
Dear Sir,

Thank you for your letter and your kind comments on the reception you report of Radio Jamaica. We confirm the accuracy of your programme logging.

The station to which you were tuned operates on 1180 Kc/s and is located at Montego Bay on the north-west coast of the island. The equipment used is a Collins 20V transmitter rated at 1200 watts. It feeds a 150 ft. mast radiator. The station runs unattended and is designed to provide broadcast coverage in the north-west of Jamaica beyond the range of mountains which shield that area from our main 5 Kw transmitter on 720 Kc/s located near Kingston. The station is about 100 miles from our Studios and it receives its programme input via an F.M. Link with one repeater station located in the centre of Jamaica at an altitude of 3000 ft.

We trust this information will be of interest to you.
