

SPECIAL TESTS COMING THIS WEEK ON 12/5-7

WJVA-1580 Sat. Dec. 5, 1:30-3:00 EST WJVA regularly conducts its frequency checks & Stephen Grundtner, C.E. often follows it with modulation tests, on the first Saturday of the month. Mr. Grundtner would like to notify the DXers of his tests, and would also like to hear from all. WJVA-FM-103.9 will also be on w/WJVA-AM. They'll be playing "oldies and goodies" during this test period and we hope many will hear this friendly station's test 12/5. DON EGGERT

KYMN-1520 Mon. Dec. 7, 3:00-4:00 EST Formerly KGON, KYMN, a 50kw. fulltimer, will be James Jobes, C.E. on w/a big hour-long DX show this AM for NRC. This station is never on when both KOMA & WKBW are off, so not many except West Coast members have heard this big station. They are owned by Republic Broadcasting, Inc., Box 5865, Portland, Ore.-97222, but operate out of Oregon City. They have a colorful QSL card but reports MUST be correct! LEN KRUSE

WPSL-1510 Mon. Dec. 7, 4:00-4:30 EST This brand new station opened in September '64, T. William Lynch, G.M. so mostly everyone has not had the chance to hear WPSL, which has no early-morning frequency check. However, they have an equipment test coming up as listed above, on what should be a clear channel, so their non-directional signal should get out nicely. KROW-1460 Mon. Dec. 7, 4:00-4:30 EST Even though KROW has been on since 1955, few DX-ers have heard them as they almost never test during the wee hours. They have a very colorful letterhead showing a rooster "KROW-ing" which you'll receive with your verification on it, if you correctly log KROW's equipment test. 1460 is clear in North America, so maybe KROW can cross the country with their 5,000 watts. 481 State St., Salem, Ore. WBZE-1510 Mon. Dec. 6, 4:30-5:00 EST WBZE had their preliminary tests some five months back, and have been on regularly since. Richard C. Bridges, Eng. They too do not have an early morning f/c time period, so this special test they are planning is big news to DX fans. V/l's in from WOOK-1340 and WBTC-1540; v/q from KNBI-1530, and v/f-EE from W.I.B.S.-695 in Roseau, Dominica, thanks to Ron Schiller's tip and address and v/s! WBTC on Stan Morse's appreciated tip, KNBI's on Joe Fela's info, and WOOK on my own, all by myself, hi - dumb luck. Here is the week that was: 11/19- Noted EE w/rr and later plain pop on 1214 kc/s., but I believe it is only BBC now running much later than in days of yore. 11/22- European on 638 kc/s., but I couldn't ID the language; 12:56-1:09am but it seems awfully early for Spain as it's a SM & would be only 6am over there. Any other info? German on 1358 in again; Ben says it's East Berlin. Unn WCBG-1590 on ET/M at 2:37am s/off. MM 11/23- Brand new Colombian on 650 AN w/S-9 signal, "La Voz Amiga" and "Union Radio en Bogota" were two IDs given. I think the AN SSES on 1460 & 1580 are both Colombians also; one on 1580 says "RRCN" often. (Radio Cadena Nacional). WERT-1220, Van Wert, Ohio on ET/OC @ 3:08, logged & reported, a week before sked TEST, in the clear & S-7. NNRC's CERY-920 in nicely w/loop E/W, but it was the Castro-Oiler w/loop N/S. The situation was saved by an S-9 OC which held back the usual sloppy-over signal of local WPAT-930, probably WOKY on one of their semi-regular MM ETs. Is the AN FF on 1150 CKSA, Lloydminster, Alta., of CKTR, Trois Rivieres? Signal behaved like a Western Canadian, but ID sounded like CKTR??? How about it, NRCers up that way? With that area rolling in, I decided to try 730 (KFQD!) & logged 20 minutes of pop mx, only to get the 4:30am ID of - WNEW-1130! If "La Voz Amigo" remains AN, KORL-650 is gone forever for ECers. No CFTK-1140, Cuban jammer held that spot. Unn WDGL-1520 in OK, S-8, in the clear but at s/off WKBW's OC was on, but WDGL still audible. C U in 7.

