All stations wishing to operate 24 hours be assigned a special frequency in the BCB.

- ☐ Craig's built himself a new three-foot loop, and says the nulls are deeper and it's quieter than his four-footer. But he didn't say what kind of radio he's using!! Results below. Thomas Reiser of Chicago writes: "I have a couple of corrections for contributions made by Christos Rigas and Barry Finkel in the 1/27 DDXD-West Special section. WPGE863 - If this is truly for Lake Cook Road, there is only one Lake Cook Road Station, which is in Deerfield, Illinois . . . WTED863 -There is no Hickory Street stop on the Metra System. There is, however, a Hickory Creek Stop which is at 9430 Hickory Creek Drive in Mokena." Thanks to Eric Cooper of Mission Viejo, California for a couple of Internet reports regarding the 540/540/1260 questions in Southern California/Baja California Norte ... "There has been no ownership change. K-NEWS just wasn't getting the ratings we needed to maintain the format. We decided to go to a music format and as a transition, we'd play all Beatles for a new format. The response has been so great that we are going with it. We still have to use KNNZ and KNNS until the FCC gives us the OK to officially use the KGIL calls. We can call the station anything we want, it's just that at the top (and with the Mexican signal at the bottom) of the hour we have to use the legal calls. It will change in a few weeks." This blurb is from Jim Roope of KGIL. Also on this subject, Tim writes: "Latest news on K-Bach AM 5-40 is that their target date is now between mid-February and March 1st. Flooding in Sacramento apparently delayed delivery of an antenna to the XETIN facility in Tijuana. An article in the San Diego Union implied that XETIN would be raising power to 25 kW. In the meantime, XETIN has been silent most days, and I have heard no signs of testing on 540 or 1650." And Shawn and Wayne, between catching snowflakes on their tongues, say: "Now that was a DXPedition. We tramped out to find both of the East beverages missing. Broadcaster's hopes rise with tower

Station aims to go on air by Feb. 8 in Somerville

It won't be part of Somerville's downtown revitalization scheme, but WBRW radio will be back on the air

Branchburg residents Dan and Sarah Lohse watched a crane operator erect the AM station's 135-foot tower on a muddy Bridgewater lot

In October, Lohse received approval from Bridgewater to build the radio tower in the Finderne section on part of a 37-acre lot owned by entrepreneur Joe Horner.

A month earlier, he had stood somewhat reluctantly before Somerville's governing body as part of a tower builder's scheme to erect a 250-foot tower on a 3-acre tract of vacant borough land.

That plan was not what the professional radio engineer had in mind when he began to make inquiries to Somerville in 1993, soon after he and his partner, John Carriciolo, purchased the license and assets of the defunct AM station.

Originally, the tower was to be used exclusively by WBRW, a daytime-only radio station that had broadcast on the Bridgewater/ Somerville border for 20 years before financial problems forced it to sign off in 1990.

Along with the new sidewalk pavers and wrought iron planters, Somerville business leaders hoped radio station WBRW might have lent the county seat an added flair as it broadcast live from a storefront studio along Main Street.

With Lohse's proposal stalled, tower builder Network Management Inc., based in Doylestown, Pa., came into the picture, with a deal connected to Somerset County's effort to win approval of a tower for its emergency communications system on the Second Watchung Ridge in

At a September council meeting, Borough Attorney Phillips Heathcote Jr. questioned that plan, and the Somerville council voted to pay a consultant \$3,000 to investigate the best use of the land. The report has yet to be submitted, Mayor David Hollod said yesterday.

Lohse soon after wrote the mayor and council announcing his withdrawal. He said he was just about to give up several days later, when Horner called to confirm that his land would be available for a

Changes in programming status; reported by listeners

Locally, John Hanz writes that WADO-1280, New York City, has gone to an all Spanish talk format. He also notes that WJLK-1310, Asbury Park, NJ, has been scooped up by the New Jersey Nassau Broadcasting Partners, who have purchased 14 other Garden State AM and FM stations. WJLK is now WADB, and has dropped its country music format for adult standards. Other Nassau AM stations are WOBM-1160, Toms River, now news and oldies, WVPO-840, Stroudsburg, adult contemporary, WTTM-920, Trenton, news, sports, and talk, WHWH-1350, full service news and information, and WNNJ-1360, Newton, with an oldies format.

