Information from KENNETH MAYLATH

This program had originally been planned for another date, but since WGAR went all night, it was re-ser for this Monday morning, so that WFRN might have a clear channel for their test. Most undoubtedly need this namely-DXed station, so this will give us a grand chance of catching WFKN. This station is about 12 years old, and let's all be sure to get 'em!

Mr. Nelson is an old friend of DMers everywhere, and at one time or another has ewned eight different radio stations. He is also a licensed "ham" operator. At present he owns WHIP WAYN and WPRT. Mr. Ed Stanton, who did a DM-Test for us not so long agefrom WHIP will conduct this program over new WPET which just about everyone needs. So let's be sure to tune in.

This station was born back in September of 1950, but scant few DKers seem to have logged KAVE. Here is a golden opportunity to do so, but CJOB's new all-night Monday morning schedule will be troublesome to some. Given good conditions, though, KAVE may reach the East Coast, so let us all give a really good try for this seldom-heard station in California.

If you want a really beautiful letterhead, then give a real good try for KRIR, for theirs is a beauty. Same as for KAVL, CJOB will be on, and again we hope they'll break through to the East Coast. The first 15 minutes of this program is the regular frequency check of KFIR but they're staying on later to give all a better chance to log the station more easily.

This daytime station will stage a \frac{1}{2} hour test program immediately following their regular frequency check. Mostly popular music will be used on this test, expected to be on a clear channel, coast to coast. Here's a chance for you all, during the wee early morning hours, to have your KOF-E! The calls were changed early this year from KBKH. Good reception

"The World's Largest Amphibious Station" (which will be explained on the program) will conduct a special DN-Test, with an old friend, Pfc Thomas Cooper (Dick's son) at the microphone. He'll be there, from Cherry Pcint, where he is a member of the Marines. Tom used to be at WACB and WHIE. They may extend the show to 3:30-5:30. We hope all hear WLAS & Tom

This is the second in a series of three programs for the National Radio Club. If you did not hear last week's show, then by all means try this time, and don't forget, if you want any requests, either for yourself of some other member, just drop hr. Cole a card. He changed the time for this show so as to avoid interfering with KFIR's DX. Join in the fun!

Member Kenneth Maylath advised us that WEOL told him they were to put on a DX program at the time stated in our "DX Caleniar" and he wrote them for more information. We have heard no details at all on this program, and it just might be that it is for the Newark News Radio Club, but let us all try for this directionalized station on, we hope, a clear channel.

This information was received too late by Hank Holbrook to notify DX NEWS: On Nov. 30, either HOX, 940 kc/s., or HP50, 730 ke/s, or both, were on a special DX for N.R.C. from 4:00 to 5:00 a.m. More details will be found on Page 10 in a special communique from Hank Holbrook.
