REVISION OF OUR APRIL ISSUES

Executive Secretary Harold Wagner calls our attention to the fact that even though the Board of Directors of the National Radio Club voted to change the publication dates for weekly "DX NEWSes" from October 1-March 31 to October 15-April 15, and, accordingly, we omitted one week in October, a five-Saturday month. We also had five Saturdays in December, and there are five in this month of March, so if we publish three April issues, we'll have 35 issues instead of the prescribed 34, so we will change the former announcement of April dates to this: APRIL 14 and APRIL 28. Here is a summary of the past few weeks' DX activities. The Specials that I needed that were scheduled for 2/13, namely, WESK-1490 and WTOE-1470, were both easily logged. WCPA needed but apparently not on. KLGR logged along with WESK for a new one but not much for a report. 1490 is really hashed up here. Finally took the time to log KPOP and nice verie card has been received. On 2/16, was surprised to find KSYD-990 from 7-7:15 p.m. practically in clear for new log. Sunday morning, Feb. 19 brought me four new ones on s/ons. The new WSYL, Sylvania, Ga., 1490, signed on at just before 6:00, and got a ten minutes log. It has been with a good deal of inner amusement that I have watched Lefty's and Len's concern about NRC members' reporting to CPC programs and not stating that they are members and now, their concern about those NRC members not enclosing return postage. Fellows, you read Article 11 of our by-laws which states that it is mandatory for a person who states he is an NRC member to enclose return postage and you will know why certain members do not say so in their reports to the stations. I first saw this problem in 1952 when the engineer at WGBY, Guantanamo Bay, complained about a post card reporter. I got a sympathetic ear from the Board and that was about all. I know most of these fellows, having met them at Conventions, and I like them, but, one must think of the stations' reaction, after seeing the names of these members in the muses, contest standings, etc. and then get a postal card report or a letter without return postage from them. Personally, I believe having them as members, or at least in allowing their names to appear in the bulletin is doing the Club more harm than the rest of us can rectify. One consolation, their reputation is becoming known. Most of the old timers who wrote me after my editorial on the reports to 4YZ correctly named the post card reporter mentioned. If CPC Chairman Sid Rosenbaum approves my request that the CPCmen contact the stations they arranged DXes from two weeks after the DX, asking about results, names and addresses of non-NRC reporters, those NRC members who sent in faulty reports or did not enclose postage will soon be known by the entire membership instead of just a few of the officers as now. Guess there are "free-loaders" in every organization. Not much in the line of DX here. Still working second shift and not much chance to listen. Will be back on day shift April 2 and should get some evening split frequency DX in then.

Veries are WORD WKAL WFVA WQBC, and still have 44 reports out yet and 28 of these were for NRC DXes. 3/12- No KCOV, WSPB or CKSF heard here at all. 1240 had an oper carrier AN. WROV and WCPA DXes heard here for dupes. 3/13- WGIG, 1440 at 3:49. KAUS, 1480, test, for new one as they never answered two other reports. 3/14- Too tired and too noisy to DX long. 3/15- Noisier than yesterday. 3/16- WINN, 1240, sounds like AN. Very noisy again today. 1490 has had unknown TT on for several days lately. 3/17- KTLN, 1280, atop WTCN at 3:40 with NX. WDRC, 1360, AN with sto warnings. Pacific Coasters all good today. Unknown tester on 1270 at 4:10, voice very weak when he announced. Sounded like WTLS but no call like this here. 3/18- KJAN-dx heard OK but hard to copy because of CAU slop-over. I am sorry to state that I have no new loggings to report this week. I had to miss all of the swell specials on 3/12 because of being at work until 6 a.m. and all were needed and I believe that I could have logged all with the exception of KCOV. Of the ten specials listed for 3/18 and 3/19, only four are needed - WJON CJCS KPPC and KVMC but as I will be home I'll be trying for all of them. Nice article by Norm Maguire in the 3/10 issue. I noted that I droppee from eighth to 14th in the Contest but I'll try to get back in the top ten soon. On 3/14 WHNC-800 Henderson, N.C. copied at s/on 6:30, clear for a half hour. They never verified my 1953 report so another sent. 3/16- WSPN-900 Saratoga Springs, N.Y. heard on f/c 12:00-12:15. Veries for the week are a handwritten letter from WKAL for NRC DX. As this report was not mailed until 3/7 and the verie received 3/12, it is the quickest this season for a DX program. That was verie #102 from New York. Pennsylvania with 118 and New York with 102 are the only ones with 100 or more veries. North Carolina, Florida and Tennessee are next with 70, 66 and 65 respectively. 3/15, two letter veries - WKIX for NRC DX and WQOK for RS, both using their old letterheads for WNAO and LAKE Nuts. WKIX also sent a picture post card of WNAO - Nuts again. 3/16, nice letter from WORX-1270 with a Scripto retractable pen and a swell letter from the PD of WSPN Real veries, hi, and the last verie of the week from WQSN-1450 who stated that the month of March is a trial month for the "Night Watch" program. Let's hope that when the trial is over the verdict will be negative, hi. Starting the DX Season as of Sept. 1 I had a total of 1,512 veries and I have picked up 96 on the way, four from 1949, one from 1951, three for 1952 and 12 for 1954. This is my first report to the "Musings" since becoming a member over 14 months ago. Guess you've just shamed me into writing, and I'll try my best to write as often as possible. First, I had better give a short resume on my DXing. Have been DXing since 1929 and verifying since February, 1930. My heard log is 2,565 in 33 countries, with 2,333 verified as of today in 30 countries. Since 1947 I have been using a Hammarlune HQ-129-X, with an indoor antenna. Veries since March 1 number 15 as follows: 1060-WRCV, 1480-WAGR, WJUN-dx, 1380-KJET, WEGA-dx KBIA-dx 570-KGRT, 730 KOPP, WDCF-dx, 1470-WAAG, 1440-WQOK, WKAL-dx, 1450-WQSN, all letters, and 1310-WFCR, 900 KFNW, cards. KOPP's verie states they are changing their call to KKOG, as they are "a cog in the wheel that makes Ogden grow." WQSN noted they are on AN seven days and hope to do so indefinitely. As to new DX since March 1 added the following: 3/3- WMAX 1480 TT 3:18 to 3:30 as per club tip, KBIA 1580 good through QRM 3:32 to 4:06, for two new. WLEE 1480 testing at 4:01 but not needed. 3/5- WQSN 1450 AN new, plus three DXes, WHXY badly QRMed at times, but mostly good, WTAC very weak and splashed by WIP 610. WKAL very good. Nothing from WVIM or WIKB due to WCAU's warm-up carrier. They are only about two miles from me and their 50 kilowatts really mess up 1200 to 1230 completely. The evening of 3/5 was excellent for IAs. Got a good log on PJA5 1435 from 8:08 to 8:30 and added HJKC 840 who was S-3 on top with no sign of WHAS. 3/6, again all IAs. Took logs on CMHU 720 and CMCA, 730, both new for me. Didn't get up for 3/12, as CKSF was the only one needed and as WCAU puts that carrier on by 4:15, there was little hope anyway. 3/24, got ID on BOS 1600, but not enough for verie as WWRL too much for them.
