For example, the new 50,000w XR-tower location of Station CHRC-800 Quebec City, Que. is approximately 15 miles S of the city on Highway #1, & has a large sign informing those who pass by what is taking place. Actually the ground-breaking had been just a short time before our visit, so it will be some months before CHRC will be testing their new 50kw XR. The CP for WFTN-1500 10kw. days in Newton, Mass. is definitely not on the air as yet. While in North East, Pa. we found that the CP for WHYP-1530 1,000w daytimer is not on the air yet, although we saw a tower in the area which could well be theirs. Station WOVE-1600 500w daytimer in Troy, NY is not on the air, although in 5/66 they changed calls from WXXW. The 1,000w unlimited station WFTO-1520 in Toledo which had been EPing as far back as 3/66, has not as yet taken the air on RS, & possibly will not before mid-September, as they have two different XR locations, w/two sensitive directional patterns. The CP in Mason, Mich. (WUNN-1110) 250 watter is likewise not on the air as yet, as we travelled near by & no sign of them. Station WZBN-1500 in Zipp, Ill

JAPAN. JCHK, Sendai. Parallel to JOGK-840 from 0427 on 10/3, with classical music, then a discussion program. Weak static ORM with similar time pips at 0500 (last chime slightly different pitch) was possibly HLKB. By the way, Larry Godwin ID'd HLKB with a KBS announcement at 0455. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 922 COLOMBIA. HJAF, Em. Fuentes, Cartagena. Noted back on this channel 9/5. (IRCA/Cleveland, Ohio)
- 944 FRANCE. CRTF, Toulouse, readable 0025 10/3. (Wood, Indiana)
- 960 BERMUDA. ZFB-1, Pembroke. VOA relay heard to s/off 0215 exactly 10/1. (Bob Foxworth, P.O. Box 5283, Raleigh N.C. 27607.)
MEXICO. XEIQ, Cd. Obregon, Son. Dominant 0100 10/3. ID as "Radio IQ." (Eee-Koo) or "Radio IQ, unico en su spiritu." (Wood, Indiana)
- 962 ECUADOR. HCNC1, R. Cosmopolita, Quito, runs late on weekends, 90% Ecuadorian music, power 800 watts. (IRCA)
- 965 UNID L.A. heard here evenings in early October. (Coles, Texas) Most likely YNLU, R. Managua. (Ed.)
- 975 ECUADOR. HCAW2, Ondas del Pacifico, Guayaqui 1, will soon install a 10 kw transmitter. (IRCA/Quito)
- 995 ECUADOR. HCEW2, R. Suceso, Guayaquil, in around 2230 with pop music. Gong sound on ID. Heard 10/8. (Coles)
- 1027 ECUADOR. HCRR2, R. Popular Rocafuerte, Guayaquil, is AN with program called Reloj Musical. (IRCA/Quito)
- 1030 UNID. L.A. Spanish-speaker heard 9/3 at 0250 with whistling interval signal. Weak. Venezuela? (Raczko, Ohio.) Most likely XEGR, Radio Centro, Mexico City, whose ID (sometimes whistling) is to the tune of that old childhood favorite "You're a Dirty Robber" -- or "Johnny's Got a Girl Friend." (Ed.)
- 1034 PORTUGAL. CSE2, R. Clube Portugues, Parede. At 0010 9/26 MM, good strength with music and Portuguese talk. (Kowalski, Pa.)
- 1035 HAITI. HVEF, Cap Haitien, heard 9/29 at 2025 just before Hurricane Inez struck Haiti and put them off the air. (Raczko, Ohio.)
- 1040 HONDURAS. HRVH, R. M11, Tegucigalpa, heard 10/2 at 0045 with modern music (RR-mx de la nueva ola) and SS-ID's fair to good with fading. (Parsons, Ont.)
- 1048 PERU. OBX40, Onda Popular, Lima. Noted 9/5 2050-2130, but not enough for report. (IRCA/Cleveland)
- 1055 NICARAGUA. YNLL, R. Masaya, Masaya, heard 2016 9/2. (IRCA/Cleveland)
- 1089 URUGUAY. CX28, R. Imparcial, Montevideo. Logged at excellent level with Spanish at 0035 9/26. (Kowalski, Pa.)
- 1115 INTL. WATERS (England). Radio 270 operates from the old Dutch fishing boat Oceanm 7, moored off Scarborough. Transmissions are eventually going to 24 hours per day, and verification is by QSL-card. This information from a letter received from the Director, Radio 270, 278 Scalby Road, Scarborough, Yorkshire. (Calkin, N.B.)
- 1118 ECUADOR. HCEG1, R. Exito, Quito. Here with 400 watts from 1111. 0600-0700 7 days. (IRCA/Quito)
- 1120 CHINA. The Russian service still holds forth well; eg. on 9/26 at 0500-0600, with frequent "Govorit Pekin" IDs. Maybe the new FBIS will help with the locations of the Chinese stations. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)

