13 METRES BOOMING!

Since the new international broadcast schedules commenced on 25 October a lot of new frequencies have been activated on the 21 mHz band, taking advantage of the increased sunspot count. First time users of this band include Spain and Iran.

AUSTRALIA 21740 Radio Australia Shepparton opens at 2100. Strong signals till closing at 0200 and then continues on alternate frequency 21725 until 0900 close.

AUSTRIA 21765 Radio Austria International 0800 Oct 25 new frequency opening in German. English for Australasia carried at 0830 and 0930. Signal improving to very good.

COSTA RICA 21460 Radio for Peace International heard with Glenn Hauser's 'Continent of Media' Saturdays at 0130.

CHILE 21550 Voz Cristiana now regular with Spanish gospel programming from 1800 fade in till closing at various times between 0030 and 0100.

CYPRUS 21470 BBC East Mediterranean Relay with 250kw here since Oct 25 from 0900 in Somali language. Opens with Big Ben chimes and closes abruptly 0914 UTC. Thanks to ILG and Hans van den Boogert of DSWCI for confirmation of site.

CZECH REPUBLIC 21745 Radio Prague, the External Service of Czech Radio new frequency opens 0930 in Czech Oct 25. 0959 multi-language identification followed at 1000 by English news. Strong signal.

ECUADOR 21455 USB HCJB Quito audible all local day, eg 1830 and after 0830.

Mainly English programming. 'DX Partyline' heard at 0110 Sunday. 21470 is also in use—noted with Andean music 1834.

FINLAND 21670 Radio Finland 0700 Oct 25 new frequency for Winter Schedule, opening in Finnish. English carried 0730 till abrupt closure 0753. Strong signal.

FRANCE 21580 Radio France International regular in French from 0830. Parallel 21620 opens at 0900.

GERMANY 21695 Deutsche Welle opens in English to Africa at 0600, good signal. Also heard on 21585. Both closed 0650. 21640 also opens 0600 in German. 21560 opens strongly in German at 0800 with 21640 in parallel.

IRAN 21770 Teheran signs on in French 0630 with "Ici Tehran..." // 15260. Quran from 0632. Also heard in German at 0825 recheck. Hrd Oct 31. 1st time on 13 metres?

ITALY 21520 RAI Rome here regularly in Italian from 0600 past 0900. Not as strong as other European signals.

ISRAEL 21620 Kol Israel opening in English 0500 with news and weather. Very good. Off abruptly 0515. New frequency, first noted Nov 1.

JAPAN 21670 NHK World Radio Japan opens in English 0100. From 0200 fre-

PORTUGAL 21655 RDP Lisbon 0834 Oct 31 very good in Portuguese, with spurs on 21675 (good strength) and 21635 (poor). 21655 is also audible here in in our daytime period, noted 1805 Oct 31 past 0035 Nov 1, when only signals from the Americas and Australasia are usually audible on 13 metres. 21515 also noted in parallel 1800 — possibly weekends only.

RUSSIA 21790 Voice of Russia World Service opens strongly in English 0600. Frequency closes 0900.

SAUDI ARABIA 21495 BSKSA opening 0846 Oct 25 (0850 a few days later) with Holy Quran Service. At 0900 full Arabic ident with frequencies. Good signal past 1000. // frequency 17880 a better channel.

SINGAPORE 21715 BBC Far Eastern Relay, English by Radio Oct 25 using this new frequency 0300-0330 UTC. Fair signal. Mandarin and English from 0315.. 250kw. Thanks to ILG and Hans van den Boogert for confirmation of site.

SLOVAKIA 21705 Radio Slovakia International, Bratislava in English 0700 // 11990.

SPAIN 21570 Radio Exterior de Espana
Oct 25, 0900 signing on in Spanish with
strong signal, possibly first time REE has used
13 metres? // frequency of 21610 opens at
0930 UTC. Latter also noted closing in Arabic at 1856 UTC. 21700 another new frequency hrd Nov 1, with closing annots in Spanish 1755, strong signals.

tween 0500 and 0600. Strong clear signals. 21660 BBC World Service Relay opens at 0300.

TURKEY 21715 Voice of Turkey since Oct 25 is using this frequency for English 0400-0450 UTC to East Asia & Australia. Also announces 6010 & 9655 to Europe & North America, 7240 to East Africa, but none of these // frequencies audible. At 0500, 21715 resumes in Turkish and is audible in NZL past 1000 UTC. New second 13m frequency 21500 is used by VOT between 0500 and 0750 UTC.

