

9/11- Quite a bit of activity here as I acquaint myself with West Coast DX. Reports between 9/4-10 to the following on RS: KPOJ KFXD KVI KOH KWJJ KWIL KOL WGN CHUB KINY KTAC CFUN KMOM; four 590s, KID KHQ KUGN KFXM, all on 9/4 plys KMAR-1570 ET under CHUB and then in the clear after the latter's s off on 9/10, and KTRE-1420 Hurricane Watch on 9/10. Veries in from KOIN KSLM KJAX KVIP7, the former signed by Don Hoffman, who was still a DJ at KGMB when I left Honolulu. It's a small world! KXYZ-1320 noted in the clear, Hurricane Watch, 9/11. Where is XERF? I don't recall hearing them since I've been here. You Amarillo lads didn't take action, did you? Haven't gotten any DX NEWSes since the end of July; my landlady is not too large on forwarding my mail except two bills which came today. Even now though CHUB is in the clear. Notes on the above reports. KINY-800 was coming through, so tried for KICY-850, nothing but a weak KTAC. I really love the way S.F. stations take advantage of their mornings off. KNBQ's OC has been on every time; KCBS stuck around this morning, and KFRC early Sunday morning with TT. Looking through old veries I note that KXRX-1500 San Jose surpresses its signal towards 610 which makes for poor Eastern reception. WGN is a hold-out from way back; noted that I am missing quite a few clear channel stations, so I thought I'd better do it before the FCC finalizes its plans to pyt regional stations on some of the clears, mostly in the West. Other 50 kw. outlets I'm missing are WRCA WMAQ WOR CBL KXL WABC WHDH WCBS WLS KGBS KATR WRGV KRLA WCAR WDGY WJJD WHAM WGAR KOMA KXEL WPTR KDAY, 11 of which are readily readable. No TPs yet - haven't stayed up late.

Hi fellow Musers! For this first of what I hope will be many contributions to DX NEWS I don't have too much to report, but what I do have ain't all bad, as the man said, hi. Hurricane Carla might have been the cause of all the Texans on Sept. 11. New were WACO-1460 2:14-3:20 weak; KIOX-1270 powerful to fadeout at 4:35; tentative; KTBC-590, but faded out before ID. Old; WOAI-1200 and carrier from either WBAP or WFAA-820. Besides Texas I heard KSEW-1400, Sitka, Alaska on a f/c 3:25-4:01 the same night (they were still going when I tuned out), aimed at Coils (Hoyles?) - Niblack and Associates, Seattla. Sept. 11 also saw WFBL-1390 4:03-4:27, lost in slop from KRKO-1380; WCAU-1210 4:37-4:44 with crop reports from New Jersey (that all they carry that time of night?) and WNBC-660 at 4:56-5:00 with unID QRM (probably XERPM). Other new ones were WMAQ-670, Sept. 2 at 12:50-1:34 a.m.; KKJO-1550, 3:54-4:22 Sept. 8; KGEM-1100 1:17-1:25 with terrific QRM from CKWX-1130; WHAM-1180, 1:26-1:32 Sept. 8 with QRM from KEX-1190. The RX is a National NC-46, and currently the only antenna I have up is a 50' dipole aimed North/South, 20' above sea level with a 72' co-ax leadin. Maybe I should use the dipole as a leadin, hi. NC-46 is a 10-tuber made about 1946. Reports out to: WABC-770 KKJO-1550 WFBL-1390 KSEW-1400 WACO-1460. Recent veries from CHML-900 WMAQ-670 CKRD-850. CKRD uses a Collins 20V with three 200' towers. Their pattern is aimed 30° West of True North. V/s is Ken L. Martin, CE. 73 for now. (Welcome to the NRC, Dave, and we'll be hoping with you for those many contributions to DX NEWS! -ed.)

