Those who have not yet sent their registration for Convention 77 in Christchurch are advised to delay no longer. Available accommodation is filling fast, with registrations to hand from many parts of NZ, 5 Australian states and Hawaii. To guarantee your place, registrations must be in this month.

The programme outline is: Friday 8 April: Official Welcome at 2.30pm, followed by tour of Radio Avon, before heading to Convention site for a night of DX. Saturday 9: Grand Auction, tour of Ferrymead Historic Park (including vintage radio exhibit), meal/movie evening at seaside Summer, followed by midnight Special DX. Sunday 10: Panel Discussion with guest speakers, picnic lunch at Akaroa, more DX. Monday 11: Official Farewell timed for 10.30am.

Apologies were received from Stan Larking, Bob Harman and Jim Selby. Branch comments on the planned change of the Magazine Committee will be sent to the National Secretary and Magcom. After a couple of rather noisy months, the atmospherics are down and the DX is starting to come in again with a vengeance. Evening reception from Europe is no longer a rare occurence, and it seems like the Latins now have a year-round reception pattern, rather than March-September of past years. North America is coming through in strength and morning Asians and Europeans are available: Highlights include Southland reception of Caribbean Radio Lighthouse and Radio Jumbo, both opening at 1000 GMT; more Indonesians being heard, KTNQ 1020 (new call for KGBS) being widely heard; first NZ reception of KKAA South Dakota on 1560; Radio Centro, Madrid and Albania 1394 being 'looped' here in Wellington.

A newspaper report reproduced in InCA's "DX Monitor" states that a bill before the Mexican Congress will sharply restrict the playing of foreign music on Mexican Radio stations. Under the proposed measure, 90% of all music broadcast on Mexican stations would have to be Mexican. This raises the question of whether XEROK, XETRA, XERF and other XE's with English programming will be adversely affected?

Duncan Watson in the Bay of Plenty writes: "During the holidays I have been busy on a 40" Loop. When finished, it resonated from 560kHz to way over 1500, and required 15pf in parallel with the 365pf condensor to resonate on the MW band proper. When used with a simple booster it has far greater pick-up than my 100' longwire, and is far less susceptible to static pick-up.(I couldn't pick up Fiji 560 on my longwire due to the static) The loop aerial was certain -ly worth making". If you aren't using a loop, why not try one? All your Ed's DX is done on an unamplified model, along the lines of the design which all new members receive a brochure on in their New Members Kit.

NBC's News and Information Network (a la KFBK 1530kHz) stays on air till 30 June 1977, when it will be disbanded. Info per IRCA. This updates last month.

Harry Weatherley visited Rossmoyne Park near Melbourne, the site of the 11th Australian National Scout Jamboree, to pick up a SI for the temporary station 3JR which was operated by the scouts on 1550kHz. A 10 watt transmitter was used and the entire mobile studio facilities were loaned by 3DB for the event. The Station Manager indicated that it was unlikely that future jamborees will be permitted to operate a MW statio, so Harry greatly values his verification.

There's plenty of interesting NZ broadcasting news elsewhere in this issue, but a couple of extra items just in from David Ricquish. Along with the Gospel Radio Fellowship and Radio Manukau(Auckland), an application for a commercial AM station in Christchurch has been lodged by Canterbury Broadcasting Company. A 'good music' sound and 'responsible news' is the planned format. An FM licence is also sought. The BCNZ is investigating the possibility of a low power AM repeater for the Whataroa area of South Westland, to improve reception. Needless to say, finance is the main problem.

A spate of short-term broadcasting warrants have been approved by the Minister of Broadcasting under the terms of the 1973 Broadcasting Act. In some cases, we have little information, but here goes...for those who missed 3XF RADIO FERRYMEAD 1030 last February, this station in the vintage radio exhibit at Ferrymead Historic Park, Christchurch will be on-air 12-13 March, again on 1030kHz. The address for reports is c/- Radio Avon, P.O.Box 1290, Christchurch. 4 University stations will be on air this month, 2 for the first time. 1XB 950kHz is licenced to broadcast 21 February-12 March. Address c/- Auckland University Students Association, Private Bag, Auckland. 1XC WAIKATO UNIVER-SITY 1450kHz is licenced 28 February-13 March. No other details to hand. RADIO U 1230kHz Canterbury University Student Union Bldg, Private Bag, ChCh is licenced 24 February (DR says 21/2) -5 March. Finally we have 2XA RADIO ACTIVE c/- Victoria University Students Association, Private Bag, Wellington on 1260kHz. 2XA will operate 21 February-9 March 7am-9am, 12 noon-2pm and 7pm-10pm weekdays. Weekend sked is 7pm-10pm. All stations have a maximum permitted output of 100w. In all cases, return postage with reports is a must. PS: 1XB RADIO BOSOM hours 4pm-11pm weekdays.6pm-12pm Sat.



Ray Crawford DWWW 620 letter/verie from Johnny R. Alavazo, Radio Engineering Director of Kanlaon Broadcasting System. Power is 50,000 watts with shunt-feed type non-directional antenna. They also operate DXXX 1010 with 100kw. The very friendly letter concluded: "If it will not be a burden on your part, may we encourage you to monitor us more at your most convenient time on 1010 and 620kHz. We would like to find out what time when our stations are penetrating your country clearly. If you could set a time, we would like to make some dedicated programs to you and your friends there at NZ".

