Sorry fellas. Is there a new FBIS out since January 1959? As fas as counting veries from different locations may want to count "old" veries a while - but I found a new list necessary and more practical. In '55 when I moved from Chicago to near Milwaukee I counted all previous (though few) foreign DX but not the toughies like Chicago's 1240 daytimes, Local WEMP-1250 passes only WEDC evenings. I consider a 100 mile move as quite incondequential. That's my personal view - how do you other DXers view the matter? Faith for DXer who reports to TIFC 4VEC HCJB etc., but boys, check your veries. My '58 report to HCJB-700 came back a SWBC QSL, over here a Monte Car@ report brought back a QSL with wrong date and no frequency - that is, other than the DE and BCB on front. Radio Vatican verified by card 15290 kc/s. (19.63 m.) instead of my 1529 kc/s. (or 196.3) logging. Stations like Austria, RIAS and Radio Alger have perfectly specific cards. Also I have the newly famous "London calls the world" card with X marked "Your report was in accordance with our published schedule" - note, published. I wrote to Cyprus to verify 719 kc/s. This QSL is only as good as the check made on the report and DXers' integrity. I count it, but influential SW DXer Ken Boord doesn't. Another correction, Fred's 3/26 column: Communist German at Erfurt (half as far away from me as Milwaukee to Chicago) is positively on 692, first logged 11/1/59, and is included in 1/1/59 FBIS as 20 kw., not too new. Recheck on an Army Collins proves to me my radio was 1052 (dual 1484). Tripoli and Benghazi according to Lars Ryden of Kallhall, Sweden. 1960 World Radio Handbook lists these. Program was for Ramaddan, for 30 days from February 28 in '60 and 30 from 2/17 in 1961. Final for Lefty and you other old timers, I'd rather foul up DX-wise than be unlucky in love! Boy, I miss Wauwatosa, Wisconsin! 73 from the Danube DXer.
