With ID by city of license now a widely realized MUST, it should help both FCC monitoring and BCB DXing. That letter has been the result of many weeks of work on the part of the committee, which in addition to Starr and Wesolowski, includes Dave Johnson of IRCA. Ernie, by the way, says anyone who wants to help in passing out the material can ask fro copies from him. Here 'tis:

WE'VE HEARD YOU'RE A DX'ER!

Your name has been forwarded to me from a broadcast band station to whichyou have recently mailed a reception report. It may surprise you to know that there are many others likeyourself who are interested in the same hobby. In fact, there are thousands all around the world. Some listen to TV, others DX on shortwave, and still others, like you, are DXing on the standard broadcast band, between 530 and 1610 kes. In North America alone, there are roughly 5100 standard broadcasting stations. A ound the world, there are many more that you may be lucky enough to hear at some time or other.

Almost every station has received reception reports from DXers just like yourself. A reception report usually requests (NOT DEMANDS) a letter or OSL card proving or verifying that that person did hear the station on a specific day and time. All stations in the U.S. are required to maintain a log of program material pr sented on the air and open to the FCC for a period of 5 years.

Here is what a good reception report normally contains. The Chief Engineer is the person to whom the letter is usually addressed, as he is the person who knows the logs and knows what times the transmitter was one the air. Often the DXer has a choice between using a report form printed by his club or writing out a report in letter form. TXXX Either way is okay. The amain thing to remember is to be neat. If you can type, do so. If not, you may use regular size paper ($u\frac{1}{2} \times 11$), preferably with ruled lines. Be sure the paper is clean and remains so.

First come the address and greeting. Then, your first paragraph should include the fact that you are pleased to receive the station. Mention its call letters, slogan (if it used one), the exact freuencey, like 1100 kc. (not "about 1100 kc"), the day of the week and the date of reception, plus the time that your report covers. Mention if the station was heard on regular schedule, a test, or Frequency Measurement Check. Always report the time in the time zone of the station. For foreign stations cutside North America, use CMF. If your are not sure, use your local time and explain that you are confused!

Now comes the body of the report, or program log material. Most DXers print along the left margin the time of each entry, followeds by program details. Almost every beginning DXer believes that stations keep a log of each record played. This is not so! Only the type of music should be reported - like Rock'n Roll, Country and Western, or middle of the road. Material required by the FCC consists of all commercials and public service announcements like for the Army, Heart Ass'n., or U.S. Savings Bonds. Station ID's must be given at least every half hour. Always write them down word for word! If the station uses a slogan, write it down as you hear it. Stations log all newscasts and weather forecasts, plus any news bulletins given. The announcer's name is always helpful, too. You may not report it correctly but it will mean something to the station. Try to report as much as you can of a Sing-on or Sign-off announcement, as it is unique. Get the owner's name and station's address, if given. Try also to write down the sponsor of a commercial and any address or phone number given. For Frequency Measurement Checks, which are made once a month between midnite and 6 a.m. localtime, and usually last for 15 minutes, write down the exact times of the ID's and mention if the test was with tone (including what pitch, if possible), or if music was played.

Following your log of program material should come a paragraph concerning your receiver, antenna, signal mire strength (not the SINPO code, as most stations don't know what it means), the percent of readability, and quality of the signal. Your closing paragraph should contain the request for a verification and mention that return postage is enclosed.

Be sure to thank the person for his time and interest in the hobby. End the report by signing your name. Don't forget the return address! Then try to get it into the mail within 24 hours. If you have done all this, you should have a verification within 30 days. On the reverse is a sample reception report which many club members use:

With bulletins published 34 times per year, these two clubs deal specifically with the Broadcast Fand only, and are considered to be the best in the country.

Obviously, adds JAC, the simplified explanation is directed to the beginning DX-er. It is expected that as he joins a club, and reads how some of the other guys are earning their verifications, he will pick up an idea here, eliminate an idea there, and come up with a reporting system that is uniquely his own. The above, though, are the bare minimum ABSOLUTE NECESSITIES for a good report. Personally, we send our seports to the station blind, without addressing the C.E., because in many instances the C.E. works for several stations. And we use song titles because, although most stations do not log them, they can tell from the kind of music reported if it's possible you heard them ... or if you've made a mistake and that ain't their kkind of music. But these are things the individual will have to decide for himself. At any rate, a salute to Jerry and Ernie for a good start on a project that will improve casual reports and, possibly, add to the rells of our club. -- JAC

fore.

