## Pirate Awaits Ruling

by Charles Taylor

Boston MA ... A federal judge here is expected to make a decision this month regarding the legality of a pirate radio station group that wants to broadcast from an unoccupied frequency in the New York market.

The group, Radio New York International (RNI), is the same that broadcast for four days in July 1987 from the freighter Sarah off the coast of Long Island, NY. At that time, the FCC ordered the station off the air because it violated international communications treaties.

RNI resurfaced in August with the argument that the station should be allowed back on the air, citing the First Amendment.

### Dog in a manger

Jeremiah Gutman, the attorney representing RNI through the New York Civil Liberties Union, said the Commission was acting like "a dog in a manger saying nobody can use (unoccupied frequencies) until they decide we can."

The FCC maintained that the government does have the right to oversee usage of a limited resource, such as the radio spectrum.

In the most recent action 4 November. both sides filed comments with Federal District Judge John McNaught in Boston. A decision on the issue is expected sometime in December, Gutman said.

Previously, Gutman and Eileen Hagerty, an assistant US attorney representing the FCC, presented their respective arguments before McNaught on 21 October

### Under advisement

Following that meeting, the judge acknowledged the issue's importance and decided to take it under advisement. Gutman said. McNaught also offered each side the opportunity to file additional comments two weeks later, thus the 4 November deadline. No further oral discussion took place at that

If RNI's viewpoint receives a nod from the judge, the station plans to return to the air at 1320 on the AM dial, Gutman said. The decision also would mark a precedent in broadcasting, where an operator's rights to frequency allocation always have been carefully monitored by the FCC, he added.

"I think it's an important case," said Gutman. "The judge has an opportunity to make the First Amendment vibrant here. I think the position will serve correctly that no organ of government can close off an open place for communica-

#### Radio daze

 Mike Kakovannis, the mad programmer who almost wiped out the metro area's premier AM radio station the first time he got his hands on it is up to his old tricks, folks.

Effective today, WNEW-AM will introduce a new lineup and Kakoyannis has once again destroyed one of the station's traditional perennials. Yeah, say goodbye to "The Milkman's Matinee." First it was the "Make Believe

Ballroom," which Michael decided would be better off as a comedy talk show. So he fired Bob Jones, Jim Lowe and Marty Wilson and brought in Steve Allen and not only was it embarrassing, but WNEW-AM came perilously close to losing all of its hard-won audience.

Kakoyannis, who comes from an FM background, couldn't seem to get it in his head that WNEW made it with music and news, not as a talk or sports station. But even he knew he had goofed and Allen eventually was let go, along with the three hours of sports.

After that, talents like Ted Brown, Jonathan Schwartz, Les Davis, Mark Si-mone and Jazzho Collins scraped and struggled and finally restored some of

WhEW's respectability.

Kakoyannis just wouldn't let go, however. So, even as we write, he has killed off "The Milkman's Matinee" (as well as Merle Kubrick's soothing, quiet jazz during primetime) and has sched-uled nine hours of talk shows instead.Kakovannis, as a result of all his past and present wreckage, has since been promoted to executive vice president of the station's parent company.

Bruce Williams moves in tonight at 8, followed by Larry King at 11 p.m. and a pop psychologist named Dara Wells from 2 to 5 a.m.

Jazzbo, who was just right for the midnight "Matinee," will now be limit-ed to weekend wakeup shows at 8 a.m. Saturday and 6 a.m. Sunday.



# WAGO will air R-Phils games

The Reading Phillies' radio days — and nights — begin next season on WAGO-AM/1240.

Reading Phillies owner Craig Stein and WAGO president/general manager Jack Weinlein signed a one-year contract Thursday for WAGO to broadcast all R-Phils games home and away

This marks the first time a local station has made a total commitment to minor league base-

"Being on WAGO will help us increase the level of awareness in Reading Phillies baseball in this area, and at the same time, maintain the interest of our fans," said Stein. "We're just thrilled for the opportunity to expand our base even further.

"Hopefully, it will result in getting more people out to the ballbark."

The voice of the Reading Phillies - only a playby-play announcer will be used - is expected to be named within "a couple of weeks," according to Weinlein. WAGO has received audition tapes from all over the country

The only other matter to be resolved will be on those Sunday afternoons when baseball conflicts with WAGO's Motor Racing Network broadcasts of NASCAR races. One of the two events will be aired on a tape-delay basis.

