Monday 2/6 no luck with DXes besides KGGM-610 which wasn't needed but sent a postcard. No sign of CJME-1300 so wonder if they were on. One of the locals was on Conelrad tests on 1240 and was getting an image on 1300 part of the time but 1300 was clear otherwise. Down to the business at hand. On 1/23, Station KOCA-1240 Texas was heard with RS at 3:30. 1/27, KFDF-1580 Arkansas with RS until s/off at 6:30 p.m. KDAY-1580 California with s/off at 8:01. 1/29, CMBC-690 Cuba on RS. at 9:15 p.m. 1/30, KCSR-1450, Nebraska, r/c at 2:20-2:35 on the 30th of each third month. WIBG-990, Pennsylvania RS at 3:17 a.m. CJAD-800 Quebec on RS at 3:25. WJET-1400 Pennsylvania RS at 3:50. 2/3, CKWX-1130, British Columbia, RS at 2:55.
