It was CFSE, Senneterre, Que. & was as Andy Rugg listed in a helpful Musing, some time ago. In part, this is the reply. "From your description, I would say that the station you picked up was, in fact, CFSE Radio from RCAF Station, Senneterre, Que. CFSE is owned & operated by the personnel of this RCAF Station. We are licensed to broadcast on 1450 kc/s. Mowever, we do not have the equipment required to accurately measure our frequency so it is quite reasonable that you picked us up at 1425 or 1427 kc/s. Our peak power is 50%. We broadcast from 6pm to midnight Mon-Fri, noon-midnight Sat., noon-6pm Sunday. CFSE was set up to entertain EE speaking service men & their dependants in a FF speaking part of the country. However, some of our broadcasta are in FF." End quote. There was much more & the v/s was E. R. Cowan F/O, manager. Senneterre is hard to locate on map. Found it about 40 miles NE of Val d'Or & about 50 miles E of Amos. Am proud of this one & wouldn't swap it for a handful of TAs. Nice verie in from CFDR-790 & none from CKCM-620. Florida has become the fifth state to hit 200 or over.