Actually, except for some very good signals from CX28, Montevideo-1090 this past Monday AM 9/25, and a scattered few other and hearer LAs, there hasn't been much foreign DX other than TA. The Eastern Canadians are strong every night, and the U.S. Midwesterners are good early evenings, but the real choice domestic DX has yet to come. I have noted KFI with a good signal behind CMHQ around 10 p.m. several nights, and this should be a sign of improving reception from the West. But getting around to my recent DX, I would say that Spain and Portugal have been the most frequently heard and loudest. Norte I-1061 was particularly good on 9/18, and a new one for me. Other Portuguese stations were strong at s/on the same morning. On 9/19, Lisbon I-665 was logged, and that is an accomplishment for me since WNBC is a tough barrier here. In Spain, Radio Zaragoza-872 was finally logged on 9/19 and has been heard several times since, early evening. On 9/20 Madrid-1016 (formerly 1022) put in a very good early evening signal for a new logging. Paris-863 was another new one for me, logged on Monday morning 9/19. Altogether there have been many European signals in September, mostly from the South European countries. Africa has been heard from too, the best signal and best catch being Cairo V on 818, logged on 9/21 between 10 and 11 p.m. (but this time would change to 11 to midnight when Cairo returns to their regular time). A very loud and distinct signal, and another new station and country. Sebaa Aouin, Morocco-701 is being heard evenings to their 7 p.m. s/off, but tough to pull through WLW and WOR. Yes, the season is off to a good start, but I wish my DX NEWS would arrive so I can find out what is going on in the rest of the world (of NRC).

## Report on Condition on the National Radio Club for 1960-61 Season

This being the end of the 1960-61 DX Season and the beginning of another this report is being published in order to inform members as to the condition of their Club.

As most of you know, during the 1959-60 season the club purchased a new A B Dick Mimeograph machine. During the 1960-61 season the Club purchased a hand model Addressograph machine. Both of these have played a large part in reducing the man hours required to publish your DX News. Being that one person does the mimeographing and mailing DX News, you can be sure a reduction in the time required is appreciated.

One remark regarding the Addressograph. This machine requires metal plates on which your name and address is impressed and when a new plate has to be made up, it is done by the Addressograph Corp. That is why a fee of .15¢ must be charged each member when they change their address. So please remember this when sending in a change of address. However all plates containing the addresses of members that was in effect as of Oct 1 1960 are on file. Thus if you change address to one that is new, the fee must be paid, but if you happen to revert to an address that you had since Oct 1 1960, then it will be on file and no fee is required. Also please send changes of addresses to me, here in Buffalo and not just include it in your musings report as it can be missed.

Your Exec Sec proposes to again keep DX News to no more than 10 sheets of paper (20ppages) to insure that it can be mailed without going over the 2 ounce limit. It is also my intentions to continue our annual dues at \$4.00 and this can only be done by sticking to the 20 page bulletin. As Ernie Cooper, our Musings Editor, stated in the Aug 19th issue, the NRC is strictly a Broadcast Band DX Club, which means covering the frequencies beginning with 535 Kcs and ending with 1605 Kcs. Everything other than that will be DELETED from your reports. Sooo please stick to BCB DX and save Ernie a lot of work. Breaking down the 20 page allotment comes to this. 15 pages for the Musings section; 1 page for DX Down the Dial and 4 pages for International DX Digest. Naturally there will be issues when this allotment will shift a little, but in most issues it will stand. Both Ernie and myself feel that if you will stick to reporting BCB DX, giving the information necessary to tell what you have heard and verified, along with information that would enable others to tune in what they might need, can easily be done in your report without going overboard in yak yak talk. Limit of 30 lines will continue to be in effect with the right for Ernie to cut below that if he finds it necessary to get his section to be within 15 pages(Stencils

To publish things such as the Latin American Station list are out in the future. Only a total of 54 members purchased that list which actually did not pay for the paper and postage used plus the mimeo ink and envelopes. We will continue to publish the Freq Check list along with New CPs issued and at times Conditions of the Frequencies, that is if Kruse will continue to cut the stencils for those articles when worth while. Ernie will also continue to publish all the FCC data he receives as in the past. Also we will continue and this time enforce our rule of 1 report to a member in an issue, so it will be up to you fellows to get your report to Ernie early enough to insure him receiving it in time because if it does not and he receives another one from you for the following issue, one of them will be tossed into the waste basket. Probably some of you will think I am harsh, but I am sure that all would be better satisfied knowing their DX News will come faithfully in the future as it has in the past, thus operating the club in a strict business like manner requires planning and sticking to it. I am sure a hit and miss system of operations wouldnt be tolerated long.