WYZE-1480 4:10. WGUS-1390 4:15 s/on. WPON-1460 s/on 4:30. WYNS-1150 in real clear w/nice NRC plug. But it was knocked out at 4:57 when WIMA s/on. I never even heard A TA w/the old S-120, but now I can even sit back and listen to some of them. I now have about 40 countries logged (w/about ten verified!), and this number will easily go up. ELEVEN YEARS AGO in DXD, Roger Anderson of Arlington, Va., reported reception of Frederikstand-1578 in English at 2101; Vigra-629 & Stavanger-1313 S9+ at 0050; Steve Johnson, Havre de Grace, Md., reported Falun-1223 at 0150, as did Anderson who, additionally, told of reception of Sundsvall-593 at 0135 and the Swedish synchronised network on 1562 S-8 at 0115. Kermit Geary, Walnutport, Pa., logged 2KO-1410 0530-0550; Roger Anderson logged 2KO at 0534 and 4AK-1220 at 0553. Hank Holbrook, Bethesda, Maryland, says it is the best season yet for this country, and recommends that all give it a try. He suggests that we listen from 0400 on, especially on Sunday mornings when the U.S. stations come on late. Says TPs are often audible as late as 0700 if the channel is clear. - 555 NICARAGUA. YNG, R. Tic Tac, Chinandega. Weak signal, L.A. music, and frequent ID's. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 584 SPAIN. R.N.E., Madrid, fair to good here 0116-0135 11/16 with one 7-minute fade. Program was a drama. (Rugg, Que.)
- 593 MOROCCO. R.T.M., Oujda, in parallel with others of the Arabic service on 11/17 with special program heard until about 2210. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 605 COLOMBIA. HJKL, Em. Nueva Granada, Bogota. On 24 hours with L.A. music operation. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 615 NICARAGUA. YNM, Rdfa. Nacional, Managua, at 1945 news, music later; very good signal; often 10 db or better. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 625 COSTA RICA. TIRICA, La Voz de la Victor, San Jose, fading in and out for two hours after 2200 11/16, with very strong signal on their peaks. WATE-620 a bother as even a strong signal on a split frequency is tough on the S-120. (Hoffman, Ohio) Typical L.A. programs, often separable from local on 630. Veries with very attractive card. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 645 PANAMA. HOS22, R. Mia, Panama, very good on 11/14; Hours not according to WRH, but positive ID as "Radio Mia" at 0015 11/14. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 655 EL SALVADOR. YSS, R. Nacional, San Salvador, in the clear 1050 10/28, S9 signals quite often; news on the hour; L.A. and classical music. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 656 EUR. RUSSIA. Murmansk taped around 0105-0115 11/14 for report to R. Moscow. (Miller, Wash.)
- 665 PORTUGAL/UNID./UNID./WEST GERMANY/LITHUANIA. Whew, what a mess! Until 2000 there are four stations here, with Lisbon dominant. The second most powerful is unid., and located unusually far North, very likely Iceland. They sign off 2000 exactly in Unid. Language; Lisbon goes off around 2002. After these two are off, two more are left, one weak, the other very weak. The weakest, I think, is a German; the 2nd weakest is very intriguing. I get very clear bearings for Gibraltar area or a bit south. No language yet for this one, but Western music heard around 2020 one night. This station may be the wandering Spanish Sahara EAJ103 or the wandering Libyan in El Beida that EBU hears. Vilnius puts OC on around 2045 and dominates this channel after s/on usually at 2100. (Nelson, Mass)
- 674 FRANCE. R.T.F., Marseille, finally heard here 0130 11/16, but faded under CBF-690 slop when the local started playing loud symphony stuff. (Rugg, Que.)
- 675 COSTA RICA. TIU, San Jose, just fair separable from 678, but not as strong a signal. (Conrad, Kentucky)
- ECUADOR. HCAU2, R. Atalaya, Guayaquil. I've often heard a Latin American QRMing TIU, often taking over the channel. I suspected Ecuador, and this has been confirmed (from date and program material) by Dave Gleason of Quito and IRCA. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 678 NICARAGUA. YND, Union Radio, Managua, good 10 db signal nearly every night. Very clear ID's; L.A. music. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 680 CUBA. Who's the AN Cuba here past 12 a.m., R. Progreso? (Sexton, Ont.)

