- COSTA bos fair at times, 11/14 0445-0506. Had tropical between s, very shallow audio. Faded around 0450 leaving Metune o hear end of s/off and NA. Carrier cut at 0506. more t ts. (Falconer)
- 540 -COLOMBIA Very interesting situation here, long established A. Mandial in Hogota, HJEX on 1370 w/1 km, NDF since the early 50% when they used to battle JOHD in Tease after KEES and ELST signed off on MUNa, may have purchased the HJEX-Horizonte facilities. At any rate, on 11/11 after KELT test s/off at C800, the dominant latin w/MOH modern latin recordings, made much mentions of R. Mandial and BCN. At O803, production ID: "Esta es is senal internacional de BCN, Is asdio de Colombia". At O817, "Sacio Mundial presentan Musicales BCN." At O811, "a. Mandial, frequencia Musical de BCN", etc. No commercials were heard. Another latin, w/Tropical mx and some w/an Andean Indian flavor, had more frequent annus by both man and woman, but could not be IDed. likely Tropicana, I guess. (Collarman)
 - -HIGHAGEA Tape on 11/11 from 1047-1147 found H. Corporation in Managua domiment over another latin, a US atm singing on w/ESB and Dixie at 1055, and a FF atm. The YB had lots of commercials at 1055 and again at 1125, w/a dramatic program, lots of dialogue, beginning at 1100. At 1130, 2 male ancre had rapid-fire my and commercials. Time checks in EST. (Callarman)
- 550 -UNID Hight have been WFRB Fonce, F.B. at 0100 11/12 w/repid talk in seemingly FR dislect of SS. WMAQ-580 and WRFM-680 were excellent at same time. Just missed hourly ID. (Foxworth)
- -UNID Probably YV at 0750 11/16 w/TOs for ADT spoken slowly and little speech between each record, faded at hour. Heard later, around time of KHMO LX but no ID again, seems AN. Definitely not any Ouban format. (Foxworth)
- 579.5-MEXICO Net on WIBW earlier on car radio led to checking 11/16 from G2A3; freq varied slightly. G2A7 comedy dialog, S5; G2A8 TC "..de la popularidad en la frontera, satio /Mascota?/"; G253, GST TC, G259, ID as "A. Variedader" mil watts, "musica moderna"; G3G3 ad for the ZAh Distribuidora Corona en la Carretera /Caxaquena/ y Avinida Lopes Matece...", ad string, weaker by G3A1. The H. Variedades known is XEMP, Ciudad Victoria but this isn't on the border; maybe a change for XEMU, Piedran Negras? Tried subsequent nights, but couldn't pull it thru. (Hauser) Full free given as 579.63.
- 580 -EL SALVADOR Seldom reported before midnight, 11/15 managed to mull WINW, 0359 giving net stms on other freqs: "...1080, para la zona oriental, en San Miguel ...220 (T), Santa Ana, Zona Occidental...* However, Rediocadena Central, YSDR Santa Ana, is listed on this freq. 2 spaced chines, (Hauser)
- 580.5-UNID Flanking 580 on this side, a het noted 0341 11/16; no audio. (Hauner)
 584 MiFSE Presumed Swobodnyi, foreign service outlet w/GC program 11/18 1152-1202.
 At 1200, Kremlin bells and CC talk similiar to 047. 37 carrier at best, weak
 sudio w/HOGO slop. No HFO on listed Chinese-585. (Seaver)
- 595 -DOMINICA Surprisingly strong 11/16 0210 slow mx w/talkover; 0215 back after fade; mostly lo-key; 0230 exactly, ID as Hadio lominica, devotional, s/off, arateurish anthem, 0233:35 OG, rock steady; still on at 0238 the gradually fading. (Hauser) ** Finally, due to my inactivity past year, logged this one on this channel w/vy shallow audio 0157 11/16. Caribbean EE talk program, w/ local mentions. (Edmunds) 112 (ED)
- 625 -COSTA RICK/FERU? TIKE H. Omega way on top here w/WWW slop 0310 11/16. SS readable u/them, looping Peru, only likely other to be heard here so tentatively that. (Binunds) 124 (ED)
- 630 -MEXICO XEFS Monterrey, NL 11/15 1226-1230 w/local nx, ads, ID at 1230 by call letters, then lost. Also 11/16 same time and programs. (Glesson) A MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR OUR NEW SEALAND PRIENCE-THEY NOW HAVE 26 AMers TO WORRY ABOUT. GEE, FELLOUS, WE'VE GOT SOME PREQUENCIES OF HEME WITH THAT MANY AMERS ON THEM !!