UKRAINE 21510 Radio Ukraine 0931 Oct 30 strong in Russian-type language, presumably Ukrainian. First time I've logged Radio Ukraine on 13 metres. Ident 1000. // frequency of 13590 weakly heard. Also audible Oct 31 signing on 0700 with interval signal and ident in Ukrainian. // 13590 good at this earlier time.

UNITED ARAB EMIRATES 21700 UAE Radio Dubai with Arabic & English identifications, then into English news. Gone at 0552 recheck. 21605 in Arabic noted from 0700 when // to 15395. 21735 and 21630 carry Voice of the UAE from Abu Dhabi in Arabic opening at 0200.

UNITED KINGDOM 21550 Merlin Network One testing here morning and evening. Regular promos as "the future of broadcasting". Heard in the clear at 0847 with rock music and also at 1756 when mixed with Voz Cristiana Chile.

USA 21485 VOA Portuguese Service via Greenville NC good with closing announcements at 1757 UTC. 21725 WYFR Family Radio strong in French 1759 with ident and gospel prgms. WYFR also audible at this time on 21525.

VATICAN STATE 21850 Vatican Radio 0957 Oct 26 signing on with powerhouse signal for Brazil in Portuguese.

Shortwave Report

with Matt Francis in Canberra

Welcome to the new broadcasting season, now known as 'B98'. Plenty of news this month to keep us all busy!

ALBANIA: TWR via Cerrik, in English: Fri 0745-0935 9685; Sat 0745-0950 9685; Sun-Thu 0745-0920 9685. (TWR)

AUSTRIA: ORF schedule to Australasia: 17615 0800-1100, 21765 0800-1100 with English at 0930 (Francis/ORF)

BELGIUM: Radio Vlaanderen International, in English: 0830-0856 9925, 9940; 1130-1156 9925, 13745; 1730-1756 5910, 9925, 12080 (Julich); 1830-1856 13745; 2230-2256 13670 (Bonaire) Note that RVI has a new address - RVI, 1043 Brussels. (Francis/RVI)

BULGARIA: Radio Bulgaria schedule for English: 0000-1000 5865, 9415; 0300-0400 7375, 9485; 1200-1300 15700, 17500; 2000-2100 5850, 7535; 2200-2300 7535, 7545 (Station)

CHINA: Deutsche Welle, via Kunming: according to B98 schedule English 0900-0950 15105, 2300-2350 15360; Indonesian 2200-2250 9630. Haven't heard a peep on 15105 at 0900 and haven't checked other times (Francis)

COSTA RICA: Within the next few months, exact date not set, AWR will discontinue SW from Cahuita, and move all SWBC to the Dominican Republic. Will continue producing programs at Alajuela for their satellite network (Allen Graham, HCJB DX Partyline, Oct 11 after a visit to Costa Rica in late September, via Review of International Broadcasting, Glenn Hauser's Shortwave/DX Report 98-45)

FRANCE: Budget cuts and growth in use of other mediums such as satellite, local FM relays and internet have led RFI to cut its SW airtime by 30% from 25 October. Mostly affected are broadcasts in French, via Issoudun and French Guiana (Francis/RFI)

GERMANY: Radio Asia Canada [via Julich-ed.] has disappeared; this should be satisfying to our reporter Ernie Behr, who first exposed their connections to the the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Elam, considered a terrorist organisation in Sri Lanka. In UADX via BC-DX, Victor Goonetilleke, a Sinhalese, says "Finally the LTTE showed its head in their program. We were about to expose them to the German government." Harold Sellers, Toronto, hard-coredx, also notes that their "frequencies empty, website not connecting, telephone number unanswered." Via hard-core-dx, Paul Ormandy, NZ, says RAC was last heard on 15245 around the end of September. (Glenn Hauser, World of Radio 961)

-Sunrise Radio via Julich using new 6110 from 0700-1859 (replacing 5850-ed.) (Deutsche Telekom, via BC-DX 387)

-Croatian Radio via Julich, for Australia/NZ: 0600-0800 13820 beamed to Wellington; 0800-1000 13820 beamed to Adelaide. (Francis/HRT)

–No sign of UN Radio via Julich per schedule in last month's column, although a new schedule has been published for B98. (Francis)

GREECE: Voice of Greece: 0600-0800 9775 (Delano); 0900-0950 9770 (Delano); 2100-2250 9420 (Kavalla). 11645 (Kavalla).

