DX conditions during the past week have been fair to excellent here in the Northeast. In addition to powerful signals from all of the usual TA's, several nights have featured reception from the Middle East particularly on 10/23, 10/25, and 10/27. M.E. reception commonly occurs about this time of year but this last opening was rather unusual in one respect. Most M.E. reception during previous years has taken place on nights when reception from from Southern Europe and North Africa was also unusually good; thus many M.E. signals are logged with much QRM from the usual TA's, e.g., Syria and Holland on 746, Beirut and France on 836, etc. During the recent period of M.E. reception this common pattern was reversed, however, and the Europeans were if anything weaker than usual. An unusual exception to a common pattern. Writes Ben Dangerfield in Pa., "No need to tell you TA cx good 10/21 thru 10/26. I would modify it to very good Mediterranean area and NW Europe; NSG (not so good? Ed) to Central Europe with a few exceptions. Egypt on 736.5 and Koranareading on 1196; nothing on 677 except possibly a faint het; Italy and Albania tremendous. Turkey and Libya must be around somewhere." Writes Jerry Connad from his new location in Florida, "Beautiful TA signals on 10/21; rather weak but little fade and a lot of them." The PREDICTION: good to excellent TA reception until about the middle of November, then a general decline in TA reception (and high-latitude TP rx also) for several months.

"Germany. The Armed Forces Network plans to drop all of its MW outlets" except for the 150 kw outlet on 872; 611, 935, 1034, 1106, 1142, 1304, and 1502 will all be deleted and replaced with FM transmitters. (SCDX)

"Turkey. Future plans call for 300 kw on 629, 300 kw on 1061, 1200 kw on 1016, and a 600 kw station on a frequency still undecided. (ARC) Should be easy then, Ben. (Ed)

Station Procedures and Reporting Techniques

by Jerry Starr, WHOT, Youngstown, Ohio

During the 1960 NRC Convention in Boston, Bart Cronin and I had the pleasure of conducting a seminar on the subject of radio station procedures and their relation to reception reporting. For those who were not ableto attend, the following is a condensation of some of the interesting questions posed and the answers.

TO WHOM SHOULD A RECEPTION REPORT BE ADDRESSED? The common practice of sending the report to the Chief Engineer, or, alternatively, to the Engineering Department, is the best policy. Sending the report to the station in general isn't the best idea- the chances are good that the report will join the junk mail in the wastebasket.

DO STATIONS KEEP A LOG OF THE RECORDS THEY PLAY? With very few exceptions, stations do not keep any sort of music log. Noting the type of music in your report may help toidentify the station, but a logging of record titles only should not be verified. One exception is when the record's position of popularity is mentioned— the station obviously has a record of this position. It is also advisable to mention reporting an equipment test which includes some recordings, as the engineer probably chose the records. (Some DXers like to include record titles in all reports anyway, for a sense of completeness. rk)

EXACTLY WHAT DO STATIONS LOG? The FCC requires stations to keep three different logs; the Program Log is the only one of importance to DXers. The Program Log must show all commercials, public service announcements and program titles. This Log also indicates a program's starting and finishing times of a program; and each ID. Singing jingles, except where incorporated as an actual ID, are not usually logged. Although stations usually keep these logs past the required two years there is little chance that anyone will dig out an old lg just to verify your follow-up report.

WHAT'S THE BEST WAY TO REPORT AN EQUIPMENT TEST? You can report the type of modulation used and the exact times of IDs. No Program Log is required for these broadcasts, but the exact time of each period on the

air must be recorded; record titles may behelpful, as noted above, and try to log word-for-word IDs. Take recorded reports are especially useful for tests (see Tape Recording for DXers, a previous article). If you report a test which you have not positively identified, make it clear that the report is tentative.

DO STATIONS REALLY ATTACH MUCH IMPORTANCE TO DX REPORTS? Despite what we'd like to believe, the cold fact is that many stations couldn't care less. At one time stations relied on reports to determine their technical performance, but today's equipment takes care of that. Information such as local weather is of no value to the station (and of little importance to the DXer), but it is wise to fill in these spaces rather than to leave a blank line. Remember that radio is big business, and many stations can't be bothered by DXers; often reports have only curiosity value. Some stations, of course, are interested in reports, but their value is nowhere near what it was years ago.

Editor's Mote: Keep in mind that, just as some stations never verify at all, many others verify all reports, including those containing insufficient details. Quite a few stations send out standard QSLs to all reporters, while others accept descriptions of the most dubious kind. A verification, like a reception report, is only as good as the care that went into it; a vague or inspecific verie is as suspect as a report of the same stock.

Glad to have gotten this in, I hope it helps at least some of our new-er members.