-GUADELOUPE ORTF was atop w/girl FF speaker 2300 11/15, some mx at times. Never stays in very long and always heard early in the evening here. Soon lost to YVQO-CMQ. (Foxworth)

-SURINAM Radika atop the freq w/lots of company 0015 11/18 (Sun evening here)

w/typical Hindi program. (Foxworth)

-FARAGUAY ZP19, R. Caaguazu, Coronel Oviedo, 11/18 t/in 0445 w/mostly mx. some anmts. Splash from CMQ-640 and WSM-650. Sig w/fades into noise level, at times good level. No flutter, long slow fading. Super ID w/super sig strength taped 0547 for tape file, no question about it, including mentioning "..republica de Paraguay..." and TC including "...cuatro hora..." More than 2 minutes anmts also taped 0558-0600. Better than Brazilians on 860 & 1180 and Argentina on 1030 which have been heard last season and this season. New country. Is this just 5 kw? (Sundstrom) You may get a visit from Captain Glotz for not reading your DXN. Power increase to 10 kw was reported in DXN Vol. 41, #26. (ED) ** Not noted again despite several checkbacks. (Foxworth) You obviously aren't checking at the right time. (ED)

-UNID A het of about 250 hz noted 0850 11/18; Paraguay and ?? (Hauser) -UNITED KINGDOM BBS FS. Daventry noted 11/7 in passing w/electronic piano ...- IS 0345; nice clear sig, about S7. (Taylor) Glad to see you escaped from the basement. Did RS ID this for you? (ED)

- -CUBA CMKU Santiago, 11/18, tentative, only typical IS (//630,640) hrd 0500, thru WSM, no other audio. Part of R. Liberacion network? Only Cuban listed here to my knowledge. (Sundstrom) * * Radio Liberacion noted here for first w/mentions of "...en Cuba" 11/4 0935. (Shaftan)
 - -MEXICO XEZM Zamora, Mich. 11/14 1245-1305. Soap opera 1245-1256, spots to 1300, then ranchera mx. ID clearly as "En Zamora, escuchan a X-E-Z-M" w/ echo on the 4 call letters. At times 100% readable, totally cove ring XETNT who is on same bearing. Mich #3. (Gleason)

-VENEZUEIA Radio Girardot 11/4 noted here 0926 w/AST TCs w/HJJX (who IDed

previously). Also ran some IA mx. O/u Cuban. (Shaftan)

-VENEZUEIA 0328 11/18, 5:26 TC, "hora Rumbos-la hora de Venezuela" u/WMAQ CC. Looks like Venezuela needs a better hora-like Cagigal. (Hauser) ** Tentative Venezuelan noted here ripping up usual mess of WMAQ/CMKP here w/WI-SA mx also some Surinam wailing and some Calypso. Assumed per power. 11/16 0312. -COSTA RICA Radio Sonora noted here 0332 11/16 tnx to PT tip. Ran/(Shaftan)

some IA mx, frequent IDs as "Esta es-Radio Sonora". Bombing in at S9 here. No QRM from domestics here (cause none existed on sidebands, hi). This is contrary to AM's observations in Foreign Log which says no IDs as R. Sonora heard. Here no other IDs noted. Beautiful tape. (Shaftan) 116 (ED) -PUERTO RICO WAPA San Juan noted w/a very nice ID clear atop at 0100 11/18 and

was in from about a half hour before to 15 or 20 mins after that, then nice PR opening died out. Checked quite a few other freqs, 740,810,870, etc. w/ negative results and likewise nothing on 780 or 1000 so seemed just a bottom of band opening (see 550 tent). -COSTA RICA Radio Reloj finally definitely IDed w/"Radio Reloj en Costa Rica" 0852 about even w/WIW. Good tape 11/11. (Shaftan)

-VENEZUEIA Radio Popular, YVMH on top in WIW null w/up tempo mx. 11/13 2315-

- 2330 finally giving way to the TI w/someone else u/them. (Falconer) 11/18 1027-1032, 1051-1102, typical KBS program, talk at 1030, into a play or soap opera w/singing and 2 YL's talking to 1058; at 1100 a probable "KBS...HLKA" ID by YL, followed by KBS pips _____, then OM talk. Faded some at ID time (Murley's law). KMPC was off until after 1230.
- 75 -CHINA Foochow, Fukien regional stn (I BELIEVE) heard very well /(Seaver) w/man and woman alternating in speaking some strange language (not CC) on NM 11/18 at 1005. Faded out at 1102 but heard again after 1215. Have good tape,

-MEXICO (Tentative) XEX Mexico, DF noted here w/riano mx, Most inst 0807. SS talk. (Shaftan) 129 (ED)

- THO -BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS ZBVI Hoadtown, Tortola 11/16 at 0123; male ancr with strong NN accent during Calypso mx prgm; call 20616 for Auto Repair Service; Mobile Home Sales for St. John's, St. Croix, phone 773-4615, Heinicken's spot: "Penny for penny, it's Heinickens, #1 best flavour all over the VI". -CUBA Radio Rebelde noted here on new freq w/IA mx, ID 0520 11/16./(Taylor)
- First time have noted audio from this new outlet tho I have gotten hets against WBEM before. No sign of WBEM tonight tho. Was bombing in at S9. -NEXICO XEROK Ciudad Juarez finally noted for first time.w/new /(Shaftan) call 11/10 at 0440 in null of PJB/CKIW remnants during La Hora Nacional and

