Several NRC'ers have really taken to heart my call a couple of years ago for information pertaining to mailing times of DXN, and I recently received a list of mailing times from Robin Christoff, Welland, Ontario, some 25 miles NW of Buffalo, NY. Perhaps other members in Canada can use this information as a bellwether or at least a comparison to their own delivery times. Robin reported an average 5-6 day delivery period, with the usual slowdown starting in early December and lasting through late January (9-13 days). Oddly, the Nov. 2 issue took 18 days to arrive, but the Nov. 16 issue only four. Thanks to Robin and others who have continued to keep track of delivery trends.

Ken Chatterton reports that the 19th edition of the *NRC AM Log* is completely sold out, with the 20th edition due out on October 1.





DDXD-East

Deadlines are Tuesdays: June 1, July 6.

In response to some questions and a suggestion from one of our contributors, Bill Hale and I have been e-chatting with Paul of late about some possible tweaks to the DDXD format. It has been suggested that we adopt UTC instead of Eastern Local Time in the domestic column, and that we collapse the 0000-0800, 0800-1600, and 1600-2400 into a single loggings section. We were generally of the opinion that, since most domestic stations are on a local-time schedule, the use of UTC would be more confusing than helpful (imagine saying that Rush Limbaugh, for example, may be heard 1700-2000 winters and 1600-1900 summers). However, we thought that the time breakdowns of the loggings section (which date back to the days when Bill was doing the whole of DDXD, East and West) may have outlived their usefulness, and we have made some tentative plans to combine them over the summer. We did want to provide an opportunity for your comments, Easterners and Westerners alike. So please drop Bill or myself a line, and include your latest DX catches while you're at it! And thanks, as always, to all of our members who contribute to the column with their ideas and suggestions, as well as their logs.

From Sheldon Harvey of the Canadian International DX Club: "The station CJMS-1040 kHz. in St. Constant, Quebec, did go on the air last Sunday afternoon [4/25 - DY] at 3 PM. In speaking with one of the station owners, Mr. Michel Mathieu, he told me that there was a reason for coming on at this time. It marked the 45th anniversary of when CJMS, then at 1280 kHz. in Montreal, first came on the air.

"The station is on the air now, testing with their nighttime power and pattern of about 1100 watts. They will only begin official programming on Monday, May 10, 1999, presumably with the morning drive show. Check 5 or 6 AM Eastern. At that time they will be using their daytime power of 5000 watts.

"The broadcast last Sunday included a brief discussion on air with various people associated with the station, and contained a mix of various French and English country vocals, and many instrumentals.

"According to their proof of performance with the CRTC, they will have to play 65% French language vocals, and of course, meet the 35% Canadian content regulations as well (instrumentals are not part of this equation). This won't be difficult to do, as the majority of the French songs will also qualify as Canadian.

"I do not have the details of the antenna pattern at this time, but I hope to soon. The station will accept reception reports. They can be reached by telephone at 514-990-2567 (CJMS). Their mailing address is CJMS Country 1040, 200-B St. Pierre, St. Constant, Quebec J5A 2G9.

"I hope this information is helpful to you all."

Several new members have written recently, asking about how to report stations that have not been positively ID'ed. Let me pass along one of my responses for general consumption:

"People have different opinions about tentative loggings, but the hobby standard is that you should be conservative about claiming to have heard a station. Unless you're sure, you should use one of these qualifiers:

"(1) 'Presumed' means you're virtually certain you've logged the station, but have not actually heard an ID. Example: "WOWO-1190 (presumed) with Fort Wayne Comets hockey strong, no ID."



"(2) 'Tentative' means you have strong reasons to conclude it's the station you think it is, but you aren't sure. Example: "WJOX-690 (tentative) with sports call-in show, discussion of Auburn basketball." Here, you have an Alabama sports talk station discussing an Alabama sports team, but it's not impossible for a national sports talk network to discuss Auburn basketball. In fact, there is so little local programming on AM these days that mentions of teams and localities are not necessarily conclusive.