We'll wade right into this subject with some detailed comments from our CPC chairman, Alan Merriman.

"There is no question that the CPC has turned into something of a problem. The NRC CPC has been something less than spectacular this year and I suppose most of the blame can be laid on me. To be completely frank about it, my interest in DXing has been something less than enthusiastic this year. A combination of problems here has resulted in my doing very little DXing, therefore I have found it difficult to spend the time pushing the CPC.

Also, there has been a lack of coope ation necessary to really get the CPC moving. This lack of cooperation has come on two fronts. First, in my being unable to get the materials necessary to carry out CPC work, and secondly the lack of volunteers who are willing to really work at it. Volunteers are not lacking in number, about 25 have written me for CPC information this year, but in the majority of cases you hear from them once when they request the CPC info and after that nothing. I can only assume that most of the volunteers are young, and they get discouraged by the lack of replies. You commented that a CPCer considered himself lucky if he was able to talk one off to ten into a special program. I'd say a CPCer is lucky if one station out of ten even bothers to reply to his request." XXXXXX

I would interject here, Alan, that I understand your note re difficulty in obtaining cooperation on the one end, and steps are being taken to make some changes. Ye Pub, for example, has his spare hours filled with running the club bulletin, and doesn't DX anymore as a result. And in any hobby, it's hard to generate interest where it is waning. And I know, too, that some of the CPC materials are not used proberly, witness the WLCY comments from Dennis Waters -- and the CPC'er who sent his renewal dues in with a cover-letter on CPC stationery.

"I read withinterests Jerry Starr's comments about stations that promised to test but failed to show. I agree withis observations 100%. There is no doubt that many stations fail to show because they have forgotten all about the program. Upuntil the 66-67 DX season, all sta ions that presented a special program for the NRC were given a nice write-up inthe bulletin, and a copy of the bulletin containing the write-up was sent to the station the week of the test. This bulletin, arriving a few days before the test, served as a friendly reminder of the test. When I took over as CPC Chairman in1965, I understood that this was standard procedure. As far as I know, bulletins were sent to all the stations who tested forus during the 65-66 season, but the following year, stations testing for us were not sent copies of the bulletin despite the fact that all CPC members were told to tell the stations they would be sent a copy of DX News. Year I wrote to you late tast Scring asking for extra copies of the bulletin so that I could send them out, but the extra bulletins were never sent as far as I know. Apparently bulletins are not being sent to stations this year either, andagain all CPC members have been told they would receive a copy of DX News if they did a test for us. If these bulletins were sent, they would serve as an excellent reminder of the test."

In take my medicine on this, Alan. One of my New Year's Resolutions, though, was to reinstitute this procedure. In the past few issues, (Jan 6 on), this procedure has been reinstituted. I recall, I joined the club after I did a test broadcast for which I had received a sample bulletin. So this will change, for the better. Alan has some other ideas for changes, as follows:

"Personally, I think that the entire CPC should be re-organized. In my opinion the best idea would be to set up a joint CPC under the spensorhip of ANARC. It should go evern further than just using ANARC as a clearing house for CPC infromation. The entire CPC organization should be handled through ANARC. I agree with John Twoeie when he says the CPC should have about 25 active members. Getting 25 members is no problem, but getting 25 members who are willing to stick with it despite a lack of replies is quite a problem."

Alan goes on to suggest dividing the country into 25 geographical areas (or frequency blocks) and assigning each member one of these areas, eliminating duplication of effort when more than once CPC er contacts the same station. He continues: "After reading the remarks of Eric Floden, the new IRCA CPC Chairman in the last dialog, I imagine that he would be opposed to a joint CPC. No doubt there would be other people in both clubs who would be opposed to a joint CPC. The way I look at it though, all courtesy programs that are arranged are for all DXers, not just for the members of the club that arranged the program. I think that this is one area where maximum cooperation between all the clubs is desirable. While a joint CPC would take away some of the competition between the NRC and IRCA, I think that in the light of the problem facing the CPC that serious consideration should be given this proposal! Alan, the IRCA Board of Directors voted substantially against this proposall when presented to them. The NRC governing body is an record favoring same.