Robin Chambers DZSA 1230 broadcasts entirely in Philippino. Address is Radyo DZSA, Delta Broadcasting System, 5th Floor, Republic Supermarket Bldg, Florentino Torres Street, Santa Cruz, Manila 2805. Excerpts from a verie letter from Raul N. Choa, General Manager: "We appreciate very much your tuning into Radio DZSA. We never thought that a foreigner would pay close attention to our all-Filipino format, with your limited knowledge of the Philippino language. DZSA started the all-Filipino fomat only this January 1976, to boost up nationalism and Filinisation in broadcasting. After 3 months of operations we ran away with the 9th place in all Metro Manila radio stations' rating record. Tremendous response from our listeners gave us more courage to penetrate this field which most radio stations here in the Philippines dare not to explore, that of using the Filipino language, music and arts to convey our message. The program that you happened to listen to was one of our public affairs programs entitled 'Isang Sulyap' (A glance at ...). This program, which runs horizontally from Monday thru Friday, gives information about the history of the Philippines, historical calendar, culture of the early Filipinos (Negritoes, Malays & Indonesians) and on-the-spot interviews with government officials concerning listeners' problems and relevant events of the day. The program also has an editorial section in which the announcer comments on everyday Dene Lynneberg life."

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO RADIO MILLÓN?

In the April, May, July and August 1976 'Broadcast DX' column, we featured news of a new Costa Rican station, Radio Millón, which would have an output of one million watts! Since then we've heard nothing of this operation until NRC/IRCA member Ron Schatz, who was consulting engineer to the project, brought us up to date via the 18/10 issue of NRC's DX News. Extracts from his report....

"This is the story of the biggest hot potato in broadcast history, and of a US corporation struggling in quicksand trying to get rid of it. The original million watt Costa Rican station was built by Continental Electronics Inc. for a chap named Windsor on behalf of the Christian Broadcasting Network. Due to tremendous hemisphere-wide opposition to such an operation, CBN abandoned the project, leaving Continental's parent company, E Systems, to repossess the facilities. Since that time, E Systems has sought desperately to sell the station to various government and religious broadcasters, but without success. It was finally decided that E Systems itself would operate the station as a commercial enterprise in an effort to get a return on it's original investment.

Since the frequency of 625kHz was subsequently assigned to a different station (TIXE Radio Omega) during the megawatter's lengthy silent period, a new frequency had to be found for it's reincarnation. My choice of 1560kHz was accepted. But before anything else could proceed, the station had to be placed on the air for 'observation' and that was the purpose of the historical 8 March 1976 DX Test. The two 500kw parallel Doherty amplifiers were not at their peak during the test, and the transmitter ran at only 80% efficiency with 50% modulation; the transmission line was blamed. Still, the test got out, and reports arrived from Lima, Peru and Western Canada, and all areas in between. A subsequently scheduled series of tests for 27-29 March never made it due to modulator problems; nontheless, my report to Continental apparently pleased them so much that frequency conversion.

The massive and costly conversion included all aspects of rebuilding the transmitter for operation on 1560kHz, including component replacement, tower moving, and parasitic hunting and elimination. New studios were built in San José and linked by FM to the transmitter in Paraiso, this mainly to protect employees from RF radiation and to shorten commuting distance. Future management of the station was organised into Radio Millón S.A., into the hands of Costa Ricans.

Now it turns out that the US Government got wind of Millón's revival, and they don't like it. It would take only a simple protest from the USA to the Government of Costa Rica to keep the station off the air, and that may have been what happened. At any rate, Radio Millón has been described as presently being in a 'holding pattern' as E Systems tries to find a way out of this mess. The station is possibly a critical factor in the FCC's critical decision on the question of 'super-power'. (Proposals to allow powers of up to 750kw for US BCB stations currently under consideration. Ed)

- +1XI Radio I has a frequency change to 1330 planned, but the latest date for this to take place is in May 1977. John Allchin
- +Synchronisation of Northland area stations is expected before the middle of of the year, possibly around March/April: 1YK 1010 will move to 830, in synchro with 1YX already on that frequency. 1ZK 1440 and 1ZN 970 will later synchronise on the vacated frequency of 1010. This will be followed by 1YE 1050 moving to 970. Finally, 2ZP New Plymouth will move from 1370 to 1050. No room for the planned feature articles this time, but a few brief items on hand: 3RMT-FM operated by the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology is on air from 7 February, advises Ash Nallawalla. 7CAE-FM 92.1mHz began tests last December and will begin regular stereo broadcasts in February, using an ex-ABC TV transmitter with an ERP of 500w at horizontal antenna. Dear Mr. Oliver,

Thank you vary much for your letter regarding reception of ABC-FM in New Zealend. We've had many varied reports of reception since we commenced operation in January. However, your report is the first international one we have received.

ABC-FM originates in Adelaids and is relayed and broadcast in Molbourns on 105.7 magahertz; Cenberra on 101.9 magahertz, and in Sydney on 92.9 magahertz. The Adelaids frequency is 92.1 magahertz. All transmitters have an effective radiated power of 50 kilowatts with the exception of Adelaido where it is 10 kilowatts.

The information you give corresponds to our program records. The program was "Streight Down The Middle", our daily middle-of-tho-road music segment. The network has a basically classical music format with folk, jazz, rock and features playing an important role.

I am afraid I can't supply a QSL card as the ones we have svailable are hopelessly out of date as in fact they still show stations operating in New Guinea. However, I would think you were listening to our Sydney transmitter.

Once again many thanks and find enclosed some information about the network.

BBC/DW CARIBBEAN RELAY UPDATE

Deutsche Welle's first 250kw transmitter at Antigua was inaugurated on the first of November 1976, and the second was due on air at the beginning of February 1977. 'Hallo Friends'

The 1976 DW Handbook refers to a 50kw transmitter being built on the island of Montserrat, and says it will be used by both BBC and DW. In a letter, BBC advise that the Montserrat site will be used for a 'shortrange service'.