"(3) 'UNID' can include stations about which you have some idea, as well as those for which you have no clue. Example: "UNID-1380 with Boston Red Sox baseball, probably unneeded WSYB."

Hope you're all enjoying the warmer months by now, which are not necessarily empty of DX! If you're planning on visiting the Big Apple this summer, drop a line and see how polite New Yorkers can really be.

Ben speaks: "TA reception continued pretty good all of last week, the week between Europe going on DST and our going on it, resulting in some early sign-ons as I suggested. The last 2 or 3 days seemed to favor the high part of the band around the 1500's with some very strong signals as most of the low end tapered off."

Mark speaks: I listened on the evening of 3 April and noted fairly good European reception at sunset (just after 2300 UTC), but a drop off in conditions later on. Of special interest was the likely move of Azores from 837 down to 836. Ben Dangerfield in PA has also noted this. Canaries on 837 was a good deal stronger than 836 this time around. I checked 846 hoping for a reappearance of South Africa, but Italy was very strong. Indeed the Africans were at a deficit to Europeans: 765 had Switzerland and Senegal alternating at first, then a complete Swiss takeover. Thursday evening's outing to Granite Pier in Rockport, MA was a success on several levels. A BBL-1 Broadband Loop was run in the "K9AY" mode. A fairly good amount of cardioid pattern nulling was obtainable with the 6 ft. (1.8 m) per side square loop with one end of it connected to chassis ground through a Vactrol (voltage controlled resistor). With a cardioid pattern already somewhat established by the "mini-K9AY" antenna itself, phasing its output against the active whip gave an extraordinary amount of nulling: most New York City stations - usually obnoxious pests - were reduced below the strengths of adjacent Europeans! DX highlights included Israel-1206; Greece-981, 1179, & 1512; Egypt - 774, 819, & 864; tentative Iran-1503; plus the usual blasters from Kuwait and Saudi Arabia during a "power burst" of Levant / Middle East reception (DX times: 8 APR 2215 UTC to 9 APR 0115 UTC). Some signals came close to pinning the S-meter. Many Europeans were strong (Croatia-1134 trashing WBBR, etc.). On a drive home from Cape Cod on Saturday afternoon, I stopped at a good beach DXing site at the Powder Point Bridge in Duxbury, MA. Foreign DX was interesting; not much out of northern or eastern Europe, but very strong Spain and North Africa. All the usual stations from that area were loud; I'll have a complete report on the DX later. Morocco on 612 seems to be reactivated as I heard African drumming and shouting, then followed by more-Arabic-sounding music at 2350 UTC (17 APR). Brazilians on 760 and 690 were noted. Off-channel stuff: Azores is still on 836, Ceuta on 1583.62, RASD Algeria on 1550 (loud at 2235 through local WNTN), and tentative Angola on 1502.0. Caribbean splits 555, 705, and 895 started showing up a bit after sunset as I was getting



ready to leave: the signal levels of these weren't that impressive."

Ben speaks: "I read the report from Gary in Albany who doesn't get TAs and thinks maybe it's because he's on a river valley. I live a couple of miles from the Delaware River [that also flows into the Atlantic] and have logged hundreds of TAs over the years." (Keep trying Gary! - Jim)

Bob speaks: "Long time member Bob Galerstein (since 1974) here with my first ever IDXD contribution! I've submitted various items over the years to *DX News*, most notably to Pro Sports Nets, but never had much of an international DX bug until the last few years, fueled mostly by reading your column. My sporadic DX'ing and IDXD-type loggings are very garden variety, hence my lack of participation. But, if everyone contributed one or two of these per month, you'd be quite a busy person. Incidentally, I do thoroughly enjoy your personal stories leading off some columns and the others' submissions, especially Mark Connolly's tireless Hall of Fame loggings."

Morris speaks: "This is probably the last trip to Coe Hill this season as the site is not available during the summer."

