MUSINGS OF THE MEMBERSAnthony F. Lagatutta, ETNSN, Operations Radio Lab - N.A.S. - Norfolk, Va.

Well, well, well. Greetings to all NRCers out there. Yes, it is I again and I am still very much alive and quite conscious of this DX world about me. Since my last report a long time ago a lot of things have happened. Navy life is still treating me very good. Exactly two weeks ago today, I arrived here in the great land of Norfolk. I consider myself quite lucky as I will be working at the Radio Lab at the air station and this is shore duty. About a month ago I completed Electronics Technician, Class A School out at Great Lakes, Illinois. DX was good out there, but with a lot of studying todo, I did not find much time for same. Ever since I found out that there were good DX places outside New York City, I wanted to live around this area or near N.C. Well, I guess my childhood dream finally came true. Now to DX. My receivers down here are a Zenith #780, eight transistors (including RF stage) and my six year old Crosley five tube portable. DX in the last two weeks here netted the following: WMGM-1050, WQXR-1560, WRCV-1060, WBPD-1580, WKTX-1600, WKWF-1600, WGIG-1440, ZNS-1540, 4VEH-1040, WVAM-1430, WKBW-1520, WWDC-1260, WBZ-1030, WFBG (found to be on 1290), WADO-1280, Radio Swan-1160. These were heard at twilight or in the evening. Of special notice are WKWF seemed to be a great catch when I first heard them, but it seems to be a regular nightly affair. If Radio Swan on 1160 is only 50 kw., it sure is a mighty antenna system they must have. A couple of nights ago, reception was quite poor, yet they were coming in as though they were only across the bay, like a local. Daytime DX is great but it is severely limited in the barracks so I like to take my receiver down to the waterfront so I can utilize the effects of the directional antenna. Best daytime DX so far is WPRO-630, WOR-710, WIP-610, WHP-580, WVCH-740, WNEW-1130, WKEN-1600, WKSB-930, WJWL-900, WCBS-880, WHLI-1100, and WNBC-660. There are many more good ones but I have not heard them yet. Here in the lab, they have a beautiful SP-600 which I get to DX on sometimes and a lot when I really want to. 73s.

A few brief DX sessions failed to produce anything new, but expect to get back in the groove with the ending of E.D.S.T. Pre-sunset and twilight DX will soon be at peak performance and usually produces some rare DX. Locals WHLL-1600, WOMP-1290, WKWK-1400, and WMOD-1370 all have 5:00 a.m. s/ons. WRVA celebrates its 36th year on the air on November 2nd, and a report usually brings special booklet. (Try between 6 and 7 p.m.). I don't believe we should stampede to prepared card veries just because a station or two frowns on this phase of our hobby. I'll strong along with Ken Bush and Ralph Johans in reference to the general practice of prepared cards. Have a magazine article (Stag) of Dr. Brinkley's hokum at KFKB in Milford, Kansas, and will lend to any interested member. DX NEWS is always top mail here. Thanks to Norm Maguire et al for the excellent guide for all who follow our hobby.

