To Bill H. & others: The 1360 Hate Club is dead, hi. A fine gathering Saturday at Hugh's, and we were very pleased with the turnout, but still hipped for even more. We all talked at once, and had a lot of fun, and the time went like - pffft! Watch for next group gathering, possibly between 12/25 & 1/1, maybe Sunday 12/27. Veries in from W.I.B.S.-395, v/f, a nice v/l on six-year-old f/up from Ron S.' friend at Montserrat for their DX in '58 on 1550 kc/s.! I never thought I'd ever get their verie after they ignored two earlier reports. Most of my DX this week was on Thursday AM 11/26, Turkey Day: CFAM-1290 cl mx & NX, & s/off @ 2:12am holding its own w/the 1290 ANs. Tried WBCA-1150 r/c but only weak TT, unIDable u/WCOP/XEJP. WPAT-type mx on about 674, could be either France or Radio Musica, Costa Rica, language too weak to ID. WLCB-1530 r/c-DT (dial tone) u/WCKY, & WBFQ-1540 r/c-DT also, u/KXEL/WPTR as listed, only add 5 minutes onto WLCB's listing. They left air at 2:57, actually. Unn WJAK-1460 noted on still another f/c-DT 3:30-3:45 o/WBNS, who go through the motions of s/off at 4am & say back in a few seconds w/5,000 watts, then back they come with usual s/on stuff - odd. An SS-1220 noted s/on 4:30, unID. C/w mx station on 1370 on RS @ 4:10 w/Coca Cola ads, unID. Last (fourth) newie was WGYW-1430, s/on *:58am. Unn WDEV that afternoon atop @ 2:30pm! Same odd good CX on 1460 (CKRB-FF pn top) & on 1270, CFGT, ditto! WJJD at 3. 11/30 Only one new one, WAGL-1560 TEST, booming-fine signal. Noted WIVI-970, maybe AN u/WWSW @ 3:30am. ABM2-1340 was on top at 2:40am! Very interesting TEST from WAGL, engineer was evidently interested in DX as he said channel was clear when he tuned it in on his car radio on the way to the XR. No chance to try for YVQB-1020 12/1 as RX went to "hospital" for one day; it's back tonight in tip-top shape. C U in 7.

I had a very pleasant visit from old pro Hal Robie the other night and spent the evening talking DX, eating lamb chops and listening to my taped DX Library. Insofar as I am concerned, our problem w/Israel-737 is still completely unresolved. I see two stations coming on about 10:55pm; both TAs. Spain plays IS, a man speaks for a while, it resumes, man speaks again, IS resumes, time pip 11pm, woman speaks few words and man begins the NX. At the same time Israel is signing on its SW parallel w/exactly the same format: IS, speech, IS, speech, IS, woman, nan in Arabic! How's that for confusion? The second station heard w/IS one night at 10:59pm was taped; IS is very similar but definitely not identical to that from Israel SW as is obvious when tapes rerun in succession. And to add the final straw, an LA was also heard for the first time last night at this time on 737 plys 30 cycles per second, modulation poor, mentioned Panama often, looped Panama to Guatemala. Don't anybody get upset if I'm found saying that such and such a station was visible or not visible; honest, I'm not on Peyote! I've got a new technique for producing electronic display of a given frequency that tells me exactly how many carriers are there (up to four or five); this is a very sensitive technique that makes stations far below audibility visible. In conjunction w/this technique I've just finished some further modifications that allow me to make direction finding bearings on stations that aren't alone on a channel or even necessarily audible. This system recently passed its test when it enabled me to get good bearing on both Turku & Tunis (962) at a time when both were equally powerful. In addition, the loop enabled both stations to be well separated. I won't go into details about the electronics involved; I'm perfectly willing to talk anybody's ear off who is interested but I don't think it's of general interest. How many other NRCers have high quality oscilloscopes? I'm currently preparing an article for the NRC on the use of direction finding loops on the BCB that will be, I believe, unique in the history of BCB DX. Since there has been a renewed interest in loops lately I have one point to make to anyone who is attempting to use them for direction finding that will save much grief. The point is this: When there are two on the same frequency, the null bearing is intermediate between the bearing for the individual stations taken alone. An example: Around 10pm both Burg, East Germany (nulls 138°) & Miramar (nulls 160°) are both coming through well. When both are coming through equally well, the null bearing is about 149° (the average of the two individual bearings). If Miramar were to fade out, the bearing would shift toward that for Burg, 138°. This effect explains why several DX-ers have found large variations in bearing angles: if there is a second station there, even though inaudible, it will tend to pull the primary bearing in its direction. More next time, meanwhile, good DX to all.

