Then, upon playback, this tone activiates the Seeburg and stops the tape. At the end of the record, 1 8/10 esconds of silence activiates the tape machine. This allows us, a small staff, to have announcers at any time of the day that we desire. This very successful model was designed and constructed by Gilbert Hose, C.E. at KFXD, Nampa, Idaho."
