



A Walk Through the NRC Product Catalog
NRC members have access to a veritable
treasure of DX knowledgeand experience through
the NRC Product Catalog. The purpose of this
"for Beginners" column is to bring attention to
some of the items in the catalog.

Over the years, many hundreds of articles on all aspects of medium wave DXing have appeared in DX News. Several hundred of those articles have been selected for listing in the catalog, and reprints are available at nominal cost. Some of those articles present information at the novice level. Others are technically advanced. For convenience, selections of articles on some subjects have been assembled in booklet form.

Antennas are the heart of DXing. The catalog lists four collections of antenna articles in booklet form and a listing of 79 separate articles available as reprints. Note here that some of the reprints also appear in the booklets. Few DXers build their receivers "from scratch", although that has been done, but many have built their own loop antennas. Home construction of an effective loop antenna is not particularly difficult. Even for those DXers who have bought or will buy a commercially-built loop antenna, home construction of a loop is an inexpensive and informative project. The only advantage of ferrite-core loops is compact size.

Probably most of us never heard of a Beverage

antenna before getting into organized DXing, although the name appears often in DX News. The first was built about 1920 by Harold Beverage, an engineer for RCA. It was twelve miles long. The Beverage antennas used for medium wave DXing are not that long, but still require considerable real estate. To function as a Beverage, the antenna should be at least a half wavelength long, which means that to cover the medium waveband, a length of about 900 feet is needed. When correctly installed and located, the

Beverage is the ultimate antenna for medium wave reception. There are numerous Beverage articles in the catalog and one booklet, Beverage and Longwire Antennas Design and Theory."

For information on receivers and receivers

For information on receivers and receiving techniques there are two booklets and over one hundred articles in the reprint listings. Some of the articles appear in both the reprint lists and in the booklets. Included are reviews of some receivers which are currently popular, including the Drake R8, as well as others which are fading into history. Again, the articles vary in technical level from basic to considerably advanced.

me Much is known about radio wave propagation in the medium wave band, but it is not an exact log science. The 39 articles listed in the section on let propagation contain material not found in the ble radio textbooks. Recommended reading for all nts DXers is P10, "A Beginner's Guide to the eir lonosphere".

The best-known item in the catalog is the NRC AM Radio Log. Now in the 14th edition, and updated annually, the AM Log is over 300 pagesin 8.5 x 11 loose leaf format. All medium wave stations in the U.S. and Canada are listed by frequency, in large type with adequate space for entering call letter changes and other changes reported in DX News. Also included are cross reference pages which list the stations alphabetically by call letters, by State, and by City. The NRC AM Radio Log is recognized internationally and is almost essential for medium wave DXing.

Numerous other items appear in the catalog, and their not being described in this article is in no way a reflection upon their value. 





# RFI From Household Electronics

I recently discovered that our late-model TV set was emitting radio-frequency interference throughout the long-wave beacon band WHILE TURNED OFF! Unplugging the power cord killed the RFI, and reconnecting it started the interference again.

This is a Zenith 20" Sentry 2 MTS Stereo Color TV Model SJ-2065-W, with infra-red remote control. The interference was manifested as buzzy, slightly broad and unstable signals, apparently harmonics of a 36.96 fundamental frequency from their spacing. The signals were strong enough to drown out weak NDB stations. They could be nulled in the Drake R-8 with my 2-ft. homemade loop; the null was in the direction where the local TV cable system's coax entered the building.

For this reason, I had attributed these signals to radiation from the cable system; however, they persisted when I disconnected the cable at the outdoor lightning arrester and splitter. The signals did disappear when I opened the main a-c power switch, showing they came from inside the house. After restoring power, I used a battery-powered Sony ICF-2010 on the long-wave band as a search receiver tuned to one of the harmonics. Eventually, I found the source of these signals was the turned-off Zenith TV located in the bedroom next to my listening post. Right at the TV set, the harmonics were strong enough to light up all of the Sony's signal strength LEDs.

Disconnecting the cable system's coax from the TV did not affect the QRM as observed in the shack, nor did adding an a-c line filter at the power outlet for the TV. The only action affecting the offending signals was to turn on the TV, or to disconnect its power cord.

Incidentally, the harmonics of the 36.96 kHz radiation were not limited to the 190-530 kHz NDB band; they were found well up into the shortwave spectrum. In fact, I derived the frequency of 36.96 kHz by zero-beating the 100th harmonic at 3696 kHz with the Sony's BFO.

I have no way of knowing whether this behavior is generic to some feature of the TV set, such as the remote control circuitry or not; it could possibly be a malfunction. I checked with a local TV shop franchised by Zenith, and the technicians weren't able to help me. I plan to write Zenith for their opinion.

This experience prompted me to check other household electronics equipment for radiating signals while turned off. The VCR associated with the Zenith in the bedroom was clean, as was the older Zenith TV in the living room. The living room VCR, a Sanyo VHR-3350 VHS HQ Model with infrared remote control, radiated a strong signal at 525 kHz, with fairly strong second and third harmonics. However, these signals weren't audible in the shack two rooms away.

Our AT&T Model 5500 cordless phone in the living room was generating a 300 kHz fundamental signal, with harmonics up into the SW region, while on-hook. Going off-hook had no effect on this signal. It and its harmonics could not be heard in the shack; they were detected only in the immediate vicinity of the 5500.

The Brother Model 600 Facsimile machine in the shack generated spurious signals at the low end of the AM broadcast band while in a stand-by mode. The actual frequency varied according to the answer mode; for Auto Answer, the frequency was 557.9 khz; for Manual Answer, it was 561.7 khz; for TAD (Telephone Answering Device) it was 554.2 kHz. Again, harmonics from this equipment extended up into the SW spectrum. This machine was located four feet from the Kiwa loop used for BCB DX'mg. I had realized previously that the Brother fax caused interference when operating, but never considered it as an RFI source in standby.

The last piece of radiating turned-off equipment turned out to be the Kenwood R-5000 general coverage receiver stashed away in the basement until the shack is remodeled. It was plugged in to keep the memories alive and minimize any problems from humidity. The Sony showed a whole series of strong signals in the beacon band with a spacing about 17.56 kHz apart which disappeared when the power cord was disconnected. Interestingly enough, turning the R-5000 on caused these signals to change from a pure cw beat note to one modulated with a buzz which remained even after it was turned off. However, unplugging it from the power and reconnecting it restored the pure cw beat. These signals couldn't be heard a few feet from the R-5000; however, one wonders what would happen if it were in the shack with the Drake R-8 and its 2-ft. loop.

Because of these findings, when I want to DX the 190-530 kHz beacon band lake at night, I unplug the offending TV set, along with the automatic night light in the bedroom which generates broad-spectrum noise interference. I also turn off the solid state turners that control the front and side porch lights, and make sure that the 20-watt fluorescent light in the kitchen used as a night light is also off. The cabinet humidifier in the kitchen uses a solid state speed control for the fan and moisturizing pad, so I turn that off too. After all this, I sometimes find that the atmospherics are too strong to make listening worthwhile, and turn everything back on and go to bed!