- 548 GERMAN F.R. Draunschweig? Konigslutter? 1845-1900 on 11/19 and other dates. Pop music, time pips at 1900, then news in German. Some time ago, I reported hearing American English on this freq. No ID caught then but presumed it to be AFN. Program apparently was dedicated to Pres. Kennedy, but now nothing but this one being heard. (Piechuta, Conn.) Draunschweig, judging from the manner of listing is metro area served, Konigslutter transmitter location. (Ed.)
- 566 IRELAND. R. Eirean, Athlone, fair to very good 1758-1805 11/20 for my #45 country logged. (Rugg, Que.) Noted 11/7 with Irish music to 1800. (Piechuta, Conn.) Heard very weakly several evenings at 1800. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 575 GERMAN D.R. Leipzig (I believe this one) 1928-2003 11/11; much popular music & announcements in German. Good signal. (Holbrook, Md.)
GERMAN F.R. S.D.R., Muhlacker, 1915 in German with Pop music 11/18. (Piechuta)
LATVIA. Riga logged 11/21 2200-2230, mixed with Leipzig, with Muhlacker off the air. In Russian, then Latvian. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 584 SPAIN. R.N.E., Madrid, heard very well here signing on at 2300, and signing off at 2000. However, don't know if he signs off at 2000 every night; might sign off earlier at times. (Gustafson, Ill.) A real powerhouse here. Really beats out opposition on 580 and 590. Heard till about 1800. (Geller, N.J.)
UNID. Uninterrupted music, pop from 1920-1945, then classical music to 2000, followed by more pop to abrupt s/off at 2015. Not one spoken word during this time. What time does Madrid s/off? Noted 11/20. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 593 GERMAN F.R. Hessischer Rundfunk, Frankfurt, noted 1800 11/22 with news in German. (Piechuta, Conn.)
MOROCCO. R.T.M., Oujda I, heard many evenings to 1900, but is not as good as the other Moroccans on 611, 701, and 935. (Gustafson, Ill.) Logged 11/1 1810-1832, Arabic music with chanting. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 594A UNID. U.S. Pop music around 2100 on 11/18; couldn't catch ID and language didn't seem to be English. Probably an L.A. Anbody know for sure. (Sampson, NJ)
- 602 FRANCE. R.T.F., Lyon, must have been the one here with powerful signal in French shortly after 1700 11/22. Didn't stick with it as I have many French stations and I wanted to look for something more spectacular. Not heard here before at this hour. (Robie, Mass.)
- 605 COLOMBIA. HJKL, Emisora Nueva Granada, Bogota, comes in most evenings, with a poor signal. It consists mostly of talking in Spanish. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 611 MOROCCO. R.T. Marocaine, Sebaa-Aioun, good to 1900 s/off; starts coming in about 1730. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 625 COSTA RICA. TIRICA, La Voz de la Victor, San Jose, noted 2159 to 2220 11/17; have this one verified in previous years as TIPG and TIDCR. Good verifier. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 638 SPAIN. R.N.E., San Sebastian, heard well in the early evenings to 2000. This one is not quite so well received as Madrid 584, Barcelona 737, or the best one Sevilla 683. (Gustafson, Ill.) In weakly under CBN s/lop after 1900 11/20. I believe they s/off 1914, but am not sure. (Rugg, Que.) Noted fighting it out with Prague 11/22 1815-1830. (Piechuta, Conn.) Heard 1739-1756 on 11/14, often good in the afternoon. (Holbrook, Md.)
UNID. Language/location not ID'd. Heard with orchestral music at 0056 on Sunday 11/22, with several loud chimes at 0102, then more music. Seems awfully early (0600 GMT) for Spain??? (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 641 SURINAM. RADIKA, Paramaribo, logged 11/16 0332-0414 poor, with very heavy QRM, with Hindustani type music; again logged 1916-1946 11/18 with heavy QRM; Hindustani music til 1925, when am sure they were in English. On 11/19, logged from 2120 to 2130 apparent s/off. Real rough here with QRM from 640. (Holbrook)
- 647 ENGLAND. B.B.C. European Service, Crowborough, noted 11/21 with foreign service programs 2251 to 2330 when they signed off abruptly. (Holbrook, Md.)
ENGLAND. B.B.C. Third Program, Daventy, noted 11/15 1647 to 1705 good to fair. (Holbrook Md.) News in English 11/12 at 1800; Very good lately. (Piechuta, Conn.)

