# LEAGUE A.G.M.

The League's 29th Annual General Meeting will be hosted once again by North Otago Branch, and held on Saturday 15 October 1977. # TWR GUAM ON AIR

Yes, TWR Guam are on regular shortwave broadcasts at last. Test programmes in the evening period began on Sunday 4 September. Those DXers lucky enough to catch KTWR that day and report on reception, will receive suitably endorsed 'first day of broadcasting' QSLs. Frequency Coordinator David Fisher writes that only one transmitter was in use most of the first two days, but by 6th September 98% of the evening schedule was being met. This was the first day on which programmes were beamed on the southern azimuth, to Indonesia 1015-1100 GMT on 11705kHz. David suggests that this will be the most favourable transmission for NZ. The 4 September-5 November schedule is as follows: 0900-0930 English, 0930-1000 Japanese, 1000-1100 English, all on 11780kHz to Japan. 1015-1100 in English to Indonesia on 11705kHz. 1100-1130 in Cantonese, 1130-1300 Mandarin to Southern China on 9640 and 11705kHz. 1300-1330 Vietnamese, 1330-1400 Labtian, 1400-1500 Cambodian, all to S.E.Asia on 9670 & 11705. Morning transmissions are expected to begin on 24 September, according to the following schedule: 2100-2200, 0000-0100, both in Russian to Asiatic USSR on 15155kHz. 2200-2300 in Japanese to Japan on 15155. 2300-2400 in Mandarin to China on 15155 and 11705kHz. Indonesian is scheduled 2200-2245 on 15175 or 15155. 0000-0030 Vietnamese to S.E.Asia on 15175 or 15155. 0030-0130 English on 15175 or 15155 to S.E. Asia and India.

Some time periods will be temporarily filled with music and English announcements. Japanese broadcast times were moved to earlier evening time-slots to avoid duplicating the hours of FERC's Japanese programmes.

THREE NEW CLEAR CHANNELS: 1ST RECEPTION OF NEW BROADCAST COUNTRY BY MEMBERS.

Keep your ears open - it's all been happening! To summarise - on 7/8 1ZK Kaitaia moved from 1440 to 1010, the latter frequency having been vacated by 1YK moving to 830 in synchronisation with 1YX Whangarei, 24 hours. The reason for 1ZKs move to 1010 was reportedly due to overseas stations causing interference on 1440: On 21/8 1ZN Whangarei moved from 970 to synchronise with 1ZK on 1010. A week later, 1YE Kaikohe moved from 1050 to 970, 24 hours. So, we now have 1ZN/ZK synchro on 1010, 1YX/YK synchro on 830, and clear channeld 1440 & 1050. Some DXers were lucky enough to catch 12K solo on 1010, but such may be a rare opportunity in future.

Finally, at 1200 GMT on 27/8, 1XI Radio I closed down on 1590, and some 21hrs later resumed on the new frequency of 1330. Format is now 'Beautiful Music' and talkback. Their move to new spacious studios is imminent. Once again Radio Hauraki is playing old jingles advertising 'top of the dial'. Remember when ...

Two further frequency changes are afoot. 2ZP New Plymouth is due to go to 1050 from 1370 in mid-December, while 12B 1070 may make an early move to 1080, its allocated frequency in the 9kHz Plan to be effected in November 1978. During August, both Victoria University and Auckland University broadcast under short-term warrants. 1XB Radio B 950kHz 100w was on-air 14/8 to 20/8. 2XA Radio active 1260kHz in Wellington has received reports from as far afield as Tauranga and a ship in Foveaux Strait! They were also apparently heard in Melbourne! A Federation of Student Broadcasters has been set up in Wellington, composed of the student stations in Auckland, Hamilton, Wellington and Christchurch. They will seek more permanent licences to broadcast throughout the University year. John Allchin, Gary Lewis & BC

The first of the latest batch of broadcast warrant applications, Gordon Dryden's Radio Manukau, was stalled by legal technicalities introduced by some opposing groups, but the hearing should be underway again by now. Meanwhile, a company led by Aucklander Colin Lehmann has been formed to launch Radio Rainbow in Rotorua. They hope to apply for a private radio warrant later this year. In line with their application for a network of stations in South Canterbury, Radio Avon carried out field tests with 1kw and 10,000 cycle tone on 1360kHz from Ashburton on 7-9 August 2200-2300 GMT, according to Ron Killick in Tune In. Watch for future tests from Timaru and Oamaru on 1360.