Between October 5th and 18th reports of reception have been sent to: 1580 KYND for RS, 3:44 to 9 a.m. when KDAY signed on; 1350 KRVC, Ashland, Ore. new, on ET with religious music, 5 to 5:27, Saturday, 10/15; 1240 KGY for ET/TT, 6:21 to 6:42 Sunday 10/16; and WMBD-1470 AN Monday, 10/17. Many thanks to Len Lockwood for calling me regarding KGY. KROY and KBMY were heard also, but the tone was even with them at times. Other DX notes: 1190 KEZY no longer AN; many foreign language stations heard Monday, 10/10; probably Japanese; one still there after KOHO should have signed off at 5, so probably not they on 1170. 800 CJLX was weak, if on for Special; very strong static, 10/17. Only three veries; 630 KSXX for 6/6 report, without f/up; 1510 KMOR form letter and note, and 1580 KYND with a very KYND letter. Their motto is: "The art of being 'KYND' is all the world needs"; a good one. The report about 1270 KTFI using 250,000 watts reminded me when they were in trouble for using excessive power many years ago; also 550 KFYR; were their others? you old timers? How about some reports, fellows? Thanks, Len Kruse, for the CPs in frequency order; very easy to check against the Weyrich Log and my set of maps for each frequency; helps much. The page of notes on the White Plains Convention were quite clever; hope for more. You fellows in school needn't feel so bad; we working men can't afford to lose sleep either; practically no DX except on weekends, and holidays; Thanksgiving the next one, then four days Christmas and New Years. Hi there everybody from a new member of the NRC. I am a sophomore at Fairleigh Dickinson University in Teaneck, New Jersey. I've received three issues of DX NEWS already, and really have enjoyed them. I've been DXing for about two years now, with 205 stations logged (65 varied.) DXing is difficult around here (there are four 50 kw. and six 5 kw. transmitters within ten miles of here), but here are some of my better catches - 540-CBK, 530-CFRA, 610-WCKR, 620-WTMJ, 690-WVOK, 790-CKSO and WRUM, 820-WAIT and WOSU, 1010-KLRA, 1070-WKOW, 1150-WAPO, 1390-WFMJ, 1380-CKLC, 1500-CHUC and KSTP, 1510-CKOT, 1540-ZNS and 1550-WBSC. My latest station was KLCN-910 in Blytheville, Arkansas. I heard it for the first time on 10/3 at 5:30 a.m. EST and almost daily thereafter. The radios that I use an RCA Victor model 23T (eight tubes), an RCA Victor "Filteramic (X-4JE) five tubes, and a five transistor Philco model T-50. The "Filteramic" does a good job of eliminating static and keeps to a minimum the QRM from the local stations. Bye for now - will try to report as often as possible. 73s. (Welcome to the NRC, Allen, and we will be watching for more reports! -Ed.)

The DX season is really beginning here in Short Hills. I catch most of my new ones at sunset. A week or so ago I picked up 4VEH in Cap Hatian, Haiti on 1040. They were broadcasting in English and gave complete info on the hour as to where they were, their SW frequencies, and they asked for reports. On Sunday the 16th, I picked up the s/on of an Armed Forces station on 1480 at 3:30 EST which sounded like VOUS (?). Their time was an hour and a half ahead of mine. Anybody know about WQED on 1320? Where? I picked up my first known Puerto Rican, WAPA in San Juan. It seems as if my antennas are rigged to pull in the Carribean. Some nights the band is packed with Cubans. Some of my varies include WROD WGST WRFB CHNS WRAL WPOM WELE and WJCM from Donna, Radio Swan, WAIT WCTT WBSC (sent informative letter and program guide). Other catches since my last report are 10/15- WRUM. 10/6- WYDE. 10/14- KLCN. 10/10- WTAL. 10/20- WLIK. 10/20- WFNS. 10/15- WHKY. 10/14- WLOU/. 10/15- WGHM. 10/11- WOIC. 10/5- WBNB. 10/6- WGTC and heard that WKMI changed from 5,000/1,000 to 5,000/5,000. Reception here seems to be getting better. On Monday 10/17, I wook up late at 4:55, but I did get a good log on VOUS-1480 on an AN sked. They had a terrific signal. I can't see how they do this with 50 watts. At 6 a.m. EDT, logged what I consider an excellent catch as I heard the WRUM-790 in Rumford, Me. sign on completely atop WAEB, WTAR, WEAN etc. On 10/16, I logged 4VEH on about 1035 kc/s. all evening in French, Spanish, and English. They are in Dap Haitien and will varie all reports. Send to Box 1. Earlier, at 6 a.m., the s/on of WDEA-1350 in Ellsworth, Me. logged about WAVY and WINY. One below them mentioning Hot Springs. Probably KAAB - will have to get a taped ID, as WAVY too strong here for log. On 10/17, noted that WLCY nor WALA on AN, whew! Also, I didn't seem to hear WABB below VOUS, so maybe they're stopping. KERN-1410 S-5 at 2:30. KGMS-1380, off air at 3:01 until 5 a.m. PST and took a reading on KPOI for new report, at 3:24, when WAWZ came on air. 10/18- TT all around today. 10/19- TT on 740 atop KRMG at 1:47. With the DX season beginning to get interesting, I am hopefully awaiting the end of Daylight Savings Time and a return to normalcy. Wish I had the time this year to enter the Domestic Contest and the Foreign Contest both, but will have to limit my activities to the latter. I am working reasonably hard on the Foreign Contest, and have already submitted 21 reports to 16 countries, with three countries now in, plus Canada (which of course is not in the Contest). The Canadian verie is from CHOW, Welland, 1470, now 1,000 watts, 18 hours a day. My only report thus far to a TA station is for a 9/18 logging of Sebaa Aioun, Morocco on 701 (and still out). Locally, please note that WNPV, 1440, Lansdale, Pa. is now on a RS daytime sked. Lansdale is about 15 miles north of Philadelphia. Also of local concern is one nearby which seems likely to be granted a CP soon to be located in Media, Pa. (15 miles southwest of Philadelphia) and use 690 kc/s. with a directional pattern. Best of DX.