- 647 UKRAINE. Simferopol, heard at 2125 11/22, but not enough for a report. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 650 COLOMBIA. HJKH, La Voz Amiga, Bogota, now has no silent period; ruins frequency. (Schatz, Fla.) Brand new one, apparently, AN Monday 11/23, with ID's as "La Voz Amiga" and "Union Radio en Bogota." At 0400, announcer mentioned about 10 other Colombian BCB stations by slogan and city. (Cooper, N.Y.) HJKH probably the Colombian one at 0440 11/23. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- HAWAII. KORL, Honolulu, occasionally over HJKH with rock and roll Monday morning 11/23. (Schatz, Fla.)
- 655 EL SALVADOR. YSS, R. Nacional, San Salvador, 11/9 1945 with good signal; it comes in most every evening. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 656 ITALY. R.A.I. Synchronised network poor to good 1656-1727 11/20 for Country #44. (Rugg, Que.)
- UNID. A weak T.A. station heard near 2400; have not been able to identify this one. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 660 MEXICO. XERPM, R. Programas de Mexico, Mexico, D.F. very clear behind WNBC at 2330-2400 11/25, with U.S. Standard pop music. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 665 LITHUANIA. Kaunas, very good signal past 2200 s/on 11/22; man and woman with Lithuanian program. (Schatz, Fla.)
- 680 PUERTO RICO. WAPA, San Juan, signs on 0445 with annct in Spanish, then anthem, in third place to open carrier, probably KNDR, and non-stop record-player. (Callarman, Texas)
- 683 SPAIN. R.N.E., Sevilla, is the best T.A. signal on the band, and should be hrd from Coast to Coast. Sure packs a wallop here. Transmitter comes on at 2230; at 2245, he comes on with interval signal, different from the one Barcelona on 737 uses, though both are R.N.E. stations. Have heard him signing off a few minutes after 2000 several nights. (Gustafson, Ill.) Really puts in an amazing signal here. Strongest-sounding Spaniard. (Geller, N.J.)
- WEST BERLIN. R.I.A.S. was probably the strong German speaker which apparently signed on 11/22 at 2230, completely overriding Belgrade, which had been on since before 2200. However, the German was in turn buried at 2250 when Sevilla turned on its powerful transmitter. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 685 GUATEMALA. TGRT. R. Fabulosa, Guatemala, noted with strong signal 2200-2230 on 11/4. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 692 GERMAN D.R. Deutschlandsender, Suhl, poor to fair 2155 s/on to 2238 11/21, in parallel with 782 and 728. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 695 DOMINICA. W.I.B.S., Roseau, noted 11/13 1857-1940, fair to good, in English. (Holbrook, Md.) Heard with weak signals around 2000. (Gustafson, Ill.) Absolutely terrific signal here 11/25 from 2040 to 2115 s/off. Normally poor, but clear and completely readable on this occasion. Exceptional reception such as this is always thrilling to hear. (Robie, Mass.)
- 701 MOROCCO. R.T.M., Sebba-Aioun, heard well many evenings from 1730 to 1900 s/off; WLW gives him a rough time at times. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 725 UNID. AN Spanish speaker here Sunday mornings. Guess it's TILX. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 728 GERMAN D.R. Deutschlandsender, Schwerin, fair to poor from time to time 11/21 after 2155 s/on, parallel 782 and 692. (Holbrook, Md.)
- SPAIN. R.N.E., La Coruna, very strong 0209-0226 11/22, two ID's at 0215. (Rugg)
- UNID. Weak T.A. heard here; believe it to be the German. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 733 UNID. Who is station heard here, really strong, 1702. In practically every evening. Seemed like a T.A. but not entirely sure. (Geller, N.J.)
- 737 SPAIN. R.N.E., Barcelona, comes in real well and often; runs later than the other R.N.E. stations. Hear him at 2245 with interval signal and s/on a few minutes later. He seems to s/off at about 2007. (Gustafson, Ill.) Rock and roll type music to 1800, then church bells, ID by femme, and news in Spanish. (Piechuta, Conn.) R.N.E. and second UNID. T.A. still both s/on about 2258; now there's a further complication: Unid. L.A. now being heard past 2300, very poor audio quality, mentions Panama often, loops Panama to Guatemala; this station 23 cycles to the high side of R.N.E. (Nelson, Mass.)

