# BROADCAST DX

- + Plaudits this month to the League's small but active Taranaki Branch. See Page 2 for details of their DXing efforts 3000 feet up Mt. Egmont!
- + N.Z. isn't the only country with public complaints regarding changes in broadcasting policy. After all medium wave broadcasts from the South African Broadcasting Corporation were concluded on New Year's Day, following the complet -ion of nationwide FM networks. Widespread dissatisfaction has resulted in the reintroduction of MW broadcasts in Capetown and probably other centres " in order to give listeners longer time to acquire FM radio receivers." It has been emphasised that the reintroduction is not permanent. According to SADXC, the only MW transmitters still in use had been relaying commercial programmes from Radio Clibe de Mozambique.
- + Reporting to the Southern Cross DX Club, Chris Martin writes that 7LA 1100 has stopped all night programming and now closes at 1400 GMT leaving 6MD in the clear. A 7LA spokesman said that the shortened transmission hours resulted from the current economic climate. Chris also tells us of a DXpedition on 5 May with tentative reception of AFRTS Diego Garcia 1475 with American news at 1315 GMT.
- + According to a Port Moresby newspaper, (per Ron Killick NZDXRA) the Papua New Guinea medium wave callsigh prefix 9 was dropped on 14 April.
- + Finally, on the local scene, the ZM music stations are now operating 1800-1200 every day, including Sunday. The YO's are also shortly expected to begin morning broadcasts on Saturdays and Sundays.

NETHERLANDS. The Home Service's Third Programme has changed frequency from 7250 to 647kHz, effective 1/3, and now operates 24 hours a day.

EOLIVIA. According to a La Paz report, 10m Bolivian pesos will be invested this year in the expansion of the telegraph and radio broadcasting systems.

this year in the expansion of the telegraph and radio broadcasting systems. The installation of radio stations in 878 Bolivian towns linked through an Earth Station in the COMSAT system and financed by the Andean Development Corporation, is envisaged. Microwave equipment and the stations at Oruro, Cochabamba & Santa Cruz will be completed in December this year. (13/3/75)

PORTUGAL. On 11/3, Radio Clube Portugues in Lisbon reported that its Porto Alto installations had been "hit by the fire of the counter-

of action their Lisbon medium-wave transmitter. Despite this, Radio Clube
Portugues had continued to operate by using it's national FM network and the
MW and FM facilities of Radio Renascenca. This latter station has been off
air for some time due to a strike. (1034kHz hrd in NZ occasionally)(13/3/75)
DAHOMEY. According to a Cotonou broadcast, a new national radio station is
being built in Cotonou with West German technical assistance. (13/3/75)

NORTH KOHEA. According to a South Korean report on 5/3, there have been considerable increases in the transmitting facilities in North Korea. The output of the Sariwon transmitter (930kHz? Ed) was increased from 150kw to 1500 kw early this year; 7 other stations, including those at Kaesong (813kHz?Ed) and Haeju (625kHz? Ed), have increased in power from 50/100kw to 100/500kw range; highly directional aerials have been built for these transmitters; broadcasting periods have risen from 19 to 22 hours per day; and a 1400kw MW transmitter has been imported from Japan to further expand existing facilities.

CYPRUS. The Turkish-Cypriot broadcasting station Radio Bayrak (1095kHz MW) has announced that test broadcasts of it's Turkish programme on 6150kHz began on 10/3. The new transmissions should reach areas where MW reception is poor, particularly in the western part of Cyprus and in Turkey. The BBC have located the station on 6163kHz. (13/3 & 27/3/75)

INDONESIA. According to a domestic broadcast from Jakarta, RRI will install 52 additional MW transmitters to supplement its broadcasting network throughout Indonesia. It will also improve studio equipment and the distribution of spare parts to all RRI broadcasting stations. The project will begin this year.

THE SECOND CHANNEL. TV2, NZ's alternative nationwide TV channel will use the following wavelengths: Auckland - Channel 4, Wellington - Ch 5, Christchurch - Ch 8, Dunedin - Ch 4, Hamilton(Te Aroha) - Ch 3, Palmerston Nth(Wharite) - Ch 4 and Invercargill(Hedgehope) - Ch 3. All will be horizontally polarised except Te Aroha and Wharite which are vertical polarisation.

RADIO HAURAKI intends applying for an FM stereo licence of a limited and experimental nature. This follows a statement by the Director General of Radio NZ that stereo radio reception would be available within 5 years. Hauraki stated that they could have an experimental station on air in 4 months after approval being given.

2MBS in Sydney is run by the Music Broadcasting Society of NSW Coop Inc, Box 176, The Union, Sydney University, NSW 2006. They have a 12 month temporary licence, with the promise of extension. 900 Society members pay \$25 annual subscription to receive programme schedules for the 78 hours of broadcasting weekly. Off-air relays have been requested for Woolongong and Newcastle.