The non-profit, non-commercial station being promoted by the Wanganui Broadcasting Association has moved closer to reality with the groups incorporation. The callsign 2XR (R for recreational) has been allocated for the venture, and a power of 30 to 100 watts proposed. \$10,500 will be needed to get on air, with annual operating costs between \$2000 and \$5000. Programmes of general cultural, educational and religious significance would be aired 3 or 4 evenings per week, between 7.30 and 10.30pm. Phil Brooks

On 30/9 1XX Radio Whakatane's transmitter will be relocated by the airport, where it will provide for better reception to the Bay of Plenty area.D. Watson

Highlights were FR3 Mayotte (the island in the Comores Group which elected to remain French, when the rest became independent), Sao Tome, Mauritania and Andorra 818. SABC have permanently rescinded their plans to leave MW altogether, so there's still hope for us Kiwis to hear South Africa on the broadcast band again, hi!

Late October sees daylight saving and economic cutbacks in TV hours. so let us see a compensating increase in your DX. Yank reception is improving!

SENIOR: -RAY CRAWFORD, Invercargil Below are the projected frequencies for NZ medium wave stations, to take effect on 23 November 1978, received via David Ricquish. Frequencies have 9kHz separation, and will be common to Europe, Africa, Asia and Australasia. The Americas will remain with 10kHz separation between frequencies, so there'll certainly be some interesting DX from that area, although our chances for Europe and Asia will be diminished. Currently we have 47 totally clear channels in NZ. Given the same station numbers under the 9kHz plan, there will be 51 "American" frequencies which are 5kHz or more away from an occupied NZ frequency. Yank 'graveyard' channel 1450 will be lost to us, but we will gain 1400kHz. 1230 remains clear but 1490 will be 'wedged between Twizel on 1485 and Taupo 1494. So to the list...

Wellington tasted FM Stereo on 26-27 August, when a pirate FM transmitter, with output believed to be 30 watts, broadcast on 91.5mHz from a location traced to the vicinity of Victoria University by Post Office staff. "Radio Auckland" was manned by four Auckland University students, in the capital for the National Arts Festival, and reputed to have made occ-



asional FM broadcasts in Auckland since 1975. Most of the programmes were tapes used during a Capping Week stunt in Auckland earlier this year. The venture was aimed at showing the public the virtues of FM radio.

Bryan Clark reports being 'sold' with FM stereo, having excellent reception of the broadcasts on Saturday 27/8 from 10.54am tune in, until hurried sign-off at 12.29pm, as the Post Office moved into the Victoria University area with detector equipment. Good signals were also experienced through a small bedside clock radio, equipped with only 6 inches of wire for an aerial:

John Allchin reports that an experimental stereo FM radio broadcasting system may be set up in Auckland. This is the aim of a recently formed federation of enthusiasts, who plan to obtain an experimental transmission licence from the Post Office. Convenor Mr C.J.Wright has said that the test transmission would help gauge public reaction to FM, as well as identifying any problems associated with this type of radio system.

Further evidence that there will be a growing campaign to introduce FM broadcasting in NZ comes from the formation of the Federation of Student Broadcasters. This was one of the 'planks' in their initial press release following formation in Wellington during August.

India is the latest country to introduce FM broadcasting. On 23/7 transmission on 107.1mHz from Madras was inaugurated. Initially there are 2 hours of broadcasting daily, with a coverage of 100km. Transmitters are also being installed at Delhi, Calcutta and Bombay.

