I have used this 183-D receiver nearly seven years and every time that I have had to use headphones I have been burned up. Maybe "impedance is not critical" for a fellow who wants to listen to a ball game. But a DXer wants a stethoscope, not a muffler. Tried everything, results negative. Then I bought a pair of 11 ohm "American Bell" phones from Allied Radio and I sure got something. Loud signals are readable with audio against the pin at O. Fairly good signals are about right with RF at 5 or 6 and AF at about 1/3 of one, on the 1-10 scale knobs. No need of a reading on the S meter for perfect copy. Set is light, comfortable, uses the standard plug and costs the huge sum of two bucks. I think that this would be perfect for any National receiver which I have ever tuned, Zenith TO, and likely any set where the jack was hooked to the transformer instead of the plate circuit, or any set with pp audio. 4/13 WDCR DX was at least as gool as WIRY through WRIT but all that I could copy was the frequent IDs, etc. Did they read titles?

Eight new loggings to my DX Log. Station KIMB-1260 Kimball, Neb. was heard on 4/1 from 2:10-2:20 a.m. with a f/c-TT. Then on 4/3 the f/c from Station WZEP-1460 De Funiak Springs, Fla. (ex-WFMM) was heard from 3:00-3:15 a.m., well over AN KENO. Then on 4/5 the brand new station with ETs was Station KINT-1590, El Paso, Taxas, heard from 3:20-5 a.m., with heavy interference from AN WAKR.
