From the pages of DX News:

50 years ago ... from the October 18, 1952 DXN: Everett Johnson, Mendota, IL reported receiving 11 veries during the past week, including one from KVMC-1320 for their DX program on 9-1-52. Bill Prater, Grimsley, TN reported having Tennessee verified 100%.

25 years ago ... from the October 24, 1977 DXN: Perry Ferrell's view of the Sony ICF-5900W was that it was drift-prone; it used a cheap crystal in the calibrator; it was temperature-sensitive; and it used soft nylon gears that resulted in backlash.

10 years ago ... from the October, 1992 DXN: KQNG-570's tower in Lihue, HI "crumbled like a paper clip" during Hurricane Inika, but the station was back on the air in a couple of days via a 400-foot wire strung between two trees.

Now that we're back to weekly publication, I'd like to remind all contributors to DDXD-E to limit their reporting to **new catches or re-logs due to call letter or format changes**. Also, if you can, **please send your logs to me via email**. Of course, if you don't have a computer or internet access I'm always happy to type your loggings, but putting the column together is a big job during the height of the season, and the less typing and reformatting I have to do, the better. Email me and I'll send you the specs for submission. Thank you for your consideration! (Ginny is being diplomatic; let ME be a little more direct: there seems to be one or two individuals who apparently send in so-called loggings to DDXD so that their names appear in print more often. If you have a large number (over 2 or 3) loggings appearing in the "Presumed and UnID section" all the time, I'm going to ask YOU to start sharpening up your reporting skills by listing enough details for easily-heard stations so that they can be listed in the regular DX section. If you don't hear the call letters during your session, listen long enough so that you do so that your logging is no longer "presumed". It's official, the FCC has given the OK for the move ahead on digital radio, IBOC, for both AM and FM stations in the US. It's going to be interesting to see how this is going to affect both listening by the general public and us, as DXers. On 10/11, I was able to sit in on a demonstration that was put together by Harris (one of the major radio transmitter makes in the U. S.), and what I heard for AM improvements audio wise was something to knock you off your chair! FM improvements were less noticeable, but it seemed to cure some of the multipath of the signal that was monitored. Don't worry, this isn't going to happen overnight; I'm sure that it's going to take some time. Now that the FCC has accepted a standard for digital radio, this gives the green light for manufacturers to start producing receivers, which will start showing up in your favorite stores by the spring of 2003. With the modifications that will have to be done to the analog signal being transmitted is a reduction in AM audio bandwidth, from its present 9khz to 5khz. This will mean stations will be getting new gear to pass the higher bandwidth needed for the digital signal and, hopefully, the antenna system will be able to pass the higher end digital source (I know of a few that can't to this day!).

Don't worry, many of the present consumer equipment available rolls off the high end frequencies on AM at about 3000 hertz, so it won't be a noticeable change (A Superadio in wide-band mode will probably detect the difference, or an R390A set at the 16khz bandwidth setting right under the towers). I'm sure that this will be a big change in a favorable manner, not like the big mess that happened with AM stereo in the '80's (how many are still running AM Stereo? Locally, WICK-1400). It will also be interesting to see what digital propagation will be like at night, less noise? The best I can say is 'stay tuned!'. 73's
