money. A simple R-C filter that passes 200-3000 cps was the difference between my totally readable tape of KREX 1100 and Karl Jeter's partially readable tape, recorded simultaneously off a Beverage. The spare parts filter eliminated the low grumble of LA hets on the channel that usually degrade DX on the channel here. The peak is just great for CW but many plans for a simple sharp filter have appeared in CQ and QST that would cost a fraction of the QF-l cost.

The QF-I that I used was horrowed from NRC'er Vern Shearer of Atlanta. Linda Brodsky had a chance to use the unit, and all of us were disappointed in the results using peak and lowpass functions, but pleased with the notch. No ID's jumping out of the mud and splatter, etc. If you want every last bit of DX technology buy the QF-I but there are things that should be bought first, like mechanical filters, second rx's, a good loop, or a noise blanker.

A Brief Review of the Autek QF-I Audio Filter A THE REAL PROPERTY OF THE PRO

The QF-I is Autek's most recent audio filter. It is vastly different from the old Q-Box that many NRC'ers are familiar with, in that it provides notch, lowpass, and peak functions Each function is controlled by pots for frequency and selectivity. Only one function can be used at a time, making processing of DX tapes quite a chore if a lot of cleaning up needsto be done.

Electronically the QF-I consists of an active filter section employing 4 dual op amps-3 747's and a 741- plus an audio power stage and power supply for operation from ll7 VAC. Input and output impedances are not critical and in fact Autek claims they can be com-

Autek supplies typical response curves with their fliers and also with the QF-l instruction booklet. Anyone interested in the measured performance can write Autek as the graphs are too numerous to reproduce here.

Now for performance evaluation. I tried out the peak function in three situations: processing of DX tapes, live listening, and down on 80 meters for CW. It proved almost worthless for processing of tapes, not making one of my tapes more readable. I tried ali sorts of peak versus selectivity combinations but none of them seemed to be effective in getting ID's to stand out. In live listening results were equally disappointing, but perhaps this was due to the fact that my rx has been extensively modified and there is little left for an audio filter to do in the area of cleaning up. On CW the QF-l performed most admirably. I tuned down to 80 meters on a weekend night after dinner and found the usual wall to wall packing of signals; with the selectivity control advanced almost fully and my rx filters in the sharpest position I could easily read one and only one signal at a time. If the selectivity control is rotated fully the filter has too much of the ringing sound associated with sharp filters, and fast CW can not be copied.

The notch function is perhaps the most useful and effective of all for DX use. A sharp notch can be adjusted to any frequency, allowing the removal of the last bit of a heterodyne or TVI buzz that a notch filter left. It is also useful in removing a second heterodyne if you are DX'ing in close quarters. The notch is sharp enough to have no degrading effects on adjacent audio frequencies.

The lowpass function has a variable cutoff from 200 cps to 2500 cps, just barely high enough for AM DX'ing. Reducing the lowpass cutoff point below 2500 cps drastically reduces audio level and readability; tuning the lowpass frequency down only 10%-20% practically eliminates all audio.

My major criticism of the QF-l is the quality of the audio. It distorts on high level peaks regardless of the input signal level and can drastically interfere with the ability to read a signal. Even with the controls set for highest lowpass frequency and no notch or peak the audio sounds tinny and distorted to some degree. Shot noise and sideband splatter produce a distortion that lasts up to a second after the noise peak.

Overall the OF-I does not warrant the \$54 investment. If you need to notch out heterodynes you are much better off using a crystal filter notch or a Q- multiplier, as this will remove the carrier and reduce possible distortion via demodulation against the interfering carrier. If the last traces of heterodynes remain after notching and need to be removed a cheap audio notch filter can be built; I whipped one up from my junk box but the cost in Radio Shack parts would be less than \$8. Certainly everyone should have some sort of bandpass audio filter but I think an acceptable job can be done for much less

Product Review - McKay Dymek DR22 Receiver



McKay Dymek Co. of Pomona, CA. has announced development and marketing of a new synthesized receiver, the DR-22. Present plans are for the first deliveries of the unit to be made in mid-February, 1977. We feel there will be enough interest in this new unit to warrant our preparing this summary of the receiver's features for the benefit and information of all DXers. As we have stated in the past, in a case such as this, where we have not had the opportunity to personally evaluate the performance of the set, we can simply provide the manufacturer's specifications and allow the reader to make his own choice as to whether he may wish to consider purchase of the unit, without any recommendation (for or against) from this reviewer, or this club itself.