(v) Frogramme Content(continued) This was very pleasing and rather surprising for all reports. Only comment that I could make is that members could try and give even more detail, especially of news items etc. Some members obviously use taperecorders and their value for accuracy cannot be underestimated. They turn out fine reports.

(vi) General Comments. Being on the air for only one day, Radio Rhema was really in need of listeners' comments. It was really disappointing that so few gave their personal comments on the broadcast apart from sometimes comprehensive descriptions of their equipment or reception conditions. I feel that this was the main weakness of most reports. In essence, they were comprehensive technical reports, but devoid of individuality (discounting writing styles) and creating a rather boring impression. What will interest stations in acknowledging reports is an obvious interest by the listener in them. After all, most stations exist only to communicate with people on an individual basis, even though they may make some advertising revenue out of the contact at the same time. In the case of Radio Rhema, comments were especially required on a whole host of things such as technical studio quality, quality of programmes and presentation itself, impressions of the listener on the worth of such gospel material, and whether it would make it as a full-time broadcaster. Diers are among the fortunate few in NZ who are in a position to critically compare the station with other similar radio stations already operating, and comments drawn from this experience would have been especially welcome.

After being at the receiving end of reception reports, I would ask all members to bear the above comments in mind when sending reports in the future. Most League members can be proud of the technical standard of their reports. Now they should concentrate on putting that little bit of themselves into their reports, that little extra that can so often spark completely unexpected replies from even the most ordinary station. Most reports will get QSLs, but extra special reports (every report should be extra special:) can lead to some worthwhile experiences for both the receiver and sender. Be individual in your reports."

is in the provision of programme data for confirmation. However the general standard of NZ reports is very high.

As we require programme detail to confirm reception reports, I would stress the importance of supplying adequate information. In our case, the most reliable indications are music titles. From this we can confirm the date of broadcast, and, fairly accurately, the times of broadcast. Details of promotions etc are also quite adequate, but music titles ensure confirmation in all cases. If you are able to advise DXers of this it may help them in their future efforts."

Comment: Not all stations are required to keep a log of music played, so best bet is to give as much specific detail as possible in your reports. BC

#### STATION OF THE MONTH

#### Antarctic Reappears

Big news this month is the apparent change of frequency by the American Forces Antarctic Network, McMurdo Sound. Paul Aronsen of Invercargill heard them on 7050 khz between 0615 and 0900 GMT on 28 April at poor level, but since that time no further reception has been reported. The shock appearance of an Antarctic SW broadcaster hit the DX world ten months ago. Dene Lynneberg was the first to positively identify their weak and fluttery signals on 6012 khz, and in subsequent months AFAN was heard as far away as the eastern USA. A 1 kw FRT-24 transmitter is used for the shortwave outlet, with an omni directional antenna located above New Zealand's Scott Base. 3 miles from the AFAN McMurdo studio. The 24 hour broadcasts provide isolated Antartic research stations with continuous radio entertainment. 
#### DOWN UNDER GETS UNDER WAY !

WHEN: Queens Birthday weekend - 0600 GMT on Friday 31 May to 2000 GMT on Monday 2 June.

WHERE: The 41 metre band, 7100 - 7300 kiloHertz, inclusive.

WHO: Open to all members of the League.

HOW: what can be heard in the often neglected 41 metre band? Here's your chance to participate in a nationwide project to produce a survey covering all stations heard in the band during the forthcoming queen's Birthday holiday period.

TIPS FOR PARTICIPANTS: Most of us could not contemplate listening through the full 24 hours of a day. We would suggest you specialise on a certain time period or certain portion of the band (eg 7100-7200 kHz etc), or perhaps try identifying those stations transmitting in a particular language, or all the VOA's etc etc. This will give the survey added depth and avoid some duplication of effort.

Prepare for the survey period by spending some time in advance, getting to know your way around the 41 metre band and familiarising yourself with the frequencies of some of the major stations.

Format required as per the following example, with particular emphasis on the time a station is occupying a frequency:-

Reception is noted this month of the American Forces Antarctic Network on 7050 first noted by Paul Aronsen in Invercargill on 28 April. ++ From May 4 many frequency changes took place, and Radio Canada retimed its transmission to the South Pacific to 0800-0900, although another change is possible from September to 0900-1000. ++ Earle Fisher, former host of Radio Canada's Listeners' Corner has been ill with Pneumonia and is presently recuperating in Panama City, Florida.

BRAZIL Radio Nacional Brasilia is using 11780 for English from 2100-2200. They are also on the air from 1900 in Portuguese and 2000 in German on 15245.

CANADA Radio Canada International has retimed its service to the South Pacific and this is now broadcast 0800-0900 on 5970 and 9625.