- GUATEMALA. On 10/3 at 2315, I heard a station here under KMOX with Spanish announcements, ID and tic-toc musical time check, but ID somewhat scrambled by KMOX and all I heard was "Desde Guatemala..."; fading in and out. (Parsons, Ont.) TCRR, Guatemala City, logged 2247 9/29, 100% dominant and no sign of KMOX for at least an hour. (Coles, Texas)
- 1125 COSTA RICA. TISRHE, R. Popular, San Jose. ID, slogan, and chime of some type noted 2300 10/5. (Coles, Tex.)
- 1129 COLOMBIA. HJCO, R. Sur America, Bogota, drifts to here. HJAC noted back on 1130 2040 9/2. (IRCA/ Quito and Cleveland.)
- 1140 GUATEMALA. TGT, R. Sonora, Guatemala. Marimba music 9/29 2225. WRVA looped. (Wood, Indiana)
MEXICO. XEMR, Monterrey, N.L. Must have had antenna change. They're heard all the time now, strong. For example, on 9/29 at 2247. (Coles, Texas)
- 1150 MEXICO. XEJP, R. Variedades, Mexico, D.F. Heard MM 9/26 in the clear with AN WCOP silent, and used two slogans-- "Radio Variedades" and "Union Radio," which had me fooled for a minute, as I thought it might be a Nicaraguan. I think they s/off at 0200, as I had them before this, tuned back, and they were gone. (Cooper, N.Y.)
- 1160 AS. RUSSIA. Another frequency for the R. Moscow Far East Service is noted, in English at 1000 hours, as heard in New Zealand. (NZ DX Times)
- 1180 MEXICO. XEPR, R. Felicidad, Mexico, D.F. heard on 10/2 at 0124 with slogan ID and music; fair, but much QSB and heterodyne (or carrier) from WHAM. (Parsons, Ont.)
- 1187 INFL. WATERS (England). R. Caroline South heard here nightly from 2200 to past 0100 with hit parade and non-stop pop program. Good signals, and now the most consistent TA heard here. (Calkin, N.B.)
- 1188 COLOMBIA. HJCT, La Voz de la Costa, Barranquilla, easily separable 2034-2040 9/2. (IRCA/Cleveland)
- 1200 CUBA. CMKD, Holguin, heard 10/3 at 0201 with news, comment, pips every second, and parallel to CMK-1210, also heard at same time, but with much better signal. (Raczko, Ohio)
- 1205 FRANCE. CRTF, Bordeaux, quite good at 0015 10/3. (Wood, Indiana)
- 1214 ENGLAND. BBC Light Programme in 10/2 at 2345 S5-S9 signals, but very noisy. I've noticed many fewer TA's than last year, but this one was here strong. Program as usual-- Semi-pop with male announcer. (Jerry K. Conrad, P.O. Box 91, Walton, Ky. 41094)
- 1220 UNID. Pacific station in American English heard the last few MMs from around 0230 until the NHK station fades in at about 0315. Kwajalein, perhaps. Maybe one of these times, I'll luck out. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 1250 AUSTRALIA. 5KD, Radio Prosh, Adelaide, N.S.W. went on the air during prosh week, an annual celebration by Adelaide University students of the Society for Confirming Immoral Impulses Among Engineering Students. Planned for 3 kw, but averaged about 1 kw. Several breakdowns, and jammed, too. The transmitter was on a tug off Kangaroo Island. Adopted calls 5KD because its frequency is halfway between 5AD and 5KA. (NZDXRA)
- 1265 ECUADOR. HCUE6, Ondas Azuayas, Cuenca, noted on this channel. (IRCA/Quito)
- 1275 ECUADOR. HCJC1, Ecos de Cayambe, Cayambe, replaces HCJC6 in Pujili, new station with 300 w. (IRCA/Quito)
- 1285 ECUADOR. HCCO1, R. Quito, La Voz de la Capital, will be on this channel for six months more with 800 watts, then revert to the government. Same sked as 760. (IRCA/Quito)
- 1295 ENGLAND. BBC European Service in English again scheduled at 1600 here. (SCDX)
- 1320 MEXICO. XEAI, Radio AI, Mexico, D.F. Noted at 0120 10/10 with regular Mexican music. ID -- "Radio Ah-EEEE" -- sounds like the announcer's falling off a cliff. (Coles, Texas)
- 1323 UNID. L.A. With Spanish music and L.A. announcements on this frequency. Noted after 2300 fairly strong at times, but heavy fading. No ID caught. Who? (Calkin, N.B.)
- 1325 NETH. ANTILLES. PJA10, Aruba, heard nightly at 2300 with music, announcements, anthem and sign off. Good signals, but some GRM from the Unid. on 1323. Anybody ever get a QSL from PJA10? (Calkin, N.B.)
- 1349 INFL. WATERS (England). According to letter from Mr. Roy Bates, Director and owner of Radio Essex, reports of reception are welcomed to 33 Avenue Road, Southend on Sea, Essex. Radio Essex is now contemplating opening one Radio Albatross later this year from a fort at Tongue Sand in the Thames Estuary. (Calkin, N.B.)
- 1355 UNID. L.A. Audible evenings, even with local on 1360. Loop says Central America. Heard most often around 2100-2200. (Conrad, Ky.) I get one on 1354, about 1/2 kc. below the dismal TV buzz on 1354.5. Jack Keene has identified HRME, R. El.Patio, La Ceiba, HONDURAS, here. My station signs off around 2359. (Ed.)
- 1376 FRANCE. CRTF, Lille, fairly readable despite WTT5-1370 here in Bloomington, 0024 10/3. (Wood, Indiana)
- 1440 MEXICO. XELZ, Radio LZ, Mexico, D.F. ID as "la L.Z." (elly zayta) at 0130 10/3. (Wood, Ind.)
- 1466 MONACO. Trans World Radio, Monte Carlo, religious programs in East European languages through midnight 10/2-3. Is no longer parallel shortwave 6035 and 7135. (Wood, Ind.)
- 1474 DOM. REP. HLAG, Santiago. Noted 9/13 to 2200. (IRCA/Cleveland)
- 1475 AS. RUSSIA. The R. Moscow Japanese outlet heard on 9/26 with many IDs and then a nice IS at 0500. In by 0340 on 10/3. Reported. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 1480 MEXICO. XETKR, Monterrey (N.L.?) was above KBOX much of the time from 0212 until its 0302 s/off on 9/12. New Call for XENJ? (Scrimgeour, Calif.)