Bruce speaks: "Latin American DX was essentially shut down by the end of April. Normally strong signals from Colombia, Cuba, and Venezuela disappeared, leaving U.S. clear channels in the clear. Stations such as WSM-650, WSB-750, and KYW-1060 which are usually plagued by Latin American interference have been noted with exceptionally clear signals. Considering that not more than a month ago, and throughout the DX season, Cuba was dominant on many frequencies, it would be interesting to learn what caused such a dramatic change in propagation conditions."

STATION NEWS

- AUSTRIA: ORF announced that as from coming Monday (28 April) the MW-1476 KHz and SW 5945 KHz will carry a program intended for all Kosovan's. Language support English, German, Serbian/Croatian and Albanian. For this purpose the 1476 KHz transmitter will use "increased power". Times between 17.00 and 02.00 local / 15.00 - 24.00 UTC. Existing MW programs will be cancelled in favour of this program. [ORF Television news; 21 April / ZIB2, via Franz and the British DX Club in Medium Wave News e-mail]
- CHINA: Dongfang 800 kW RFI in FF 1300-1400 to southern part of Vietnam according to RFI printed schedule. The site is located on westernmost tip of Hainan Island, South China, with open water towards Vietnam and the Philippines. [Uwe Vol-D via LR/MW-EKO in Medium Wave News APR 99]
- FRANCE: UNID transmitter with Radio France Internationale heard this morning on 1080 kHz (April 14, 0320-0510... UTC). Fair signal. Does anybody know more? Thanks. [Karel Honzik, the Czech Republic via *hard-core-dx*] I think this transmitter is located in Villebon/Romainville-Paris, last year used by Radio Latina during world soccer 98 games. I have a QSL of Radio Latina. [Ruud Vos Utrecht, Holland in *hard-core-dx*]
- GERMANY: Mega Radio 1575 from Burg was scheduled to start in January. Power 200 kW nighttime and 500 kW day-



- time. [Play-IDX #1006 in Medium Wave News APR 99]
- CANADA: RUV has been hoping that the new east-west long wave stations (189 and 207 kHz) will merge their service areas to a greater extent than the old east-west longwave stations did, so that the 666 and 738 kHz south and north gap filler may be closed down. However the firm and final decision has yet to be made and the stations are still on the air and will be until such a decision is made. This decision will probably be made as soon as possible this year as actual comparative propagation evaluation is available. It is possible that a new station might be necessary in the southern gap, to the west of the present 666 kHz site. Again this has yet to be determined. - IRELAND: 828/963 Radio Na Gaeltachta has closed down these two frequencies. Only 540 kHz is on the air. [BE via MV EKO in *Medium Wave News* APR 99]