DXD via Ash Nallawalla

Kazunori Ushigome of Tokyo is one of Japan's premier TV DXers, having received both Chinese and Russian TV on channel R1 (49.75/56.25mHz). He dreams of tuning TV stations from Australia/NZ and comments that Japanese radio amateurs using 6 metres have often received sound transmissions from Australian TV (ch 0.Ed)

### HOW TO TAKE PICTURES FOR TV-DX Part I

Now that summer is coming around again, it's time to take out that camera and have it handy to the TV for that exciting TV-DX. Here are some suggestions on how to take photographs of the Screen. When you send off your DX report, a photo may give valuable and definite proof of your reception.

You will get the best quality in your photographs when you adjust your set so that the contrast is slightly below

normal, but set the brightness control so that the highlights and shadow show up details. Move in close so that your viewfinder is filled with the TV picture. If your TV is a small portable, it may be necessary to get a close-up attachment to fit your camera. To centre the TV screen onto your film, tip the camera slightly in the direction of the viewfinder, or you may not get the whole picture. This doesnt apply to single lens reflex cameras of course.

You will need a tripod if you use shutter speeds of less than 1/30th sec, or at least a solid object on which to rest the camera. If you don't, you will get camera shake and a picture which is both blurred or out of focus. Watch for reflections on the face of the TV screen. To help stop these, turn off lights near the set and close curtains/blinds.

+ No wonder the SWL/DX hobby is big in Japan. Known as 'BCL' (broadcast listening), the hobby is being activ-

ely promoted by the major manufacturers, who are now bringing out transistor receivers with LED digital frequency counter displays. The following details are based on advertisements appearing in recent issues of the Japan SW Club's "DX Guide" and will give an idea of the various equipment currently available in that country, with local prices (based on 260 yen = NZ\$1). No doubt the SWL hobby worldwide will soon benefit from some of the exciting sets featured. NATIONAL's RF2200 or DR22 (see July Times) sells for \$134

in Japan, but now has an exciting big brother, the RF2800 'Proceed' at \$192. This set has LED digital frequency display, giving visual readout to the nearest 1kHz. 'Proceed' is the name given to what appears to be a communications receiver version of the RF2800, again with LED frequency readout. This is the National RJX-4800 at \$384 in Japan. The RD9810 Antenna Coupler Unit is available as a companion for the DR22 at NZ\$26. Rangewise and pricewise, National appear to have much to offer the BCL. SONY is currently promoting it's World Zone 33 CRF-330K at \$1615 with everything that opens and shuts! There are 29 SW bands, 2 for FM, MW and LW, LED digital display of SW frequencies, a quartz digital clock, built-in cassette recorder and time clock enabling remote recording. The C7-5950 Skysensor at \$218 also features a built-in cassette machine. Their best-seller is the little IC 5900 which sells at \$107 - see below for more details of this. YAESU's FRG7

Finally, DRAKE's SSR1 sells in Japan for NZ\$267. +FRG7 owners should note that the mHz lock-light must clearly go out and not merely dim. Ash Nallawalla reports that his worked only on the middle bands, and would not even dim on the others. The fault was promptly put right by Radio Engineering Ltd under the warranty agreement. Rumour has it that an LED readout version of the FRG7 is planned for 1978. Des Davey advises that Yaesu are marketing headphones, YH-55, for the FRG7.

+Jack Searle has been vacationing in Fiji and reports that there's really nothing on sale in the radio line that would appeal to the DXer. They hadn't even heard of the National DR22: So if you're planning a holiday up that way, it would be advisable to see what the NZ Duty Free shops have to offer. Miles and Carlaw in Auckland still have the DR22 (See July Times), but price is now up to A\$144. The duty free regulations are a little more favourable now - we hope to have details of these in a future issue. +As indicated above, the DR22 has a big-brother. Our regular Japanese contrib-