FINLAND The Finnish Broadcasting Company has retimed its English transmission to North America and it is now broadcast 2300-2330. A new transmission is heard from 0700-0730 on weekdays on 6145 and on Sunday from 0730-0800. Other transmission are at 1400-1430, 1600-1630, 1800-1830, 2030-2100, on 9550 11755 15185 and 21605. The transmission at 2300 is on 15185, while a relay of the Home service is carried on 6120 on weekdays 0330-2130 and 0400-2130 Sundays. This transmission also carries the English programmes at 1400-1430 and 1600-1630 on 6120. The power of this transmitter is 15kw. Other powers are: 9550 15kw, 17755 15kw, 15185 100kw; 21605 lkw.

HOLLAND Radio Nederland is now using 15110 in place of 15105 in its transmission to the Far East in English from 0930-1050. The programme is also carried on 11825.

HUNGARY Radio Budapest has a new transmission to Australia and New Zealand from 1030-1100 in English. The frequencies used are 7220 9585 11910 15160 15285 17780 21525. A service to North America is heard now from 0200-0230 and 0300-0330 on 6000 7250 9585 9833 11910 15220 and 17710, except on Sundays.

INDIA All India Radio Delhi is heard well with English news at 0830. Hindi at 0850 and slow speed English at 0900 on 15280. The programme also carried on 6050 7125 9590 9630 11715 11935 15180 15280 15360 according to announcements.

JAPAN Radio Japan changed some of its regional frequencies on May 4. 0100-0300 to North America is now on 15235, 0630-0830 to Europe on 15430; 1800-1930 to Europe on 9605.

MEXICO Radio Seis, one time Radio Firsta and Radio Tricolor is heard well on 11880 up to 0400 when it is blocked by Turkey. Seis is also on 15110 but this frequency is blocked by Radio New Zealand.

NEW HEBRIDES Vila 3945 has extended its schedule and now closes after a French programme at 1000. The station relays English news from Radio Australia at 0700.

NORWAY Oslo has reduced its twansmitter coverage for each transmission and now is serving the Pacific from 0700-0830 on 6180 11850 and 15175. 1100-1230 on 6180 15175 21730. To North America 0500-0630 11879 15175 17800.

PAKISTAN Karachi opens at 0658 and has English news at 0700, closes down at 0730 and announces as using 11885 17750 17830 17890 21590 and 21730.

SAHARA 6095 power is 100kw. The station is heard opening on 11805 at 0800 and on 6095 at 1800.

SIERRA LEONE Freetown on 3316 has BBC news at 0700 followed by local announce ments. Closes 0730.

SINGAPORE Heard on 6155 around 1000 mixed with FEN Tokyo, playing English pop/. Has time pips at 1030 and then news in Malay.

SWEDEN Stockholm has cancelled its transmissions to Australia and NZ until recent tests are analysed. English is heard best 1830-1900 on 6065 11790 15240 and 0230 -0300 9695 and 11705.

POWER BOOST FOR NIGERIA The NEC is starting a development project under new studios and transmitting stations are being erected in each of the 12 Nigerian states. The external service "Voice of Nigeria" is being equipped with 3 new 500kw transmitters.

VOA IN THE NEWS A merger between the Voice of America, Radio Liberty and Radio Free Europe has been under consideration. Cost savings would accrue from combining of technical facilit--ies and equipment. Currently VOA has a budget of US\$55 million and RFE/RL \$50 million. Under the proposals, VOA would retain it's own separate editorial direction and also possibly have a separate charter from the US Information Agency. Also, a USIA Advisory Committee has recommended that VOA have 2500kw outlets to obtain superiority over the 500kw transmitters of other major nations!

SAUDI ARABIA's current foreign language schedule - English 1000-1300 GMT and 1700-2000 on 11855kHz; French on same frequency at 0600-0800 and 2000-2200; Turkish 0500-0600 on 11685; on 11855 in Swahili 1600-1700; and on 15115kHz with Indonesian 1300, Urdu 1400 and Farsi 1500-1600. P.Edwards

RADIO NORDSEE INTERNATIONAL'S radio ship Mebo II, which was seized by the Dutch police last October, is now free to leave European Waters with all transmitting equipment aboard. The ship is heading for Gambia on the West African coast to resume commercial broadcasting. Eickelmann SCDXers RADIO NACIONAL DE BRASÍLIA'S International Service is broadcast over a 250kw Brown Boveri transmitter located about 50km from the Brazilian capital. Following Portuguese at 1900. German at 2000 and English at 2100, a one-hour national governmental programme "A Voz do Brasil". National programmes of a commercial nature are broadcast 24 hours a day, over 10kw transmitters within the city limits. Frequencies are 15445, 11720, 9665 & 6065kHz.