## CLUB REPORT CONTINUED

With the use of the Addressograph plates it has lightened the burden of keeping a check and recheck to see that every member receives a DX News. It has also eased the method of issuing renewal notices. Beginning with the Oct 7th issue the following system will be used in so far as sending out renewal notices.

In your DX News which is mailed before your expiration date and the one on it or immediately preceeding it another notice, thus giving you just about 2 weeks advance notice. Upon which if when your expiration date arrives and nothing is heard from you, your address plate will be pulled from the rack and not inserted until a renewal is received or some other word has been heard from you. As you know, all memberships expire either on the 15th or last day of the month, so we urge you to renew promptly and avoid missing an issue or so because of lateness. Your cooperation in all these matters will be appreciated along with making the publishing job a little easier along with being pleasant.

Because of rising costs of the mimeo paper and bulletin envelopes, your Exec Sec bought in large lots to obtain a little better price, but I have found that since my last purchase, prices have risen, so we can expect to pay a little more for our future supplies, even buying them in large amounts. However you can be assured that I will in the future do my best in obtaining as good a prices as possible. Thus I hope that all of you will renew promptly in the future to insure the future of your clubs operation as it has been in the past. To many of you members who have not been with us too long it might be a good place to inform you that since October 1940 the NRC has issued a total of 34 bulletins each and every year without a break, even thru the war years. Further it has been only about 6 or 7 times during all those years that DX News has been mailed a day or 2 late, all other issues have been mailed on time, winter and summer. So thanks to each and every one of you for your past cooperation and I will be looking forward to serving you for at least the next 3 years. So in closing, can I look for your continued cooperation??? Trnx. Pop.

SPANISH REPORT FORMS were .02¢ each with instruction or translation sheets with each order of 25 Or more. However due to the fact that they show our former Lake City, Penna address, I have reduced them a bit, thus effective at once they will be sold in lots of 25 report sheets for .35¢ with translation sheets as long as those sheets are available. In so far as the Lake City address is concerned, this can easily be blacked out.

The usual order for NRC Letter heads and English Raport Forms have been for 100 and they have been mailed in a large envelope taking the 3rd class rate. However being that the 3rd class rate goes up in January, the price of station will have to be increased, the amount will be published later, or when known just what it will be. Orders of more than 100 are sent parcel post and it is not as yet known if this class of mail will be included in the postal raise. More on this later. So to be sure suggest that you order now and be sure of the above prices.

Regarding the slips explaining DX that was included with your DX-News a couple issues back. I have placed an order with Dick Cooper for a good supply. To date several members have placed their orders with me and believing they will be a popular item to include with your DX reports I thought it best to have a supply on hand. They will be shipped as soon as the supply arrives from Dick.

Now a word in regard to the deletion of the Supremecy Rating List. For the past several years it has always been a sheet that its Editors were continually asking for cooperation from the members so this list could be popular. Yet the cooperation was always lacking and now that it has dropped to the listing of only 22 members your Exec Sec could see no good reason for its continuance. Many say, use it only when we have a blank side of paper. All well and good but none of us know just when we will have a blank side, it could be often and then it could be several issues before a blank sheet is available, so it could be laying here several weeks before space would be available. We will continue to publish all data such as F/C lists-Construction Permits-Condition of the Frequencies and all other data that pertains to giving members the DX data and information they need. So thanks to Hank Wilkenson for his efforts in trying awfully hard to keep that column going

The paper this has been mimeographed on is the smaller paper we do have on hand and it is used only for such items as this along with our extra features such as F/C lists-CPs-Cond of Freq etc in order to use it up and also to save our regular bulletin mimeo. All this is being done for the purpose of keeping your annual dues at \$4.00 and yet able to have enough club funds on hand for not only the purchase of bulleti supplies but also in case repairs are needed for our equipment that is needed for the publishing job. The above financial figures do not include the money on hand for members First class postage fund nor the monies of some New Zealand members being entrusted to the Club.