- 737 UNID. L.A. reported by Dangerfield, Hoffman, is rough copy here due to heavy slop over from the Canadian on 740, but here are the results to date: It may be Radiolandia, TIRA, San Jose, Costa Rica, probably with 10 kw., down from 750. Heard here 2230-2330 11/25 with music, news and time checks, all Spanish. "RADIOLANDIA... COSTA RICA ... CENTRO AMERICA" seems to be part of the announcement, although I admit there is some doubt. (No signs of Spain, Israel, Iceland, etc., on this particular occasion.) (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 755 PORTUGAL. Lisbon a powerhouse here. Heard him to 2000 one night, but believe he signs off shortly after 1900 regularly otherwise. One evening, heard two other T.A.'s interfering with him. One of them signed off at 1830, but the other one stayed on and caused a heterodyne. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 760 MEXICO. XEABC, Radio ABC, Los Reyes, Mex. logged for report 11/30 0205-0235 well atop the Cuba tick-tock. Report to Radio ABC, Plaza Ferrocarriles 5, Pinar Pisa, Mexico, D.F., address from IRCA member in S.L.P. Station plays Mexican Top 40 type music with very rapid-speaking announcer, who each break mentions "La estacion de Los Reyes." (Callarman, Tex.)
- 764 IRAQ. R. Baghdad, logged several evenings 11/19, 11/20, & 11/21 poor to fair here. S/on around 2158; Arabic type programming, much music, chanting. Asian #2 in 18 years of DX. (Holbrook, Md.) Very strong 11/22 2200 to almost 2300; must be directional to the west, as I suspect the U.A.R. stations on 773/818 are. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- SENEGAL. Dakar copied 11/16, for another report, in hope of getting a verie this time. Good until s/off, but not the early season regular it used to be earlier in the season. Always heard, but often poorly. (Robie, Mass.)
- SWITZERLAND. Sottens heard with good signals after 0100; also on this frequency heard of course is the real powerhouse of DX stations, Dakar, SENEGAL, good almost every evening to 1900; There is a T.A. giving him slight interference all the way to 1900; might be Sottens then, too. (Gustafson, Ill.) Sottens in French 1710-1714 s/off 11/20 through Senegal. (Rugg, Que.)
- UNID. T.A. with chanting between 0100 and 0130 11/9. Is it Iraq or Senegal? (Bartels, Wis.) This late, it'd be Senegal. (Ed.)
- 773 U.A.R. Cairo, continues to be the best Egyptian evenings. (Piechuta, Conn.) Poor with chanting thru WABC lulls around 1800 11/20. (Rugg, Que.)
- 782 GERMAN D.R. Deutschlandsender, Burg, most reliable of three parallel frequencies, others 692 and 728. Logged 11/21 2155 s/on to 2238. Heard many evenings here. (Holbrook, Md.)
- PORTUGAL. CSE9, Miramar, heard well early evenings around 1830, but 780 interference is usually very heavy on him. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 795 BARBADOS. R. Barbados, Black Rock, in every night with a good signal. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 800 NETH. ANTILLES. PJB, Bonaire, is in every night; it comes way over CKLW and XELO. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 809 UNID. A Spanish station heard here, very weak, though. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 818 ANDORRA. Radio des Vallees, Andorra, finally came in for a good log and report, 1728-1751 in French 11/20. Multilingual ID 1745. (Rugg, Que. Heard here and taped 11/5, really coming in strong, dominating 820. (Geller, N.J.) Real good signals at 2345 s/on, but have heard him better after 0100 on a couple of occasions. This is one of the better T.A. signals here. Cannot find any trace of Cairo, though have heard T.A. carrier here around 2230. (Gustafson, Ill.) Logged 1930-1959 s/off, with popular music and many U.S. selections. (Holbrook, Md) Pop music, including English at 1930 11/18. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 822 COSTA RICA. TIOS, R. Titania, San Jose, here evening of 11/18. Saw some question on frequency recently. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 827 BULGARIA. Sofia heard 11/21 with excellent sig at 1659 when IS was repeated several times prior to their prog'm in Italian; clear ID repeated twice by man followed, and signal held until 1725 for best catch of week. (Robie, Mass.) Logged here for sure with ID in Macedonian (?) at 2330 s/on, good level. Prior to s/on, this station plays a highly entertaining (if you're watching) selection of tone test wave forms, including square waves. Noted 11/26, Ctry #85. (Nelson)

- R. Sofia probably the station here after 1700 11/21 & 11/22 in what appeared to be Italian. Off the air by 1730. All data checks with WRTVH. I was just unable to get ID. (Rugg, Que.)
- 828 SPAIN. EAJ1, R. Barcelona, in Spanish at 1945 11/18. (Piechuta, Conn.)