WAGO, which has billed itself as "Your Official Racin' Station," has a large and devoted motor sports following. The advertising spots for the races sell out quickly, and the cards and letters of appreciation from the fans keep pouring in.

Weinlein said deciding which event to tape delay would be made on a case-by-case basis.

"We'll be mindful of what the public tells us," he said, lobbing the ball into the peoples' court. "We'll be flexible. There won't be any hard-andfast decisions. It's a good mix (baseball and racing), and we think we can keep everyone happy.

Stein certainly would fall into the happy category. He and general manager Chuck Domino have been lobbying WAGO to air the Reading Phillies games since before the start of last season, Stein's first as sole owner.

"A lot of the credit goes to Chuck," explained Stein. "He worked diligently and feverishly to get Jack to cave in. Our success in 1988 went a long way toward getting Jack to our way of thinking."

The secret of that success was Stein's aggressive promotion and marketing campaign, and a refurbished, like-new Municipal Stadium. The combination enticed a club-record 144,007 fans to watch a team that finished out of the Eastern

The revolving turnstiles were all the proof Weinlein needed that the Steln way was the right

"To be quite frank, I was skeptical at first," said Weinlein. "I wanted to see how the new guy on the block would do. But the ballclub proved itself. When you consider that half (the population) of the county showed up, that's quite impressive. A 50 percent return is not too bad.

"This year, with our format changes, we think the Reading Phillies will be good for us.

Those format changes are in response to recent ratings which show WAGO as Reading's lowest-

Weinlein hopes the switch will help WAGO wage a better fight. To that end, the station has dumped its "All Golden Oldies" format in favor of an oldies-based adult contemporary sound, "Radio 1240," as it's now being called, also is adopting a much higher profile locally.

"The whole tone of the station will be local," sald Weinlein.

And the Reading Phillies will play a key role in the new strategy. Weinlein realizes the competition

— Philadelphia Phillies broadcasts — will be stiff. No matter how hapless the Big Phils happen to be, people still will listen to those games on WEEU-

But Weinlein isn't after big ratings - although they'd be nice - as much as he's trying to forge a new identity for the station. He is daring to make WAGO different. And for that, he deserves much

"The stark reality is that we are an AM radio station in Reading," he said. "And because of that, we have to offer different programming, an alter-

## Law firms get big bucks for challenging broadcast license renewals

WASHINGTON — Challenging broadcast license renewals before the Federal Communications Commission may be more profitable than broadcasting itself

The Washington law firm of Co-hen and Berfield has proved especially adept at such challenges or rather, at winning large settlements for withdrawing them. Since 1985, its clients have accepted settlements amounting to more than \$12.5 million to withdraw license renewal challenges.