// XEW. Nice way to log XE's, hi. (Taylor) -NETHERLANDS ANTILLES IN Nederland noted for first time as rarely fades in

before 0200. Hrd w/SS program very weak in CKIW, etc. mess 2342. 0010 ran

-MEXICO XEUX Tuxpen, Nayarit 11/24 1301-1307 when XERSU signed on late. Hrd string of local ads, plus one for movie house in Vallarta, Jal., and Bullfight in Mazatlan, Sin. Was completely in clear, like a local. #2 from this new state. (Cleason)

-MEXICO XERSU Ciudad Obregon, Son. Address I have is Apartado Postal 75, and street address is Blvd. Rodolfo Elias Calles y Durango. Is owned by one of the newspapers. Telephone information probably had them as "R. Variedades" and not as XERSU. If you want to call, its 3-78-10. (I haven't gotten a

verie after 4 f/ups). (Gleason)

-UNID'S At least one IA and probably more u/pest HJCY here w/IA mx. Freq sounded like a IA graveyard w/HJCY dominant in mess. 1004 11/11. (Shaftan) -UNID UFO (Unid Foreign Oriental), likely FDR Korean outlet at Najin (WRTH List), w/what sounded like 2nd net program in KK, martial mx, strident talk,

etc. Seemed // Wonsan-877. 11/18 1210 and on. Severe WBAP QRM. (Seaver) 5-UNID 11/3 het noted on this odd freq. Probably some local spur but anyone

have any ideas who? 0542. (Shaftan)

-HAITI 4VEF noted here for first time on null of super pest WNYC. Had FF rel program, very strong w/no sign of WHAS. S/off 0154 w/Amazing Grace. Beautiful tape of s/off mx. No mention of freqs like 1035 w/off with. 11/10. -ST LUCIA R. Caribbean Internacional noted here after 4VEF s/off w/FF rel

program, ID 0203, s/off w/what was presumed NA 0204. (Shaftan, last 2) -UNID 11/15 0450-0510 w/soft SS MoR vocals. Opening best seen to Honduras.

Nicaragua and C.R. at time. Seemed to have nx at 0500. (Gleason) 🟥 -COLOMBIA HJKC Emisora Nuevo Mundo, Bogota 11/14 0140 w/some type of live

event, feeding CARACOL. Heard 2 nights previous same time w/elimination round of a beauty contest. Well o/KOA, some one on channel about 100 hz off. (Gleason) Stn off freq likely the TG. (ED)

-PERU OAX4H R. Nacional del Peru, Lima fairly well 0325 on 11/16 w/woman singing native songs and long talk by man in SS. Haven't heard this one for a

long time. Verified many years ago. (D. Reynolds)

- -UNID SS W/a very interesting sig in the old "Go West After Sunrise" syndrome. In fact, it was toward the end of the Mt. Vernon Critical Hours when I found ranchera mx, both slow and fast, on the channel at 1504. Heard short anmt by both man and woman, but could not dig them cut. Looped toward Central Mexico but there wasn't enough of an angle to get rid of WwL, which took over at 1516. (Callarman)
- -UNID W/SS rock 0516-0520 11/15, heard mention of "Costa Rica" once, had 2 min fast CST time, plus jingle before each record. (Gleason)

-SOUTH KOREA HLKB Pusan well on top of JOHK at 1300 pips but then o/u w/hard to tell JJ from KK. This on MM 11/18. Other S. Koreans noted this morning also. (D. Reynolds)

🚰 -HAITI 4VRNM, R. Nouveau Monde tentatively the one here 11/16 in FF w/5 cuckoos, mx in FF by male ancr 2200, including frequent Haitien items. Sound like they? (Taylor) * * W/ID 0300 11/16 in/out w/R. Aeropuerto and domestics in seve re aurora. Taped, new. (Edmunds)

-UNID Trying for Haiti here, a girl singing at 0120 11/18, seemed cuts from an album of archaic slow ballads, commentary by deep voiced man, (Cont)

-UNID (Cont) a few words about the mx between each cut. No ID noted at half hour. Cenerally clear and atop but by 0140 started to get some signal from 91-Q (WHCQ Conn) though signal was still in there at times. At 0200 I heard definite Radio Canada nx on the hour which almost certainly was CHRL (who has been heard several evenings here this year). I also had a definite Radio Canada ID at 0300 11/15 here, though much weaker then. I tried 910 after talking to RJE who says that AVRNM had been heard. I don't know if I had the 4V or CHRL, or both, but much of the reception is on tape for analysis. (Taylor) -UNID A tantalizing one here in AA, quite strong w/male Quoranic chanting at 2330. sig at S9 even on 11/4. Bearings skewed, so no help from DF. Help? -MEXICO XELC La Piedad, Michoacan 11/15 1202-1210 w/ID as "L-C" /(Taylor) and into "Mexico, creo en ti" PSA program at 1203. Very good signal, slowly faded out. (Gleason)

-JAPAN JONR Osaka at S6-7 level at 1118 on 11/25. They have fine varied programming. (Wilkinson)