As you can see, Your Club is in good financial condition. Your annual Dues have remained the same for several years and it is the intent of your Exec Sec to continue this policy despite a rise in all supplies purchased to publish DX News. Beginning January 7 1963 the cost of mailing DX News will be increased from .03¢ for the first 2 Oz to .04¢, which means that aprox \$110.00 per year more will be added to club expenses. Checking above you can easily note that had another \$100 been added to last seasons expenses the club would have had a loss instead of a slight overage.

That is the reason that your Exec Sec has invoked the 10 sheet limit (20 pages) for all future DX News. By doing this we do save on the amount of mimeo paper used, yet by curtailing your musings to containing DX data and DX info, leaving out what brings the musings into the personal correspondance class. Because this report is late it does allow us to see that despite the last couple issues this month, DX News although less in pages, did contain plenty of DX data and DX info. Thus I am sure that by limiting DX News to no more than 10 sheets of paper, no members will be deprived of the latest and most complete coverage of DX information. Another reason for your Exec Sec's action is that we do have a large number of young members who are attending school or college and although many of us could easily afford a raise in dues, these lads couldnt and in many cases a raise could force them to drop their membership, besides we must realize that our younger members will in the near future be the ones who will keep the NRC going.

While on this subject. I would like to again inform all that Pop Edge will definitely retire in 1964 with the DX News for August 1964 being the last issue I will publish. Beginning with the first issue of September 1964 there will be a new publisher, who or whom it will be I have no idea but I believe that it might be a very good idea for some one or some group (2-4) to get their heads together and begin to find a solution. From my experience I would suggest that a group of 2 to 4 try and take over. If this could be arranged no one person would have too much to do and the entire process of getting a bulletin out could be done in one evening with the club book work being done during other spare moments. If you are interested in DX a small group could get a lot of enjoyment from the publishing job and yet not have it become a burden. I suggest 2 to 4 people because to have one person do it all, well at times its a tough job especially when you make up your mind to continually meet the mailing schedule as it has been these past years. Anytime info is desired on the publishing job, I will furnish it. *Kay*

REPORT OF THE N.R.C. TO ITS MEMBERS by Ray B. Edge - Exec Sec.

It had been my intention to publish a tri-monthly financial report but due to having to work the publishing of DX News into a system along with going right into weekly issues, my good intentions had to be laid aside. However here it the entire report covering the period from Oct 4 1959 until and including Aug 15 1960.

Receipts;-Oct 4 1959 Hal Wagner turned over to me as club funds the following sum, exclusive of any money held by the club to cover first class postage requested by some Members and that money held here for some of our New Zealand Members. \$ 641.33  
Dues and by the sale of Rpt Fms - Ltr Heads 1122.10  
Total taken in from 10/4/59 - 8/15/60 \$ 1763.43

Expenses for the same period - - - - - \$ 1505.58

On hand as of August 15 1960 - - - - - \$ 257.85

As you will no doubt note, we had quite a large amount of expenses which was due to the following; Hal Wagner knowingly that he would not continue the Office of Exec-Sec and Publisher did not wish to have a large stock of bulletin supplies on hand when he turned over his Office to whom ever was to be selected believing it might be to someone that was a great distance from Lake City and which would have caused a large charge for transporting said supplies from one place to the other. Thus upon my taking over I had to immediately purchase mimeo paper-envelopes and have the front pages printed up. Almost immediately I ordered from Dick Cooper a goodly supply of NRC Letter-Heads and Report Forms along with membership applications-slips telling about the club which is included with every sample issue of DX News mailed to prospective members and new membership cards. We have NO OUTSTANDING BILLS, all is paid for