NICARAGUA. YNOL, Ondas del Luz, Managua, with a good signal 2045-2115 10/26. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 834 DR. HONDURAS. R. Belize in with a good signal every night. (Bartels, Wis.) Has "Rah-dio Nederlands" program "Wondrous World" 11/18 2055. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 836 FRANCE. R.T.F., Nancy, noted 11/17 1745 with piano music. (Piechuta, Conn.) Noted 1733-1801 s/off 11/1. Heard frequently since. (Holbrook, Md.) Good here around 2330. (Gustafson, Ill.)
LEDANON. R. Lebanon, Beirut, noted 11/8 1622-1655 under, over and through Nancy. Good at times with Arabic programming. 1st Asian in 18 years of listening. (Holbrook, Md.) Sounds like a filter cigarette commercial, Hank! (Ed.) Beirut finally logged in Arabic at s/off 1728 over R.T.F. Had a real hard time ID'ing him for sure. Usually far below R.T.F. but up very high 11/24. (Nelson, Mass.)
- 840 GUATEMALA. R. Emperador, Guatemala, heard with marimba music following WHAS & HJBI s/off 11/25 and apparently off 0202½. On 11/24, heard Radio Emperador ID at 0049, and ID 0138 11/26 with Hawaiian music to follow. (Freeman, Calif.)
UNID. L.A. in every night after WHAS signs off, has a weak signal, maybe it is Guatemala. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 845 ITALY. R.A.I., Rome. In very well despite local CKVL-850 just before 1900, 11/20; CKVL then put on raucous music and drowned 'em out, darn. (Rugg, Que.) Good practically each evening. Strongest ever here on 11/22 1845. (Piechuta, Conn.) Doesn't come through here very often, but heard him well on a couple of occasions with real good signals near 1930. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 850 NICARAGUA. YNAV, Managua, on after KOA s/off 10/29 0100-0130. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 854 RUMANIA. Bucharest, very good early eves, even topping PJC2 at times. (Schatz, Fla.)
WEST BERLIN. R.I.A.S. added to the log 11/7 2157 to 2226 apparent s/off and is frequently noted evenings. Popular music during above period. (Holbrook, Md.) On at 0030 and heard until 0130, apparently with a special program. Almost like a local at 0030; never heard before here. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
UNID. There are two T.A.'s heard battling it out around 1830 several evenings; can copy neither so far, but am going to try to stick it out some evening and maybe one of them will make it. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 860 BRAZIL. PRA3, Rio de Janeiro, apparently an all-nighter; often on top around 0200 here. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 863 ARMENIA. Yereven is heard here almost nightly in Armenian (not Russian as previously thought) from 2100 past 2245; see no sign of Ben's station signing on at 2215. But on 11/26, another station faded in around 2225; was just enough off freq. to produce an audible het. This 2nd station looped just right for Nairobi; bears much watching. (Nelson, Mass.) Logged 11/21 from 2100 to after 2200 with a fair amount of detail. I believe the language up to 2200 was Armenian, but at 2200 Moscow was relayed, so Russian used. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
FRANCE. R.T.F., Paris, at poor level through CJBC, CKVL 1700-11/20. (Rugg, Que.) Good here around 0030. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 870 UNID. Crazy sound on 870 all morning 11/22. Any ideas? (Geller, N.J.)
- 872 SPAIN. EAJ101, R. Zaragoza, had quick ID 1742 11/22, but faded before I could get enough for a report. (Rugg, Que.) Heard here with good signals 1900 and after. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 880 GUATEMALA. TGJ, R. Nuevo Mundo, Guatemala, in with WCBS 0003 11/25, no ID but they referred to an item occurring "aqui in Guatemala" which is good enough for me. (Rugg, Que.) In with good signal every Monday morning. Some nights, it even knocks out WCBS. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 885 MONTSERRAT. R. Montserrat, Plymouth, logged 11/13 in English 2010 to 2038 at fair to poor level. (Holbrook, Md.) I've been working on Montserrat here. I can occasionally get BFO tone before 2100 and once some modulation, but only a couple of minitse of classical mx. Loss of signal 2100 indicates I'm working on Montserrat OK. (Freeman, Calif.) Heard weakly around 2000. (Gustafson, Ill.)

- 908 ENGLAND. B.B.C. Brookmans Park here weakly after 1700 11/22 with a brief burst of fortitude at 1709. Not enough data to report. (Rugg, Que.)