- MEXICO: Semi-local XESS-1450 is now "14-50 AM, La Fuerza de la Palabra". They relay XEDA-1290 Mexico City at least part of the time, which is "R. Trece, La Fuerza de la Palabra". [Tim Hall, Chula Vista CA via amfmdvx@qth.net]
- NETHERLANDS: Finally one of the new private Dutch medium wave stations are due to hit the airwaves. Max AM is scheduled to commence broadcasting late April or early May 1999 on the frequency of 1557 kHz with a power of 2.5 kW. Perhaps only 1 kW in the beginning. Format will be all news and there will a daily English broadcast is planned - probably at 1800-1900 hrs local time. The transmitter site will be somewhere near Amsterdam. [Stig Hartvig Nielsen, Denmark, via *hard-core-DX*] Radio 10 Gold (675 kHz) is thinking of giving up its medium wave frequency. Main reason would be lack of listeners, especially due to the fact that most people who used to listen to them on 675 kHz, have turned to the FM frequencies. Whereas at the beginning 40% listened to MW, this number has now dropped to 4%. As it costs them 2.4 million Guilders per year, Wegener/ Arcade (the owners) estimates the MW broadcasts will end in three months' time. No worries for the Dutch listeners, but the foreign listeners will surely be sad about this. Dutch public broadcaster NOS has asked the Dutch media minister whether it is possible to get a 5th FM network. In return they would give up their Medium Wave frequencies (used now by Radio 1 and 5). Source: Radiovisie [Medium Wave Circle e-mail]
- NORWAY: In mid May the work at the new NRK 675 kHz transmitter at Rost will be finalized, and the new transmitter will be put into operation. Frequency is the same as the old Bodo transmitter, which will be closed down. Power will remain at 10 kW, although the new site is capable of running up to 20 kW. The new transmitter combined with an excellent location almost sitting in seawater should improve the signal compared to the old situation. Following an initiative by the DX-Listeners' Club in Norway it seems likely that the switch from the old Bodo transmitter to this new facility will be marked through exclusive transmission on this frequency. We have suggested to NRK as the programme provider and Norkring as the technical operator of the transmitters, that a special broadcast should be made on the last night Bodo is in operation, and the first day of broadcast from Rost. The decision on the extent of special programmes still is not made, but what CAN be said is that it is very likely that the event will be marked in some way. According to the current workplan, Rost will be put into service on May 14th, but with possibility of a couple of days plus/minus. Closer to the actual transition date, we will carry specific details on our web-page <http://www.dxc.com/> as to exact dates, times and extent of the special broadcast(s). Reception reports will be most welcome, details will be available on our web-page. Follow-up report: Press release from DX-Listeners' Club, Norway: "A special broadcast is scheduled to take place on 675 kHz on Wednesday May 12th 1999 between 2000 and 2400 hours UTC. The transmission will be carried from the new Norwegian AM-site at Röst in Northern Norway, replacing the old transmitter on same frequency located in Bodö. If everything goes well, the transmitter will be put on air during daytime on May 12th. At this time Bodö will be shut down. Röst will carry the normal programme ("Europakanalen" in parallel to for instance 1314 kHz Kvitsøy) until 2000 UTC when a special prerecorded programme will be aired exclusively from Röst until midnight when "Europakanalen" will be switched back. The timeslot should give grey-zone propagation possibilities for northern Europe, so even if the Dutch Radio Ten Gold transmits on the same frequency, some long distance DX could be possible. Remember also that this new site is far better than Bodö, regarding location. Röst