A halftone photo of the front panel of the set (which is taken from the writeup appearing in the firm's newsletter, Dymek News, Vol. 2 No. 2) appears elsewhere. All other information herein is from the same source. We also are including the block diagram and specifications that were included in the article.

The price (as of this writing) is \$895. The receiver tunes continuously from 50 kHz to 29700 kHz, including all the Longwave, and Medium and High Frequency bands. Five front panel knobs set the frequency to the nearest 5 kHz interval, which is indicated on the front panel by 7-segment light emitting diodes (LEDs). In addition the last knob also operates as a fine-tune adjust over a +5 to -5 kHz range, allowing exact tuning to a desired frequency. However the right hand LED does not vary as the fine tune is adjusted, but reads either 0 or 5 depending on the synthesizer step, so some "english" is called for in determining exactly where the set is tuned. However, the "narrow" bandwidth setting, being 4 kHz wide at the -3 db point (per specs) would make the tuning broad enough so that the exactness of tuning is relatively uncritical. The "wide" bandwidth setting is listed as being 8 kHz at -3 db so this should make the DR-22 a set that will provide good highfidelity audio (at least, as well as can be expected on SWBC etc.) and this also implies that it would be more difficult to separate weak signals from very close (in frequency) strong signals on this set than on others. There is a notch filter, but it operates at audio, not at IF, and is fixed at 5000 Hz which implies maximum usefulness on SWBC reception where channel allocations are generally 5 kHz apart. and where adjacent-channel signal levels are usually near those of the desired channel level. The Dymek write-up in fact emphasizes SWBC and hi-fi local AM reception, but it should be possible nevertheless to have good reception with clear, wideband audio on domestic (even-number) channels on the MF Broadcast band with the DR-22. This reviewer has often found that clarity and understanding is usually enhanced with wideband detection (where the signal/noise ratio permits) over that type of reception through crystal filters or mechanical filters. Of course, when copying in the presence of noise or sideband splash, or other forms of interference this is no longer true. The sensitivity in AM mode is listed as 2.5 microvolts through the entire range from 300 kHz to 29.7 mHz, although the specs do not specify how good the signal to noise ratio is at this figure. It is the reviewer's opinion that, while results would be good on domestic MF (and on HF) channels with moderate to strong signals and minimal to fair adjacent channel QRM, reception would be difficult of weak "splits" with the existing IF. If the signal were tapped out after the third L.O. at 455 kHz and run through a separate narrowband IF amplifier, it should be possible to get very good results in terms of selectivity, while existing wideband capability would be unaffected.



(The following remarks appeared verbatim in Dymek News for 12/76. They are authored by Paul Metsker, Chief Engineer for the McKay Dymek Company. We believe this will be of interest to many readers of DX News who are interested in following new developments in receiver design. The company's George McKay has given permission for us to describe the DR-22 in this bulletin, using material appearing in Dymek News. The preface says in part, "We believe ... the thinking of the engineer who designed it creates a document of considerable historical interest which can only underline the honesty and integrity incorporated in the receiver. Mr. Metsker's comments, taped in a casual setting, are reproduced here with only minimum editing")

Today sensitivity is no longer a real problem in designing a receiver. You can get sensitivity - very high sensitivity - very easily, but when you hook up a very sensitive receiver to a decent antenna, the receiver can easily be overloaded by stations on frequencies completely removed from the one you want to listen to, which can result in just hearing garbage on your frequency instead of the station you want.