- 917 YUGOSLAVIA. Ljubljana is Bob's unid. here; puts OO on around 2246 and signs on 2300 nightly. Not the slightest trace of a second stn visible. (Nelson, Mass.) Heard early evenings on a couple of occasions. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 926 BELGIUM. R.T. Belge, Brussels, 11/17 with talk, xylophone IS at 1815. (Piechuta, Conn.) Good around 0030. (Gustafson, Ill.) Weakly after 0130 11/22, but not enough for a report. (Rugg, Que.)
- 935 GERMAN D.R. Deutscher Sodatensender seems to s/off at 1930. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Program of pop music here between 1900 and 1930. Details seem to match Ben Dangerfield's reference in Nov. 14 DXD. (Robie, Mass.)
- MOROCCO. Agadir noted 11/11 at good level 1837-1902 s/off; arabic music and chanting most of period. (Holbrook, Md.) Very good here 1730-1900. (Gustafson)
- UKRAINE. Lvov, following s/off of Burg, interval signal noted 2000, followed by R. Moscow relay in English. End of transmission approximately 2030. Heard both 11/21 and 11/22 good signals. S/on again with regular Russian broadcast at 2200 on 11/21. However, on 11/22, Russian programming was noted at 2100. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Believe heard here between 2204 and 2236 11/17 carrying Oriental type music, but was mixed in with what sounded like Spanish throughout most of that period, so waiting for better copy. At other times when reception has been more certain, it has been too brief for a report. (Robie, Mass.)
- 944 FRANCE. R.T.F. Toulouse I, good here after 0000. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 953 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Think Bob Hoffman's station here (Nov. 14 DXD) may well be Czechoslovakia. Heard poorly here, though not at s/on. Prague on 638 uses IS such as he describes, and also has six time pips at 2230. (Robie, Mass.) The trumpet fanfare, I believe, is used on Foreign Service programs only. (Ed.)
- SPAIN. EAJ29, R. Intercontinental, Madrid, good after 0030. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 962 UNID. Mystery heard after 0000 in French; don't know if this is Tunis or not; have written reports to him two years in a row without an answer. (Gustafson)
- 971 GERMAN F.R. Westdeutscher Rundfunk, Langenburg, logged 11/22 0115 to 0144 at fair level with heavy QRM. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 975 ECUADOR. HCAW2, Ondas del Pacifico, Guayaquil, noted on R/S 0121 11/23, still on after 0200, maybe AN. WRH says call is HCAW2, but not used on ID's. Spanish pop songs, no ranchero. (Morss, Mass.)
- 989 SPAIN. R.N.E., Madrid, heard here early evenings to 1900 with weak signals and heavy 990 interference. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 995 ECUADOR. HCEW2, R. Suceso, Guayaquil. This complete ID heard, surprisingly well, 2115 and 2130 11/23, with Latin American music. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- ECUADOR. HCPC2, Radio El Tiempo, Guayaquil, here from 610 kc/s with 10 kw. power. Intense signal here all evening. No fixed sked; ID's at odd times. (Schatz, Fla.)
- 998 ANDORRA. Very weak here around 0100. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- MOLDAVIA. Kichinev usually noted parallel to the various transmissions described under UKRAINE-935; noted at various times 11/21 and 11/22 with good signals (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- 1000 MEXICO. XEFV, Cd. Juarez, Chih., daytimer, noted 11/28 0950-1005 with long string of commercials in Spanish. Good on western sunrise skip until groundwave from KTOK took over. (Callarman, Texas.)
- 1015 EL SALVADOR. YSC, San Salvador, a weak signal 11/8 2145-2200. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 1016 GERMAN F.R. Rheinsender good signals in early evenings. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1025 AUSTRIA. Dobl/Kronsborf stations atop the freq. 11/22 with loud and clear signals 1717 to s/off 1805. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
- COSTA RICA. TIAC, R. Fides, San Jose, comes in with a fair signal about three times a week. (Bartels, Wis.)
- SPAIN. EAJ8, R. San Sebastian, following s/off of Austria, came in with a strong signal until its 1900 s/off with "Viva Franco." (Dangerfield, Pa.) Heard often evenings with "Arriba Espana ----" "Transmite Radio (San Sebastian-?)" at 1900 s/off on 11/22. Leaves R. Fides in clear after s/off. (Piechuta, Conn.)

- 1030 MEXICO. XEQR, R. Centro, Mexico, D.F. Re Conditions of frequencies 1st, XEQR went past 0430 11/30. Noted with ID 0437. (Callarman, Texas)
 UNID. L.A. mostly under XEQR 11/23 with same type program. Who? (Schatz, Fla.)