- 1506 UNID. Carrier noted around 0417 seemed to have Latin Beat music, but could make out only the rhythm. Unknown who it could be. (Coles, Texas)
- 1510 ECUADOR. HCPC2, R. El Tiempo, Guayaquil. Here from 610. (IRCA/Quito)
- 1520 JAPAN. NHK Second network was fair in strength from 0345 until 0415 on 10/3. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
NEW ZEALAND. 1ZU, Taumarunui, was scheduled to open officially 10/1. (New Zealand DX Radio Association.)
- 1560 MEXICO. XEVIP, Mexico, D.F. heard through open carrier at 0200 Saturday, 10/1. (Foxworth, N.C.)
- 1562 CUBA. CMBG, Cardenas, was probably the Cuban heard fighting XEVIP on 10/2 at 0312. Faded back to a het quickly. (Scrimgeour, Calif.)
- 1586 W. GERMANY. NDR, Oldenburg. German talk at fair strength 0005 9/26 MM (Kowalski, Pa.) Note EBU list last issue. Now 400 kw. Langenburg here. (Ed.)

AUSTRALIA. 4EK-1300 and 4EK-1220 went AN Sunday 9/4. (NZ DX Times)
FIJI. Here's the present lineup for Radio Fiji. The stations on 890 and 1320 are in Lautoka. Those on 560, 710 and 840 (Sunday mornings only) are in Suva. Stations are planned for Labasa, Raki Raki, Sigatoka, and possibly Ba. (NZDXRA) Dialog: DX'er #1: I heard Fiji this mornin;. DX'er #2: Bah! DX'er #1: No, Raki Raki. (Ed.)

INDIA. New Indians include Pasighat 1060; Bhuji on 1290, and Jeypore on 1460. (New Zealand DX Times)
ENGLAND. The British Government has decided to set up a "pop only" radio station run by an entirely new authority. The station's cost will almost certainly be met by advertising. This means certain doom for the pirates. They will be off the air soon after Easter when the recently published bill becomes law. Stations operating from the Thames Estuary forts may be gone even before the bill is passed, as a decision to demolish the forts is expected at any time. Plans for the new official pop station are being completed, and it is expected that they will be published within a few weeks. The BEC will have no hand in the new station. (SCDX)

INTERNATIONAL WATERS. Summonses were served on 9/21 on the company operating Radio 390 and its secretary David Lye. The case, which is regarded as a test case, will be held at Canterbury magistrates' court on 11/24. Ted Allbeury, managing director of R. 390, said in an interview that there are over 300 unauthorized radio stations, and they include R. Vaticana, The Voice of America, and A.F.N. "We are in very good company," Mr. Allbeury points out. Meanwhile, R. Caroline is asking its listeners to write in for printed forms for protests against the Government's action against unauthorized radio stations. (SCDX) SCDX also is reporting a "Radio Jim" Sunday mornings on 198 meters, and an Irish pirate on 300 m. named R. Ballyvaughan, with an address at Main St., Ballyvaughan. Some of these seem to be heard in very tiny localities, and may be the British version of those flea-power stations kids set up in their basements. (Ed.)
