

I agree with Ernie's comments re "quality and quantity" DX. I am obviously a foreign DX bug, but will admit without hesitation that many, perhaps most, of the real tough catches are right on this continent. Certainly some of the LAs and TAs are fairly easy marks, particularly those using split frequencies, if you happen to live in the proper location. I prefer the foreign stations because I find them more interesting. I was a domestic DXer in the 30s, in Pittsburgh, when I couldn't get beyond Cuba and Mexico, except in rare cases, so when I resumed DX in 1958 I had to make up for lost time. Of course, my location near the Delaware River has a lot to do with my choice. Now for a little recent DX: 10/12- Bremen-1358 was noted fairly strong at s/on, 12:00 midnight. A program of setting-up exercises opened. Later on 10/12, thought I had a new split until it turned out to be WSSC, Sumter, S.C. over on 1345 kc/s. On 10/14 they were on 1335, and on 10/19 away over on 1375! All during evening hours. I'm wondering if this was their main signal, or if these were images. 10/15- Quite a few good European signals, but the only new report went out to the BBC Start Point station on 1252 kc/s., heard S-8 at 1:30 EST. This was 7:30 am BBC Summer Time. Tried for Liberia-650 at 1:45 but found KORL, which usually seems to be coming in when the BBC Home stations are strong. 10/19- In the early AM, Paris-863 and Nancy-836 were doing very well between 12:00 and 12:15 am, carrying the same program. 10/22, and several nights since then, plenty of LA activity but the only TAs usually have been CSB9-782 and CSB9-1578.
