Also a lot of the domestic DX should probably go into DX Down the Dial (or the latter section should be eliminated). I also agree w/Glenn Hauser's comments from several issues ago about verifications. They really are pretty worthless. Some stations will verify anything. Others don't verify at all. If I really had to have proof of some DXer's logging, I'd have a lot more faith in a tape than in a written verification. Nevertheless, QSL cards & letters on station stationery are pretty, & I sympathize w/those who are plaugued by a dwindling QSL percentage. Has it occurred to anyone that bad reports are not always caused by laziness, dishonesty, and/or sheer irresponsibility? Plunking down a few bucks for NRC membership dos# not automatically make a DXer the world's greatest living authority on how to write reception reports. If the MRC issues a handout on "How to Write a Reception Report" it was left out of the materials I received when I joined. INTERNATIONAL DX DIGEST

DX conditions have been generally very good during the past week. Here in the Northeast, many of the rarer TA's are again audible since March 11th or so. TA's peaked her on 3/15 and 3/16 - with the first logging of Spanish Sahara in several months on 3/15, and the first good Russian opening since the "Christmas Disturbance" mid-evening on 3/16. The first good South African opening of the season occurred on 3/21 permitting the logging of Angola on 872. Dangerfield concurs, "TA's common 3/8-3/16, peaking on 3/15, but fairly high noise level most of the week. TA's out of picture since mid-evening 3/17, so cycle may be over". But in lower latitudes, things have deteriorated, according to Silvera in Jamaica, "Well, the cx here have deteriorated and there is muc static. Seems to me that it is the beginning of the end of the DX season". We suggest paying particular attention to the Africans on 638, 872, 908, and 1286.

C.M. Stanbury speculates again, this time about the VOA station in Vietnam on 760,

"In the new official VOA frequency schedule effective III/5/67 this station is again listed after an absence of almost a year. However it was not off the air during that time, according to NASWA's Feb. 'FRENDX'. In fact, according to this reliable source, it wasn't even silenced by a Viet Cong morter (sic) attack in the summer of 1966. Its absence from the list probably indicates that during this period it was not airing any VOA programs at all, with the entire schedule devoted to programs produced by another (non American) agency, presumably the S. Vietnamese government. A similar practice is applied to the Philippine frequencies of 920 and 6170 kc. When they are used entirely for P.B.S. XMSNs, as now, they are deleted from the VOA's list even though the XMTRs are actually still on the air. It is also interesting to note that until the VOA schedule effective V/4/65 the 760 kc station's power (50 kw) was listed but not its location. After that date, and now, the power is NOT listed but the general location (Vietnam) is shown. It seems reasonable to wonder whether around that time the facility was not drastically altered. However the power itself was apparently not changed. According to a letter received from VOA last fall, it is still 50 kw. What have West Coast DXers have (sic) heard on this frequency from the Far East during the past yar or so? S/On is 0600 EST."

Several WC DX ers have reported hearing Chinese on 760 and have assumed it to be from the CJKT station on the channel. Last reference to reception of the VOA station that I can find is from Ken Brownless who reported it at 0845 on 11/13/65. Why not just write and ask the VOA, Stan? (Ed)

On Reciprocal Paths... will be a new IDXD feature. Since, to a first approximation, MW signals will travel either way over an open path equally well, it should be of real value to examine foreign receptions of US stations. Aside from constantly pointing up our own noise and interference problems, information on overseas receptions of North American stations may lead to a better understanding of the factors which control propagation on TA and TP paths. Bugaj in Morocco reports receptions of WHN, WINS, WNBC, WOR, WABC - all between 1930 and 2110 on 3/1. During the month of February. New Zealand DX'ers logged the following NA stations: WMAQ-670 @ 0300, WCWC-1190 @ 0300-0400, WCOL-1230 @ 0330, ZEM1-1235 @ 0400, WEYE-1290 @ 0625, WING-1410 @ 0255, WIAC-1510 @ 0300, and WCKY-1530 @ 0330. Ah, yes, will all you EC DX'ers who logged 1 kw Zedders during February - please stand up.

The BBC World Service will go 24 hours-a-day, 7 days-a-week as of April 1st, according to SCDX Bulletin #905.

We'd like to give a plug here for a most useful aid for obtaining those hard-to-get foreign QSL's - the DX Stamp Service run by Sax Ringler, W2SAW. For a moderate fee, Sax will supply the DX'er with mint stamps from the country of interest, sufficient to provide airmail return postage for a verification. Mint stamps are generally a better way of enclosing return postage than are IRC's - not only are rural postmasters wary of accepting IRC's, but not a few countries totally refuse to honor them. Some typical prices: Bolivia - 25¢; Martinique - 30¢; Sudan - 40¢; Nigeria - 50¢. Sax promises to provide 24 hour service on all orders, and will supply a full price list on request. MEDIUM WAVE BROADCASTING IN CHINA

(This week we continue our examination of Chinese broadcasting with a look at the nature of the internal structure of the broadcasting system. A little study of the organization chart on the next page will provide the reader with a unique insight into the character and origins of the disruption of communications in China associated with the present civil disorders - GPN)