- 685 GUATEMALA. TGRT, R. Fabulosa, Guatemala. I think this adequately covered in earlier bulletins, hi! (Conrad, Ky.)
- 692 GERMAN D.R. Deutschlandsender, Suhl, was AM Saturday 11/14. Very good signals. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 695 DOMINICA. W.I.B.S., Roseau, in English 1900 with BDC news relay. Signal here is very junky with much fading, etc. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 705 ST. VINCENT. W.I.B.S., Kingstown, heard for short periods on and off during past week; Very weak. Hardly enough yet for decent report. (Robie, Mass.)
- 707 UNID. Arab here very good w/Koran reading to 1830 s/off w/unreadable closing anncts in Arabic. I think this is Cairo's cultural program, sked to close 1830 on 710; 1830 is unusually late for an arab to go off. Noted 11/16. (Nelson, Mass)
- 715 HONDURAS. HRTV, R. Hondurena, Tegucigalpa; talk is Spanish but music is North American. Veries in English on letterhead. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 723 UNID. My Arab here seems to s/on nightly 2230, too weak to ID so far. (Nelson, Mass.) See Lars Ryden's comments below. (Ed.)
- 725 COSTA RICA. TILX, R. Columbia, San Jose. Very frequent and clear ID's; much talk and music. I read somewhere, parallel to 1195, but NOT. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 730 UNID. A station with Oriental music and chimes on the hour, heard at various times on 11/15 between 0500 and 0600, mixed with another station. Faded out for long periods. I thought at first it was Trinidad, until Trinidad was found to be the other station. A possibility, but an extremely remote one, is Kuching, SARAWAK. T'would be nice, though. (Dangerfield, Pa.) See lead item. (Ed.)
- 737 SPAIN. R.N.E., Barcelona, is now only one heard here with s/on at 2300. Listening almost nightly for repeat of what I thought I heard when I believed I had picked up Israel. Gordon Nelson also tuning this frequency, but he indicates Spain only to date. Very possibly I was wrong. (Robie, Mass.) Hal, Gordon's report of last week apparently written after his last contact with you. Evidence is strong FOR Israeli reception as reported. (Ed.)
UNID. Second TA s/on w/IS 2258 along with R.N.E., Barcelona. Sounds like vibra-harp, maybe; Sounds like part of a melody; time pip 2300 and swamped by R.N.E. Noted 11/19. Help? (Nelson, Mass.)
- 760 MEXICO. KEABC, R. ABC, heard over the Cuban 0159-0210 11/16, ID jingle of ABC, ABC, ABC... to the tune of Jingle Bells. Merry Christmas. (Hoffman, Ohio) Heard. Where located? (Sexton, Ont.) A Canadian member of IRCA says Los Reyes, Estado de Mexico. (Ed.)
- 764 IRAQ. Baghdad TT after s/on 2240, IS starts 2254 (bird chirp); by 2315 has faded way down but still there; three stations on at this time: Baghdad, Sottens, and a very weak one looping as SABC, but couldn't pull readable Audio. Noted 11/21. Watch this latter. (Nelson, Mass.) Signal held from 2259 to 2326 11/12; Longest period to date. All chanting. (Robie, Mass.)
- 770 VENEZUELA. YVQQ, R. Puerto La Cruz, atop all with ID at 0501 11/12. (Millar, Wn.)
- 773 U.A.R. Cairo, Egypt, noted dual 818/7075 SW @1818 11/7 during brief WABC lull. The het had been heard for a long time but this was the first time that 770's resurrected paganism subsided to a sufficient extent to let Egypt filter through. (Rugg, Que.)
- 775 COSTA RICA. TIW, R. City, San Jose, music, talk, news, frequent ID's; Part of Radio Mundial Net. (Conrad, Ky.)
NETH. ANTILLES. PJA8, R. Antillana, St. Nicholas, Aruba, ID'd best in early AM after 0400 s/on. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 791 GREECE. VOA, Salonika, finally logged under R.T.F. OC 2358; man speaking in Greek, then continued with interview type program over/under R.T.F. past 0005 11/20. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 795 BARBADOS. R. Barbados, Black Rock, programs old U.S. Pop tunes and ads at 1830-1900. Good signal all evening til 2200 s/off. Veries by air letter, but a mimeo thing. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 800 NETH. ANTILLES. PJB, Trans World Radio, Bonaire, along with XELO, getting to be a nuisance. (Conrad, Ky.) Tsk, tsk! (Ed.)
- 809 YUGOSLAVIA. Skopje AN 11/20 with special programming, probably due to the new earthquake in that area. (Dangerfield, Pa.)

