

I was gonna get one, but decided on a new car instead, hi. Let's see what kind of reports these guys with R-5000's send in... Also, let me note here Robert's letter was returned to him, so some of his loggings are a bit aged. But, despite the USPS's valiant attempt to suppress Bob's DX, I'm putting them in anyway.
- Welcome back, Mike Jeziorski, whose name I remember from the pages of DX News many moons ago. Let's hear from all you 'new' members and report what's being heard at your DX shack.

- 1560 KKID OK SALLISAW - 12/24 0500 with full AM-FM ID at :00; in and out all night with C&W mx; didn't appear to be a test; what gives on this one? are they on fulltime now?? (RK-IL)

- 12/21 0249 somebody in and out of the GY jumble with more hardcore 1340 UNID 27 heavy metal and slogan: AM 1340 - music too loud for FM: lousy music, great slogan (MJ-MI) [Possibly WLZR Milwaukee, which was recently reported to have switched to heavy metal -Ed.1
- 1/16 2300-2315 talk You have been listening to --? -- on your hometown UNID 27 1380 station, W???, poor under CBJ (DT-ON)

- WVAM PA ALTOONA is REH-ON 's IRN unID (MH-NE) ... is probably Charles Reh's unID from 1/21 DXN: they've been IRN for some time (TH-CA)

- 1/7 0345-0430 in well for most of the time I was on the channel; over/under 1570 UNID CFEZ with OLD off the bird; definitely heard a mention of Hattiesburg before 0400; at 0430, station suddenly cut away from the bird to play an a cappella version of Dixie, I'm guessing it was WIZK, even though Da Log sez they're daytime only; any help from somebody down in Ole Miss? 'Wireless Telephone' Comes to Springfield—1921

new sound came to our area A in 1921, when Radio Station WBZ, located in Springfield at the former Westinghouse Plant in East Springfield, started broadcasting. Springfield was selected as the site of the first radio station in New England by the Westinghouse Electric Manufacturing Company, the foremost developer of the new "Wireless telephone" as it was referred to at the time by the Springfield Union.

The Springfield Union, Sept. 18, 1921 reported on the first broadcast. "Tomorrow Springfield will have the first of the Wireless telephone instrument known as the Radio-phone. People all over New England will be interested in this demonstration, in which it is expected that the Governors of the New England states will have a part. The demonstration will be made at the Springfield factory of the Westinghouse Company, where this past week was invalled the largest radio telephone instrument in New England. It is expected that

most of the New England Governors will be in attendance there, and will be transmitting their own greetings over the telephone. These speeches and a concert will be received at most of prominent cities in New England within a 200 mile radius of Springfield While this was the first

demonstration in New England, the Westinghouse Company for the previous six months has been sending out evening broadcasts at East Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania over radio station KDKA, reportedly being heard within a 1000 mile radius of Pittsburgh. The article mentioned that more than 2000 families in the Pittsburgh area had installed radio receiving sets in their homes. According to the Springfield Union, "these sets are known as Aerola Jr., and all that they require is 100 feet of wire attached to the instrument which is placed on a table in the room. There is a small adjustable handle on the appliance which is moved by the operator until his instrument is attuned to the vocal or

The Westinghouse Company was proposing to introduce to Springfield hmadcast services such as storm warnings, weather reports, market conditions, and other items of general interest to be broadcast at regularly stated times. The Springfield Union reporter concluded his first report with the following prophetic statement. "No one can say what may yet be developed in this young art. From a mere play thing of scientific interest only five year ago, at least to the large electrical companies, radio has grown to proportions that command the respect of all thinking men of the day. Great things can be looked for as a result of this newly awakened interest, and this concentrates effort at develop-

The following day the Springfield Union reported on a speech by Speaker of the House, Frederick H. Gillett, to the six New England governors, and other guests gathered at Massachusetts Governor Cox's banquet on the Eastern States grounds. A concert followed the speech. The speech and the concert were transmitted from a studio on the roof of the Westinghouse plant to a receiving set at the Eastern States grounds

Gillett opened his speech as away follows, "I have been requested to say a word to you governors of the six New England states by wireless telephone from the Westinghouse plant." His brief speech covered the importance of farming in New England. The concert that followed featured singers Mrs. Karl Eckbert. Miss Anna P. Wollman, Edward E. Hosmer, and Walter R. Marsh, and Milton Aronson, the violinist. The quartet sang "Annie Laurie," and Mr. Hosmer "The End of a Perfect Day." Secretary of Agriculture, Harry C. Wallace, spoke to members of the Boys' and Girls' clubs at the Exposition via the station on the grounds. The six New England governors also had an opportunity to send a message to their respective state capitols.

The opera-tors at the Exposition grounds transted the speeches by radio to Westinghouse plant, and relayed it back to the grounds, so that each governor heard himself speak. The speeches were sent to each state capitol by holding the telephone receiver to the radio transmitter.