Also as of Aug 15 1960 we have in stock 50,000 sheets of our regular "Ivory" mimeo paper - 23,500 envelopes and 1 A.B. Dick Model 416 brand new Mimeograph machine which was purchased May 1 1960 for \$304.15 The reason for this purchase was that the rubber pick up rollers on the machine we had just wore down and no adjustment which has to be made depending on the humidity or dryness of the mimeo paper, it being kept in the cellar you just have no control over this condition. Then too, to use the paper that this is mimeographed on, was impossible with the machine we had because of the worn out pick up rollers. In the past Hal tried to buy new ones with no success and again I tried this early spring without success because these rollers have not been made by A B Dick for at least the past 10 years, in fact A B Dick considers the type we had obsolete. But I am sure that if you will examine the copies of DX News you have received beginning with the April 30 1960 issue and then look over the article "How To Enjoy Better DXing" I am sure you will easily note a very clear and sharp locking mimeo job. Further, being that we have aprox 90,000 sheets of the same mimeo as this message is on, it can now be used easily, thus saving our regular sized mimeo for many items that appear as extras in DX News along with plans to use this size paper for such things as the F/C lists-List of Const Permits by the FCC that Len Kruse compiles and if possible the Domestic and Foreign Contest standings that can be put back to back.

The article "How To Enjoy Better DXing" has been mailed to every member in Good Standing as of July 25 1960. Those members whose expiration date fell on July 31 1960 will receive their copy when they send in their dues. It will be known as the "NRC CODE OF ETHICS". Use it wisely.

After you have read my report in the musings section of the Aug 20 issue you will know why the Edges were not or will not be at our 1960 White Plains Convention, so with intentions of getting this sheet in the same issue of DX News providing weight allows and if not it will appear in the Sept 1960 issue in which case enough sheets will be mailed to White Plains in order to be distributed to those at the convention.

Because of the selection of a new Publisher last year at the Omaha Convention many other items that should have been discussed just were not. At this convention I believe those many things will be discussed. They include the contests for both Domestic and Foreign. The outlining of our CPC Committee as to what the plans for the 1960-61 DX Season will be. However it must be remembered that the contacting and scheduling of daytime only stations will have to be omitted but it is believed that the CPC can come up with plans that will enable a good many hard to hear stations come on either by a test or a DX Program. Those of you at White Plains will certainly form a cross section of all NRCers so express your thoughts so those of the CPC will know the best way to satisfy the majority. Then support the CPC with reports to the stations they do get to come on the air.

Another item is the Supremacy Rating list. Porter Atherton did a good job in the past. Now that he is unable to continue and Hank Wilkinson has taken it, please support him in his efforts. This listing is NOT a contest but only shows the others who and what he has done, kinda urges others to get higher in the listing. If you have good ideas that might help this listing, give them to Fred Van Voorhees at the convention and I am sure he will listen with an open mind.

XERF etc. This subject should be a good topic at the convention. Quite a few discussions have appeared in the pages of DX News and I am sure a good talk about this at the convention should finally decide if the majority of our members want to see discussions as this continued or shall it be eliminated from the pages of DX News. Here at Buffalo I have several letters on this subject, but being I will not be at hand, believe you at White Plains can easily settle this once and for all times. Being that both Fred Van Voorhees and Lefty Cooper will be at White Plains and both of them along with your Exec Sec-Publisher form club policy, it is up to you to make your desires known to them and at White Plains is a very good place to do it.

During the past season the 30 line limit for members reports has worked out fine and from my observation it did not in any way deter a members report. I am asking Lefty to continue this policy the coming season. As stated before we can mail 10 sheets of paper (20 pages) for .03¢ in the USA and .04¢ to Foreign Countries. If we have just one more sheet to add the postage goes up .01-1/2¢ in the USA and .02¢ to the Foreign Countries. However at times when we have 2 or 3 sheets more, the additional postage is worth it, however it has been rare that we do have 2 or 3 sheets over, but if we did have that many often it would raise havoc with our postage bill which is the reason we wish to stay within the first 2 ounce weight limit for DX News.

In winding this up I would like to urge all of you to continue to support your Editors and please abide by their rules for reporting to them, it makes their job so much easier along with less chance of errors creeping in. Support DX Down the Dial - Your CPC and cooperate with all the others who do club work. No one is compensated but because it is a hobby to them and they enjoy putting their efforts into DX News so that others can get the most up to date and correct data along with letting others know how and what is being heard.