Broadcast band signals are very strong; if you're living near a metropolis or something like that you might have several 50 to 100 millivolt signals coming in, and if the receiver can't handle those high level signals in the front end before they get to some selectivity, the receiver's usefulness is almost destroyed. On the short wave bands you can get 50 to 100 mv signals coming in from a decent long wire antenna. Even though the receiver has been designed for very high sensitivity, if care has not been taken to allow it to handle high level signals, it will develop intermodulation and cross modulation interference that will destroy a lot of your receiving ability. So, what we've done here, we've put extra care into the design to allow high signal level capability on adjacent frequencies. The first mixer is a double balanced hot-carrier diode mixer which is designed for power levels up to, I think the compression point is about +15 dBm, which allows a third-order intercept point of maybe +25 or so dBm, getting close to a decent fraction of a watt before you have extreme intermodulation.

A third-order intercept point is one good way of comparing receivers. Our DR22 should be approximately +25 or so dBm for the third-order intercept point; another receiver designed strictly for sensitivity might have a figure of--I've seen figures of -30, even -40 dBm--it'll be overloaded much sooner than our receiver will. We've got that high level first mixer, followed immediately by a crystal filter at the 30 mHz first IF to narrow down the passband as quickly as possible. After that, there is a stage of amplification at 30 mHz and then it's converted to 10.7 and immediately goes into a crystal filter before any more amplification, so that we get into as much selectivity as possible, as soon as possible, to prevent stages further down the line from getting overloaded.

So that is one thing--one of the outstanding features of the radio... I've had a (Brand X - name deleted in original copy-ed.) receiver, which costs like \$7,000, hooked up to a long wire antenna at my house, about one mile from KWOW here in Pomona, running 5,000 watts at 1600 kHz and delivering a signal of about 200 to 300 my peak-to-peak into 50 ohms. Without any tuned circuit at the antenna, the receiver is completely wiped out. In our DR22 we've provided the capability of bypassing the RF amplifier so that we can feed directly into the mixer without having an RF amplifier stage that can get overloaded. By doing that we still have satisfactory sensitivity down on the broadcast band and I use the receiver with no preselector at my house where this much more expensive radio (although it's built well) is just completely (overloaded). The DR22 does not have a preselector which would have to be peaked up each time you changed frequency. We tried to build the radio so you wouldn't have to do that. Now for extreme situations we're going to build a preselector as an accessory so that if a listener is right on top of a station, let's say he is a block away from 5,000 watts or 10,000 watts or whatever, he can still use the radio. We want to have that out at the same time the radio comes out, approximately. I'm working on that as another side project.

One position of the band switch uses the RF amplifier with no antenna filtering (except for the low pass filter, which is always in the circuit, the low pass filter rejects everything above 30 mHz, to get rid of images and any other interference that may be above 30 megs). The next position is fully wideband, no filtering, and straight into the first mixer. The next two positions put a high pass filter into the antenna line to reject everything below 2.5 mHz; one of the two positions uses the RF amplifier and one does not. Then the fifth position puts a 30 db antenna attenuator in the circuit and runs the signal directly into the mixer. With so many functions on the band switch available, I think in better than 90% of the cases of use the listener won't need the preselector, so that's why we didn't put it in every radio, avoiding the extra cost when it won't really be needed.

Another big feature this radio has over conventional radios is phase lock loop tuning. On a conventional radio right now that you might pay several hundred

dollars for, you tune the thing with a mechanical tuning dial and some kind of pointer to indicate where you are; you'll likely have adjustments for both a coil and a capacitor; either one could get out of alignment and throw your dial off. Mechanical backlash can introduce error also, and with normal use you might not know where you are within 10 or 20 or 30 kHz depending on how often and how closely the unit is calibrated. Here in the DR22 all local oscillators are crystal controlled. In the first local oscillator the frequency is set with rotary switches which program digital information into the phase lock loop to set it to the exact frequency that you want, and your tuning accuracy is derived right from a crystal no matter where you are (tuned). The fine tuning control is on the second local oscillator

allowing you to tune plus or minus 5 kHz from what the LED readouts say on the dial.