is way out into the Atlantic Ocean, with lots of seawater all around, and a brand new transmitter. Up to date info will be available at <http://www.dxl.com/> in a few days time, reporting on the progress and possible late changes. SERBIA/NATO: This morning 12 April at 0900 UTC I've an unid station in slavic language on 1003 kHz. Weak and interfered by my local RAI outlet on adjacent 999, but it could be the NATO station in former Yugoslavia reported by Mike Barraclough. I'm just on the other side of the Adriatic Sea from Yugoslavia. More to follow when I can get an ID. [Fabrizio Magrone, Italy, e-mail] I have been trying for this station at around midnight UTC (no signal) and around 2000 UTC on the next day, but no signal again nor a piece of carrier to be heard. My distance is ca. 1000 km from the border of Macedonia where probably the transmitter is located (?). Fabio's distance of ca. 600 km gives him better conditions to hear the ID and possible on-air times for which I am already looking forward. [Karel Honzik, the Czech Republic via Medium Wave Circle e-mail] Unluckily I hadn't the time to check again on ornings; no trace of the station in the evenings and early mornings, so probably it's a daytimer only. Will try it again this weekend. [Fabrizio Magrone via e-mail] Daily here in Salzburg around 09-11 UT with S=5/7 signal! There are no other transmissions! [Christoph Ratzler in Medium Wave Circle e-mail] Yes, it is a NATO station and it is transmitted from a fleet of US Air Force planes normally based in Pennsylvania. [Rémy F. in Medium Wave Circle e-mail] The NATO station on 1003 is still active; but I noticed it in the morning only. Yesterday, April 17, I logged it at 1100 UTC; later, at 1140, it was off the air. Today, April 18 (Sunday), nothing during the whole morning; maybe due to today's very bad weather, if it's really an airborne transmitter as it has been said. [Medium Wave Circle e-mail] In support of Operation Allied Force, elements of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard's 193rd Special Operations Wing have deployed to Germany. Two of the unit's "Commando Solo" aircraft left Harrisburg International Airport Saturday night [March 27], along with one support aircraft. Additional personnel and equipment will depart in a military airlift later this week. In all, approximately 100 members of the 193rd will take part in the mission. The "Commando Solo," which the 193rd flies, is a specially modified EC-130 turboprop aircraft. It serves as an airborne broadcasting platform, transmitting messages over radio and television frequencies. Previous deployments have been carried out in support of the Persian Gulf War and during operations in Haiti and Bosnia. [Steven Thomma and Richard Parker, of Knight Ridder, Washington, in Harrisburg Patriot-News March 29 via P-mail from Brian Alexander, in WORLD OF RADIO 984/ Glenn Hauser SHORTWAVE/DX REPORT 99-17, April 9] Radio station called "Allied Voice" broadcasts in Serbian from airplane on 1003 kHz, 3 FM frequencies and 1 TV channel (21) for people of Serbia, Yugoslavia. The plane flies 6000 m (18000 ft) high and the MW transmitter has 10 kW. I heard the station for the first time yesterday, April 25, between 1000-1320 UTC sign off. My location is Plzen (Pilsen), 90 km SW from Prague. Yesterday I had a poor signal here in our house, in the middle of all that noise of bigger town (170 000 people). Today (April 26) I took my car, a Lowe HF-150 receiver and 50 m of wire and drove to the edge of the city. The noise was as strong as in our house so I drove on, some 10 km north to the area of small villages and forests. When I connected the wire to my receiver, I could not believe my ears, the signal was so good. I have been listening for more than 1 hour until the sign off at exactly 1400 UTC. According to my observations, Allied Voice (Zayednichki Glas) is on the air daily for 3-4 hours (April 25: 1000-1320; April 26: 1030-1400 UTC). The program consists of Anglo-American pop and rock with short comments (2-4 minutes) every ca. 15 minutes. The station ID is (in Serbian) "Allied Voice", "Allied Voice of NATO", "Radiostation of NATO forces" and similar modifications. Anti-Miloshevic comments and propaganda are read by men and women with a strong American accent (!). It seems they are Serbs living in the US already for many years. The signal is technically quite OK, propagation from airplane flying so high above the ground is excellent, the signal has no fading at all (it is early afternoon of our local time!). Although it has only 10 kW, its level was practically the same as the one of Hrvatski Radio on 1134 kHz (600 kW). The signal of Belgrade on 684 kHz (2000 kW, now maybe less) was poor with long and deep fadings. My location is ca. 1000 km from Belgrade. I think that it is possible to hear the signal up to 1500 km from Serbia. Leave your town with a portable - (or car-) receiver



and a roll of wire and it is very probable that you will hear it (until it is too late). After all the transmissions are a bit funny. I think that accented speeches and strong propaganda contents will hardly find massive audience, especially in Serbia where people are now very sensitive of everything what is coming from NATO countries that are destroying their country. It reminds me the time in August 1968 when 5 countries of the Warsaw Pact occupied our country (the Czech Republic). Immediately after their entry the clandestine station called VLTAVA went on the air from Dresden, East Germany. Strong accent of German speakers and communist propaganda did not find their listeners and the station remained only a source of jokes ... [Karel Honzik, Czech Republic, in Medium Wave News e-mail]

SERBIA (more): Banned Radio B92 from Yugoslavia still live on the Web - Following the government closing of its radio operations last week, Belgrade, Yugoslavia-based Radio B92 has relied on the Internet to provide independent news on the Yugoslavia-NATO conflict. Radio B92 was shut down by officials with the Yugoslav Federal Telecommunications Ministry on March 24, on charges that the station's broadcast was exceeding the allowed power level of 300 watts. But the radio station's audio (in Serbo-Croat and English) and video Web broadcasts, as well as text documents — found at www.b92.net — continue to feed information about conditions in Yugoslavia to anyone with a Web browser. Radio B92's ISP is OpenNet. With a banner across the top of the site reading "Banned Radio 92 Still Live on the Web," Radio B92's headlines include uncensored information about events such as diplomatic meetings between Yugoslav president Slobodan Milosevic and Kosovo Albanian leader Ibrahim Rugova, downed NATO aircrafts, and damage levels in bombed regions of Kosovo. [copied from update@winfiles.com via Dave on Medium Wave Circle e-mail]