- 1034 PORTUGAL. CSB2, R. Clube Portugues, Parede, in quite clearly 2330-2400 on 11/24 I don't think this one signs off. (Dangerfield, Pa.) Heard regularly here evenings. (Gustafson, Ill.) Noted 2345 with music and song 11/14. (Piechuta, Conn)
- 1035 HAWAII. WVEF, Cap-Haitien, heard almost every night with a good signal. They have an English news program 2000-2015. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 1040 BRAZIL. PRG2, R. Tupi, Sao Paulo, with a fair signal 11/9 0145-0240. (Bartels)
HAWAII. KHVH, Honolulu, logged 11/22 0355 to after 0450. Pretty weak signal, but enough to report, I think. Freq. was clear. (Dangerfield, Pa.)
 UNID. French off and on 0220-0230, any suggestions? Another friend also heard it. 11/9. (Bartels, Wis.)
 UNID. English off and on between 0220-0230, possibly KHVH, noted 11/9. (Bartels)
- 1043 GERMAN D.R. Radio D.D.R., Dresden, in and out with deep fades 0100 11/23. (Morss, Mass.) Heard in early evenings with QRM from another T.A. (Gustafson, Ill.) Hrd quite well on 11/20 from 1745 to 1800. Got a tape. (Geller, N.J.)
- 1052 ENGLAND. B.B.C., Start Point, with CHUM trouble 1642-1651 11/22, paralleling 1088; surprised this one could override the 1050 domestics. Report out. (Rugg)
- 1061 PORTUGAL. Norte II, heard 1902-1918 s/off on 11/7 with good signal, but QRM is heavy. (Holbrook, Md.) Good in early evenings. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1075 COSTA RICA. TIFC, San Jose, good signal 1935-2015 10/27. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 1088 ALBANIA. Tirana, heard on a couple of occasions near 2330. (Gustafson, Ill.)
ENGLAND. B.B.C. Droitwich, ripping apart WBAL 1750 11/20. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1097 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Bratislava, believed the one here with opera from 1722-1738 fade and again with instrumentals from 1816 to 1828 11/20, but I never heard any talk thus couldn't recognize any language and pin it down. (Rugg, Que.) Excellent choral music 1815-1830 11/19, English announcement by femme. (Piechuta, Conn.) Heard near 2300. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1106 GERMAN F.R. AFW, Munich, heard early evenings. (Gustafson, Ill.) Noted with Giants football game 11/22 1730, strong QRM from UNID. with Operatic arias. (Piechuta, Conn.)
LITHUANIA. Vilnius, good most nights past 2200 s/on. Parallel 665? (Schatz, Fla.)
- 1115 ITALY. R.A.I. Synchronised with 2d program, logged 11/21 1630-1640 s/off. In the clear at the time. (Dangerfield, Pa.) 1631-1639 11/22 w/RAI ID at 1639; report out. (Rugg, Que.)
- 1124 BELGIUM. Wavre suspected to be the French mingled with Barcelona, Spain, 1735 11/22. (Rugg, Que.)
SPAIN. EAJ15, R. Espana de Barcelona, good at times 11/11 1720-1754. (Holbrook)
- 1169 PORTUGAL. CSB30, R. Renascenca, heard in evenings with heavy 1170 interference. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1170 PUERTO RICO. WLEO, Ponce, will be AN Christmas AM in Spanish; WWVA was off that day last year. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 1178 SWEDEN. Horby caught for the first time here on 11/22 fair level till 0200 fade. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 1200 UNID. English with fair signal 0508-0515 11/2. It had singing and music; at 0508 I heard an announcement of the time for 0308. Any suggestions? (Bartels, Wis.)
- 1205 FRANCE. R.T.F., Bordeaux, a powerhouse here near 0000. (Gustafson, Ill.)
POLAND. Polskie Radio, Logged parallel to 1304 11/7 1931 to 2000 s/off. (Holbrook, Md.)
 UNID. After 2200, noted 11/14 dignified pop dance music to 2230, then news in English, unable to determine accent. Not obviously American nor British) carrier came on at 2240 and the hetro didn't help any. Quite weak signals. Last season, an unid. here was reported by many. Definitely Thule, definitely NOT Thule, Ascension Island, NOT Ascension Island, CBC relay, Etc. Maybe this season the mystery will be solved. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 1210 HAWAII. KZOC, Honoruru, unusually good and readable 11/23 0130-0300; little reportable info; no savvy Japanese. (Schatz, Fla.)