utor Masami Onizawa writes: "In mid-May, National Panasonic brought out a new portable receiver, the RF-2800 with a digital readout system down to 1kHz. It has 28 transistors, 3 FETs, 5 ICs, and is smart in appearance. Dimensions 7 381mm long, 258mm high and 143mm deep. Weight is 3.9kg, which includes 6 D size batteries. AC mains power is also available. Features are: Frequency Range: MW (525-1605kHz), SW (3.2-30.0mHz in 3 bands) and FM (76-90mHz). IFs are 2.0mHz (first), 455kHz (second) and 10.7mHz (for FM). Sensit-ivity is given as MW 14uv max, SW1 0.5uv max(3.2-8.0mHz),SW2 1.0uv(-16mHz) SW3 1.8uv(-30mHz) and FM 2.5uv. Image rejection is quoted as MW 38db at 1500 kHz, SW 32db at 6mHz, 24db at 12mHz, 23db at 24mHz, FM 32db at 89mHz. Selectivity is given as: Wide +2kHz (-6db), +13kHz (-60db); Narrow ±1kHz (-6db), ±9kHz(-60 db). From 3.2 to 30.0mHz, one can read the frequency down to 1kHz. On MW however the digital displayer indicates frequency 455kHz, so this must be subtracted if the



**EQUIPMENT** REVIEW the display is being used to determine frequency. This continued...... is the only problem with the receiver. (There is a conventional dial for all bands as well.Ed). Overall performance is very good. I think that the RF-2800 will be available in NZ soon, and it will catch the eye of League members. Cost here in Japan is 49,800 yen, about 166 US dollars, and cheaper than the Yaesu FRG7."

+ SONY ICF5900W. Arthur Williams recently obtained one of these novel receivers in London, and comments as follows: "It is a 5 band (MW, FM & 3SW) dual conversion (SW) portable of compact weight (2.2kg!) and size (23 x 23 x 10cm). This receiver uses a bandspread tuning system to give a readout accuracy of 5kHz on SW. The 3 SW bands are spread (by means of a special tuning capacitor) equally across the dial, and are divided into 250kHz segments. The main dial is set to one of these marks by means of a crystal marker built-in. The desired frequency is then tuned in on the bandspread dial. The band coverages are 1: 3.9-10.0mHz, 2: 11.7-20.0mHz, 3: 20.0-28.0mHz. To tune to, for example, 15220kHz, the main dial is set to 15250 with the crystal marker, and then the bandspread dial is tuned to 220. The tuning accuracy is very good, comparable if not better than the Barlow Wadley. Selectivity could be a little better on SW, sensitivity is comparable with the B-W. There is good sensitivity on MW and the set works well with a MW loop aerial, but tends to overload on a longwire. There is no RF stage. Besides the above-mentioned features, the ICF5900 has base & treble tone controls, dial light, DX-Local or FM-AFC, and BFO. I think it is an ideal set for the itinerant SW listener giving accurate SW tuning in a compact package."

+HELP WANTED Steve Clearwater, 7c Welbourn Terrace, New Plymouth writes that he recently purchased a Drake SSR1 communications receiver. Initially he suffered bad image problems on the lower bands. Not only were the harmonics of local 221 1370 heard strongly, but the station was also audible at reduced strength all through the low shortwave bands 120, 90, 75 and 60 metres. Steve solved this problem by constructing a simple wavetrap out of an old aerial coil and 365pf variable capacitor - this was connected in series with the aerial and simply tuned to 1370kHz to completely solve the image problem. He continues: "Unfortunately another problem has arisen and I fear it may be more difficult to fix. I am finding that signals from such stations as Radio Australia and Radio Nederland in particular are so strong that they are tending to obliterate about 20 to 50kHz either side of their frequency on some nights. The problem occurs only on the higher SW bands - mainly 9 and 11mHz, and although it doesn't happen every night, it is fairly regular. Otherwise, the receiver is performing very well, especially on the tropical bands." SW Mailbag Editor Tony Marr comments that he has already observed this shortcoming in another SSR1. The receiver's "front-end" is unable to discriminate against a strong signal, and in cross modulation the strong signal tends to 'swamp' all those around it. The Local/DX switch does not seem sufficiently effective, so some form of improved attenuator in the front-end might be worthwhile. There is a need to drastically improve front-end selectivity but not sensitivity, so a preselector with no gain might be the answer. Can any SSRT owners provide a working solution for Steve?

