Haarping it up in Alaska

The High Frequency Active Auroral Research Program (HAARP) facility in Gakona, Alaska, will conduct a second HAARP Listening Test in mid-March, seeking reports from hams and SWLs in North America. According to Radio Netherland's "Media Network" programme, the transmission schedule will be as follows:

Friday 26 March 1999 - 0800 UTC on 6990kHz; 0820 UTC on approximately 3390kHz. Saturday 27 March 1999 - 0700 UTC on 6990kHz; 0720 UTC on approximately 3390kHz.

HAARP will send a CW message and request signal strength reports. QSLs will be available only for reports mailed to HAARP, PO Box 271, Gakona, Alaska 99586.

The last HAARP Listening Tests were conducted in March 1997 and while there was an expectation that those transmissions would not be audible outside of North America, Bryan Clark in Auckland has a prized QSL. Only after he submitted a tape of his reception were HAARP officials prepared to believe that their signals reached so far.

YOUNG ROYCROFT WINS THROUGH!

Alan Roycroft has been associated with radio in New Zealand, the Pacific Islands and Hawaii for over 60 years. He is now an Honorary Member of both the NZ Radio DX League and the Vintage Radio Society of NZ. In this 3-part feature, originally published in the 'Radio Age', we learn of Alan's earliest days in radio. Part 1 of 3 - Alan Roycroft reminisces on his arrival in NZ in the mid-30s...

"At last the sun came up as we finally sailed into the Auckland harbour - was I ever ready. I had mentally rehearsed every bit of the action that would take place before I laid hands on my beloved wooden packing crate and got it somewhere that its contents could be carefully re-catalogued. First a hurried breakfast, then up on deck at a spot I had planned where there was a clear view of the ship's hold so that a careful eye could be kept on everything that would be lifted out onto the wharf.

Finally, the tarpaulins were whisked off the hold opening, then the battens piled aside on the deck. Oh, why didn't those stevedores get with the crane? My knowledge of the ways of the waterside workers was about to be brought up to date. "Now take it easy boys, there are no other ships due in today, so this one will have to fill our time cards." Dad joined me at my overlook and was amused at my impatience. "My guess is that it will be late afternoon before the Vancouver freight is brought up. Remember all the stuff that was loaded at Honolulu and again at Suva? Well, that has to come out first. Now come along and meet all our friends who have come to the wharf to greet us."

I reluctantly submitted to the kissing and endearments. When one is 15, this tribal custom is particularly distressing, but those aunts and uncles could only do it once. Dad suggested that I accompany him to the Storage Company. STORAGE? "Oh, yes, remember that we do not have a home here in Auckland yet, and we are staying with Grandma for a few weeks until we find a place." WEEKS! My dreams of unpacking the crate faded into oblivion. Well, at least I would have the pleasure of playing my Philips QP radio at Grandma's.

Dad's performance at the customs office was a bellringer. He had brought in an Aston Martin from England, which was parked on the wharf awaiting our return. My brother had a Canadian CCM bicycle, so we had quite a pile to declare as worthless junk. My priceless collection of radio equipment was downplayed so far that no one wanted even to open the crate. All my brother's efforts to scratch the beautiful blue paint on his new bicycle and remove a pedal and bend the seat supports availed him nothing. An obviously new bicycle was a new one in any condition. But boy, did those 'jerks' work over that Aston Martin; they even found the special tools that Dad had hidden under the seats. We were all edgy and tired by the time all the goodies were stowed at the storage shed and we headed for Grandma's.

I took great solace in renewing my love affair with the Philips QP radio. I was to bunk down on the lounge floor, so it took many hours to rig up an electrical extension, antenna, and headphones to my makeshift bunk. The next few days, Mum and Dad left early to go house searching. On the third day, they invited my brother and me to see the results of their efforts. It was right on a beach. It had only two bedrooms, but plans were being drawn up to add a second floor while we occupied the original house. I would be needed to clean up the section and help the carpenters. Sounded OK to me. It was late spring and the beach sounded most inviting.

We piled out of the Aston Martin at our new home. I led the inspection and suddenly discovered that all the lights were gas. GAS! Not even 12 inches of wire in the whole edifice "But Dad, how can we live in this joint?" "Oh, we'll make do until the house rebuild is completed." "But gas! No electricity!" Nothing I could do, say or threaten could change the awful truth. I would have to use my crystal set FOREVER!!