HAWAII: KWHR absent from 11565 in 0700-1600 period since October 29. Joe Brashier at LeSea tells me its due to a transmitter fault and parts had been ordered. As of 4 November still off. (Francis)

HUNGARY: Radio Budapest gets high! New schedule shows use of 25700 from 1100-1200 (to 1300 Sun) for Hungarian to Australia, also on 17670 and 21560. English at 0200-0230 6135, 9835; 0330-0400 9835, 11890; 2000-2030 3975, 6025; 2200-2230 3975, 7250 (Francis/station)

IRAN: Voice of Islamic Republic of Iran heard on new 17560 for English 1100-1230, as well as 11875, 11830, 13605. (Francis)

JAPAN: Changes to NHK World Radio Japan's schedule for English from 25 October: 0100-0200 17685 (x 21610), 0100-0200 15590 (x17810), 0100-0200 15325 (x15590), 0300-0400 21610 (x17685), 0300-0400 17810 (x17855), 0500-0600 15590 (x17810), 0600-0700 15590 (x17810), 1000-1100 15590 (x11730), 1100-1200 15590 (x11730) (NHK)

KUWAIT: Radio Kuwait has added a morning transmission in English 0500-0800 on 15110 (Erik Koie, Denmark, BC-DX 388)

LIBYA: External services now ID as "Voice of Africa" with news in English and French on 15235, 15415, and 15435. Heard in Canberra since 17/10 at good levels in 2030-2100 period. At other times in AA. English has been absent from Libya for many years, and the "Voice of Africa" reflects a shift in diplomatic emphasis by Libya from the Middle East to Africa (Francis)

LITHUANIA: Radio Baltic Waves is a non-profit, non-government broadcasting initiative which ran a test transmission on 4 November on 6235. 10kw transmitter located in northern Lithuania. Plans weekly transmissions in Belorussian for half an hour at 1700, repeated at 1900 and 2100. Later plans to go daily. Motivation behind the station is the poor human rights and press freedom in Belarus. Stig Hartvig Nielsen in 'Hard-Core-DX' reported good reception in Denmark from around 0900. (Various reports)

NETHERLANDS: Radio Netherlands in English: 0430-0525 6165B; 0430-0525 9590B; 0930-1125 9820B, 12065I, 7260P; 1130-1325 6045J, 9855W; 1430-1625 12090M, 15585M, 13755T; 1730-2025 6020M, 9605M; 1830-2025 15315B, 9895F, 11655F; 2330-0125 6165B, 9845B. Sites: B Bonaire, F Flevo, M Madagascar, I Irkutsk, P Petropavlovsk, T Tashkent, W Wertachtal (RNW)

PAPUA NEW GUINEA: NBC Port Moresby reappeared mid October on 4890 and 9675 following absence for several weeks due to transmitter failure - but as I write this at 1030 on November 3rd, has mysteriously disappeared again (Francis). Whoops! 4890 back on again, heard with good signals at 1120 on 7/11. (Francis, via urgent email to Chief Editor)

SAO TOME: VOA relay for English to Africa at new time of 1100-1130 Mon-Fri on 13675,15510, 21705 (Francis/IBB)

SERBIA: Radio Yugoslavia in English to Australia/New Zealand 1330-1400 on 11835 (replacing former 1900 transmission). But who's listening at 12.30 in eastern Australia or 2.30am in NZ? (Francis)

SINGAPORE: SRI via Kranji 9540 1100-1330, 9575 1400-1615 (SRI) Radio Netherlands via Kranji 1130-1325 11690 Indonesian, 2230-2325 6120 Indonesian, 2330-0025 9590 Dutch (RNW)

SOUTH AFRICA: Channel Africa is using new 15215 for English at 0500-0530 and 0600-0630, to West Africa. Also at 0300-0325 9525; 0400-0430 5955; 1300-1455 11900, 17895, 21530; 1500-1530 17870; 1600-1630 6000; 1700-1730 & 1800-1830 17870 (Francis/Sentech)

SPAIN: New schedule for REE in English: 0000-0200 6055, 0500-0556 6055, 1700-1900 15170 (Mon-Fri), 2000-2100 9595 (Mon-Fri), 2000-2100 9680 (Mon-Fri), 2200-2300 9595 (Sat/Sun) (REE)