-UNID Likely JONR, heard 11/11 1054-1102. OM & YL talk in JJ, a very quick set of tones, then 3 tones and a longer tone on the hour. Could be 2 UFO's and domestics and Mexicans. JONR reportedly has long tone on the hour. -TURKEY New TRT outlet finally heard here 11/7 from 0230-0300 w/up tempo mx,

some MoR in Turkish: Fastern flavour to mx, very unlike AA fare hrd on Moroccans, Egypt, etc. No speaking noted through the half hour, but hugh gaps of dead air between cuts. First speech came at 0300, w/female ancr and ID, f/by nx. Fair tape, likewise new country, whatever that means. (Taylor) -GUATEMAIA TCOM Pajapita, "R. Frontera" 11/4 1213 w/wake-up greeting program, light SS rock. 1st time this season. (Gleason)

-MEXICO XEXL Patzcuaro, Mich. 11/16 1255-1258. Good u/KSWS carrier w/local spots for Patzcuaro and Uruapan, plus the ancrs opening remarks. Roswell on at 1258 ended log. XEXL must s/on at about 1255 daily, rather than 1300. -VENEZUEIA YVRS Radio Margarita, Ia Asuncion w/fair sigs on 11/25 at 0620 w/ KDKA off. Cuckoo clock IS then R. Margarita ID. IA mx. (Fogue) / (Hauser)

-VENEZUEIA The stn reported last time w/0800 s/on, is R. Calendario; better 11/26 0800 w/an unfamiliar march, which turned out to be "El Himno del Estado Zulia"; AST TC; s/on mentioned 9520 SW; 0804, "Amanecer Zuliano".

-UNID This one is driving me cuckoo...nothing much readable but those chirps, again 11/26 0714,0729,0744. Usually 3 at a time; KDKA carefully nulled. (Hauser) Looks like this is YVRS, see above. (ED)

-HAITI 4VEC noted here w/armchair copy 1025 11/11 playing SS rel program. 100% readable. (Shaftan)

-UNID An IA noted here 11/7 at 0215 tune-in, distinct from Ias Tablas on 1047; peaked to 10 db over S9 to a low of 🗊 in 45 second fades. Slow paced male ancr; SS male vocals e.g. "H ernando's Hideaway" 0225, a Dutch vocal 0227; short anmt by male ancr 0228 (unreadable, sounded like DD, not SS), f/by "Waterloo" in EE 0230. Not another new FJ?? (Taylor) According to RFS in DXM Las Tablas is now back on 1045, but don't know date they returned. (ED)

-COLOMBIA Madio Santa Fe nice and atop at 0724 11/19, in as well as SW // 4965. Soon faded completely and was replaced by R. Atlantico fairly strong. All the while 4965 stayed the same, hi. (Foxworth)

-COSTA RICA TIFC San Jose 11/5 0455 end of religious program, ID in EE by YL,

weak but no QRM. (Forth)

-UNID Someone noted here w/Surinam type wailing, IA mx, mentions of Bogota thru WTIC. No positive ID on \$\frac{1}{2}\$ hour but ran mx 0136 11/16. (Shaftan)

Phenomena such as lightning bursts will produce unexpected patterns. Since lightning is broadband radiation, it will produce the same pip height across the entire frequency range, and since it is present on every frequency at all instants that the strike lasts, it will cause the pip to stay up as long as the strike lasts. This results in a rectangularly shaped displacement with a jagged top. The width of the displacement depends on the length of the lightning strike.

Pulse radiation causes a series of spikes which may appear to drift slowly across the screen depending on the PRF (pulse repition freq.), and its ratio to the SB-620 sweep speed. LORAN-A which can be heard in the Northeast U.S. on 1900 and 1950 khz makes a pattern like the teeth of a wood saw. Periodic buzzing interference from appliances with brush-commutator motors that arc does pretty much the same thing. This distortion of the pulse shape is apparently due to shock excitation of the SB-620 crystal filter, with ringing causing pulse stretching.

Commercial spectrum analyzers have adjustable bandwidths in contrast to the fixed bandwidth of the SB-620. Since commercial units are often used at microwave frequencies, their bandwidth can often be several megahertz, contrasting to the 0.15 kilohertz SB-620 bandwidth. Such units will give a more accurate rendition of rapid transient phenomena, such as noise spikes and pulses, though this is not of very great practical importance to the MW DX'er.

This is a good place to look at "images" as they can be classified as "unknown signals". Images generated in the receiver are unavoidable byproducts of the superhetrodyning process. They aren't a great problem on MW due to the wide frequency ratios in the receiver's tuned circuits. and the high-Q front-end selectivity used by DX'ers. On shortwave, this is a more serious problem due to reduced ratios between desired/undesired signals, and the wideband antennas used by most SW DX'ers. When the DX'er tunes across part of the SW band and listens, it is not apparent which of the signals he hears drifting past belong there, and which are alien. The SB-620 dramatically answers this question. Use a moderately wide sweep width (20 to 30 khz) and operate "sweep width" in "variable" to give a fast response time. This is to allow the eye to track the pips as they move past. Look for pips going past in the opposite direction than the stream flowing past. These are the images (being heard at 2 x IF freq. or, 910 khz away from input frequency). Look also for pips which may appear to drift past in the same direction, but at half or twice the rate of the stream of pips flowing past. These are also bogey signals, which may be mixes generated in the receiver itself, and which often aren't audible as a signal or true image would be. A true image will cause a birdie or whistle as it crosses a signal pip moving the other direction, in the receiver passband. The cure is better antenna selectivity and/or set realignment.