And that is how it went for 6 months. Mum saw that I was not my fully effervescent self after the novelty of swimming, yard work, picking up nails and helping the carpenters had worn thin after a few weeks. So, as the 1935-type of mum, she sat me down and suggested this enforced radio-idleness as a good time to catch up on a lot of theory that I was probably weak on. She hit the target right on, so she drove me up to the largest technical college in town in her bright red supercharged Austin Seven sports car. Mum would have been in her 40s at this time, and no doubt enjoyed the whistles that greeted her every time she went out in her sporty rig with a bandanna tied over her slightly greying hair.

The community college said that their radio courses started in May each year, and no way would they accept applications in between, so there! We next visited a commercial college downtown and met their rather grand principal, who I picked as a semi-destitute phoney. "Oh yes, we can start Alan right away in our radio serviceman's course. Payment in advance please; Room 22 at 6 pm, 3 nights a week. Your instructor is fully experienced and licensed as a radio operator by the Post and Telegraph Department."

In the second instalment of Alan's reminiscences, we will learn of his early radio education in the mid-1930's.

Shortwave Report with Matt Francis in Canberra

Argentina LRA36 Radio Nacional Arcangel San Gabriel. Widely reported in North America and elsewhere during the past month in the 2300-0100 period on 15475 with its new 10kw transmitter, as detailed in last month's 'Shortwave Report'. Good to very good signals observed in the Americas. As of 1 March, the official start date, the schedule was 1800-2100.

Australia Radio Australia has increased its Indonesian broadcasts with a new half hour broadcast at 0800-0830 (1500 local time in Indonesia) on 17750 and 15415 since 8 March. It will provide news updates and information additional to the existing 2130-0000 morning broadcast (on 11695 and 15415). All broadcasts are from the 100 kw transmitters in Shepparton, Victoria. The additional service will be available on Radio Australia's Indonesian language web site which includes news bulletins in text and audio as well as information programs. RA says its strategy of rebroadcasting some programs via local FM stations in cities is proving successful. (Francis)

Belarus Radio Baltic Waves plans to start in May on 612 kHz (40 kW, Vilnius) and // in the 6 MHz band (50 kW or 100 kW, via Sitkunai) (Lithuania-ed.). We will supply you with the frequency and schedule information. (R. Pleikys, RBW Project Coordinator via B. Fransson-SWE for Clandestine Radio Watch 024)

Canada RCI made one frequency change from Sackville, as of Monday Feb. 22: 5935 replaces 5995 at 2200-2259 for English and French half-hours to Europe, using 250 kW on a 60 azimuth. (Westenhaver, Cumbre DX)

*An overview of 49 metre Canadians from Noel Green in the UK, as reported to BCDX 408:

6070 After a tip from Mike Barraclough I found CFRX Toronto audible 0800 when Sweden left 6065 on Feb 16+17. Fair level using LSB to avoid DW 6075. Only anno CFRB, all talk incl "News every 30 min on CFRB". Wx sport business etc. Still audible 0900+ but fading.

6130 CHNX Halifax using only USB (nothing on LSB) also well audible with usual "Oldies 96" as well as wx. Annc as "a Maritime Broadcasting System Station". Can still copy this one at 0910, one hour after sunrise.

6160 CKZN St Johns - I assume this one - surely not CKZU Vancouver - ID as CBC only. Had progr from Channel Africa on "CBC Overnight" until 0800 when "Nx on the Hour from CBC Radio One". At 0805 "CBC Overnight" with progr from DW. All in En. Not listed as active at this time. Still audible but very low at 0900 when DW via ATG boomed in at s-on for En to OCE on 6160.

* 11755 Merlin Network One (Follow-up to Cumbre 231) This channel originates not from the UK but from Sackville instead; 2000-2200, beaming towards Europe (60degrees). This appears rather strange, but is likely because there are no suitable antennas for coverage of Central Europe available at the

UK sites during this hours.(Ludwig/Cumbre DX)

Central African Republic Good news for those who didn't succed in picking up the very weak signals from Radio Minurca late 1998. David Smith informs me that Radio Minurca will have a new and more powerful transmitter up and running between now and the end of March - and it will run on 9900 kHz. (Stig Hartvig Nielsen, Denmark) I've also seen reports of the first QSLs from Minurca arriving in the US - did anyone in the Pacific manage a report?-ed.