SERBIA (more): A correspondent of mine wrote those broadcasts to the Serbs are on 87.9 — not heard yet, and 106.4, and to hear it better she tunes to 106.5. There's another broadcast from a mountain site on 106.5. She says she's heard that in 4-6 weeks a "network" of FM stations from sites in surrounding nations will be on the air, 24 hours. Construction is underway. Interesting; since FM is going to be tough out to the mountains and can be easily jammed. My friend says FM is very, very popular in Serbia and like in the USA, AM isn't too popular. Many people in the region have SW; they reluctantly tune in AM; FM is the trend. The affluent 10-12% or so have a satellite dish, usually hidden from view — put out at night and hidden during the day. There's a fear of confiscation and problems. CNN is a popular view but only about half with dishes watch it regularly. One female correspondent isn't too popular with some. Sports is very popular with basketball a hit. There's some NASCAR interest and baseball is a curiosity. Takes their mind off the woes they're undergoing. BKB was missed during the strike and car racing before NATO action started was a major interest. Allegedly there's some electromagnetic jamming causing problems with domestic radio, TV, electrical power, appliance use. I understand domestic radio and TV installations which are tied in with the military comms are now fair game to air strikes by NATO. A US military honcho said in a prepared statement to a reporter's question that they'd like to take out the Serbian radio and TV studios and transmission sites in order to disrupt "their" one-sided reports, lies and propaganda. There's an email URL [<http://www.anonymizer.com>] around where people in the affected areas can file reports without fear of having it traced back to them. They're encouraged to openly speak out on how they're being hampered, what they've experienced, damage reports, what aid is needed, etc. [Bob Thomas, CT, April 12, REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING e-mail] Several transmitter sites were destroyed last night (April 22/23) in Serbia by NATO bombs. Transmitter Beograd-1 (684 kHz) suddenly lost its modulation in the middle of news at 0006 UTC (April 23). There was only a carrier and noise. The noise surprisingly affected also the adjacent channels and there were absolutely no signals audible on 675 kHz (Radio 10 Gold, Holland) and 693 kHz (BBC), both usually very strong here in the night. At 0032 the Beograd transmitter was switched off and the stations on 675 a 693 kHz returned loud and clear. In the morning the transmitter was back with its usual signal level. These times correspond with Radio Beograd's announcement (in the morning news) about bomb attacks on the center of Belgrade that started at 2:06 am local time. Radio Free Europe Serbian program seems to be on the air for the whole night on 1458 kHz from Tirana, Albania. It is the transmitter which produces terrible intermodulations on 1413 and 1503 kHz. By the way - this transmitter was donated by China some 20 years ago during the crisis between China and Soviet Union. It has been rebroadcasting Radio Peking's programs for Europe. Later, when another crises occurred (this time between China and Albania), the government in Tirana announced that the transmitter will be given at disposal to the "heroic Vietnamese nation" for rebroadcasts of Vietnam foreign service to Europe. But it never happened and Tirana was using the transmit-



ter for its own foreign service. [Karel Honzik, Czech Republic via Medium Wave Circle e-mail] And the latest info from Karel, as of MAY 2, 2100 UTC: No radio stations seem to be on the air in Serbia after the electricity breakdown at around 1930 UTC caused by NATO bombing. Radio Novi Sad (1107 kHz) relays Radio Zrenjanin (Vojvodina). Continuous pop instrumentals with occasional announcements saying that there is no water nor gas available in the city at the moment. The systems will be open from 11:30 pm to 12:30 am and from 5:30 am to 7:00 am. Radio Crne Gore (Montenegro - Jim) on 1503 kHz is on the air. BALKAN MEDIUM WAVE NOTES