Since it is not possible to predict what sort of unusual signals may be encountered by the reader from time to time, we can't say too much more. This is of main interest to the SB-620 who DXes other than the MW band. The Heath instruction manual has some comments and sample drawings dealing with AM, CW and SSB signals as found in the amateur bands. The experienced user will soon be able to get a feel for what comprises a signal by its sound and appearance. DX'ers interested in pursuing this further may find Hewlett-Packard Application Notes helpful, especially Nos. AN 150-1, AN 150-2 along with AN 150-4 and AN 150. Since this material deals almost exclusively with operation of Hewlett-Packard equipment, they are mainly of interest to the DX'er wishing to augment his technical knowledge and increase basic understanding of principles of operation. AN 150-2 (Pulsed RF analysis) helps the reader understand how a spectrum analyzer responds to impulse radiation, which we discussed above. See also the reading list at the end of the article.

List of Spurious Responses and Images encountered in Author's Unit.

- 1. Weak pip, travels across screen at half the speed of real signal pips as the receiver is tuned (hereafter called "half speed"). Centers on screen when rx is tuned to 575. Pip is seen with receiver RF Gain all the way down.
- 2. Strong pip, travels across screen at "full speed". Appears at 700 khz. This

- is obviously the 2nd harmonic of the signal in the SB-620 IF chain getting back into the input. This behaves just like a real signal pip at 700 khz, although nothing is heard in the receiver.
- 3. A fairly strong pip appears to move at half-speed, centers on the SB-620 when receiver is tuned to 802; coincides with the 800 khz pip when receiver is tuned to 795 khz. This pip remains on the screen with the RF Gain on the receiver all the way down. Like #1, this one disappears when receiver is placed on "standby".

4. Sweep oscillator in the SB-620 (350 + 455) appears at about 805 khz and radiates from the SB-620, and can be heard in the receiver as a "weep-weep" sound. This is more apparent if the DX'er is using a loop close to the SB-620.

- 5. A weak pip appears that stays stationary on the SB-620 screen as the receiver is tuned. It is only seen in the 1140 to 1170 khz range and appears slightly to the high side (to the left of center). It rises up and then fades down as the receiver is tuned through the range. It moves in and out with adjustment of the "vrbl sweep width" pot. It disappears with the antenna switched off. No audible signal in the receiver is associated with it. It appears strongest at the 1155 position on the baseline when the receiver is tuned to 1150.
- 6. Same kind as above; stays stationary as receiver is tuned. Appears 10 kc to the left (higher) as the receiver is tuned from 1240 to 1280.
- 7. Pip appears at center screen when receiver is tuned to 1505 khz. This is perhaps the most objectionable spur in the whole list. It travels across the SB-620 screen at half-speed and is strong enough that it could be confused with weak DX. With the receiver tuned to 1496, the spur pip appears at 1500. With the receiver tuned to 1500, the spur appears at 1502 on the screen. Tuned to 1505, the spur appears there (center screen) and tuning the receiver up to 1515 makes the spur pip move up to 1510.
- 8. A weak pip moving at "half speed" appears at center screen with the receiver is tuned to 1610; FF gain has no effect on it. It is usually buried in the noise.
- 9. A weak pip, barely visible, appears, moving at half speed, when receiver is tuned to 2310 and RF gain has no effect on it.
- 10. RF leakage at various points in the SW spectrum, and to a lesser extent, causes image energy to be created at 350 khz at the SB-620 input. This can cause the entire baseline to lift up. Refer to Heath manual for more on this. We have found slight evidence of this when the HQ-150 is tuned to 797 khz, the height of the baseline varies with the setting of the receiver RF gain control.

It is likely that a fussier alignment, and a bandpass filter in the SB-620 input would eliminate much if not all of these problems, or reduce them to the level at which they would not be readily noticeable. Only items 2, 3 and 7, above, have been of any real annoyance to the author. Readers who own HP-45 calculators are invited to calculate which mixing mechanisms are responsible for the above pips. Readers whose receivers' IF differs from 455 khz will probably find their own completely new and different set of image pips.

Connection to the Receiver.




Fig. 15. Assembly manual description of interconnection with the receiver.

The recommended Heath procedure is of course entirely satisfactory, and is recommended to the DX'er not thoroughly versed in electronic fundamentals. A permanent connection may be made by running a co-ax lead from under the receiver chassis, through the isolating capacitor supplied with the kit, installed on the mixer tube plate pin, and out the side or back of the cabinet, and to the SB-620 input. This is the procedure described in the Heath manual, as shown in Figure 15:

This is a simple procedure for single-conversion receivers with no first IF in the 2 or 3 mhz range; that is, with only a single mixer at 455 khz. There is no confusion, then, as to which tube to connect to.