 UNID. L.A. over/under KZOC to 0200 s/off. Don't recognize anthem. Who? (Schatz)

- 1160 UNID. Believe the French one heard here well before WJJD comes in. (Geller, NJ.)
- 1180 UNID. Believe SS, heard AM of 11/22, with loop pointing South; ID'd at 0240 as "Radio Cantambere." (Geller, N.J.)
- 1187 HUNGARY. Szolnoc I. Heard with fair signal 11/23 1703-1755 when it faded. (Robie, Mass.)
- 1205 FRANCE. R.T.F., Bordeaux, heard well every night to 1800 signoff. (Geller, N.J.)
Above four items out of order, sorry. (Ed.)
- 1214 ENGLAND. B.B.C. Light Program is on with pop music these nights until 2100 or so. (Cooper, N.Y.) Noted 1744 to 1815 11/7 with program of popular music, in well. (Holbrook, Md.) Continues good here also. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 1223 SWEDEN. Fauln sounded parallel to 1178, but much better signal; good till 0220 on 11/22. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 1235 BERMUDA. ZBML, R. Bermuda, Hamilton. As good as S9 11/30 0117-0155 for complete log with pop music on "Bermuda Calling" show, now billed as Bermuda's only AM program. A few commercials noted. (Callarman, Tex.)
- 1286 CZECHOSLOVAKIA. Rough one to copy here, heard near 2230. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1295 ENGLAND. B.B.C. European Service, Crowborough, in German 11/15 at 0005. (Piechuta, Conn.)
- 1300 PUERTO RICO. WILL, Mayaguez, is AM; heard under WERE here. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 1304 POLAND. Polskie Radio, was noted in parallel to 1205 1931-2100 s/off 11/7. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 1313 NORWAY. Stavanger. First time for Norway; excellent signal on 11/22; s/on 0130, still going strong 0230. (Sampson, N.J.)
- 1325 UNID. French speaker 1840-1900 11/9. 4VW or Trinidad. (Bartels, Wis.) 4VW. (Ed)
- 1331 ITALY. R.A.I., synchronised logged 11/8 0035-0106, but rough through 1330 QRM. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 1358 GERMAN D.R. East Berlin heard regularly Sunday mornings shortly after midnight. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- UNID. Believed to be Bremen, heard with real good signals near 0000. (Gustafson)
- 1376 FRANCE. R.T.F., Lille I, a powerhouse here around 0100. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1460 Spanish-speaker on this channel AM, logged 0324 to 0400 but could not read ID due to severe, low-pitched het. Gives 5-10 second anct., including time check equal to EST, between each record. Plays quite a bit of ranhero music, but not Mexico. (Callarman, Tex.)
- 1466 MONACO. R. Monte Carlo, a powerhouse around 0100. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1475 AUSTRIA. Wien I, noted 11/7 1658-1731 with rock and roll type music at good level. (Holbrook, Md.) Very good signals near 0000. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1495 INTL. WATERS. R. Caroline II, fairly good at 0137 to 0222 with pop and rock and roll music. (Holbrook, Md.)
- 1502 POLAND. Warsaw logged 11/7 1822 to 1850 good strength with pop music. (Holbrook) Very good signals near 0000. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1510 BRAZIL. At least 5 unid. 100-watters here 11/23 past 0300, one dominant playing accordian music. Faint but readable. Ok, men, stop saying "wow!" and dive in there! (Schatz, Fla.) Wow! (ed.)
- 1520 INTL. WATERS. R. Caroline s/on 0100 & still tremendous 0300 11/23. (Morss, Mass.)
- 1525 COSTA RICA. TIEEAW, R. Turrialba, Turrialba, now heard well evenings. ID's with calls, a rarity among Costa Ricans. (Schatz, Fla.)
- 1529 VATICAN. Vatican Radio noted 11/7 1650-1657 s/off and several evenings since. (Holbrook, Md.) Heard on one occasion near 0200, too weak for good copy. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1538 GERMAN F.R. Mainflingen was one of best TA's early Sept., at 1900 & at 2230 s/on Not too good lately, tho. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- SENEGAL. Dakar heard on occasions near 1900; verified last season on this channel. (Gustafson, Ill.)
- 1540 BAHAMAS. ZNS, Nassau, in every night under KXEL. S/off 2305. (Bartels, Wis.)
- 1546 UNID. Stationweak in unid. lingo along with B.B.C. Common Wave around 1620 may well be Baranovitji, but can't be sure yet. (Nelson, Mass.)