- 812 COLOMBIA. HJBW, Em. Atalaya, Bucaramanga, clear ID at 2359 followed by anthem and sign off. Good signal, much WGY QRM. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 818 U.A.R. Batra, faded in here around 1800 11/7, after another abortive attempt at reporting Andorra; but Egypt was a more welcome catch, my #42 country on BCB; also noted much weaker at 1720 11/8. (Rugg, Que.)
- 863 ARMENIA. Yerevan, logged with fairly good signal 2220-2250; woman in Russian (I don't think was Armenian), bad fade, 11/18. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 881 GERMAN D.R. Radio D.D.R., Berlin, in at 1945 11/20, tough to read though through WCBS. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- WALES. B.B.C. Welsh Home Service, Washford, in control of channel around 0130 11/14, only sign of WCBS being a strong hetro on B.B.C.! (Millar, Wash.) Very good 0330; fooled me for awhile; thought I had LYC-880, hi! Noted 11/16. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 890 DOM. REP. HIPJ, R. Popular, Santo Domingo. Excellent here 0457-0507 11/16; programming was inspiring speech 0457; Lord's Prayer 0458; "Jingle Bells" as theme song 0459, ID @ 0500 as something similar to "R. Popular, La Voz Dominicana," followed by talk and male vocals. Tune out 0507. (Rugg, Que.)
- 895 PERU. OBE/K, R. El Sol, Lima, is consistently mediocre nightly around 2200-2300. (Nelson, Mass.) So am I, Gordon. (Ed.)
- 905 CUBA. CMHW, Santa Clara, L.V. has been heard here evenings. Not sure if this is their regular freq. or if due to XR problems. Definite ID. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- UNID. Noted 11/17 about 2300, couldn't tell if Germany or not; didn't sound like German, but too weak to tell. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 935 MOROCCO. R.T.M., Agadir, on to 2210 11/17, and parallel to other Moroccans carrying Arabic service. Not so strong as last year, maybe directional. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 962 FINLAND. Turku I very good 0100 11/21 along with Tunis II, TUNISIA; could null one out and get perfect readability on the other at will; Turku audio quality better. Turku logged for country #81. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 965 NICARAGUA. YNLU, R. Managua, talk with music very good. Usual s/off 0100; often 10 db signals; L.A. programming. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 975 COSTA RICA. TIRS, R. Athena, San Jose. I have never heard this slogan. ID's as "Radio ??? Costa Rica". Seems 24 hours, at least I hear them past 0300. (Conrad)
- 995 ECUADOR. HCAW2, R. Simpeto, Guayaquil, new station very powerful nightly around 2345; first heard testing 11/16, playing good pop music, xmtr occasionally went off unexpectedly. Perfect Spanish ID 2350 giving freqs. as 995 MW and 96.5-FM; sounds like 50 kw. Heard nightly since. (Nelson, Mass.) NRC is specifically excluded from use of copyright listing which could clear up slight discrepancy in call and slogan. (Ed.)
- 1000 UNID. Terrible jumble of weak Pacific and Asian stations 0300-0500 11/16, nobody up enough to ID. This was the only clear channel for DU stations that morning; bears much watching on MM's here in the East. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1015 EL SALVADOR. YSC, San Salvador, ID's as "Esta Es YSC, Radio ??????" (I guess this part is frequency as I hear a cinco in it.) Very strong often as good as KDKA. (Conrad, Ky.) Slogan is Radio 1015. (Ed.)
- 1020 TONGA IS. ZCO, Nuku-alofa, logged once again over/under KGBS, which was very high and clear 0315 11/16. Why can't I get any other Pacifics. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1040 GUATEMALA. TGXA, R. Centro Musical, Guatemala in nice and strong 0153 with music and advertisements. Easy!!! (Sexton, Ont.)
- 1043 GEORGIA. Tbilisi logged signing on 2043 o/u Dresden; Russian readable occasionally past 2115 11/22; Yerevan-863 very good at this time also; this was Russia night. (Nelson, Mass.) "Govorit You-all!" (Ed)
- 1045 KOREA, NORTH. "R. Pyongyang" outlet quite good 11/13 0945-1000 s/off with repeated IS as shown in WRTVH. (Millar, Wash.)
- 1061 SARDINIA. R.A.I., Cagliari, temporarily overriding Kalundborg and Norte around 1700-1730 parallel to RAI Common Wave 656, which was very high at the time, noted 11/21. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 1079 POLAND. Katowice, trying to break through WTIC 2315 11/20, and successful at times. Not enough readability for a report. (Dangerfield, Pa.)

