LETTER FROM WRUL (SW) NEW YORK, sent us by WAYNE PIERCE

August 10, 1961

"Dear Mr. Pierce: station will announce greetings to the NRC Convention on Monday Sept. 4, 1961 at 2000 hours GMT (4 p.m. New York Time). We are happy to do so since we are most interested in meeting of organizations such as yours.

"If it is at all possible, we would also like to broadcast something additional about your organization. This could take the form of a tape received from an organization official, from yourself, or from a designated reporter giving a convention summary.

"Also, our station will accept a reverse charge phone call from yourself, or someone designated by your Convention on Monday Sept. 4th at 11 a.m. which could include any convention particulars that you wished. The call should be made to Plaza 2 2870 at 11 a.m. or shortly thereafter. If the time is inconvenient, let us know and we will try to accomodate you. Please have the caller ask for me by name.

"There may be other ways that we could service your organization as well. Since we reach 3/4 of the globe under optimum broadcasting conditions, we may be able to report to many of your members on some of your projects and activities. We would be willing to consider a regular report to NRC members, as a feature of one of our programs.

"Please let us know your reaction to the above, and if there is any other way we can co-operate. Sincerely yours," (signed) Hill Edell, English Language Service.

Wayne tells us WRUL will greet us as above on 17,750, 15,385 and 11,790 kc/s. with a probable power of 50,000 watts. This suggestion will be discussed at AMARILLO.

WHAT BETTER WAY TO END YOUR SUMMER THAN TO COME TO THE NRC CONVENTION IN AMARILLO

Hi - just joined the Club. First of all, I would like to thank Mike King and Frank Williams for their cards. To get into DX quick, it hasn't been good. Can pick up only semi-locals just about. As an added problem, I have also been bothered by moderate fading recently, some of the time I'd swear I was listening to some SW stations the way they've been fading in and out. Totals since I joined the NRC (six weeks or so ago) are 166 logged, 21 verified, and 12 reports out. Majority of those logged are from the daytime hours. I pick up 74 stations during the daytime hours here. Some of the veries received are from WWVA WATE WCCO WOAI CHML WLS (Mutilated in mail) WFBR (with verie stamp), all cards, and WHAS CKOC WNAR and WNDR letters with an exception of WNAR which also sent back the report and included a coverage map (indicated in form letter it was standard). I also received a coverage map from WKAP with NOTHING written on it by the station and no note or letter enclosed. What does this mean? As others reported last month, WERA-1590 is testing. I heard it on 7/28 between midnight and 1 a.m. EST with a TT and piano music. Very disappointed with its signal then as it was only barely above WAKR's signal. Both signals were poor. At the XR site they use two Collins 5 kw. XRs. One is 21 years old, or about that age. The main one about four years old is used five days a week, the other on Wednesdays and Saturdays, midnight to midnight. This is one of the stations that never leaves the air as I'm sure many know. They haven't had their carrier off since May of 1959, except for brief power failures, but with five power sources, , , --. They are Conelrad for Akron on 640. CE is George V. Paul who says reports are verified, if correct, eventually. We got the new board in at WCUY finally. The Gates Studioette replaced an RCA 76B. WABQ-1540 here in Cleveland has changed its XR site and puts out a signal many times improved over the old set-up. New Gates 1 kw. XR, new tower and ground system. The biggest difference comes from the new ground system replacing a beat-up counterpoise. On the trip to Akron I also stopped by the XR site of WHLO-640.
