Arctic Radio Club Info: Switzerland 531 Beromunster is on the air 0600 (Sun 0700)-1900 relaying RDRS1 except Sunday 0830-1215 and Mon-Fri 1000-1100 and 1400-1500 when RDRS2 is relayed. 1566 Sarnen relays RDRS1 only, sked 0600(Sun 0700)-0805 and 1700-2400 (Fri and Sat 0100). International Waters R. Caroine has apparently returned to 963. 1250 Libya, 1295 Sudan and 1303 noted off freq. Ivory Coast now heard on 1494. Angola Em. Regional de Lobito wandering between 1520 and 1530. R. Nacional is still operating on 1088 as follows: weekdays 0800-0900, 1200-1300, 1530-2200 (M-W-F 2300). Sundays 1700-1900. Ireland the old Athlone 566 tx was put into use on 612 May 31, sked 0630-0200 local Irish time. This will be the new 2nd National Pgm, with this being the only MW freq. The 254 kHz allotted to Ireland in the Geneva LW plan will not be used until 1981-82. Monaco R. Monte Carlo has confirmed using 300 kw on 702 beamed SE towards Italy, pgms mostly in I. Mozambique Nampula is on the air on 1223 0330-2310. Tete, Chimoio, and Inhambane are observed opening at 0355 on 1160, 836, and 557 respectively. Saudi Arabia Duba is being

well heard on 594 with 2000 kw. Spain 1134 EAK13 is now using 5 kw. Taiwan Voice of Asia is a new stn which started January 1 on 621. Sked 1100-1700 with EE, Thai, Indonesian and Mandarin. Beams to the Far East. Transkei Capital Radio will use 603 with 500 kw 0500-2300. Test transmissions will begin on October 26 followed by regular pgms from 12/24. USSR 1476 Lvov is now off during the night. Night pgms for Ukraine are now on 891 and 1278. Colombia HJZV 1160 increased power to 10 kw 3/24. Ecuador 1465 R. Iris v/s Yolanda Caidedo.

Ramadan starts on 7/26 and lasts 27 days.

April EBU Monthly Observation Report: 174 unid jammer, 272 Czechoslovakia now fully operational with 1500 kw, 520 2 unids heard by Lisbon during the daytime, 764 Omdurman still here, 765 Dakar now 400 kw, 800 Amman Jordan still here, 999 R. Matla w/20 kw heard, 1349 Mauritania still here, 1481 Dubai still here, 1562 Portugal and Greece still here, 1578 Portugal still here.

Foxworth's Follies: "The FCC, in a Notice of Inquiry (RM-3312) had a period ending on 4/18 during which anyone could file comments pertaining to the proposals by the Daytime Broadcasters Association and the National Telecommunications and Information Administration to change the channel spacing on the AM band to 9 kHz in the Americas. I filed comments opposing this on technical grounds. (The proponents of this plan are acting mainly on political grounds). I wonder if anyone else in the NRC filed comments on this notice of inquiry? Mine ran to 10 pages single-spaced. While the rest of you were debating the merits of bad poetry, I was trying to keep the hobby alive, which is hard to do given the limited time available to me". (Well, well, well. I certainly would have filed comments a la Foxworth except for two rather important factors: (1) I was not aware of this NOI, not having the access or contact to be kept aware of developments outside of my vocation. If this NOI is so crucial, one of our NRC'ers in the broadcasting field should have presented this in DX News. A good candidate would be someone employed by one of our major market clears, say in NYC or somesuch, hi. (2) I circulated through my mind the favorability of the 9 kHz spacing and could not come up with objections strong enough to outweigh the advantages. In particular I doubt that the lessened separation between stations would lead to greatly increased interference, because the shape of the selectivity curve in your average radio is such that the difference in rejection between 9 and 10 kHz is minimal. Witness the relative success the rest of the world has with the 9 kHz plan. People will counter that modulation is much less elsewhere in the world, but that is a moot point because what we are concerned with is the difference in reception in the Americas with 1 kHz less spacing. I still can not discover adequate technical reasons to oppose 9 kHz spacing; perhaps as an individual with more experience and knowledge in this area you would care to present further details? And as for your comments on poetry, I stand beside you 100%. I fully believe we would fiddle while the club burned, devoting our energies to subjects of great import such as "poetry". CH)

Medium Wave Club assorted items.... Guinea Bissau made the transition to 1071. In February, Gabon and Zaire were noted on old channels. R. Futura, Nicaragua was blown up (date unknown) by Somoza. Upper Volta has made the switch to the new plan. Unfortunately Gabon was reported on 1557 ex 1554.

The March 12, 1979 issue of DX News contained a review of the new Radio Shack DX-300 by Wayne Heinen which was rather critical of, among other things, the tuning and selectivity of the receiver. A recent release by Rob Harrington, president of the Colorado Association of DXers, mentioned the problems encountered by Rob, Jeff White and Larry Cunningham with their receivers.

Following is a copy of an article from "The Marketplace Report" which is published monthly by the ANARC DX Equipment Information Committee, Harold Sellers, Chairman.

