This two-hour period will be a maintenance or Proof of Performance test, and will allow DXers an opportunity to log this much-sought station. Although several AN stations will be on the air during this time, notably WIND, WQAM and KMON, we feel many will be able to log WQTE, who may use some cycle tone modulation during the course of this test broadcast. They first went on the air 7/12/56 as WMIC and in August 1959 they changed their calls to WQTE. They are known as "The Good Music Station" and also "The Golden Voice of Southeastern Michigan." This will be a half-hour DX Test, by this year-old station, WNPV, which uses 500 watts and a directional antenna array. The program will feature recorded music, with IDs after every selection. "The Voice of the North Penn Valley" will be looking for your DX reports, and it is presumed that a clear channel awaits this program, giving everyone a chance to make a fine logging. WMED-1470 AN at 3:16, unnn WNEW-1130 AN 4:45. The local WERE-1300 is now AN seven days. The program on Monday is "A Night Filled with Music" no rr) with ID once every half hour. Here is some junk I have taken from my veries: CJSP-710 sends a letter with s/on and s/off TX, October is 6:45-5:45, November 7:15-5:15. WDOK-1260 has two studios, main one at 1515 Euclid Ave., Cleveland 15, two small ones at XR on Rockside Rd. (Ohio 176), Seven Hills, O. Alternate main XRs are RCA BTA 5F and 5R1. They have a five-tower in-line array of quarter wave radiators, five for night, four for day, pattern mostly N. Test and maintenance is 12:01-4:00 Saturdays. WGNp720 main antenna is 750', aux 250', both non-directional. They are AN except 2-6 Tuesdays. They were WDAP until 1924, when the Tribune bought them and changed call to World's Greatest Newspaper, their slogan. XR is at Roselle, Ill. WJAS-1320 uses one antenna days, two nights, one is 246', other 175'. WLS-890 GE XR is in Tinley Park, Ill., 580'. WOWO-1190 XR is in Roanoke, Ill., v/d shows two towers 420'. WRCV-1060 has Westinghouse XR originally installed in 1934 but modified many times since, in Whitmarsh, Pa. WREC-970 studios and XR are three miles S of Ashtabula, O. and they have three AM towers 265'. They did have a 485' FM tower, but that was blown down last April. I hope everyone will obey the new v/s list rules, because in my opinion it is a very useful column, and I hope it won't be thrown out. Well, I squeezed everything in, this is 26 lines, so 1 cubed plus 72. Anyhoo, latest additions to the log are: KMON5560 10/9 at 3:20 a.m., strong, but with bad QRM from KSFO; XEAZ-1270 (La Voz de Oro) 10/12 at 2:38 with a possible s/off at 3:00; KGB-1360 10/22 strong, QRM from KEEN; KOOK-970 10/17 fair with QRM from KREM; KORK/KBET-1340, 10/18 at 3:48, mutual QRM, both fair; KMVI-550, 3:00 on 10/19 fair and poor with QRM from KOY and un-ID Canadian, possibly CKPG. I've sure been looking for KMVI a long time! Latest veries: WABC KKJO KSEW v/ls, letter from WMAQ after card arrived. V/s: WABC, E.M. MacKinnon, no status given, KSEW Ed Scholz, CE, KKJO, Earl Hash, SM, WACO R.E. Lee Glasgow, VP/GM. Station data: KSEW uses BC-250T by Gates, antenna is shunt fed (whazat?), 150' high, with a pattern approximately a circle.