THE CONNECTING CABLE MUST BE CONNECTED TO THE PLATE OF THE MISE TUBE JUST PRECEDING THE FIRST IF AMPLIFIER OF THE RECEIVER.

Many DX'ers own HQ-180 series receivers, and it is possible to use the SB-620 with this receiver, especially if we keep our interest limited to scanning a relatively narrow band of frequencies such as 20 or 30 khz. (Preselection in the first IF of the receiver might cause roll-off of gain farther out than that). The following are comments kindly provided by Eugene Vonderembse regarding his experiences with the HQ-180 receiver, used with the SB-620 and the Heath HD-11 Q-M.

"Just a note to say that I'm delighted with the SB-620. With the FMS-3 to calibrate it, the Scanalyzer is a superb device for any serious DX'er. I already have located several stations that I would have never noted without it. No serious problems in construction. When I turned on the SB-620 I did find that the pilot light refused to go on in the "linear" position, but quickly discovered that reheating the proper solder joint would solve that trouble. And I found that the recommended 3/4-inch screws were too long when I put the device into its cabinet. One screw shorted out the pip gain control. That quickly was corrected by using 1/2 inch screws. Otherwise everything went perfectly.

"I do get a spurious pip at 805 khz, courtesy of the sweep oscillator, and I also get a whishing sound there. I'm using the SB-620 on my HQ-180A. To avoid the need of digging into the guts of the receiver, I bought a test socket and made the connection to it. That works very well. I've grounded it carefully, and I have a well-grounded shield over the tube. Actually, I used this system before in experimenting with the Q-multiplier and found it satisfactory, so anticipated that I could use it.

"There is a problem with the HQ-180A. The first 455 IF becomes a 3035 IF stage on the two highest bands, and with the SB-620 wired for 455, it did not function on those two bands. A possible answer would be to construct two pre-mixer stages for the Scanalyzer, and switch them in and out as needed. As far as that goes, though, that's not a serious problem. I don't use the two bands very much ...for a SWL, that would be a serious difficulty. Note: A single IF can has the coils for the first IF for both stages, 455 and 3035, so both can easily be adjusted to compensate for the Scanalyzer. The low IF coil is tuned from the top, and I've made that adjustment. But since I must take the receiver out of the cabinet to get to the 3035 coil, I haven't bothered to correct it yet.

(later) "I've attempted the hook-up that you suggested, but I tied into the plate circuit of the First Converter, V3. Eventually I will probably try V4 as you suggested. I decided, however, that V3 was a logical place to start my experimentation. One advantage of using the test-socket system is

that I can easily switch from tube to tube. It simply is a matter of plugging in the socket and plugging the tube into it.

"The SB-620 now does work on all receiver bands, and I've lost a couple of unwanted pips. While it may be there, I've been unable to find the 805 pip in my preliminary examination. I did locate that pip at 1502 that you mentioned with the old system. It still is around, though it's lost some of its amplitude. And the sound of the oscillator, around 805, seems to have gone.

"My tests to date suggest that the signal already has narrowed in bandwidth at V3. 


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"Just a note to say that I'm delighted with the SB-620. With the FMS-3 to calibrate it, the Scanalyzer is a superb device for any serious DX'er. I already have located several stations that I would have never noted without it. No serious problems in construction. When I turned on the SB-620 I did find that the pilot light refused to go on in the "linear" position, but quickly discovered that reheating the proper solder joint would solve that trouble. And I found that the recommended 3/4-inch screws were too long when I put the device into its cabinet. One screw shorted out the pip gain control. That quickly was corrected by using 1/2 inch screws. Otherwise everything went perfectly.

"I do get a spurious pip at 805 khz, courtesy of the sweep oscillator, and I also get a whishing sound there. I'm using the SB-620 on my HQ-180A. To avoid the need of digging into the guts of the receiver, I bought a test socket and made the connection to it. That works very well. I've grounded it carefully, and I have a well-grounded shield over the tube. Actually, I used this system before in experimenting with the Q-multiplier and found it satisfactory, so anticipated that I could use it.

"There is a problem with the HQ-180A. The first 455 IF becomes a 3035 IF stage on the two highest bands, and with the SB-620 wired for 455, it did not function on those two bands. A possible answer would be to construct two pre-mixer stages for the Scanalyzer, and switch them in and out as needed. As far as that goes, though, that's not a serious problem. I don't use the two bands very much ...for a SWL, that would be a serious difficulty. Note: A single IF can has the coils for the first IF for both stages, 455 and 3035, so both can easily be adjusted to compensate for the Scanalyzer. The low IF coil is tuned from the top, and I've made that adjustment. But since I must take the receiver out of the cabinet to get to the 3035 coil, I haven't bothered to correct it yet.