In Fairfield County, CT., WNLK-1350, Norwalk, WSTC-1400, Stamford, and WINE-940, Brookfield, are all simulcasting as "Fairfield County News Radio", with long news blocks during drive timers, talk at other times, and home shopping on Sundays! And over in New Haven County, WQUN-1220 is now on the air with the satellite-fed Music of Your Life format, ID'ing as "AM 1220, a service of Quinnipiac College". A few miles away finds WNEZ-910, New Britain airing romantic Spanish music!

Perry Crabhill of Winchester, VA writes that WWTL-700, Walkersville, MD, has dropped its religion and country music format for an all Arabic format. The programming is supplied by the Arab Network of America, headquartered in Washington, and the Metropolitan Broadcasting Corporation, in London. And WBPS-890, Dedham, MA., now formats all news in French during AM drive, as noted in the Boston Globe. The rest of the broadcast day is given to brokered ethnic programming and some sports talk at night.

I notice that some of our reporters are having problems with Latin American (Spanish) names. Most Latin Americans are big on titles. North Americans use them sparingly, for example for Doctor, Reverend, Father, Governor, Mayor, Senator, President and Professor, but not a whole lot

more. Almost everyone in Latin America uses the title. Some of the most common are: Arq. (Architect), Ing. (Engineer), Dr. or Dra. (Doctor, Masculine and feminine), Abg. (Lawyer), Econ. (Economist), Lic. (Licenciado—it means a person holds a B.A. degree and may not have any particular professional reference.) A word of caution, when someone uses Dr. or Dra. it may not mean they are a medical doctor. For some it will mean they have a PhD from a U.S. or local university. For others in a country such as Ecuador it means they have a Doctorado degree which is equivalent to a Masters degree in the U.S. In any case, when in doubt, use the title, it is very important. Add to this the complications of Latin names. Most people use three names, the first being their given name, the second being their surname, the third being their mother's surname. Once-secret radio station is silenced

▶ KRSN-AM once broadcast Duke Ellington live and coded news of the A-bomb's success

unsuccessful, he said, because most potential buyers these days want FM stations. As of Jan. 10, the down-home AM station became a part of Los Alamos history.

Like Los Alamos itself, KRSN — originally known as KRS — came into being because of the Manhattan Project, the top-secret project on the isolated mesas of the Pajarito Plateau that developed the first atomic bomb during World War II.

Bob Porton came to Los Alamos from Florida in 1944 as a member of the Army Corps of Engineers.

It was his job to help keep up morale in the closed community of 6,000. He coordinated dances and athletic activities, ran two small movie theaters and managed the tiny radio station.

He remembers the lunch-hour scene on July 16, 1945, when he and co-workers were surprised to find the control room at the small Army-run station filled with 35 to 40 Manhattan Project scientists.

Tension increased as KRS — Kommunity Radio Service — began broadcasting Bob Lloyd's 12:45 p.m. news broadcast from KOB

radio in Albuquerque.
"He began his newscast by saying that the commanding officer of the Alamogordo air base announced this morning that a huge ammunitions dump had blown up there, but there were no injuries," Porton recalled.

Pandemonium broke out in the control

"All the scientists in the control room laughed and applauded and slapped each other on the back," Porton said. "That was their first knowledge that the (Trinity) test

The scientists and military security had fabricated the story in advance to offer a plausible explanation to those who might see or hear the explosion of the first atomic bomb in the desert near Alamogordo. The fact the story was released to the news media indicated the bomb had successfully detonated, Porton said.

Like the rest of Los Alamos, KRS was veiled in secrecy. Its signal was linked to the town's power supply network rather than broadcast into the atmosphere. Capacitors on the power grid at the edge of town blocked most of the signal from escaping "be HIII" said Porton.

No on-air reference was ever made to Los Alamos, nor were last names used or any information given that would give away Los Alamos, evistence, be said.