for tuning in single sideband exactly or for tuning off to the side a little if

Then we come up to the switchable selectivity and we actually switch between two different ceramic filters; one of them is a four kHz bandwidth and the other is an 8 kHz bandwidth, depending on what you need. In congested short wave use you might need the four kHz filter, for broadcast band use you might want the 8 kHz to get more fidelity up to the maximum available. (This implies local station reception on broadcast band-ed. note). Then we come through and we have a balanced modulator sideband detector fed with, again, a crystal controlled local oscillator and switches for 455 plus or minus 2.8 kHz to get the upper and lower sidebands. We actually have four crystal controlled oscillators; if you count the sideband oscillator there are actually five crystals in the unit. We could have cheapened it by trying to go to say an LC oscillator for that sideband detector but again we'd lose

quality. We'd lose stability that we get with the crystal. So that's what we went to.

So then, coming out of the detectors, both detectors come out to the tuner output. which is before the volume control. At that point you have the full audio response of the unit which gives bass response down to about 30 Hz and then the audio ... you know I leat out the notch filter! Before the tuner output there is the five kHz audio notcu to get rid of hetrodynes on short wave. After that, we've got our tuner output so that you can hook it up to any type of power amp you've got and run it through your audio system, or record off it, or whatever you want to do. Then we go to the volume control and then to a two watt audio amplifier and built-in Baker. There is a switch on the rear panel to turn off the internal speaker. there are connections for an external speaker, and then it's got the headphone jack on the front ...it's a nice radio. -Paul Metsker





MOTHBALL MEMORIES CHAPTER XLI - THE PHILADELPHIA FIELD, Part 2, by BEN DANGERFIELD WTEL, which is now 10,000 watts, has always been a foreign language specialist, mostly German, Polish and Greek, while WHAT eventually went into Negro programming. WCAM added Spanish and some Greek programs in more recent years. Oh yes, WTEL also has Spanish. On 1370 kc/s. WDAS replaced WELK very early in the 30's and had pop music as well as for eign programming - largely Italian and Irish. WDAS was the focal point of an interesting legal battle in the late 30's when the station was sued by Fred Waring who objected to free use of his records over the air. Other entertainers, including Benny Goodman, Guy Lombardo, and Hal Kemp, joined the battle, and eventually radio stations had to pay a royalty each time certain performers' records were used. In 1941, WDAS (always in West Philly) was shifted to 1400 kc/s. in he re-allocation, and in the postwar years moved to 1480 with increased power, also going into Negro programming. It was WDAS' Pat Stanton (of Irish Hour fame) who started his own station, WJMJ, about 1950. Originally WJMJ had requested 1530 kc/s., but WCKY blocked the application, claiming that daytime sky wave interference would result. After a long battle, WJMJ (whose call letters, I am told. stood for Jesus-Mary-Joseph), was assigned to 1540, where they are still, now known as WRCP, with country music. Back in the 1930's, again, it sould be noted that New York City stations played a major part in the listening habits of Philadelphians. When Philly had only one station to pro vide NBC programs (at a time when NBC had a Red and a Blue Network), WJZ-760 (now WABC-770) was a regular in the Philadelphia area with a strong signal from its 30kw transmitter in Bound Brook, N.J. WJZ was the key sta tion for NBC-Blue. WEAF-660 (later WRCA, now WNBC) was NBC-Red, and put in a somewhat weaker but still good signal. WOR, which went to 50kw in 1935, was directional right into Philadelphia from its old Cartaret transmitter, always with a potent signal. To a lesser extent WABC-860 (now WCBS-860) was listened to in the Philadelphia area. And WNEW did, and still does, blanket the Philly area. The only other New Jersey station heard well in Philadelphia in the pre-war era was long-defunct WPG-1100, Atlantic City "World's Play Ground"), which used 5,000 watts, but had to share the frequency with WLWL, New york. Perhaps other NRCers can add interesting tidbits to this description of Philadelphia radio as it once was. Oh - WRAX went off the air about 1937. THE END. SCIENTIFIC SPECULATION BY JUENEMAN

had your radiation dose today?

We're being inundated by the kilogram per second with words on the state of our environment. There are arguments currently raging over health hazard threshold limits of potential carcinogens and teratogenic agents. And, at one extreme, failure to define a lower threshold limit for narcotics, in the light of our ability to analyze ultratrace contaminants, makes anyone standing downwind of a hospital in danger of being nailed for unlawful drug abuse.