Germany Brother Stair in English via Juelich, changes from Feb 4: 1330-1730 6010 to Europe - new time (x1500-1700; 1800-2000 deleted 6130 for Europe. 1800-2000 additional 13810 to Southern Africa (BCDX 408)

Guam KTWR will introduce a new service in Tok Pisin ('Pidgin') for Papua New Guinea from 29 March. Mon-Fri 0930-1000 on 15330. Program name is Bible School of the Air. This will make KTWR only the second international broadcaster to use this language (in addition to Radio Australia). Meanwhile, a 5th 100kw transmitter and new antenna should be operational by April, enhancing coverage of North Asia as well as offering opportunities for expanded English programming.(Francis)

Iraq Some observations of Iraqi Radio transmissions (5935 and 9755 are inactive at present): Feb 23-24 7160 1710-2007* *1709-2005*; 9685 1754-2042* 1659-2008*; 9715 1442-1558* 1402-1603*; 11650 0731-0931*;

11785 1818-2043* 0947-1101, 1703-2008*. Only one program in Arabic is broadcast on all frequencies with ID's as in WRTH: "Idha'at Jumhuriyat al-'Iraq min Baghdad" (Turkish or carrier only past 2000 on 9685 and 11785). There are also many audio breaks and various transmitter problems. 11650 was also noted in the evening past 1900 on Feb 22. (Timofeyev, Cumbre DX)

Madagascar 5590 Radio Makanika is how the IDs sound on this new station. *1545-1855* and it seems to be a commercial station, although one with very few advertisements. Also seems to have no news or announcements. (Vaghjee, Feb 23, Cumbre DX)

Mexico Radio UNAM, 9600, has been observed by various DXers around the world at various times of day, including up to 0700 s/off. Apparently parallel MW 860, with some references also heard to FM outlet XEUN-FM 96.1. IDs heard for "Radio UNAM" or "Radio Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico". One report has power as 650 watts. An address for reception reports: Ing. Gustavo Carreno, Technical Department, Adolfo Prieto 133, Colonia del Valle, 03100 Mexico DF. (Various sources)

Morocco RFE/RL added a new language service, Kosovian-Albanian on 1-Mar (the Albanian spoken in the Kosovo region of Serbia). 2000-2030 7180, 9600, 9690 all via Briech relay (VOA 'Communications World', Feb-27)

North Korea Sonny Ashimori of Japan provided this review of activity from the DPRK to Cumbre DX:

3025 Radio for Soldiers at the Frontline reactivated here with the usual war drama and talk in Korean. Transmission is very irregular but the usual schedule is 1400-2100. This is my first observation of this frequency this year. 2625v has long been silent, but MW 1613v is very active (same schedule, not // with SW). ID and slogan with jingle at 1728 "Chonyon

Chobyondurul wihan Bangsong imnida." SIO 343-333 (Feb 23)

3900v KCBS location unknown (//2850 KCBS Pyongyang)continues to be heard here regularly (KCBS 2000-1800, relays Pyongyang Broadcasting Station 1800-2000), with the frequency drifting wildly, SIO 222-211. The carrier appears to be missing (?) and the terribly distorted audio is hardly readable. Two KCBS SW sites are known to relay Pyongyang BS 1800-2000: 3220 Hamhun and 3970 Wonsan. This may be another, or a spur from somewhere.

Sri Lanka VOA Colombo 15395 was off freq for a couple of months,

creating a heterodyne. It was corrected two weeks ago. 1400-1800 is the English News Now sked here. These VOA Ekala txs will stop VOA relaying once the Iranawila operation gets under way. The txs will then probably carry SLBC to India. They might also be available for relays to India. In the meantime, SLBC to South East Asia and Australia at 1030-1130 uses 11835 and 17850, both 35 kW VOA txs. Although the stn ancs 15120, it has long been off. English nx at 1045.(Victor Goonetilleke, UADX, Feb 21 in BCDX 408)

United Kingdom A number of changes have been announced to BBC World Service as part of its (self-described)repositioning for the 21st century and plans to compete for global audiences through an expansion of Internet output, FM broadcasts and English programming. There'll be a new 24 hour English radio news channel in addition to a general program network to be called World Service Plus. They will be available on Internet and satellite while other [shortwave] listeners will receive a mix of programs from both streams. SW broadcasts will be reduced in areas where there is an alternative, higher quality, signal

delivery method. The German service will close from March after 61 years of operation. It's worth noting, however, that despite the impact of information age technologies, including the Internet, the vast majority - some 120 million - of listeners to the Beeb will still tune in via shortwave. The BBC says it will retain shortwave in areas where other technologies, including local rebroadcasts, are not viable.

