8,000 setowners said theirs was 40,000,000. KMT quickly set up a forum program on the subject on the third day of operation. In its first week KETT received 1,360 letters und 1,051 mono colls, with about 105 consisting of interference complaints. Serricomon at Tirst domarded that the city council ask the FCO to shift KETT to another mouncl. The Council deferred action. The WEYT transmitter is located 16 miles forthwest of Santa Berbara. The site was picked so the signal would hit the back side of antennas tuned to the Los Angeles transmitters atop Mt. Vilson, 100 miles to the South. KEYP than took several store to meet the problem. It used traps on' sclocted locations to show that the interference could be met in this way. Affilistod with all four ty notworks, it incked the schedule with network programs and intalled a microwave link to rick up network programs live from Mt. Wilson. Developent and Research Lab., local equipment firm, turned out a ch. 3 wave trap that is mid to work in a majority of installations. According to data supplied the FCC, which is testing the trap, it is a simple full-section constant-K T-Type band-rejecion filter attenuating all frequencies between 61-66 mg. Other devices used by distances ranged from scotch-tape wrouging around lead-ins near receivers to homeada coil sadgets and stratogically placed scrooning. CBS-Columbia demonstrated secoivers in the city, claiming they seperated cas. 2, 5 and 4 without difficulty. The situation is "all quiet" now, according to MITT, with an average of one complaint i day. REYT said published stories about the interference were greatly exaggerated, mough concelled the problem was serious at first, and set sales were affected tenprorily. As Tel Lewis would say, "Is everybody happy?" Hi. End, LEYT story.