- 1100 CHINA. "R. Peking" outlet, possibly Taiyuan, Shansi, Prov., good enough for a taped report 11/15 0727-0740. (Millar, Wash.)
- COLOMBIA. HJAT, R. Reloj, Barranquilla, I have heard this one nearly every MM. At 0230, they said "Transmite Radio Reloj in Barranquilla. HJAT, not HJCN. (Sexton, Ont.) HJCN, R. Reloj, Bogota (???-See query in VERIE section) a regular here every MM, usually readable all AM with another SS under. (Hoffman, Ohio)
- 1110 MEXICO. XERCN, R. Cadena Nacional, Mexico, D.F. almost completely over WET & KFAB after midnight. (Hoffman, Ohio)
- 1115 NICARAGUA. YNL, Chinandega. Spanish with much N.A. music, frequent IDs as "Managua, Nicaragua, Centro America." Always good signal. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1125 COSTA RICA. TISRHB, R. Excelsior, San Jose. Excellent signal and strong modulation, which is unusual. Frequent ID's and L.A. programs. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1145 ECUADOR. HCRKL, R. Mundo, Quito. U.S. music and a female announcer; clear ID, but not often very good. NOT Haiti! (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1146 UNID. Someone with Christmas carols at 0345 11/15, and after 0400; could not catch anncts., but suspect 4VAD. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1169 PORTUGAL. CSE30, R. Renascenca, Porto, in the clear at 1555 11/14. (Dangerfield)
- 1195 COSTA RICA. TICA, R. Columbia, Puntarenas, good level to s/off around 2400; often much QRM after VOA-Munich signs on. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1255 COLOMBIA. Unid. heard at 1952 11/20, but faded quickly away. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1315 COLOMBIA. HJAK, La Voz de Patria, Barranquilla, mostly talk. ID's loud and clear. Het from somebody else there about 1313 or 1317, I think. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1322 COLOMBIA. HJ?? talk, L.A. music, not enough for ID. Anybody help? (Conrad, Ky.) HJHY, Sincelejo, previously ID'd on this channel. (Ed.)
- 1325 HAITI. 4VW, Port-au-Prince. Evidently my English-speaker here is only 4VW. In English til 2130 (don't know when started English); French then til s/off; classical concert about 2200 until over, then s/off about 2305-15. (Conrad, Ky.)
- 1392 COLOMBIA. UNID. La Voz de ????? heard 11/16 from 0400-0430, then seemed to go off. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1480 PUERTO RICO. WMDD, Fajardo, in very nicely with special NNRC program on 11/16, 0345 to 0400, and about even with WRDW. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Believed logged on DX for P.R. #1. (Sexton, Ont.)
- 1510 ECUADOR. HCEW2, R. Suceso, Guayaquil listed here in WRMB. Is it still here?(Ed)
- 1520 UNID. Has this R. Aerppuerto business gotten fixed up yet??? (Sexton, Ont.) HON, Colon, PANAMA, seems right for the drifter, last reported at 1527. But believe WRAT-1520 could confuse matters. (Ed.)

L A R S R Y D E N, Kallhall, Sweden says "I find the Nov 14 page packed full of TA receptions, and I have tried to identify some of the unid stations. This is not easy when you have no tapes to listen to, or specific log details. Here are my findings:

- 548 Definitely Braunschwig 200 kw.
- 575 May be Leipzig GDR 120 kw.
- 723 This is Saudi Arabia
- 746 Could be Cottbus GDR 20 kw, scheduled 24 hrs, but may have had a transmission break - this happens in Europe too, although not always MM.
- 764 This is a mystery, as I do not believe Sottens runs AN. Never heard that.
- 783 This is the approx freq of Syria, but they may vary. (Not audible here now).
- 791 Re Thessaloniki Greece note that when not on VOA schedule this station is used for local programming in Greek under the call "Radio Thessaloniki"
- 917 I suggest Radio Ljubljana Yugoslavia 135 kw signing on at 2300
- 953 Possible stn under Czechoslovakia is Syria 30 kw but I believe the best solution is this: On 953 are two Czech stations: Praha 150 kw and Plzen 15 kw. As you can see in the WRI sign on time is 2230; probably the two stations went on local programming for the first period. Time pips were given at half hour probably because this was the first possibility to give correct time for coming day.
- 998 Kichinev 100 kw Mg.davia is the only possible one here.
- 1052 Tripoli probably is only 2 kw, so doubt you heard this one. I suggest Tetuan, Morocco 20 kw. On the other hand, s/on time is rather early for this alternative. Other possibilities are East Germany and Rumania." Thanks, Lars, for helpful data.