III. Organization of Broadcasting in China.

The first station of the Communist Chinese broadcasting system was the New China Radio Station at Yenan, which went on the air September 5, 1945. The construction of this station was supervised by Wang Cheng, HQ Signals Officer for Mao's Red Army. After 4 months of experimental broadcasts, the Yenan station went into regular service beaming propaganda to the KMT Army to the South. When the civil war ended in 1949, Mac was faced with the staggering task of developing a modern communications system in a huge and primitive country accustomed to decentralized government. At that time there were only 82 broadcasting stations in all of China. Even the geographical distribution of these stations tended to discourage the development of a national broadcasting system: most of the 49 public stations were located in Manchuria (originally installed by the Japanese as they industrialized "Manchukuo"), whereas the majority of the private stations were concentrated in a few Eastern port cities - 22 in Shanghai alone In the first few years after the revolution, Mao chose to stress development of the monitor system (to be described later) and deferred development of the wireless radio broadcasting system. The broadcasting administration began installing new radio transmitters as early as 1953, but it was not until the year of the Great Leap Forward that the system really began to expand significantly. By 1958 there were 97 stations; by 1960 the number had grown to 146 (both SW and MW). The wireless radio system continued to grow rapidly until, today, there are almost 250 stations on the MW band alone. At the same time that the Great Leap expansion of the radio system was under way, a similiar expansion of the wired, or Rediffusion system took place, this to be describe in a moment.

Broadcasting occupies a very favored position in the Red Chinese government. While other propaganda media, such as publications, films, and the press, are under the control of their specific agencies in the Ministry of Culture, the Broadcast Administration Bureau (henceforth called the BAB) is under the direct control of the State Council. The overall controlling authority for all propaganda efforts is the Communist Chinese Party Propaganda Department (CCPPD). For many years, broadcasting was the special concern of Lu Ting-yi, the director of the CCPPD. Lu was dismissed from his post for "counter-revolutionary sympathies" on July 10, 1966. He was replaced by the supposedly more reliable Vice Premier, Tao Chu, who was in turn fired on January 13, 1967 and replaced by Wang Li. This rapid turnover in the post of Director of the CCPPD reflects the extremely important position of propaganda in the view of the Chinese government. A simplified diagram indicating the pattern of information and policy control in the broadcasting system is shown on the next page.

Few names of the lesser personages connected with broadcasting have reached the West. For a number of years (and at least into 1965), the Director of the BAB was Mei Yi, who succeeded the Russian trained engineer, Li Chan. Tien Wei, the Director of the Kwangtung Provincial JKT and head of the Provincial Broadcasting Enterprise Administration Bureau for Kwangtung, was dismissed from his post in 1965 for "failing to relay with sufficient enthusiasm" certain CJKT programs, according to one Mainland press item. The International Liaison Department was headed by Fang Chiung as late as 1965; Most MW QSL's reaching the U.S. have been signed either by Fang Chiung, or by Chao Yi Heh of the Foreign Language Department.

The basic flow of information in the Chinese broadcasting system is as follows. General Party policy is generated by the CCPPD and passed to the New China News Agency (NCNA) under the supervision of the State Council. The NCNA monitors foreign broadcast and news transmissions and produces the text that is passed to the BAB. This text is the "proper" integration of hard facts with party policy and amounts to some 70,000 words a day (1964 figure). From the NCNA, the text reaches the CJKT and is transmitted



by the stations of the CJKT system. Most but not all of the CJKT transmitters are located in Peking. These CJKT programs are then relayed by the stations of the Provincial JKT system, sometimes via direct broadcast and sometimes via phone lines. The Provincial JKT stations originate programming of local interest, including local news, but are required to relay all information concerning international affairs directly from CJKT in unaltered form. No international news or significant commentary on international matters can be originated by any but the CJKT stations. The transmissions of the Provincial JKT are in turn relayed by the Municipal JKT stations, again via direct off-the-air pickup or by phone lines. The Municipal JKT stations supply their own highly local programs and attempt to place the Central and Provincial programs within a relevant local context. Interviews with local workers and frequent "testimonials" from local party cadres attempt to elaborate on the text of relayed programs in order to generate local interest and discussion.

But the basic flow of information has not yet reaced its primary audience at the Municipal level. Few Chinese (relatively speaking) possess radio receivers, and so the most characteristic feature of the Chinese broadcasting system now comes into play the Rediffusion system. Since receivers are still prohibitively expensive (see section on Receivers and Transmitters) and could always be used to listen to "reactionary" broadcasts from outside China, countless thousands of Rediffusion "stations" are in use in all parts of China. These Rediffusion "stations" are merely powerful audio amplifiers feeding the JKT programming (received either via on-the-air monitoring or via phone lines) to dozens or hundreds of loudspeakers on street corners, communes, homes, and public buildings. Judging from information reaching the West, rather few places in China are not now within earshot of the millions of loudspeakers of the Rediffusion system. Originally inspired by the reliable performance of the Russian wired broadcasting system during the Siege of Leningrad, the Rediffusion system in China is designed to bring the influence of the central regime down to the peasant masses with a minimum of chance that outside broadcasts can also be monitored. And loudspeakers are definitely cheaper to produce than radio receivers! The loudspeakers of the Rediffusion system are now so ubiquitous, in fact, that they have even been installed in railroad cars and in public toilets. The similarity to Orwell's world of 1984 is indeed rather chilling.
