
Dear mr. Geary:






Dear Mr. Geary:


Dear Mr. Geary:

This will confirm your very detailed reception report of September 12, 1983. The station is designated as KBE-532 and operates up to 100 watts power into a very short vertical radiator on the roof of our building.

As your report indicates, the system is used as an RPW and also to furnish cue information to crews in the field. The frequency of 1622 Khz was chosen as the D. C. area is overcrowded in the conventional VHF and UHF RPU bands and we find that it works quite well for our purposes and does not add to the congestion so prevalent in most metro areas.

Thank you for your continual interest.