With all the more-or-less directed discussions about pollution of the environment, we haven't yet exhausted this resourceful snake-pit. However, there's a singular and peculiar phenomenon that is unique to the 20th century which hasn't yet been critically accused of being a pollutant.

Just to show where today's trend is heading—and, naturally, the point will eventually be raised—no one to my knowledge has indicted AM, FM, or TV broadcasts for polluting the environment. Of course, I hasten to add, there has been some outspoken comment on the content of the programing, but there has been very little said about our immersion in a continuum of coherent electromagnetic radiation 24 hours a day, year in and year out.

Throughout history mankind has survived and thrived in a natural and somewhat hostile world, where disease and deprivation, earthquakes and floods, have conditioned our species for each subsequent generation. However, up until this century we have not been asked to undergo continuous exposure to electromagnetic radiation where the broadcast spectrum of quarter- and halfwavelengths spans our growth cycle from infants to adults.

The radio energy contained in a thunderstorm or arriving from the sun is relatively insignificant compared to the man-made EM radiation emanating from the Earth, which because of its size could pass for a first class quasar in radio-brightness. But does any of this radiation affect us or our environment?

Some preliminary information in hand is conflicting, because the sub-liminal broadcast energy we normally receive seems to have been salubrious to some, made others into nervous wrecks, and apparently had no effect on the rest of us. All of this unconfirmed.

One specific case from a Texas metropolis was brought to my attention about a year ago, where a person of unusual sensitivity was nervously affected in some urban areas and not in others. This peculiarity was traced in part to FM reception and the vagaries of signal strength throughout the city.

My rationale for this uniqueappearing incident is that one point on a graph does not signify a trend; however, a single occurrence of a short-term or transient event, if observed at all, is usually the basis of study for its own sake, sometimes no matter how trivial.

This individual was most affected in a horizontal position, so it might be assumed that the body-antenna was receiving a planar wave, of the sort used for reception of FM or TV broadcasts. And, if we look at the spectrum of wavelengths normally found in a metropolitan area, the full-, half-, and quarter-waves range from approximately 0.5 to 2 meters—the identical distribution of human height from new-born babes to mature adults.

The height of children will nominally be between 0.5 and 1.5 meters, which means that their body-antennae could be receptive to those wavelengths (full, half, and quarter) of 50 to about 600 MHz. This extends from the lower TV-FM channels well into the UHF region.

For adults whose heights range

from 1.5 to 2 meters there is a little more selectivity, confining them to the VHF band, and ranging from around 37 to 200 MHz. In addition, there are a couple of "windows" between the full, half, and quarter wavelengths which would effectively limit body-antenna reception to the lower and the upper VHF TV channels, but taking in the entire FM band from 88 to 108 MHz.

The AM radio band in the U.S. is nominally 550 to 1600 kHz, which give quarter-waves of 136 to 47 meters, seemingly far out of the running as far as body-antenna reception is concerned, but since they can be detected and modulated by miniscule galena (lead sulfide) crystals-as well as isolated instances of amalgamated tooth fillings-these cannot be discounted. And, at the opposite extreme, the wavelengths of UHF TV-FM broadcast energy through the microwave region might be received by arm and leg antennas down to the cellular level, taking in such things as fingernails and teeth on the way.

There are also areas within urban environments where broadcast energies are of a relatively high intensity, which may coexist alongside regions of "shadowed," low intensity. So, if anyone feels bothered by electromagnetic fields—barring 60 Hz house-current—then it might be to advantage to take along a signal-strength meter the next time you go house-hunting.

It may be that broadcast energy will have to be an accepted pollutant, at least until such time as all our communication needs are confined to cables or light-pipes, for there's about as much chance of stopping I Love Lucy rerums as there is of banning penicillin. There may be several alternative and perhaps more effective means of communication over the horizon, but until then we can bask in the "radio-active" wastes of 20th century civilization and take our daily dose of inspiring messages.