Figure 16 illustrates the test socket adapters we've just referred to 13. These are simply extender devices with each lead brought out to a tab. for connection or measuring purposes, or troubleshooting when connections have to be accessed from the top of the chassis.



A semi-permanent hookup could involve one of these in the mixer tube socket, with all tabs snipped off except the plate pin. Check the schematic or tube basing diagram in a handbook to determine the plate pin. This reduces the hazard of shock or short-circuits. The capacitor can be soldered to the tab and the other end connected to the coax center conductor, and the braid cut short, with a wire soldered to the braid and then run to a nearby ground point.



Fig. 17. Connecting the coax lead to the test adaptor.


If you can get at the bottom of your receiver, you can make the same connection at the plate pin on the socket itself with the coax ground made close at hand. This will be a more mechanically rigid connection, with the coax lead out of sight, and does not require use of a test socket adapter. You can mount a jack on the rear deck of the chassis and thus greatly facilitate future removal of the receiver from the cabinet, as the cable can simply be unplugged from the rear, out in the open.

It must be remembered that the extra capacity to ground of the coax cable will detune the first IF stage. This is true whether the cable is run all the way to the SB-620 input, or just terminated in a jack at the rear of the receiver. The longer the cable run is, the more the detuning that will take place. If the jack approach is used, furthermore, if the IF is aligned for the cable length in use with the SB-620, it then becomes misaligned when the cable is unplugged and the receiver operated without the SB-620. In other words, even with the jack disconnected from the SB-620 cable lead, the length of cable from the mixer to the jack will still be enough to slightly detune the first IF. The manual describes this.

An isolation stage can be added to eliminate the problem. It consists of a simple tube. A type 604 was used, and it goes between the mixer and the cable run. It is called a cathode follower, and has very high input impedance (it doesn't draw any power from the mixer) and has a gain of near unity (the output level is about 90% of the input level). With this addition, the mixer doesn't care or know if a long length of cable is tied to it or not, and no IF repeaking is necessary, whether the SB-620 is connected or not. Each DX'er adding this tube will have to work out how to do the mechanical arrangement himself, depending on the type of

receiver he has. Those knowledgeable can use a transistor design to do this, with simplification of the mechanical part of the job. We used the tube because all the parts were on hand, and can be easily obtained almost anywhere.

In the HQ-150 we punched a 5/8 inch diameter hole between the mixer and localoscillator tube. Plenty of space is available for this, above and below the chassis. Use a Greenlee socket punch for this job 15. You will have to drill a 1/4 inch starting hole for the punch.



You can't get in to turn the punch with an open-end wrench, most likely, so use a socket wrench, 3/8 inch drive with a 6 inch extender. To punch a hole for a 7-pin miniature tube socket, you'll need a 1/4 inch predrilled pilot hole. Use a 5/8 inch punch which can be driven by a 7/16 inch 6-point socket (S-K 45114) which is a standard item in a socket set. To mount a 9-pin miniature tube socket, drill a 3/8 inch pilot hole and use a 3/4 inch punch. Sockets for 8-pin octal tube sockets need a 1 or a 1-1/8 inch punch. All three punches (3/4, 1 and 1-1/8) use a 3/8 inch pilot hole and can be driven with a 7/16 inch EIGHT-point socket (Craftsman part no. 44344, from Sears and Roebuck). These larger punches have a square, rather than a hex head, ostensibly for use with open end wrenches to give a better grip while turning. It takes muscle to punch through steel! Liberally oil the threads of your punch, and it'll last a lifetime. Incidentally 3/8 inch drills with reduced shanks to fit 1/4 inch drill chucks are available in hardware stores. You won't need a 3/8"-chuck drill. Once you get the socket mounted, wire the circuit as shown in Fig. 18. All parts are standard and non-critical values. Steal 6.3vAC for the filaments and B+ from handy places in the receiver.


Fig. 15. Catanda follower direct to isolate the first II stage from the coax lead capacitance, making re-peaking of the IF transformer unnecessary.

Difficulties in Operation. If your unit doesn't work ... much of the difficulty can be attributed to improper parts installation, improper hookup, improper control setting or even defective parts supplied in the kit. (Parts are NOT 100% QC checked by kit sellers on receipt from vendors).

Tom Sundstrom's unit evidently was supplied with a power transformer that had either a shorted turn, or an inter-winding short, as it did not supply rated nower, and his kit did not sweep properly. Heath replaced the transformer, and the kit, which had been wired properly to begin with, now works fine. A couple of units have turned up on the resale market with incorrect wiring that had to he traced out and fixed. (Probably the cause of the original owner selling in the first place). The author's unit worked fine from initial turn-on for over 16 months until one of the high voltage diodes (p/n 57-44) shorted. This drew heavy current and popped a winding on the transformer, resulting in no high-voltage for the the CRT and no trace. The diodes (list \$1.40 in 1972 but \$2.10 now) were replaced. and a substitute transformer run outboard to replace the open winding. A new transformer (\$6.90 in 1972 but \$13.05 today) has been ordered. My substitute transformer is a Triad R3-A rated at 500vCT at 20 ma. The CT is left floating and the sec'v ends go where the yellow and blue original leads went. If you ever lose high-voltage in your unit. this can get you back in operation. The primary runs off 110vAC. Also, the push-in speedup switch was erratic. That can be paralleled with another switch, but isn't the most important thing on the kit, although handy at times. Heath is very helpful in getting kits to work. If your kit doesn't work, go back to where it was bought and check with them.

