## MECHANICAL FILTERS...

All orders for mechanical filters have now been filled and the supply is exhausted. All units were checked at HQ prior to mailing and GPN matched up the units for use in series arrays to provide a minimum of total insertion loss. **Watch DX NEWS** for information on the next order; if you have any questions or problems with your MF be sure to let us know the serial number of the unit - we have the specifications on record here.

## PATTERN BOOKS, REPRINTS, STATIONERY...

All orders for PB's and stationery have been filled; likewise for reprints reports Mark Katz. **If your material has not arrived after a reasonable allowance** for slow mail service, contact HQ. We are holding several orders for report forms as they're being printed now; they'll go out as soon as ready. In response to a recent suggestion, by the way, we're printing the new forms on legal sized paper to permit more space for program details.

DX NEWS issue #32 to be published in late September will mark five full years of operation of the NRC by the Boston Publishing Committee. **Much has been accomplished during this time:** the trend-setting switch to offset, the production and mailing of more than 2.3 million pages of DX NEWS, doubling of the membership size, filling orders for more than 25,000 pages of reprints, and the production of three editions of the Domestic Log, the Pattern Book, and the LA Log. Not a bad record considering it was all done by unpaid volunteers with every penny going to the NRC to provide bigger and better DX NEWS...

In many respects the past year has been by far the most difficult we have faced here at NRC HQ. In addition to the heavy weekly workload required to keep DXN going out to 600 members, we've produced both a Pattern Book and a new Log - while rebuilding and moving back into the Nelson family home which serves as NRC HQ following last year's disastrous HQ fire.

Put simply, the BPC is tired. **We would like to be relieved of the day-to-day burden of running the NRC** so we can go back to our first interest - DX'ing. Freed from the publication workload we'll be able to concentrate on DX'ing, writing articles and pursuing new lines of research, designing new equipment and DX techniques, and all of the other things we've had to shelve while burdened with the production of DX NEWS and operation of the NRC.

We're asking for another group of members to come forth and volunteer to take over management of the NRC and publication of DX NEWS beginning next volume; the present BPC is prepared to continue for another five months. The new crew will take over all aspects of NRC operations: format and editorial policy, NRC management with full authority to make all decisions and to establish all club policies, responsibility for production of DX NEWS and general club operations. The new PubComm will take over all club assets including equipment, inventory, remaining stocks of Logs and Pattern Books (with reprint rights), the club treasury and records. The old BPC will serve in a strictly advisory capacity to provide whatever aid it can to the new PubComm - but the new crew will have full authority and complete responsibility from the moment it takes over.

In its 40 year history the NRC has never been in better shape than it is today. Membership stands at an all-time high; financially we're well in the black with a good inventory of Pattern Books and Logs; we've got a top-notch editorial staff and the most active membership of any DX club in North America. **But five years is long enough to expect any single group to shoulder the workload and the NRC needs a new and fresh management team.**

The minimum requirement for a local group of members interested in forming a PubComm is that they have at least three adults within practical travelling distance of one another (average age of the BPC is about 35 and we're all within an hour's travelling time). Any group of members considering the formation of a new Publication Committee is urged to contact HQ as soon as possible; we will supply extensive details on how to negotiate with a printer, costing and finances, workload estimates and costing information, alternative mailing systems, and everything else necessary to club operation. With the aid of our past experience the new crew should find that start-up will be much easier than it was when we took over in 1968...

Running the NRC and producing DX NEWS is a big job - that's for sure. But the intangible rewards are very great indeed - how else could the NRC have continued for 40 years? **We anticipate a smooth transition to the new PubComm with no interruption in club operations; if all goes well, the only changes in DX NEWS next season may be the mailing address and a few of the names...**

