Mon. April 27 K Y A 1260 San Francisco, California, 5,000 watts, 3:00-3:30 am EST. Please note that the time on this special DX has been changed from what was listed last week. The program will be on (KYA's time) from 1:00 to 1:30 a.m., Pacific Daylight Saving Time. This test will consist of tones with frequent IDs about every 5 minutes. They are most anxious to get BX reports on this test and will be happy to verify reports with their own QSL card. The test will be handled by their Chief Engineer, Mr. Paul Beck, to whom you should send your letters. This is a test of their nondirectional antenna, and it is hoped they'll penetrate to the East Coast, although WNDF in Syracuse will probably be on the air. This program was the result of a visit to the station by members Rich Heald and Greg Jones, with the info received from Rich.

## DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME STARTS

This seems always to cause confusion in DX NEWS. So, for the benefit of new members, and to remind all others, we ask that all times mentioned in your Musings, in your DX Down the Dial, and in your International DX Digest items be reported not in "fast" time but as usual, in EASTERN STANDARD TIME. We suggest that you leave the clock in your DI Den set on Eastern Standard Time, so as to avoid any chance of confusion, and that you make your notes also in EST. You'll note some stations in DST areas will change their r/c times while others even in these areas will adhere to the standard time for their frequency check. As we say, DST leads to confusion DX-wise, but so that we don't confuse one another, let's always report to DX NEWS in Eastern Standard Time, please!

The date for the May DX NEWS will be May 16. Deadline date in San Francisco and Brook lyn will be Tuesday, May 12th, and one day later, 5/13, in Mendota. V/1, GM WDEL-1150 Wilmington &, Del., J.W. Jones said the CE, G.A.Meyer Jr. was on vacation and so a delay, Jones considers joining MRC and so sent him the info and hope he joins the NRC. Heh, Bill Stone, came alive via 4/7, he DXed some and gives RS for WNDY-1500 6:15am-7pm EST for March. He'll be at MRC Convention with the Mrs. and Will See Aall of You, as they say in Rochester, N.Y. 73.

Andy Rugg - 16 Lake Breeze - Pointe Claire, Quebec Hi guys. As Roy Millar said in 4/4 DX NEWS, your BBC-881 (Wasnford) veries do not count as Wales. I checked on a map and found that Washford is on the England side of Bridgewater Bay, at roughly North Latitude 510 91 and West Longitude 30 211. If you can find Minehead (Somerset County) on a map (project a line joining Newport and Cardiff to the S coast of the Bristol Channel), you may find Washford about eight miles The actual XR is probably right on the water and could do a better and more efficient job of serving Wales from an across-the-water location than one in Wales it self so that is why the BBC's Welsh Network XR is in England. My country score gets axed by one and I expect that many other NRCers will suffer a lake fate. If you can't find the place on the map, don't worry; just take Roy's and my word for it. WBNE-1000 is the only new verie here as they verified my #3 f/up on 1963 DX. My brief absence from the books found me drooling at a fantastic signal from TIW-775, but as usual, after 13 minutes of solid copy, they took a doop at ID time and were gone, this being about the eighth occasion that this has happened. My quest for a TIW-775 ID will make Carroll Seth's Alaskan Crusade look like logging Senegal-764 on the EC. Letter from CBC Halifax says I probably heard CBAN-1140, but copy of the GBC Times that they sent also lists CBAP-1140, Shelburne, N.S. so I suspect I was hearing both relays at the same time, since both are almost equidistant from here. I can't count it as a CDAN verie, since part of the signal was undoubtedly coming from CBAP and vice versa. Counting it as a verie from both CBAN & CBAP sounds a bit unorthodox so I'll just forget about it as you'll never know who you're getting, just like the multitude on 990. CED-1110, St. John N.B. will come on in early September and go AN with 10kw. CBZ-1480 will also go AN soon. The reason for the good signals the CPC relays put out is their flat-top antennae, which give a much better skywave than the ordinary verticals. Ernie, I don't want to be a witch-hunter, but perhaps when CBC Tornoto got your report on the 1090 relay, they pulled out the list of relays, found CBLC-1090 at the beginning and didn't look further on down for more logical CPLK. You think it's possible? Bill Stone is still alive but isn't DXing because he needs his sleep. 73.

(It's CJCJ, Wayne -ERC) Log on WYZE-1480, 4:45-4:55; s/ons around 5am include WONE-980 WVOP-970 WIBX-950 and WSAN+1470.