Other considerations. An interesting aspect of using the SB-620 in surveillance applications is in monitoring the local CB activity in one's particular area. You can set the unit up to monitor as many as a dozen adjacent CB channels in one sweep, and still be able to resolve each one. If you have a nearby CB operator using an illegal linear, putting garbage all over the MW and TV bands (as many cheap linears seem to do) you can zero in on him pretty rapidly. Once you pinpoint the errant CB operator, bring the "Citizen's Band Alignment Aid" 24 into play and your troubles should soon end. It was this type of surveillance, locating brief Axis radio signal, that led to development of the panoramic receiver in World War II.

FM DXers in isolated ("White") areas with no FM locals would find a VHF Spectrum analyzer invaluable in detecting FM skip openings. The SB-620 can NOT be used for this application, unfortunately, but the DX'er with the scratch for a really professional-grade lab unit can have capability to sweep the entire FM band at one sweep, with a dynamic range of 70 db or greater. A FM band opening could be immediately spotted. The capabilities of visual signal detection are fascinating; we hope this article will spur further research and effort by DXers.

The pictures are from Hewlett-Packard AN-63. 12 They illustrate a sweep of the complete FM BCB in the San Francisco area. These pictures are very similar to results obtainable from the SB-620, although resolution is sharper. The pictures were retouched for greater white/black contrast, but the geometry of the trace is still apparent.

It is interesting to note that a commercially available FM Tuner, the Sequerra Model One 16 comes with a built-in spectrum analyzer for the FM band, as well as allowing the oscilloscope section to function as a multipath indicator and stereo separation monitor. Perhaps the advantages of spectrum analysis are being more apparent to more people.

One last comment. It's often difficult to see the trace in a brightly lit room. One of the most helpful things we know of is to use a goose-neck or elbow-arm artists lamp to illuminate the operating table, and run the bulb off a Variac or autotransformer circuit. Putting anywhere from 50 to 90 volts onto the bulb, which burns brightly at 115v, gives a mellow light that is entirely adequate for note-taking but is not hard on the eyes during a long all-night DX session, and more importantly, does not drown out the CRT screen with backlighting, making visibility of small pips much easier. We use a small rotary autotransformer to vary the lamp brightness, and often run it way down, at about 50 volts, and it really helps reduce glare-induced eyestrain. And, the SB-620 is clearly viewable without having to use excessive trace brightness. Obviously a SCR light dimmer cannot be used in this application because of the switching spike noise it causes at RF. The autotransformer is completely non-RFI generating, and quiet.

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Footnote:

Heath is introducing an entirely new line of SB-series amateur-oriented gear. including the SB-104 HF transceiver and SB-514 monitor oscilloscope. This brings up the question of whether the company is planning a new spectrum analyzer to be a part of this new series, which incidentally is solid-state. In the event the company does introduce a new spectrum analyzer, it would likely replace the SB-620. In that event, the definitive remarks concerning the assembly manual and procedure would no longer apply, but all the theory and basics of operation, including control functions and designations should still all remain valid and still be applicable. It is probable, in the author's opinion, that the SB-300 series kit will be offered for a while longer, alongside the newly-introduced units, and that the SB-620 thus will continue to be available in the coming months, as it is at this writing. (A parallel situation exists with their line of Digital Clocks; while an improved version is now available, the original model continues to also be offered). Nonetheless, even if the SB-620 is withdrawn from sale in future months, the resale market for completed units should expand somewhat, as amateurs trade-in for the newer equipment. Any reader of this article contemplating purchasing the SB-620 kit should not wait too long to check with the dealer - especially as the price is always subject to change.





Fig. 20. Commercial equivalents of the Heath SB-620, with more versatility and with a much higher price tag.







To the few with comments on the difficult problems in adding patterns like these to the NRC Pattern Book.

Try holding the book over the new pattern. Then hold the whole mess up to a window facing the sunlight. Now center the outlines of PROVINCES or STATES. At this point the pattern is very close and you won't be off more than about 5%, if that much, in your tracing.

Suggest pattern is copied with pencil and then re-drawn with a felt tip pen into the pattern book.



The reason was that neither loop could cut out KCVR (5kw in Lodi & 55 miles distant). However, on distant DX the larger loops give a better signal-t -noise ratio but do not have the pinpoint selectivity of the SM-1. KKAA-1560 S.D. reported 8/31 & a f/up to Kallestad on 10/21 have produced no veri - guess they aren't interested in IX reports. The Specials of 11/18 were obliterated by an S=9 QRN created by a heating pad in the neighborhood. This noise came on on 11/7 so Ihope it doesn't cause me to give up DXing.