I was raised in Miami, and except for my mother's funeral in 1965, I haven't been back in 31 years. Last month, armed with the ICF 2010 and a loop, I returned to note the changes. WOAM-560. I did the AN show here for four months in 1956-57 when it was still a rocker; it is now C&W. They used to have a half-wave self-supporting tower downtown, right on the water; this has been replaced by a guyed quarter-wave tower. WIOD-610. They used to have two towers right off one of the causeways between Miami and Miami Beach; 1 didn't see them. WAQI-710. I knew it as WFTL and then WGBS. Good day signal in Orlando, but in Palm Beach, the Cuban is equal to them. WSBR-740. New for me; their day 2.5kw gets out OK. WNWS-790. Originally WMBM-800. Gets out pretty well; noted in Orlando with WTAR under. Heard Jerry Wichner, who was the AN DJ on WINZ while I was doing the same at WQAM. ZN\$3-810. Non-existent in my era; good signal up and down the Fla. coast. WRFM-830. New for me. Another SS and it were equal nights at the hotel in Coconut Grove. WEAT-850. Not readable in the 50s; now OK days, WSWN-900. Not much change. WINZ-940. Better day signal up the coast now that they are ND days. WVCG-1080. Originally licensed as WMUY-1070. I don't know where the lobes go, but virtually no sign of them days in Palm Beach. At night, not great in Coconut Grove. WOBA-1140. Ex-WMIE. Very hot modulation (understandably). WCMQ-1210. Ex-WFEC and 1220. Virtually nothing in Palm Beach days and poor nights at the hotel nights. WSUA-1260 new for me. WGMA-1320. Originally WHWD, 500w-D. Lobe seems to be southward nights; multilingual (even heard British announcer!) WKAT-1360. Nice 10kw day signal; seems to be Carribbean, WOCN-1450. Big tower used to be right next to the river downtown. Obviously, they moved it further north to better cover Miami's Hispanic community, as the signal was pretty scroungy at the hotel. WMBM-1490. Started as WBAY and then WTTT in Coral Gables. Gets out OK. Tower is behind Joe's Stone Crab Restaurant, S. end of Miami Beach. ZNS-1540. Just doesn't seem to get out as well as it used to. I vaguely recall hearing it on 640 in the 40s; I don't see how anyone could agree to a switch like that! (The only similar example 1 know of was the CJBC/CFRB switch). WRHC-1550. New for me. 1 know their towers are on the water (obvioasly very near the hotel) but I couldn't spot them. WSRF-1580. Dreadful signal (0 in Falm Beach, very little at the hotel). As I write this muse, October 7, WNBC is about to pull the plug on its operations after 66 years of broadcasting. In the meantime WFAN is busy promoting the BIG SWITCH that will occur at 5:30 p.m. EDT. As WNBC goes toward the zero hour, many thoughts race through my mind, W2XY, WEAF, WRCA, the ever familiar chimes, weekend Monitor shows and the almost neverending list of radio personalities that have graced its frequency. What a shame that the one time flagship station of the National Broadcasting Company has fallen into such a state through corporate mismanagement. During this final day of broadcasting a radio retrospective was mired, in addition to chatting with callers on the air and studio drop-ins from former on air staff members. Now that the countdowns have been completed, the 1050 position on the dial has been occupied by WUKQ. They are playing a loop advising that WFAN has now moved down the dial to 660. Every once and awhile some random record cuts air and then back to the loop. The cuts are C&W, probably left over from WHN's C&W period. The next morning Spanish music fills the airwaves on 1050 as WUKQ commences programming. It appears to be "canned" music, no personalities are noted, although I am sure that things will change for New York's First 50,000 watt Hispanically programmed station. WFAN kicked off its switch to 660 with a Billy Sol Hargus routine, by IMUS, that was is poor taste, as usually and then sports talk with Pete Franklin. Oh well..

Thanks to Paul Mount. et. al. via the shortwave echo (telephone BBS), WFAN's new address is: Kaufman Astoria Studios, 34-12 36th Street, Astoria, NY 11106...WMAQ has lured away Crain's Chicago Business from WBBM, after a twety year run...KOMA, in Oklahoma City, has sitched from the big band format to oldies, du wop...WBEN, in Buffalo, is playing musical chairs, as sportcaster moves in from WGR and Tom Shannon gets the ax in morning drive in favor of Steve Brodie, formerly of KNUS-Dallas...Jack Bogut is back in Pittsburgh, this time on the FM side at WSHH...WINZ has dropped its 2-yr experiemnt with talk programming and gone back to all-news programming...Tom Brookshire is back behind the microphones again, this time on radio at WIP, in the City of Brotherly Love, where he is also v.p. of programming...Remember Radio New York International, The Pirate operation off of Long Island a few years ago ??? Well the gang is back in court battling the FCC over their operating outside the 3-mile limit. KYW has just celebrated its 23rd anniversary as an all-news station...The Larry King Show is back on the air in the Windy City and may now be heard on WLUP. The show will air from 10 pm to 1 am weeknights. This marks the first time that the King Show has aired on a station NOT affiliated with the Mutual Radio Network...Marty Glickman, a sportcaster in the New York Market has recently celebrated his 40th year of football play-by-play work. His first game was on WMGM (WHN/WFAN 1050), in 1948 doing a NY Giants/Chicago Cardinals game ... As of July the F.C.C. reports that there are 4,914 AM radio stations...AM radio isn't fairing too well with manufacturers. At a recent meeting in Falls Church, VA 180 manufactures were invited to attend a NAB meeting on AM. Only 7 people showed up and one of them said his company wasn't interested in AM at all!...So much for now.

I listened to some old tapes that I had made years ago of Cousin Brucie, Herb Oscar Anderson, Bob Lewis and many of the stars of radio and believe me it wasn't just the nostalgia value that made me pine for the good old days.
