I will also use this space to answer any questions about the Contests. If anyone wants a personal reply, please send an SASE. Dale Dawson writes, "If 50,000 watters cannot be counted within a 1,000 mile radius of home, how about those who operate on a lesser power by night and are logged at that time?" Answer: Any 50kw station within a 1,000 mile radius of home that decreases power at night, Dale (there are not many, anyway) is logged after it cuts power may be counted for Contests #1, 2 & 4. Frank Wheeler asks, "Can we use each station in all five contests, or must we use a different station for each contest? Like, could I use WBEN in all contests, or must I use another one for the other four contests, etc.?" Answer: It would be rather hard to use any station for all five contests, Frank, for if a station is used for the Graveyards Contest, it could not be used for the 250-watters Contest, consisting of only NON-graveyard 250 watt stations. However, it is possible to use a station for four of the five contests, and this is permissible. Thanks to the first entrants. Now how about YOU sending your money in?

So, get to it, lads - Steve's address is 435 Jayson Ave., Pittsburgh, Pa. 15228 and Mike's is 513 Snyder Hall, Pennsylvania State University, University Park, Pa. Mike is handling Contests #2, 3 & 5, while Steve is running #1 & 4. Entry fee for each is 20¢, & you may enter one, or all, or any number, of Contests. ADDRESS CHANGES ! !

 A clipping from HANK TYNDALL was received some time ago. I'll pass it on in part. NEW MIDDLEBURY RADIO STATION MAY HAVE TO QUIT. Radio Station WFAD, which has been broadcasting here for the last two weeks, may be forced off the air by a decision of the appellate court in Washington, D.C. The court reversed a decision of the FCC which allowed the new WFAD to begin operations July 22. The appeal has been made by WIPS of Ticonderoga, N. Y. which sought to keep the Middlebury station from beginning operations on the grounds it would hurt them economically. If WFAD is forced off the air, Donald Fisher, co-owner and station manager claims it will be the first time a station has been forced off for these reasons. (We suspect this will involve a long series of appeals and counter appeals, but any of you who have the chance to hear the station should try to get your verification while the getting is good!)

I must say I'm very proud of the way Mike Tilbrook and Steve Weinstein took the bull by the horns, rules wise, on the five different contests. I plan to enter them all. The reason we eliminated verifications as a necessity for contest points is that many of the old-timers who would like to participate in the contests feel they can't because they don't want to ask a station to verify another report for them. Thus, when they get up to 700 to 1000 or more verifications, pickings are pretty slim for a DX contest. But going further than this, I am interested to see what effect this has on the verification picture overall. The value of the verification, as I have pointed out before, has gone down in recent years, with many stations not sending out any ... or just a few ... and some stations verifying everything they get. Perhaps one or two of our contestants will be tempted to cheat ... to claim a station he hasn't actually heard ... such as we've had in the past. But the contest managers have the right to request definite proof of reception, logging notes, tapes, if available, and so the suspected misreport can still be checked. The requirement for verification hasn't stopped some DX'ers from verifying stations without hearing them, as we've pointed out before. So that really is a moot point.

- 870 HAWAII. KAIM, sent a form letter verie for my report of 8/23/64. V/s was Robert L. Lyon, GE. (Scrimgeour, Calif.) My goof, should-a been in verie secti n. (Ed.)
- 877 NO. KOREA. Pyongyang outlet on about this freq. 9/12 @ 0530. (Seaver, Calif.) Presumably No. Korea, the loudest TP on 9/12. S9 at 0610. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 920 DOM. REP. HICK, Ondas del Yaque, Santiago, back here from 930. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 950 ARGENTINA. LR3, R. Belgrano, Buenos Aires, noted with fair signal at 0445 s/on 9/2, covered by YVKS s/on at 0500. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 970 VENEZUELA. Still unable to ID this one. Tentatively, think it is YVLR, R. Central, Maracay, from 990. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 980 VENEZUELA. R. Servicio, Maracaibo. Not sure if this is a new one. However, format is different from the one formerly here (R. Catatumba) and asks for reportsto Apartado Aereo 1450; gives local QTH and telephone numbers different from those given on my verie from Catatumba. Later report says Definitely new, call seems to be YVRH? Fate of YVND unknown. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1025 UNID. L.A. Heard 9/12 at 0540, thought SS at the time, but tape is indeterminate. Possibly HJER of those onchannel. (Seaver, Calif.)
- 1030 ARGENTINA. LS10, R. Libertad, Buenos Aires, almost positive it's the Spanish speaker heard under XEQR. No ID's heard, but plenty of music at 0228 MM 2/19. (Silvera, Jamaica). 2/19? (Ed.)
- 1050 NETH. ANTILLES. PJL3, R. Caribe, Willemstad, Curacao, heard with excellent signal and music. Talk in Papamiento and ID till 0100 s/off 9/4. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1060 COLOMBIA. HJGU, R. Bucarica, Bucaramanga, noted with music and ID's at 0205 9/3. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1080 NICARAGUA. YNL, R. Circuito, Leon. Station thus IDing with rancho music from 0523-0600 9/5 when 4VA s/on. Not listed here. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1115 PANAMA. R. Minutera, Colon, new station on with 24 hour format like Reloj Nacional. Heard since 7/10. (Silvera, Jamaica). Correct name ought to be Radio Minutera if adjective is to agree with noon. (Wood, Ind.)
- 1160 NEW ZEALAND. 3XC, Timaru, by far my best TP reception this year, best signals 9/12 at 0500 and 0555 ID's, better than WJJD has ever been. (Seaver, Calif.) Audible from 0430 on 9/12, best strength after 0530 to 0604 s/off. Clear ID at 0600. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 1200 UNID. Commercial station in Japanese, with U.S. pop music. Presumably a TP, not Brazil. Too noisy for ID. 9/12 at 0430. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 1210 ARGENTINA. LV3, R. Cordoba, Cordoba. Gordon, note correct location. Has a magnificent pennant in blue, yellow and white. (Wood, Ind.)
- 1250 MEXICO. XEDL, Hermosillo, Sonora, was very loud on 9/12 over KTMS until 0210 s/off. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 1310 COLOMBIA. HJAK, La Voz de la Patria, Barranquilla, now here from 1315 kc. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1370 JAPAN. JOKD, Kitami, heard as early as 0345 EST on 9/12; loud at 0520 with English lessons. (Scrimgeour, Calif.) JOKD/JORB, NHK II programming (EE lessons) heard through domestics 9/12 at 0512. (Seaver, Calif.)
- 1375 COLOMBIA. HJEA, La Voz del Cauca, Popoyan, noted weakly under TIMAR with music at 2321 8/7. (Silvera, Jamaica)
- 1414 COLOMBIA. HJHM, La Voz de Calarca, Calarca, heard at 0151 8/22 with Bolero Music. Seems to be NSP. (Silvera)