Southland Branch members Neville Henry and Arthur Williams are presently touring Europe. From Arthur comes the following report on their progress: "We are now in Passau, Bavaria, West Germany, on the sixth week of our European tour, having left the UK on 11 July. First stop was in Brussells, where we met League member Peter Pompe and his wife and family. Two days were spent in the Belgian capital, and we had an interesting time with Peter discussing DX topics and scanning the band. Peter has a good line-up of receivers, including a Drake SPR4, Collins R390A and Hammarlund HQ180A, the latter his favourite on MW. He lives in the Brussells suburb of Krainem, where there is not too much local TVI and QRM.

Next stop was Luxembourg. We visited Radio Luxembourg but were unable to look around their facilities. In Paris we visited the 'Maison de la Radio', a large circular building and HQ for Radio France International and Telediffusion de France. We were taken on a visitors tour of the studios and Radio Museum. The latter was a most interesting display, showing the development of TV and radio broadcasting from the first experiments of Hertz and Marconi. From Paris we travelled down to Spain for a brief visit. Radio San Sebastian and Radio Panplona were logged before passing back across the border into Andorra.

We paid a visit to the studios of Radio Andorra in the town of Andorra-la-Vielle. Unfortunately, being a Sunday, there were no staff on hand to show us around, but the main foyer was open and we could see the DJ on duty through a glass screen. The foyer had photographs of the station's racilities and staff, and a collection of old transmitting valves. A note beside a photo of the transmitting site indicated that visitors were permitted, so we set out to find it. Just a few kilometres along the road we found the transmitter building, a quaint stone construction in Andorran style with a round tower on one corner.

A technician on duty was able to show us over the plant. Their MW transmitter is a 300kw Brown Boveri with an ancient 1936 transmitter of 160kw for standby. The 25kw shortwave transmitter is of American manufacture. The 3 tubes of the 300kw unit are water cooled, with the water then being used to heat an outdoor swimming pool for the staff who live at the station. The main MW antenna is located atop a hill, at a height of 2000m above sea level, and is fed by a 1000 metre feeder line. A lake beside the masts provides an earth system. The antenna itself is a vertical, supported between 2 masts 127m high. A Franklin antenna for shortwave is located adjacent to the transmitter building. We had a bit of fun conversing, as the technician spoke only a little English. Fortunately I was able to speak a little French, so we managed to communicate! Radio Andorra broadcasts in French and Spanish, as well as the local Catalan dialect. From Andorra, we passed back through France to Switzerland, where we visited SEC in Berne. We were shown over the studios by Walter Fonkhauser, President of the Shortwave Service and by the Chief of the Line Radio Service. SEC broadcasts programmes in half-hour language segments. Their aim is to tell the World about the Swiss way of life, and provide an unbiased, unpolitically orientated news

service. They are interested in reception reports which give constructive criticism of their programmes. The Line Radio Service provided by SBC is rather like 'piped music'. Six channels of programmes are provided via telephone lines. By use of special filters the normal phome

lines are used, avoiding the need for additional

circuits.

After Switzerland it was down to Italy, then up through Yugoslavia to Vienna, on to Innsbruck, to Munich and now Passau, where we are guests of League member Gunter Jacob and his wife Hannelore. From here, we hope to move on to Prague, North Germany, Holland and Scandinavia."

Broadcasts from Santiago on 9 and 15mHz have been identifying as "The Voice of Free Chile". Other frequency changes reported include Turkey on 11mHz and KGEI back on 49 metres.


Nigeria: Lagos on 11770 has been heard opening at 0555 with a programme summary and news at 0600. Some jamming on the frequency.
