It was nice to read the September 17th issue of DX NEWS telling about the enjoyable White Plains Convention over the Labor Day weekend. On Sunday, September 18th, I had a very thorough three-hour tour of the Collins Radio Company in Cedar Rapids during their "open house" thanks to Bob Gorsuch. Since my last report I have added four new stations to my DX Log. On 9/11 Station WGRC-1580 Green Cove Springs, Fla. on with Hurricane Donna. Then on 9/12 Station WTTC-1550 Towanda, Pa. on with their RS at 4:00 a.m. Then on 9/17 I heard a test from WSOQ-1220 North Syracuse, N.Y. (formerly WJMK) at 2:20 a.m., and the fourth logging was on 9/20 when Station WIXK-1590 New Richmond, Wis. was ETing, and heard yet on 9/24 with more tests. During the several mornings when Hurricane Donna was threatening various areas, a number of stations were heard, but only one new one added as noted above. I did not these were on AN: WGTO WGIG WBIL WKWF WWPF along with many more. Only two verification letters received of late, and these came from WOKK and WAAP.

I am a new member and I rank way below average in DXing. I keep mostly to the pace of members such as Len Kruse, Tom Mann. These and others are N for Normal. Ones like Hank Holbrook are "way out." Although I am new at this I have the following to report: Got interested in the field when I heard two years ago on my grandmother's radio WBAY Green Bay when they were talking about the riot of the World Series Milwaukee Braves' fans over in Milwaukee. Since then I have done many little things. You might be interested to know that on the first day of Spring 1958 KRNK had a test at 2:05 CST for about 23 hours. RS at that time was s/off at 12:00, KRNK, 1460 kc/s. Just recently I passed by WJWL in Georgetown, Del. and I told them at WJWL-990 that I had them in Baltimore. They said they're not supposed to cover that area. After that they sent me a coverage map with some other stuff of which the coverage map showed a coverage of a 50 mile radius. Incidentally if anyone hears an auction, that's they for you see the chicken auctions pay for their bread and butter. They have only one antenna and is located in a white building next to the State Police barracks on U.S. 113. After that I logged them and received v/1 from them. Just recently I sent a tape to WLCY-1380. It was the night of Hurricane Donna. I use a cheap National # NC-60 and an AM-FM Wards Airline 1959 model, with a long wire on AM which is 12' high and 30' long and an indoor rabbit-ears for FM. WLCY not verified yet.