Realistic DX-300

Word of DXers' problems with the DX-300 reached Radio Shack headquarters in Fort Worth, Texas, as a result of Jeff White, ANARC Public Relations Committee Chairman, talking with his local Radio Shack store manager. Jeff was contacted by Frank Roberts, Product Development Manager, who got details on the problems from Jeff. As a result four DXers who had written reviews received corrected receivers. Two of these people, Rob Harrington and Jeff, are now satisfied with the DX-300.

The problem with the MHz tuning was a self-oscillating 52 MHz IF circuit. As a result, adjustment of the MHz dial would tune in other stations, whereas this should only have been accomplished by the kHz dial. Radio Shack says that about 50% of the first production of receivers had this problem. They have promised to fix any receivers. If any Dixer has difficulty with his local store manager, we would suggest that he contact Mr. Frank Roberts, Product Development Manager, 1500 One Tandy Center, Fort Worth, Texas 76102, telephone 817-390-3244.

Other comments on the DX-300 have been: outdoor antenna needed, the whip being quite insensitive; overloading from powerful medium wave stations; carrying handle fragile and unsafe. We heard two complaints of the digital readout being 1 to 1 1/2 kHz off of true. This should be correctable by a competent radio technician, since most frequency counters have an adjustment inside.

MO THBALL MEMORIES

CHAPTER XXII - TWENTY YEARS AGO, by NEIL ZANK

Reading the Mothball Memories makes me think back on my own DXing history. I see that 1979 will mark 20 years since I began keeping track of stations I heard both on MW and SW. I remember going outside to the carport to sit in my folks' 1953 Pontiac to tune the radio. It always seemed that a car radio picked up more stations than anything in the house. I bought an old Philco multiband console radio from a neighbor for \$5 and used this to get a taste of SW. Then I received a Capehart AC/DC portable radio for Christmas one year. These first few years were casual DXing compared to later on when I joined the NRC. I remember discovering MWs on my own, really because I found that I could hear more Canadian stations than with many more U.S. stations off the air during this period. I seemed to develop a special interest in the Canadians. During my high school years I enjoyed listening to the CBC stations, especially CEW-990. For several years I subscribed to the CBC Times, their weekly program guide magazine. One week I received a wine-tied small bundle of CBC Times with my name & address on the outside. The post office had delivered the whole works to me. I saw that 7-8 other people in the area were also subscribers, before I took it back to the Post Office to explain their error. I remember that the CBC national network had a program called "In Reply" hosted by J. Frank Willis. I wrote a letter to them, & I heard my letter answered over the air one Sunday evening. Also on the subject of the CBC, I remember that they had a Trans-Canada Network and a Dominion Network. I have CJCB verified from Trans-Canada, Dominion, and French networks. One summer during high school years I painted our house to earn a new receiver. I got a new Hallicrafters S-38E to combine my MW & SW listening into one radio. This radio was ordered from Wards or Sears' catalog, I don't remember which. I remember my mother once saying "I think that you have gotten more fun out of your radios than with any toy you ever had." That's probably true! I see by my log book that from 1959 to December 1973 when I first joined the NRC I had a total of 327 stations heard and IDed. I did not know anything about ETs, f/c's, or CPC TESTs until joining the club. In the early years I remember running across a few screeching tones on the dial, and not knowing what they were I avoided them with a passion. (To be concluded in the next issue).

CHIDES WSM'S TACTICS

Re: the clear channels. After some thought and reading the opinions of others in both DX & industry publications, I've decided that I favor the 750-mile limit for clear stations. I don't favor the 150-mile proposal, which has little chance anyway. I still think that fulltimers are needed in smaller markets. Even the rotten coverage of 250w at night is better than nothing. As for WSM-650, and their tactics - I think they're doing a disservice to the country and to the industry by using their persuasive power (including television) for their private financial gain. They have been buying two-page ads in the trade papers, telling ministers to tell their congregations to support clear channels, and sending letters to listeners and to every other country-formatted station in the country claiming that country music will die if WSM's Opry is limited to 100 miles. That's a lie. There is no such proposal. And neither country nor the Opry will die on a network of stations that could be received with much better audio quality than WSM could ever give via skywave. The use of church pulpits as mouthpieces for a commercial enterprise is a despicable practice. WSM also stupidly sent one of their letters to KIKK-650, a country-formatted daytime which suffers because of WSM's protected status. The House Communications Subcommittee recently took the FCC chairman over the grill to ask why the Commission has not cited WSM for fairness doctrine violations. I think the Commission is dragging its feet. DON ERICSON, I thank you publicly for your frank explanation of the anticompetitive problems you had in distributing the WRTH '79. Too bad none of us have the expensive lawyers to fight the restraint of trade practiced by Gilfer Shortwave and Billboard publications. 73s.