Hi all. Apparently a number of stations are reacting to the FCC's plans to look into those feminine forum type shows. WHN-1050 NYC dropped its fem forum 3/30, saying it was inconsistent with its c/w format. About a year ago, WPOP-1410 dropped its "Women's Glib" after a number of women complained & threatened a boycott of WPOP's advertisers. WITH-1230 has also dropped its show, as has a station in Memphis. Hoping to gain some of WHN's former fem-forum listeners, WRAB-1440 Babylon, L.I. has introduced its own version of this type of show. WPTR-1540 Albany's Boom Boom Branigan, who's on in mid-morning, is also opening the phone lines now. So some are dropping these shows & a few are picking them up. KIRO-710 has split w/CBS & is now MBS, but is not clearing most of MBS' programs; KIRO will also feed the MBS network some NXcasts. Thanks to Dave Christensen for an article on this. Frank Ager of Boise in a note says the Idaho DX Club has suspended operations but hopes to resume when some of its members finish college. The Club covered AM/FM/SW/TV. WJAS-1320 Pittsburgh apparently is now NSP w/rr; its new calls are WKQT, which it till recently were held by a South Paris, Me. station, which co-incidentally switched to WKPTW calls a few months ago (on 1450). ERC, the station you heard on 1380 w/c/w AN was definitely WTVR Richmond, which continues to be contemporary days & evening, but cw AN. MM 4/2 WHN-1050 was off w/XEG & CHUM in weak y (it was quite Aurora!) & also WRRL-1600 was off, w/nothing heard on this channel because of the Aurora. The KXJK-950 Ark. ~~was~~ was heard here back on MM 3/12, w/a fairly poor signal, & some interference. In case any of you every wonder what happens to DJs & announcers, Dave Howe of WKY-1530 is now at WEHN-FM Cincinnati, Chris Bailey of KCBQ & WRKO is now at WKRQ-FM Cincinnati; Lee Simms of WPOP/WKYC is at KRJA-1110 & Jack Armstrong of WKEM/WPOP/WKYC is now at WKTQ-1320 Pittsburgh. - 595 Dominica. R. Dominica, Roseau 3/26 1000 w/s-on hard to hear because of the Cubans on 590/600. (Kramer, Ill.) @ measured 595.002 4/18 0159. (Schatz, Fla.)

- 620 China PR. tune-in 1350-1430 tune-out Heilungkiang People's Broadcasting Station, Harbin, Heilungkiang Province; CC program //5950, 1425 local ID: "Heilungkiang Jenmin Kwangpo Tientai" and apparent s/off. 4/6. (Bundy, Truk)
- 630 Pakistan. Radio Pakistan, Lahore tune-in 1855-1900; Asian mx, 1858 R Pak IDs in lang and s/off at 1900 4/5. MW country #52. (Bundy, Truk)
- 640 Cuba. CMQ Havana 3/26 noticed testing during the morning seemed to be testing a higher power xstr (8-meter as far as it would go), used various pitches on tone and OC. (Kramer Guadeloupe. (TENTATIVE-caps those of BB) tune-in 0750 to tune-out 0830 4/12; call per WRTH is KEAD; At t/i had "Roger Carroll Show" w/lr mx, military spots to 0816 (no pause on hr) 0816½ anmt:"This is the American Forces Radio and Television Service" then either long fade or long pause, 0819 "Philadelphia Orchestra Broadcast Concert" began; signal for most part steady and little QRM likely same as stn reported on previous item w/continuous mx; WRTH gives 15 watts which at 1270 miles makes about 83 mpw. NRC Domestic Log lists several Alaskan AFRS stations at 50 watts or less; Wake seems more likely. Was previously impossible at this time with local WSZC on 1500. (Bundy, Truk)
- 1500 Eastern Caroline Islands. (cf.1300) WSZC off the air for 30 hours while installing new 1300 tx from 1400 April 1 to 2000 April 2. First time in 7 years that they've been off the air for a decent length of time. (Bundy, Truk)
- 1500 Hawaii. KUMU, Honolulu t/i 1000 4/2 with IDs and WSZC gone, Hawaii #19. (Bundy, Truk)

Spoke to PT on the phone then, he noted similar. 3/25-at work, no DXing; 3/26-signal noted with man in assumed RR quite good at S6 briefly at 2310. This when the sun just beginning to hit the local horizon here. (As a ref, my local WTHE-1520 s/off at 2300) This lasted only about 3 mins; not noted rest of eve., rapid f/out. 3/27: Audio very poor, in ad out 2315 to 2340, just able to pull audio. 3/28: Back to work, tho not ready yet, no DX (cont'd)

