10 years ago ... from the March 13, 2000 DXN: Tim Hall, Chula Vista, CA reported a "Talking House" transmitter on 1600 kHz on 2/26 about a half-mile from his house, "badly pummeled by XEKTT ... which is just over the mountain in Tecate".

- ◆ Fines: Cancelled a fine of \$1500 (originally \$7000) levied against WPFD-850 Fairview, Tennessee.
- ◆ News Item: The Audio Division of the Media Bureau at the FCC has ruled in a dispute concerning the license of the 1070 kHz station in West Klamath, Oregon. Sandra Falk was licensee until she passed away in 2006; her beneficiary managed her estate until the state of Oregon petitioned for her removal, saying she had been involved in a fraudulent real estate transfer of Falk's property. The court then appointed Scott MacArthur as representative of Falk's estate, according to the FCC summary. The commission says that after more than three years of silence, MacArthur reportedly returned the station to the air on July 15, 2009, and from a location other than what was listed on the license. MacArthur, seeking to keep the station going, filed a request for STA to remain silent as well as an application for license renewal. Robert Wynne, the president of Wynne Broadcasting Co., then filed an appeal of the license renewal, complaining about the lengthy time that the AM had been off the air. The FCC now rejected the license renewal. Its rules state that if a station fails to transmit for a 12-month period, the license expires. Further, precedent dictates that licensees can't avoid the statutory deadline by using non-conforming facilities. And the FCC found no reason to extend or reinstate the license despite those limitations, as it is allowed to do in some circumstances. The commission said it will modify its databases to show that the license expired in July 2007 and it has deleted the call sign KRAM.



Over the years of working at radio stations with engineering and conducting many equipment and DX Tests, if Kermit needed the station and he heard it, it would be followed with the perfect reception report, giving every detail possible from programming to signal conditions, be perfectly written and always included return postage (which I would always return). I can't recall how many verifications I sent to him but I'm sure he has a few in his collection. In the late '70's, I had a chance to visit his home and spent the better part of a day looking at his collection of radio items from receivers to verifications, especially being amazed at the ones he had collected during the war where the letters had lines cut out of them when certain things were 'top secret' information, as our government considered then. In the 80's, I was a guest speaker at the show in Kulpsville, a forum on AM radio listening, and I brought Kermit in to talk about radio with me. At the end, I asked "and would you tell everyone your total number of verifications in your collection", when he answered about 6600 you could hear many a jaw hit the floor! Kermit also had an extensive collection of railroad and trolley pictures that he had taken in the Lehigh Valley area, many of the lines and companies LONG gone, including pictures of a rail line that ran right behind his home. And I had just spoken with Kermit at the Allentown convention this past Labor Day, thanks to John Malicky getting him on his cell phone. And as they say, time moves on. 73