LOS ALAMOS — During a recent snowstorm, Los Alamos residents arose, plugged in their coffeepots and switched on radio station KRSN-AM, which for more than 50 years had been a source of local news.

But instead of announcements about road conditions and school closures, listeners were greeted with silence at 1490 on the AM dial.

KRSN, long a presence in the community,

was gone.

Owner Dean Burns, whose father, Darrel, bought the station in \$956, said the station was a victim of Los Alamos' shrinking retail community and a lack of support from merchants.

"I was brought up with the idea you try to serve other people, but that just isn't possible anymore, 'said Burns. 'I have made all the cuts that are humanly possible, and it just didott heln "

Attempts to sell the station have been

said. "The big news was we went full time," and hooked into the United Press International wire service.

Porton is proud of the fact that the radio station helped draw big-name talent to Los Alamos during the early post-war years. Duke Ellington, Henry Busse and Count Basey were among those who played at the radio station and at dances on the Hill.

In April 1948, the station moved from the "Big House" at the former Los Alamos Ranch School to the Los Alamos Community Center downtown, where it remained until the 1960s, when it moved to North Mesa. In 1949, the government sold the station, by then called KRSN, to a private owner, who sold it to Darrel Burns and Virgil Parker in 1956.

Burns eventually bought out Parker and ran the station until about 1988. Burns is described by his family and former employees as a man who believed in community

Under his guidance, the station broadcast county council meetings live for years, sponsored visits by the Easter Bunny — often played by Burn's son, Dale — and visits from Santa Claus, played by Burns.

Burns, who died in 1991, helped form the Los Alamos Chamber of Commerce and the Community Chest, the predecessor to the Los Alamos United Way. The station spoored a "home show" twice a year for merchants and fall auto shows, since "the Hill" had no car dealerships.

Disc jockey Bruce McGrath, who worked for the station for 33 years, described the music programming format as a smorgasbord of adult contemporary music, rock in roll, "elevator" music and classical and Broadway music mixed with news — a format designed to offer something for everyone in the community.

The station broadcast at 5,000 watts and could reach clear to Santa Fe "on a good day," said McGrath, although the Federal Communications Commission used to require the station to reduce its nighttime wattage to 250.

At its peak during the 1980s, the station had about 20 employees, said Dean Burns, but it had only three employees at the time it went off the air.

All have found work elsewhere or have been absorbed into KRSN's surviving sister station, KNLA, at FM 101.

KNLA, which has an "oldies, but goodies" format, is the only remaining radio station in Los Alamos.

station. Because Los Alamos officially did not exist, neither did the station, and so it couldn't get funding from the Armed Forces Radio Network, said Porton. That meant surviving on a shoestring and broadcasting only a few hours a day.

"If we didn't have an album to play that night, we'd call on a scientist — (Robert) Oppenheimer, Louis Rosen, (Edward) Teller and Hans Bethe — and borrow it and play it and return it the next day," Porton said.

The Army held dances and used the profits to buy records for the station, he said.

Teller read Hans Christian Andersen sto-

ries into what was, by today's standards, a primitive wire recorder. The stories were played on the air for children until the device broke and could not be

repaired, Porton said.

With the end of the war, and acknowledgement that Los Alamos existed, the station finally was fully funded.

"We were sent a very fine transmitter instead of the nuts and bolts we had," Porton

Request catalogs from the various distributors to compare prices and return Carefully review manufacturers' policies. specifications to determine whether or not a product will meet the requirements of your specific application. Distributor catalogs often list vital statistics, or specifications may be requested directly from the manufacturer. The list is not exhaustive. I tried to identfy equipment commonly used by DXers as reported in DX News, along with some relatively unknown but interesting products for informational purposes. Omissions from this listing are not intentional and should not be considered blanket rejection of a product or distributor. Comments are included based upon personal knowledge or experience, but should not be considered an endorsement of one product over any others.

If you know of any additional products or distributors that would be of interest to fellow broadcast band DXers, send the information to Target DX for inclusion in future editions.