For some time I'd been looking for a new general coverage RX, and had talked with GLENN JACOBS about the R-390A he had already sold (drat!) and to DAVE GLEASON about his DR-33. After deciding that I couldn't manage the small hassles of a tube RX, I sprung for the Dymek, which I just got last week. In fact, this is really the first weekend that I've had to check it out - compared to the TRF, it's unreal to say the least (hi). Right now, all I have as an antenna is the Dymek DA-3. I hope to have an altaz loop for the coming season. But no way would I get rid of the TRF. In fact, I am re-doing the dial for about the third time. Only this time, I'm using two Papermate/Write Brothers "X-Fine" pens with very little downward pressure. Alternating between red and black, drawing lines 10 kHz apart is really easy - especially at the "top end" of the scale. Since I marked only the top half of the carboard dial, I have no trouble fitting the frequencies vertically on the lower half using Zip-A-Tone mumerals. Latly, I'm going two nights a week to learn Spanish (almost a necessity down here) - who knows, maybe I'll get more enthusiastic about LA DX! Take care.

VANDALS CUT DOWN WYCH-740's TOWER.

Here is another action-packed Musing to keep you on the edge of your seat, & this should just about put the cap on the season for me. To DX: 4/4- WYB-1490 1:44-1:54 am, w/ET, ID at end, topping frequency. 4/9- WAAY-1550 12:50-12:59am on day pattern/power for severe weather warnings w/rr. 4/13- WYFA-1580 12:26-12:59am w/ET, rr. They didn't seem as potent as WSUF used to be. 4/16- WASP-1130 6:54-6:59pm topping WNEW w/c/w mx, s/off w/Lord's Prayer, welcome addition. 4/24- WCIR-1070 6:43-6:52pm w/rr, many spots (that's commercials in radio circles, not chicken pox, hi!) 5/7, a local-like signal was noted from STAN MRESS' favorite station, WKXS-1430 1:14-1:51am w/non-stop disco. Evidently they were using WKXS-FM for audio since they let a commercial go through, which is illegal during an ET, but they went on OC at the next break, 20 minutes later. Verie are at 993 with the following added: v/l- WASP-1130 w/CM (Pa. #137), WATN-1240, WYB-1490 (on CM). V/q- WYJZ-980 (Pa. #138), WTA-1450 w/Red Sox schedule. A similar incident happened at WEEZ (now WQIQ) in 1976 when they had a tower guy wire anchor loosened by a local vandal, taking down one of their three towers. IDs from the world's champion tester were heard @ 2:06 on 5/7 and at 2:04 on 5/14. I did not hear them on 5/21. Who else but WTTI-1530? Several s/off loggings have been reported: WDJZ-1530 w/female announcer @ 7:59 on 5/15, WIRD-920 @ 8:15 on 5/15 giving studio location in the Olympic Arena on Main Street. WDJZ s/off has no SSB while WIRD does. Also, a s/off logging was taken on WCGR-1550 last week as they end their day with reminder to tune to WFLC-FM @ 8:30. WCGR also carries Yankee BB. Report also sent to WTOD-1560 for 6:15-6:30 logging on 5/13. On 5/8 or 5/9 vandals topped the tower of WYCH-740 and this resulted in a rather weak signal from that station for the next several weeks. This enabled me to null them enough to get a weak logging of WRNR-740. Report sent to them for logging during the Larry Black Show aired on SM 5/13. As of 5/20, WYCH-740 was still operated at reduced efficiency. MM 5/21 found WINE-1010, WBN-1050, WFIL-560 & WOMB-1460 were all off the air for a while. Nothing new was noted, but KLRA-1010 & KSO-1460 were heard for the first time in a while. WBDH-850 gave SID during what I believe was an ET @ 2am. Several veries are in: WLLN-1370 for their ET of 4/30, v/l says they operate 2,500 days & 500 pre-sunrise & that they went on the air on 2/12/79. V/l's & CMs also are in from WLKK-1250 & WRNR-740. They had "World Today", a local spot, & 11:30 s/off. Veries: KORV v/1 & bumper sticker; KUPL PP/c after three f/ups (OE said letter to fallow) & KKEY (three towers in Vancouver, Wash., major lobe over Portland). Still no verie out of KPNW after three tries.

Greetings squaddies and welcome to the continuing saga of KQCC-1390. Since I last reported, disco has been expanded to 9-3 Friday nights & 7-3 Saturday nights. Also, they have a "super oldies hour" (including songs from back in the 30's!) 1-3pm W-F, a jazz show 7-9pm Friday & Sunday, & a syndie BED show "The Swinging Years" on Sat. & Sun. afternoons. As a further bit of nostalgia, Don Warren, WHO's morning man in the 60's is now their morning man & they've bought back Chickerman! Little ECB DXing has been done lately due to storms & other bad CX, better than usual TV during the May sweeps, & a sudden interest in FM & SW DX after buying a Panasonic RF-2200. Selectivity is quite a bit better than on my TRF; e.g. KFVD-1430 heard only once before u/extremely good CX is now a regular w/only slight KQCC slop. Also, KCIM-1380 is a newbie here, sometimes making it past splatter from KQCC & the local "Sultan of Slop" KRNT-1350, the latter being the most trouble.