Re Tripoli-1052: Though their advertisement in WRHB shows 50 kw., the latest EBU list indicates this is only authorized, that operation is currently with 2 kw. (Ed.)

- 735 MACAU. R. Vila Verde, verified by registered letter my report of 10/12/64. Country #50 for me from California. (Wilkinson)
- 755 RUMANIA. Timisoara. Verie card and letter in for reception of 9/18; specifies 755 kc. (Robie, Mass.)
- 780 PUERTO RICO. AFRS, Ramey A.F.B., sent nice confirming letter (on back of my letter) from Lt. R.P. Everett; also confirms their 50 watts. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1090 URUGUAY. CX28, R. Imparcial, Montevideo, answered my registered mail follow-up of this summer with the same type of transit, sending the usual pennant, CM and promo sheet. Though no v/l was received, I'm counting this conglomeration of goodies as a verie as this is their standard QSL procedure. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1100 COLOMBIA. HJCN, R. Reloj, Bogota. Verie received from report sent to R. Reloj, Bogota, without mention of calls as none heard on the air. Verie specifies HJCN. I have seen frequent reference to this station is HJAT, also R. Reloj in Barranquilla. Exactly what is this ANer? HJCN is 10 kw as opposed to HJAT's 1 kw., and seems to be the more logical choice. HJCN's v/q states 10 kw. and mentions other net stations in Medellin, Barranquilla, and Cali. Anyone know for sure? (Hoffman, Ohio) HJAT is the dominant one here, usually, and does give local ID. See Sexton's report. HJAT, though 1 kw., is apparently right on the seacoast, and gets superb radiation. Both are AN, with one now reported on 1103, but which one unknown at present. If the network stations carry the same program, a verie could be inconclusive, unless the positive local ID were heard. (Ed)
- 1210 HAWAII. KZOO, Honolulu, verie card received for report on P.M. of 10/22. Known as the "Cherry Blossom Station." V/s: Robert H. Pearson. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1380 JAPAN. JOUF, Osaka, sent a very fine card and a long verie letter via air mail on my report of 10/23/64. Verie #53 from Japan. (Wilkinson, Calif.)
- 1480 JAPAN. JORF, Yokohama. Verie card received on 11/20 for a P.M. report of 10/22. This is the station logged before midnight, P.S.T. #54 from Japan. (Wilkinson)

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SWEDEN VERIES ... Lars Ryden writes: "I understand some listeners logged Swedish stations, too, and certainly they would appreciate verifications. Well, if they send their reports to the Radio Sweden address as per WRH, they will probably receive a verification card in return. This is the card used for verifications on reports on "Radio Sweden," i.e. the International Service of the Swedish Broadcasting Corporation, mainly broadcast on shortwave. There is no special card for the domestic networks. If, however, anyone would prefer a personal verification on this letterhead (the Sveriges Radio letterhead-Ed), specifying details regarding the transmitter heard, etc., I shall be glad to take personal care of them. ... I am not responsible editor of the DX programme each week, and consequently am not in a position to take care of any incoming reports, which usually are verified by a secretary. Therefore such reports have to be sent to me personally, either c/of DX-Editor, Radio Sweden, Box 955, Stockholm 1, or to my home address. I can also give you another hint for better verifications from Sweden. As you can see from the WRH, the Swedish Broadcasting Corporation only is a programme producing company, whereas the distribution of the programmes are in the hands of the Royal Board of Telecommunications, who "owns" the transmitters, network, and feeder lines, etc. Their people are of course very interested in reception reports, in fact more than those of the programme people, who verify merely as a PR guest. The technicians of course prefer reports giving correct information of reception, such as signal strength, fading, interference, comparisons with other stations heard at the same time, etc. In return, they usually verify by means of long, interesting letters. Address the letters to Broadcasting Section." Lars, gentlemen, collects stickers, other souvenirs or promotional material from U.S. stations, and I'm sure, would appreciate receipt of surveys, etc. How 'bout a hand along those lines to address shown in credit section, friends.