Mark Connelly, WA1ION, Cape Cod, MA

With all that's going on in central Europe, this is the time to monitor both what broadcasters are saying and how military actions are affecting the entire layout of the dial: some stations boosted in power and schedule to spread propaganda, other facilities knocked off the air, etc. For US DXers, Granite Pier in Rockport, MA offers the one of the best vantage points for intercepting incoming signals from across the Atlantic. Here's a survey of the frequencies on Christoph Ratzler's Balkans list, from here in eastern Massachusetts, USA at typical peak European reception time (presently 2230 to 0100 UTC):

- 558 Spain dominates, not a really strong signal; WGAN-560 splash
- 594 Portugal over Morocco; rarely Germany
- 612 Ireland and Spain. Morocco used to dominate strongly, but it's been inactive.
- 648 Usually Spain, rarely Gambia or Saudi Arabia
- 684 Beograd is occasionally noted, but it's Spain 90% of the time and a good deal of WRKO-680 splash
- 774 Spain over Egypt (and rarely Morocco)
- 810 Spain is the dominant European. Usually 810 is domestics WGY and CJVA, as well as signals from Colombia, Puerto Rico, the Bahamas, and Brazil.
- 837 Canary Islands / Spain synchros. rule here. See prior note about co-channel Azores probably sliding back down to 836.
- 882 COPE Canary Islands and BBC UK take turns dominating this channel.
- 918 Spain dominates; Syria sometimes creeps in underneath
- 1107 Spain is very strong here with Egypt occasionally behind
- 1125 Croatia is noted (// 1134), but Spain is more common. Madeira Islands occasionally noted also.
- 1134 Croatia and Spain alternate. Both are often strong. WBBR-1130 can be substantially reduced with cardioid antenna array (loop phased against vertical whip)
- 1350 Europeans are seldom noted on this channel. CKAD-NS, WGPL-VA, and WOYK-PA alternate dominance.
- 1395 Albania occasionally noted, though not too strong lately.
- 1413 Spain prevails here.
- 1458 Albania has become rather strong here lately. It had a very good signal two nights ago around

sunset at Nauset Beach, Orleans, MA. News had American officials speaking in English about Kosovo. The announcer then translated the talk into an eastern European language. Has this boosted power? There was a background growl from a station on a slightly different frequency.

1503 Nothing very strong on this channel. Low-power Spain, AFN Azores, Iran, and a few others are occasionally noted. Near the channel are Angola-1502 and Togo-1502.4.

WNRB-1510 chops up 1503 and 1512 with hard-to-null slop.

And as a follow-up to Mark's report, here is a Balkans review from Per Ole Stenman in Finland, dated APR 24-25:

684: This night Beograd-1 was broadcasting all the time // Radio Novi Sad-1269 and Radio Prishtina.

They mentioned the names of radio/TV workers who died in the Nato attack and asked for telegrams expressing solidarity. They also got it from neighbouring Croatia/Bosnia-Herzegovine/Macedonia and something Italienski redakcija. Program seemed to some extent to be prerecorded.

981.03 kHz found this station at 0020 then it was relaying Radio Televizija Serbia, over to nonstop musik, at 0100 I was surprised to hear a clear ID from "Hrvatski Radio-1" when starting the news, and yes, it was // with 1134, could not hear 1143 kHz.

1026 was relaying Beograd-1 all the night. Last Saturday I heard Radio Kragujevac here with frequent IDs+frequency announcements for AM&FM.

1062 was relaying Beograd-1 without local announcement. First time I notice this one in Jakobstad.

1089 relaying Beograd-1 only

1350 could not hear Studio B, so probably off, only Greek station on 1349.95 kHz.

1368 Radio Valjevo-2 has started a second program on this medium wave transmitter. Relaying Beograd-1 2200-2252 UTC, but after this very locally produced live program. Also reports from other parts of Serbia, at 23.59 from Radio Nis mentioning bombing, and later on from Radio Sapca.

1467 relaying Beograd-1 and with very overmodulated transmitter

1503 could not hear this station either, last time I heard Beograd 202 it was relaying 684 only.

1602 station with local program in serbo-croatian language but no IDs.

Per-Ole uses an NRD-535 and 525, antenna 500 meter deep south and 1100 meter SSE [via hard-core-dx e-mail].


