Greetings again from the DXers' paradise! Philadelphia was never like this! Not every DXer in NA gets a strong daylight split. Mine was, believe it or not, "Radio Americas." For about a week it's been heard on 1165 kc/s., perfectly clear and free from that ear-splitting Cuban jammer that I have to put up with day and night. But on 10/10 I found it back on its old frequency. Moral: Never underestimate the power of an outlaw station. (Didn't I do just the opposite, hi?) Otherwise, here's something of interest: "Radio El mundo" (WKWF) does its night program from studios in Miami Beach.