Continuing Alan's comments on CPC work, he says he thinks the best way to arrange programs is personal visits to the stations. "I don't know how many members are taking advantage of this method of arranging programs, but I hope that it is being used. As far as regionalized test programs go," Alan continues, "With the extremely crowded conditions existing today, almost every program arranged is regionalized to accreain extent. Trying to limit test programs to completely clear channels would cut down the possibilities to next to nothing. I definite—ly don't think that request to stations should be limited to stations on clear channels.

"I was really surprised to read Richard Wood's remakrs regarding Courtesy Programs. I got the impression when I first read them that Richard wasn't even aware of the CPC until he had read Larry Godwin's letter. If you followed Richard's suggestion it seems that you would have to stop logging stations heard on ET's, F/C, etc. I might add, however, that I received a letter from another DXer last year who said basically the same thing, so Richard isn't the only one who feels this way."

Ernie Cooper makes the point that some stations go on without DX News advance warning, because there just isn't time to make the publication date. He suggests CPC'ers write a station, when notified of a TEST who late for advance publication and ask them to postpone the test. "I suggest allowing at least EIGHT weeks in advance when writing for a TEST, for the more notification in DX N EWS, the larger potential audience. The more often it appears in the weekly issues the more listeners - then the New Zeland clubs and the once-a-month USA and Canada clubs can also get their members the tip. The more publicity, the better! And the TIP Must be into HO by the THURSDAY BEFORE THE MONDAY OF THE PROGRAM!

"CPCing isn't just picking out a few stations that you yourself would like to log," Ernie continues.
"It takes a sort of 'sixth sense' to pick out likely targets. If you got, or heardabout, a very friendly v/l from a station, then that one would at least be a good bet for a try at a TEST. Writing to a known tough verifier for a TEST is a waste of time and stamps. IN PERSON contacts are probably the best method - of course this means you'd be arranging a TEST from a station you yourself don't need, but you'd be doing a lot of other NRCers a big favor!"

Right, Ernie, and showing the club members that they ... lied a guy who's typed Musings stencils 34 times a year since 1946, isn't in it just for himself, but is thinking of the other guy. This is the spirit of the NRC. I find that it is catching.

Jerry Conrad has some comments on Richard Wood's comments: "I see his point, but I believe that many, if not most of us, are 'ham' Exers to a point. That is, we like to get as many spots on this globe of ours as is possible, and while anything may be heard at sometime or other, it is better to KNOW what you are listening for on a frequueony at a time. This is especially true on my pet, the graveyards. It helps to know what you are listening for. Rather than increase errors, I feel it helps reduce them."

Unless, of course, you get the kind of "fishing" reports I cutlined a few weeks ago. There are many hams, by the way, who contend that in the frenzied search for a new country, the DX-peditions are a farce and a fraud ... where a ham will set up a mobile rig on a rare country. Well, that gives us a little cross section of ideas on CPC. Now let's change to another subject.

A LIMITED MEMBERSHIP CLUB ...

Robert F. Leamy of Columbus, Ohio, caught some contemplation incur remarks about Arctic Radio Club, and comes up withthese comments: "I will have to say I am completely against limiting membe ship to thos who contribute to the bulletin for the following reasons. First and probably foremest— Some members seem to be forgetting that the NRC is not operating solely on the effort of a few members who contribute (although I do think we all owe much to their efforts.) There is also a financial support which is being provided by ALL members on an equal basis.

Seoncd-True, I could contribute to the bulletin sections more often. But isn't this defeating the bulletin's purpose? Why should I waste space with information that has likely been published in an earlier issue? Remember I am presently limited in DXing activity. But has the NRC become so high and mighty that we now place a minimum amount of activity as one of the membership requirements? I see the dues increase as a step toward solving many of the problems. Now I would like to hear some reaons for having a selective membership."

Basically, I agree with you, Bob, that the dues increase should solve at least this problem. The concept of Selective Membership was one idea thrown out to suggest one petential solution to the problem of effort in relationship to results. There is no question that the vast majority of the NRC'ers would oppose a selective membership program ... for obvious reasons. But, thanks to the overwhelming vote of confidence on the dues increase, the "temptation" toward a selective membership club has dropped. Well, look what's happened to the space. This column could, as Joe Brauner suggested, run away with us. I've gto 8 pages from Ron Schatz and 28 from Dave fischer ... neither of whom dealt with this issue's subject matter ... but we'll get to some of these and many more ideas in later editions of Dialog. -- iac