NIS outlets begin to sign with other news services

AP, CBS, NBC, Mutual radio and UPI Audio are beneficiaries

Subscribers to NBC's News and Information Service, which are facing NIS's demise on May 29 but want to remain allnews, are beginning to align themselves with other national radio-news services.

Although the plug will not be pulled on NIS for several months, some stations are already dropping the service, according to NIS's Jerry D. Coffin, who is coordinating subscriber transitions.

"We've been very flexible in letting stations out of our end of the contract," Mr. Coffin said.

Mr. Coffin said of the 62 former NIS stations, 43 have indicated they will remain all-news. But of those stations, he said, the "dominant" approach to the transition is to continue programing NIS material "right up until the end," while at the same time gradually phasing in material from other services as well.

Daytime Broadcasters Seek Breakdown Of "Super Power" Stations

The Daytime Broadcasters Association (DBA) filed comments with the FCC urging the Commission to break down the Clear Channels in a manner to provide additional Class IV local channels.

Citing the need for more full-time local broadcast service, DBA presented an analysis of the FCC obtained Arbitron listenership survey of the 25 Class 1-A clear channel stations, "outside their home market areas." According to the DBA analysis, 23,36% of the AM broadcast spectrum was serving only 1.3% of their "wide area" potential listenership. Furthermore, according to the DBA, the distant "skipping" skywave is no longer an acceptable service to the distant listener. DBA went on to cite the absence of ascertainment procedure on such clear channel stations regarding their distant listeners and suggested that clear channels should not be protected beyond their "home market."

FM station plans progressing

Organizers plan to submit an FCC application within two weeks, as plans progress to create a 1000-watt FM stereo radio station in Provincetown.

Five local residents have incorporated to form Lower Cape Communications, Inc. and hope to form a non-commercial, non-profit, community-oriented broadcasting center here.

Mark Primack, president of the organization, said yesterday there are less than 30 comparable stations operating in the country. The FCC will probably take six months to evaluate the application, which is for a specific frequency on the educational band of the FM range, the lower frequency range on the radio dial.

Meanwhile, the group will start compiling ideas for community-spirited programming.

Paul Christo, technical director; thinks the station can broadcast for a minimum of 18 hours daily. Because of a favorable topography, Christo feels a 50 or 60-foot antenna could saturate the Lower Cape, reach Hyannis and possibly make it across the bay.

There are now two AM stations and five FM stations on the Cape. In addition to Primack and Christo, the board of directors consists of Laurel Wimberg, Carol D'Amico, and Arne Manos.

The group wants to form a 30- or 40-member advisory council spanning all Provincetown groups to help form programming and other policy.

To finance the venture, the group hopes to attract federal and private foundation money to supplement fundraising piedges.

Hopefully, the idea can attract a volunteer staff to man the station: Equipment should cost about \$20,000. The operating budget depends on the cost of a site and the extent of help. The antenna itself will be a major expense.

Primack and Christo feel the Lower Cape has been neglected by the broadcast media, and that a radio station would provide a new media outlet for the town.

If the FCC approves the application by late summer, Christo thought the engineering could be ready for broadcasting by October.

Christo has considerable technical experience in the area. Primack studied bloadcasting at Emerson College.

Radio station

To the Editor:

I was very interested in the article on page 15 of the Jan. 20 Advocate about plans for a non-commercial FM station for Provincetown. It seems to me a commercial station would have much more chance for success than a non-commercial one. I am aware there are no available FM channels for commercial use in this area, but there are, it seems to me, at least three AM channels available.

1580 kilohertz could be utilized for a daytime-only station with 250 watts. In fact, some years ago this facility was granted an applicant in Gloucester, who never built the station. I believe the 540 frequency could also be used here for a 250-watt daytimer.

And, if a full-time station is desired, the local frequency of 1450 could, I believe, accommodate a station in Provincetown to operate as most other stations on local AM channels do with 1000 watts days and 250 watts nights. I feel certain Provincetown can support such an enterprise and that it would be infinitely more successful than a non-commercial outlet.

I recommend the Lower Cape communications group at least consider this suggestion.