SWITZERLAND: The SW transmitter site at Lenk closed on 24 October, Lenk was used

for SRI's omnidirectional coverage of Europe on 3985, 6165 and 9535. As a result of Lenk's closure, the transmitter sharing exchange with CRI will end. The China relay will be replaced with more use of the BBC relay at Kranji, Singapore. The only SW transmitter on Swiss soil is at Sottens. The Schwarzenburg site closed earlier this year. (Swisscom, via Paul Ormandy, BC-DX 387) However, SRI continues to use 6165 - via Julich - 0500-0730, 1630-1815 and 1830-2030. Other schedule news: 0830-1030 for Australasia 9885 (Montsinery), 13685 (Sottens); 1100-1330 for Far East/SE Asia 9540 (Kranji), 17815 (Sottens). (SRI)

UNITED KINGDOM: Merlin Network One has commenced 24-hour broadcasts on shortwave and satellite. Frequency usage: 3965 1700-1900, 3985 2300-0600, 6110 0600-0800, 6125 1800-2000, 6185 1600-1800, 7120 2200-2300, 7170 2200-0000, 9560 0000-0300, 9690 1900-2000, 9835 2200-0000, 9895 0300-0600, 9915 0700-1600, 11755 2000-2200, 11985 2000-2200, 13645 1200-1400, 13660 0800-1200, 13680 1400-1600, 13720 0600-0900, 17630 0700-1600, 21550 0700-1900 (MNO) Make sure you get your reception reports in before 27 November as MNO will not issue QSLs after that date until the first anniversary of their full time launch next year. According to CBC Audience Relations in Toronto, the shutdown of 740 has been delayed for at least a few months because they're still not reaching everyone they're supposed to be on FM. Apparently, the signal from CBLA 99.1 Toronto isn't quite as potent as expected, and only one of the two satellite stations originally planned, CBLA-FM-2 89.1 Paris ON, has been built. The other, CBLA-FM-1 90.5 Crystal Beach ON (along Lake Erie just west of Buffalo), was heard testing briefly in August but has not been heard since. (Fybush via email) As at 26 October, CBM Montreal 940 is still on the air. Likewise with CBF Montreal 690. One rumour has CIQC 600 moving to 940 with English local talk, with 600 becoming an all-news station in both English and French operated by sister stations CIQC and French-language CKVL 850. ALASKAN GOODIES We have been notified of a number of opportunities available to DXers from International Radio Station KNLS. On free offer are station pennants, a limited number of copies of CARL MANN's DX booklets "DX Tips for Beginners" and "Radio Propagation for Beginners", and audio cassette copies of a KNLS interview with the director of Alaska's HAARP programme. KNLS also operates a stamp and postcard exchange. They will exchange a maximum of 10 stamps and/or 5 postcards per mailing. All Danish shortwave programming is relayed by transmitters in Norway, and the technicians in Oslo always cut the programme feed from Copenhagen at exactly 55 minutes past the hour.

<u>LOCAL BBC RELAY REPRIEVED</u> Listeners to Auckland's 1476 AM relay of BBC World Service have won a 1 month reprieve, following a personal appeal from a listener to the owners of the frequency and transmitter, Akl International Airport Ltd. The unnamed man sought the extension to broadcasts for a month "to see if he could put some plans together".

And to our own Radio Rhema which began broadcasting 20 years ago in 11 November 1978, the first licenced Christian radio station in the British Commonwealth. Today the Rhema Broadcasting Group has 33 Radio Rhema, 7 Southern Star Network, and 3 Life fm stations covering New Zealand. Also to RISTO VAHAKAINU who has been reconfirmed as Secretary General of the European DX Council through till the year 2000. Risto was a popular participant in the League's 50th Anniversary DX Convention in Oamaru last February.

NOVEL IDEA FIZZES... Some time ago we publicised an initiative by former Radio Canada International personality IAN McFARLAND. 3 years ago, Ian had the idea that both international broadcasters and the SWL community would benefit from his setting up a mailing service to provide selections of SW programme schedules to listeners virtually cost free. Unfortunately the scheme has now closed down because of dwindling interest from broadcasters and a reluctance amongst the 2500 shortwave listening enthusiasts signed up to paying a small subscription fee to cover printing costs for additional schedules.