USA VOA's new 24-hour English-language music service will be called VOA Music Mix. No definite start date for the service was given, but it should be on the air by the end of April 1999. You probably won't be able to hear VOA Music Mix on VOA shortwave and medium wave transmitters. Instead, the service will be relayed on satellite to any local radio station and cable system that elects to rebroadcast this free service. VOA Music Mix programming will consist of a mix of contemporary music, weekdays, with hosts Ray McDonald and Bernie Bernard. Specialty music programs, including a new jazz show, will be heard on weekends. The service will include news on the hour from VOA News Now. VOA Music Mix will replace the present VOA Express, which itself replaced the former VOA Europe. ('Communications World', VOA, Feb-27)

Broadcast DX with Paul Ormandy in Oamaru

Well, I thought we had a very light mailbag last month... little did I know! And I fear if interest (read: contributions) don't increase, that our closet SW DXing Chief Editor may look at combining both the SW & MW Mailbags... so, if you enjoy this section and want to see it prosper, I'd love to hear what DXing has occurred at your place.

Highlights...

- By the time you get this, THE EQUINOX WILL BE HERE!
- More kudos for the MFJ-1026...
- The X-band is fair throbbing! Stations galore... check the trail...

And if the X-band hasn't spurred your DX interest then hopefully the Autumnal Equinox, scheduled late March will! The Equinox effect probably lasts a good two weeks wither side of the actual Equinox date and therefore conditions well into April should benefit. Oldhands will tell you that the Equinoxes (there is a second, the Vernal Equinox in September) usually bring enhanced listening conditions and it wouldn't be the first time that a New Zealand station was absolutely flattened by a station from the other side of the World! Best times to listen are around Sunrise and Sunset - either at the receiving site or transmitting site, and if you can combine sunrise/sunset at the transmitter location with sunset/sunrise at the listening location, then you might get the "double whammy" - in other words, Grey-Line Enhancement. And when you hear a usually strong NZer flattened by a Spanish station (that's

right - from SPAIN!) you'll know you've experienced Grey-Line! And it can happen in our evenings or our mornings so keep an ear alert for something that sounds a little "different". In the past I have noticed that the audio of NZ stations tend to get a bit muffled prior to being dominated by something from the other side of the World.

And when DXing from Waianakarua on Sunday the 8th, I was tuned to 840kHz logging KXTN Las Vegas, only it was being splashed by the NZer on 846... in goes the MFJ-1026 to phase out the splash, which it did nicely though it also revealed Kiribati at a good, loggable level!

Other targets brought into focus by the Equinox are South Americans, Caribbeans, East Coast USA and Alaskans... have a tune around... you may be pleasantly surprised!

3XP Radio Ferrymead

February 1999 saw this low power station in Christchurch celebrating its 8th year broad-casting from Ferrymead Historic Park. Run by the Radio Preservation Society of NZ (Ferrymead) Inc., and staffed only by volunteers, 3XP operates on 1413 AM.

With over 40,000 records in its collection, it has over 200,000 separate titles to choose its playlist from. Most music is from the 1930s-1960s, with some from the 1970s. It's format is best described as 'Nostalgia', a theme that sits well with its location as part of the Museum of Sound. This includes many prime examples of restored radios, and one of the world's premier collections of vintage gramophones.

Radio Ferrymead obtained its original 100 watt transmitter and 90 foot antenna from a local company, and most of its studio equipment from the estate of a local broadcasting personality. In 1994, the Society was given the transmitter, tower and hut of former Twizel station 3ZO (1550 AM) and moved all this equipment to the Ferrymead site in the Christchurch suburb of Heathcote.

More recently, a Nortel ex Aircraft Beacon transmitter capable of 1 kilowatt was put into service. However, power is held at 500 watts as part of the shared frequency agreement with 1ZO Tokoroa. In the winter, sunrise and sunset power is reduced further to 300 watts to avoid interference.

The station carries no commercials, but some local businesses sponsor various programmes. 3XP broadcasts on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays from 8am to 6pm NZ local time, with some extended hours to 9pm.


The current 90 foot tower has an extended ground radial system to boost signal quality, and is located on swampy land alongside the Heathcote River. Ferrymead Historic Park is site of the first railway line in New Zealand (1863) and is a popular local tourist attraction open all year round.

On 1570, helped at times by XERF having transmitter troubles, (one time being off for 12 Months) I managed to get CHUB IkW., KJFJ 0.25kW, WMES 1kW., WNCA 1kW., WRWJ 1kW., CKLM 5kW., WPAP 1kW., CHLO 10kW, 3WL 0.2 kW., CKTA 5kW., AFRTS Taiwan 10kW, CKEG 10kW.,and lastly CKMW 10kW., I did try CFOR Orillia twice while it was on 1570 but no joy from them, but I really can't complain, I have done quite well on the frequency"