One of the very early performers on station WBZ was the well known local naturalist and author of Children's stories Thorton W. Burgess. In his autobiography, "Now I Remember," Mr. Burgess recounted his introduction to radio. "One day I was telephoned by a representative of the Westinghouse Company. Would I, at seven o'clock, on a specified evening tell one of my stories for children over WBZ? A car would be sent for me, and take me home. There were no paid programs in those days, but the comgladly furnished transportation. I had never seen a receiving set, a crystal set, or a microphone Burgess was taken to the plant, and delivered to the studio. Burgess continues, "I made myself known to the lone operator, who was also the announcer. Presently the apnouncer. said it was time for me to go on. He made a brief statement that Mr. Burgess would tell one of his stories for children, motioned for the to take his place at the mike, and turned

The following day Burgess took a train to Boston. A fellow passenger, recognizing Burgess, said he had heard him the previous evening. When the station moved to the Kimball Hotel, and a new soundproof studio Burgess became a "regular." reading one of his stories at the children's hours daily, except Sunday. Two trained readers called the Dream Fairy, and the Sleep Fairy, alternated in reading. Burgess started a 10 minute feature, talking about birds, and animals. Readers sent in letters requesting that he be given more time, which soon developed into a half hour program.

the League. Soon his program was being heard throughout New England, and the Midwest. membership of 50 thousand. WBZ remained at the Westing house plant until 1924 when the broadcasting studio was moved downtown to the Hotel Kimball. In March 1924 WBZA Boston joined the local station in synchronized broadcasts of cultural programs. The Boston and Springfield stations swapped call letters in 1926, Springfield taking the letters WBZA, and Boston, the letters WBZ. From then on Springfield was in a subordinate role.

The opening of radio stations quickly resulted in an increasing demand for radios. Westinghouse started producing radio sets and related equipment in their Chicopee Falls plant, employing up to 300 people, with Springfield gaining the title of "Radio capital of New England." The early radio sets, with names such as Aerobia and Radiola. were simple two tube receiving sets. Many of the early radios, particularly the more elaborate console models, were expensive pieces of furniture, selling for several hundred dollars, equaling the price of some of the less expensive autos. The local plant was also producing short wave receivers, and transmitters for use

on ships or airplanes. WBZ, Boston, marked the tenth anniversary of radio broadcasting in New England, on Sept. 18, 1931 with a birthday party in its new studio at the Hotel Bradford. Boston. Six hundred guests were in attendance when messages of greetings from President Herbert Hoover, and Mayor Curley of Boston were read. Six dance bands a symphony orchestra and several yocal groups were part of the enterainment. NBC, New York prepared special salute, which included reetings from former members of he WBZ staff, including John S. Young, a High School of Commerce raduate. Joe Rines and his howhoat Orchestra, and Leo Reisman's Hotel Bradford's orhestra were part of the Boston elebration.

The Hotel Charles, Springfield, osted the annual convention of the American Relay League, with four nundred delegates, On May 17, 1939. The Springfield Union reported on his historic meeting. "Hotel Charles will be the scene of the first elevision demonstration ever to take lace in Springfield when the annual onvention of American Radio Relay Leagues is held this weekend. Springfields' radio station WBZA closed its brodeasting on July 13, 1962 when Westinghouse Corporation announced that it was discontinuing operation in Springfield, so that they could acquire station WINS in New York City. But as you travel along Interstate 74 toward the "Big Mac", even before you see the bridge's twin spires, you can hear it. You can hear the Traveler's Information Radio Station which broadcasts motorist information to persons approaching the

The radio system at Mackinac is an example of a nationwide phenomenon-traveler information being offered to motorists not by sign, but by AM radio. Departments of transportation are telling motorists about construction and detours; Tourism & Visitor Bureaus are telling travelers about things to see and do in towns just off the interstate highways; parks, colleges, and airports are broadcasting rules, regulations and parking information. There are more than 500 Traveler's Information Stations operating throughout the U.S. The Mackinac Bridge stations were installed in 1987 by Information Station Specialists in Zeeland, Michigan,

When you tune in the station at Mackinac, the announcer tells you about bridge conditions and whether the span is open given current weather. Reminders about speed limits, lane usage and tolls are given. Then the two chambers of commerce in the towns at each end of the bridge broadcast messages about things to see and do for travelers who will be stopping.

The Mackinac Bridge actually operates two stations, one is located on 530 KHz for northbound travelers and one on 1610 KHz for southbound. MISA Newsletter

Medium wave has the advantage of having one fixed point on the radio dial. It is a good quality, reliable signal, the coverage area of which increases from dusk to dawn (see map).

However, any broadcaster wishing to use the medium wave band has to get permission from the International Telecommunications Union, which is part of the United Nations. The procedure usually takes nine months but can be far longer if other broadcasters object.

As Dennis Thompson, head of BCD, explains, the region of southern Africa was always a tricky area for the engineers, because of its geographical location. "In order to get there from the UK or Opprus, a short wave signal has to pass over the tropics and the equator, and in drong-men tracks mp a fot of interference. We recently opened a short wave transmitter at Lesothow which improved our coverage, and now we're adding a medium wave transmitter which should help us to reach an even wider audience."

The building project is managed by BBC Transmission. It appointed contractors and supervised the installation. The transmitter in Lesothe took about nine months to build.

Keeping ahead in any sphere of radio broadcasting is a highly competitive business audiences are asking for - and expecting better quality reception.

But before the Federal Communications Commission could approve the deal, Dr. Perry filed an amended application that called for Travaglini and Petruso to buy him out altogether. The \$30,000 he received for his stock was about equal to what he invested in the first place, Dr. Perry said.