I have heard a great deal about your Club from Jim Ernst of Mahone Bay - one of your members. He has shown me copies of your weekly reports and told me of other aspects of the organization. From this I have been quite impressed. I had been listening to radio io (DX) for about six months before I knew that such a club existed. Jim was the first person I have met who could tell me about it. I had logged about 185 stations but I have just begun to send for veries. Now I'll try a brief history of the Club as I disagree with a recent statement it was organized in Erie in 1933. The NRC was born Labor Day weekend 1933 in Farquar Park, York, Pa. Our Conventions then are actually also anniversaries. Art Brackbill and Bob Weaver cooked up the idea of their own club. Bob was then a member of the Philadelphia Radio Club and the Transcontinental Radio Club. Bulletins were just carbon copies. Doing most of this by memory I can't get a perfect sequence growth but by January 1934 we were an organization with Bob Weaver president and editor, I was secretary, Luther Grim of Red Lion was publicity manager. Bob really did all the work and by now a mimeograph was in use and the bulletin was two to three pages. Members of the Buffalo Evening News DX Club were included in starting the NRC and in January 1934 the Atlantic Radio Club merged with us and in February 1934 the Central DX Club of La Grange, Ill. joined with us. I can recall early members' names such as Keith Freas, Charles Van Tassel, Ida Henninger, some of the still familiar ones like Pat Reilley and Joe Brauner. The Club moved to Erie either late 1936 or sometime in 1937. I know we had an NRC Convention in York in June 1936. I rather think it must have been 1937 in Erie. I was there along with bob and Att and the club was turned over to Mr. Gordon at that time. We had quite a time in Erie. I can still see Joe Becker on the cracker barrel on the store giving out with real DX gab. Friend Pat was there also. I guess the Kittanning Convention followed this one. How about it, Bill Stone - I first met you there. Then followed some of the most sociable Conventions in Buffalo with Ray Edge and Joe Brauner hosting them. RP\*-From Derby, England, Oct. 9th; We have once again moved out QTH this time from Wales back to England. Only wish we could have remained in that part of the world all the year around, as it's certainly a wonderful place. However, I expect we will be returning to Aberystwyth in the future. At the moment South Americans are audible just after 2400 GMT and I am looking forward to plenty of DX this coming winter season.

KB\*-I am very pleased to see the welcome signs of improving conditions on MW. Regarding the possibility of commercial broadcasting in the UK, the BBC charter has been extended until 1964. The whole future of broadcasting in this country is under discussion. One recommendation is that sound broadcasting should remain strictly BBC and that a third TV channel should go to the independent television authority. Whether or not the 2nd ITA channel would give the badly needed competition I rather doubt. It would have to be an entirely different organization to handle the job. I have on order an Ultra Rio, 9 transistor receiver on approval for trial period, so I can try it out. Cost about \$85.