1525 (cont'd): 3/29: Audio in fair at 2330 first attempt (local WTHE slow in turning exciter off) and peaked 2340 to 2346 then gradual fadeout. Man spoke to 2340, then YL spoke for about 15 secs, then played a traditional style CC record then another before fadeout. Signals fairly well copiable at peak, moderate short-term fading, random, from one second to the next, over a perhaps 30-db range, quite rapid variations in level. Average signal level stayed pretty constant over the six minutes they stayed in. 3/30: Signal noted in weak again 2335. Came up fairly rapidly at that time and was in fairly well 2335-2343 with man speaking, as on 3/29. YL at 2343 to 2343:15, then agn into music. Agn, 2 selections noted, not quite as bouncy as those hrd 3/29 but in Far E style. Sig faded around 2347 to 2350 gradually. At best, not quite as good a reception as 3/29. 3/ 31: Despite intensive monitoring for the whole 2315-0000 period, not even trace of carrier noted, nothing since either, tho not often home. TV sweep buzz lands on 1526+ and with downstairs set off, radiation from neighbor's set provides a marker, very weak, and by tuning down from this, I can spot 1525 very accurately. I did BFO checks on 3/29 and 3/30 and on both dates found the one strong carrier, and what was probably another very weak carrier almost exactly on freq along with it. No evidence was noted of the low 100 or 150 Hz het hrd prominently on 10/13/72 reception. No trace of a second audio on any reception. SAH determinations inconclusive due to short-term fading noted. Lengthy tapes of 3/29, 3/30 receptions on hand. Neither as good, however, as fantastic 10/13/72 signal which was hrd by Grant, Bailey and Merriman, besides myself. (Foxworth, NY) (Guess you heard it, Bob. Hihl! Ed.)

1550 USA. tune-in 1745 4/12 KPHI San Francisco (presumed) weak stn badly fading w/San Francisco area spots and Hi-F1 tips. (Bundy, Truk)

1550 unID. Hrd 2000 4/12 Weak EE stn hrd briefly under AFMT... Have been looking for listed Guam AFRS station at Finegayan Naval Base, but no definite clues yet. Was previously impossible due to strong mixing product on this frequency from locals WSZC and WSZD. 4QD is likely a suspect. (Bundy, Truk)

550 Puerto Rico. WKFE, Yauco noted w/s/on at 0925 MM 4/9 while on inconclusive stakeout for 4QD. Tried on 4/2 but cx were very bad, so much so that couldn't even hear WKFE then. On 4/9 they were very weak, under someone's OC that was here most of the morning. Fairly optimistic stirrings of audio, maybe around 0905 on this freq never materialized. I held hopes as Mexicans and XEPRS heard well earlier. I hope that ANYONE on the WC hearing 4QD in the 0845-0930 period on MMs will publish same, so that we in the East will know what to expect. This DXer gave up and went to bed early MM 3/5, as cx seemed poor, but look what Ross Hansch heard that MM! Optimistically, WAAY which was AN either 3/19 or 3/26 (I forget which)MM has NOT been heard since, although they are often strong here on weekday AN pgm. The WKFE s/on seems to vary widely; today was late, I think. (Foxworth, NY)

==1550 Australia. 4QD Emerald, Qsld. assumed the one here with man talking 0908 MM 4/9 for several seconds and again for a min or so 0918, apparently long talk, mx, or discussion program or whatever, no mx hrd. Mostly just a carrier, very fady and weak, even sometimes that would disappear. No QRM until KXEL-1540 OC 0915, apparently all domestics off MM and no sign of HJZI. No ID but talk definitely accented EE, rough DF seemed close to W, almost same for Hawaii. Don't see any other possibilities so will count it for first DU, country #43, and station #1600. My most distant DX, also. Reception on \$25 Realistic TRF and \$5 unamplified loop. (Sherman, MN)
